ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

- No. 4932. "An Act to prohibit the Employment in the Coal Mining Industry of certain Persons of or above the Age of Sixty Years and of certain other Persons of or above the Age of Sixty-five years and to make Provision for and with respect to the Payment of Pensions to such Persons and certain other Persons, and for other purposes."
- No. 4933. "An Act to sanction the Issue and Application of certain Sums of Money available under Loan Acts or in the State Loans Repayment Fund for State Forests."
- No. 4934. "An Act to provide for the Registration of Patent Medicines and regulate the Sale and Advertisement thereof, and for other purposes."
- No. 4935. "An Act to amend Section Twenty-nine of *The Metropolitan Gas Company's Act 1878*."
- No. 4936. "An Act to provide for the Dismantling of the Section of the Koo-wee-rup to McDonald's Track Railway between Yannathan and Triholm and for other purposes."
- No. 4937. "An Act to amend Sections Four and Ten of the *Soil Conservation Act 1940*, and for other purposes."
- No. 4938. "An Act to amend Section Sixty-eight of the *Forests Act 1928* and Section Seven of the *Forests Act 1939*."
- No. 4939. "An Act to consolidate and amend the Law relating to Surveyors and for other purposes."
- No. 4940. "An Act to amend Section One hundred and sixty of the *Administration and Probate Act 1928* and Section Two of the *Administration and Probate (War Service) Act 1940*."

No. 4941. "An Act to apply a sum out of the Consolidated Revenue to the service of the year ending on the thirtieth day of June One thousand nine hundred and forty-three and to appropriate the Supplies granted in this Session of Parliament."

—CITY OF CHELSEA.

PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by Division 10 of Part I. of the *Land Act* 1928, it is, amongst other things, enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time increase, and, after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette*, diminish, alter, or abolish any common, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Part of the said Act, and that nothing therein contained shall prevent the exercise of the powers conferred by the said Part of the said Act with respect to the leasing or licensing of any land comprised in any common: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do hereby abolish the under-mentioned common, viz.:—

The Fisheries Acts.

ALTERATION OF THE REGULATIONS RESPECTING NETTING IN WATSON'S, WOORONOOKE, AND DEW'S LAKES, NEAR CHARLTON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the twelfth day of January, 1937, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of January, 1937, respecting netting in Watson's, Wooroonooke, and Dew's Lakes, near Charlton, and permit the use of gill or set nets for the purpose of taking fish in Watson's, Wooroonooke, and Dew's Lakes (commonly known as the Wooroonooke Lakes) from the first day of December in each year to the thirty-first day of August next following, provided:—

1. That no nets shall be used other than those with meshes measuring not less than three and a half inches;
2. That no person shall use at the one time more than seventy-five yards of net.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Council is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 45,000 gallons.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

5. The Council will let for hire water meters, the rental for which shall be at the rate of Seven shillings per annum for $\frac{1}{2}$ -in. meters. Such rental shall be exclusive of and in addition to the amount of rate chargeable for the recorded consumption of water.

6. Such person or persons as may from time to time be appointed for that purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, and collect, and recover the said rates and charges.

which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all purposes of such rate be determined by a police magistrate.

(5) Such person or persons as The Ballarat Sewerage Authority may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be, and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rate and charges.

The Resolution for passing the foregoing By-law was agreed to by The Ballarat Sewerage Authority on the thirtieth day of November, 1942, and was confirmed by the said Authority on the fifteenth day of December, 1942.

Removal of Undergrowth, Weeds, and Grass from Land.

A By-law of the Shire of Corio, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and numbered 30, requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land within any area within the municipal district set forth in the By-law and declared therein to be a populous or residential area in cases where in the opinion of the Council such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, and enabling the Council in the event of default by the owner or occupier to remove the same and to recover the cost thereof from the owner or occupier.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, and every other power thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Corio order as follows:—

1. In the case of any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within that portion of the municipal district of the Shire of Corio bounded by a line commencing at Corio Bay at eastern end of Victoria-street, running westerly along Victoria-street to Thompson's-street or road; thence southerly by Thompson's-street or road to the Midland Highway; thence south-easterly by the Midland Highway to Church-street; thence westerly by Church-street to Vines-street; thence northerly by Vines-street to the Midland Highway; thence south-easterly by the Midland Highway to Anakie-road; thence northerly by the Anakie-road to Separation-street; thence easterly by Separation-street to Thompson's-street or road; thence northerly by Thompson's-street or road to Sparks-road; thence easterly by Sparks-road and Walsh's-road to Corio Bay; thence south-westerly and southerly by the shore of Corio Bay

to the commencing point, the whole of which is hereby declared to be a populous or residential area, which undergrowth, weeds, or grass in the opinion of the Council constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property—

- (a) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of such land fourteen days' notice, in writing, over the signature of the Shire Secretary, requiring the removal of such undergrowth, weeds, or grass therefrom.
- (b) All notices to owners or occupiers under this By-law shall be served as provided by section 831 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by section 90 of the *Local Government Act 1934*.
- (c) Every owner or occupier of any land on whom a notice is served under this By-law in respect of the undergrowth, weeds, or grass on such land shall within fourteen days from the service of such notice remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from such land.
- (d) In the event of default being made by such owner or occupier in complying with such notice or the provisions of this By-law, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council to enter upon the land on which such undergrowth, weeds, or grass may be and to remove the same, and all expenses incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from the owner or occupier so defaulting in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (e) Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction or order imposed or made on or against such person by any court, such person shall be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day such offence is continued.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout that portion of the municipal district described in clause 1 hereof to be a populous or residential area.
