PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 4927. "An Act to make Provision with respect to the Constitution of an Inland Meat Authority and the Objects Functions Powers and Duties of such Authority, and for other purposes."
- No. 4928. "An Act to make provision for the Meeting out of the Consolidated Revenue of portion of certain Liabilities of the Koo-wee-rup to McDonald's Track Railway Construction Trust the Neerim South to Toorongu River Railway Construction Trust and the Colac to Alvie Railway Construction Trust, and for other purposes."
- No. 4929. "An Act relating to the Surplus Revenue of the Financial Year ended on the Thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and forty-two."
- No. 4930. "An Act to make Provision with respect to the Granting of Long Service Leave with Pay to certain Officers and Employés in the Railway Service."
- No. 4931. "An Act to make Provision with respect to the Allocation of Storage Space in Grain Elevators and to exempt the Grain Elevators Board from Payment of Rates in respect of Lands-used exclusively for Grain Elevators."

Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 6 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, E. J. HOGAN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Forty-four per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of January, 1943.

CHEESE QUOTA.

I, E. J. HOGAN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be Forty-two and one-half per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of January, 1943.

RULES MADE PURSUANT TO PARAGRAPH 5 (5) (c) OF THE LIQUOR CONTROL ORDER (VICTORIA) No. 7, DATED 8TH DECEMBER, 1942, MADE BY THE PREMIER OF THE STATE OF VICTORIA UNDER REGULATION 45 OF THE COMMONWEALTH NATIONAL SECURITY (SUPPLEMENTARY) REGULATIONS.

1. In these rules the expression "The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7" means The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7 dated the eighth day of December One thousand nine hundred and forty-two, made by the Premier of the State of Victoria under Regulation No. 45 of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations and any amendment of such order.

2. Every summons under paragraph 5 of The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7 shall be intituled:—

"In the Supreme Court

In the matter of the Commonwealth National Security (Supplementary) Regulations No. 45, and in the matter of the Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7

and

In the matter of the Closure Order in respect of premises known as between Applicant, and Respondent".

3. Every such summons shall be served upon the person who has made the Closure Order which it is sought to revoke.

4. Otherwise than as provided in these rules the practice and procedure upon applications to a Judge under The Liquor Control Order (Victoria) No. 7 shall be that provided in the Rules of the Supreme Court for applications originating in Chambers.

CITY OF CAULFIELD.

BY-LAW No. 73.

A By-law numbered 73 of the City of Caulfield, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, for repealing certain parts of By-law No. 24 of the said City (then Town) and for adopting certain of the provisions of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* in lieu thereof, and for carrying out the said provisions.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and of all other powers enabling them in this behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Caulfield do order as follows, namely:—

1. In clause 2 of the Council's By-law No. 24, which was duly passed on the 13th day of April, 1904, and confirmed on the 11th day of May, 1904, and which came into force on the 19th day of May, 1904, the figure 9 appearing between the figures 8 and 15 shall be and is hereby deleted and repealed.

2. Clause 9, Part (1), of the Thirteenth Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by the *Local Government Act 1941 (No. 4869)*, shall be and the same is hereby adopted.

3. To carry out the purposes of the said clause 9 it is hereby ordered that the owners or occupiers of houses or buildings shall on the gate or gate post or on the letter box or on a conspicuous place on the front fence immediately adjacent to the entrance of the houses or buildings mark such houses or buildings with such numbers and names for the purpose of distinguishing the same as the Council may from time to time direct or approve, and shall renew the numbers or names of such houses or buildings as often as they are obliterated or defaced, and if any owner or occupier of any such house or building neglects for one week after notice to

4. Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty of not less than Twenty shillings and not exceeding Twenty pounds for each and every offence, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further penalty of not more than Ten pounds for each day on which an offence under the By-law is continued.

“Herdsmen” means any officer appointed in that behalf by the Council.

5. Each ratepayer (provided that he is the bona fide owner of such cattle and resides in the Shire of Rosedale), on payment to the Herdsman of the fees prescribed in clause 7 hereof, shall be allowed to graze not more than ten head of cattle on such lands under the control of the Council as the Council may direct.

6. Cattle referred to in the previous clause shall comprise only milch cows, young dairy heifers under two years of age at time of registration, and steers under one year of age at time of registration.

7. Fees.—For the period 1st January to 30th June in any year—13s. per head. For the period 1st July to 31st December in any year—13s. per head. For any shorter period—13s. per head.

8. No such cattle shall be allowed to graze as aforesaid unless a metal disc issued by the Council is securely affixed to such cattle. The disc shall remain the property of the Council.

9. The Council will not accept any responsibility for care of or loss or damage caused by any cattle.

10. The owners of all cattle which may be allowed to graze as aforesaid shall be responsible to see that such cattle do not graze or wander on any public highway without some person being in charge.
