STATE OF VICTORIA.

LIGHTING RESTRICTION ORDER (VICTORIA) No. 5.

EXEMPTION.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by sub-clause 3 of clause 28 of the Lighting Restriction Order (Victoria) No. 5, I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, Premier of the State of Victoria, do hereby grant—

- (a) to all owners and to all occupiers of land in such parts of the parishes enumerated in the First Schedule to this Exemption as are not less than 4 miles nor more than 10 miles from the ocean coast-line, and
- (b) to all owners and to all occupiers of land in the parishes enumerated in the Second Schedule to this Exemption, an exemption from the operation of paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) of the said clause 28.

Such exemption is granted subject to the following conditions, viz. :—

- (1) This exemption shall apply only to fires which shall be lit—
  - (a) within such parts of the parishes enumerated in the First Schedule as are not less than 4 miles nor more than 10 miles from the ocean coast-line; or
  - (b) within the parishes enumerated in the Second Schedule.
- (2) No fire shall be lit unless the approval in writing of the local committee appointed under the provisions of the Rural Fires Prevention Order (Victoria) for the particular municipal district or part of the municipal district in which it is proposed to light the fire has been first had and obtained which approval may be given subject to such conditions as to the said committee seem fit.
- (3) No fire shall be lit unless the approval in writing of the Forest Officer in charge of the district, or, where there is no Forest Officer in charge of the district, the Police Officer in charge of the district in which it is proposed to light the fire has been first had and obtained which approval may be given subject to conditions including such conditions as, after consultation with the General Officer Commanding, Victoria Lines of Communication Area or with any officer of the Armed Forces authorized in that behalf by the General Officer Commanding, Victoria Lines of Communication Area, to him seem fit.
