ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR BANK HOLIDAY (KING'S BIRTHDAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Monday, the twentieth day of December, 1943, is by section 13 of the *Banks and Currency Act 1928* appointed for a bank holiday: And whereas it is made to appear to the Governor in Council expedient that the said day should not be a bank holiday throughout Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said State, in pursuance of the provisions of section 16 of the said Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a bank holiday throughout Victoria and appoint—

MONDAY, THE SEVENTH DAY OF JUNE, 1943,
to be a bank holiday throughout the said State.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the City of Heidelberg has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land hereinafter described, and situated within the City of Heidelberg aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, E. J. REGULATIONS RELATING TO VEHICLES USED FOR
CONVEYANCE OF CARCASSES OR MEAT.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Health Acts, and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following. (that is to say) :—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Meat Transport Vehicles Regulations 1943 and shall come into operation three months after publication in the *Government Gazette*, and shall be separated into divisions, as follows :—

Division I.—Introductory.

Division II.—Application for approval and certification of vehicles.

Division III.—Transport of carcasses and meat.

Division IV.—General and Supplementary.

Division V.—Schedules.

DIVISION I.—INTRODUCTORY.

2. Any regulations heretofore made relating to matters provided for herein shall not be applicable to any portion of a municipal district to which these Regulations apply.

3. These Regulations shall apply to all meat areas.

4. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter :—

“Appliances” includes utensils, instruments, covers, containers, and apparatus.

“Approved” means approved in writing, and approval has a corresponding interpretation.

“Commission” means the Commission of Public Health as constituted under the *Health Act 1928*.

“Council” means the Council of a municipality.

“Establishment” means any premises or place appointed by a Council and authorized by the Commission as an establishment whereat vehicles may be inspected and licensed under the provisions of these Regulations.

“Inspector” means an officer appointed by a Council for the purpose of licensing after inspection and approval vehicles and receptacles used for conveyance of carcasses or meat.

“Meat” means any edible part of an animal intended for sale for human consumption, and includes edible offal and small goods.

“Proprietor” of a vehicle includes the owner or any person having the management or control thereof.

“Retail Shop” means any building or place or portion of a building or place or any tent stall vehicle or pack in which meat is exposed or offered for sale by retail or is kept or placed for the purpose of sale by retail.

“Vehicle” includes appliances attached thereto or used in connexion therewith.

DIVISION II.—APPLICATION FOR APPROVAL AND CERTIFICATION OF
VEHICLES.

5. Every application for the approval of a vehicle for the transport of meat shall be made by the proprietor thereof to the Council of the municipality in the municipal district of which the proprietor's place of business is situated in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to these Regulations.

6. In addition to making such application the proprietor shall take or cause to be taken the vehicle to an establishment for the inspection and approval of an inspector.

7. If upon inspection of such vehicle the inspector approves thereof he shall give to the proprietor a licence certificate in writing in the form prescribed in the First Schedule to these Regulations, and shall assign to such vehicle a number and shall specify on the certificate such number and the appropriate letters as prescribed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations indicating the Council by whose inspector the certificate is issued and the date of expiry of such certificate.

8. (a) Every such certificate shall remain in force for a period of twelve calendar months from the date of the issue thereof unless previously revoked under the power in that behalf contained in these Regulations.

(b) Every such certificate shall have force in any municipality or portion of a municipality wherein these Regulations have application.

9. Before using such vehicle for the carriage of meat the proprietor thereof shall paint or cause to be painted in white on a dark ground in some conspicuous position on the right or off side of such vehicle in letters and a figure or figures (as the case may be) not less than four inches in height the number and letters assigned to such vehicle, and shall at all times maintain such inscription so that the same shall be easily distinguishable.

10. (a) Whilst such certificate remains in force the proprietor shall—

- (i) maintain the vehicle referred to in the certificate in good order and condition;
- (ii) make no structural alterations to such vehicle except with the approval of the Council by whose inspector the licence was issued;
- (iii) at least fourteen days before the date of expiry as set out in the certificate notify the Council by whose inspector the licence was issued of intention to seek renewal of the licence or not to seek such renewal; and
- (iv) if renewal of the licence is intended take the vehicle for inspection to the establishment at which the certificate was issued.

(b) Any inspector, after inspection of any vehicle in respect of which application for renewal of a licence is made, may—

- (i) renew the licence and issue a certificate accordingly; or
- (ii) if the vehicle does not comply with the provisions of these Regulations either refuse to renew the expiring licence or revoke the existing licence if current.

11. (a) If an inspector finds on inspection of a vehicle in respect of which a licence under these Regulations is current that such vehicle does not comply with the provisions of these Regulations he may revoke the licence.

(b) When an inspector has revoked a licence he shall forthwith give notice in writing in that behalf to the proprietor of the vehicle and shall direct the said proprietor to return the licence certificate and to obliterate from the vehicle the letters and number painted on the side thereof in accordance with Regulation 9 hereof.

(c) If within seven days of the receipt of such notice the proprietor has not returned the licence certificate and obliterated the said letters and number from the side of the vehicle he shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

DIVISION III.—TRANSPORT OF CARCASSES AND MEAT.

12. No person shall—

- (a) Carry any meat in a vehicle except one—
 - (i) which is of a type as specified in the Third Schedule to these Regulations;
 - (ii) which is licensed for that purpose under these Regulations;—and
 - (iii) which is wholly covered in with closely-fitting material to protect the meat therein from contamination by flies or by dust, dirt, or filth or other noxious matter or thing, and provided with proper means of ventilation.
- (b) Use any vehicle for the carriage of meat unless the vehicle and appliances thereof are at all times in good order and condition and thoroughly clean.
- (c) Load any meat on, or unload any meat from, any vehicle or railway van unless while doing so he wears clean washable overalls and head covering.
- (d) Handle any meat in course of delivery, unless he wears clean clothing.
- (e) While in charge of any vehicle used for the carriage of meat refuse to allow an inspector to inspect such vehicle and the contents thereof.

13. No person shall carry on the floor of any vehicle any meat unless that meat be contained in a clean impervious container or containers.

14. No person shall use or allow to be used at any time for the transport of any live animal or of any undressed carcass or hides or offensive matter any vehicle in respect to which a certificate under these Regulations is in force.

15. When any vehicle contains meat the person in charge of the said vehicle shall see that the doors or screens are kept closed and fastened, except while meat is actually being placed in or removed from the vehicle.

16. The provisions of sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph (a) and of paragraph (c) of Regulation 12 of this Division shall not apply to a person transporting carcasses of animals reared or produced on his own farm or property to any market, abattoir, or meat inspection depot.

DIVISION IV.—GENERAL AND SUPPLEMENTARY.

17. The Council of every municipality wherein these Regulations have application shall and is hereby required to superintend and see to the execution of these Regulations; and at its own cost do and provide all such acts, matters, and things as are necessary for such purpose.

18. Any person dissatisfied with the decision of any inspector that any vehicle should not be licensed or that any licence in respect of any vehicle should be revoked or not renewed may within seven days of the communication of such decision to him by the inspector appeal in writing to the Commission and on any such appeal being made to it the Commission, after making such investigation as it thinks fit, may confirm the decision of the inspector or may direct the inspector to issue a licence in respect of the vehicle concerned or to renew the existing licence or to issue a new licence in the place of the revoked licence and every inspector to whom any such direction is given shall forthwith comply therewith.

19. The Council may appoint times for inspection of vehicles at any establishment under its authority.

20. (a) Any person doing any act forbidden to be done, or failing to do any act directed to be done, under these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

(b) Any person using for the transport of meat a vehicle for which under these Regulations a licence certificate is required when the certificate for such vehicle has expired or has been revoked shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

21. Any person guilty of an offence against these Regulations shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of Five pounds (£5), but so that the total of such penalties shall not exceed One hundred pounds (£100).

The letters indicating the municipality under whose authority any certificate is granted shall be as set out in sub-clause (2) of clause 1 of the Third Schedule to the Meat Supervision Regulations 1933 or any amendment thereof.

THIRD SCHEDULE.

STANDARD SPECIFICATIONS OF VEHICLES.

Type 1.—Totally Enclosed Vehicle.

Every such vehicle shall—

- (1) Be completely enclosed so as to protect meat from the weather, flies, and dust.
- (2) Be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished smooth.
- (3) Have a complete floor of metal or of wood boards completely covered with a smooth impervious material.

- (4) Have a permanent roof affording complete protection against entry of rain, dust and flies. Such roof shall be coved, and if constructed of metal shall be lined with material which will reduce as far as possible the transmission of heat into the body of the vehicle, and shall have an internal surface which is impervious and washable and if constructed of wood shall be closely jointed and covered or coated externally with material impervious to water.
- (5) Have permanent front and rear ends (including any doors therein) constructed in the like manner (save as to coving) as hereinbefore prescribed for the roof.
- (6) Have permanent sides constructed as prescribed for ends with weatherproof, dustproof, and flyproof vent openings of such dimensions as to properly ventilate the body of the vehicle; provided that if the vehicle is wholly insulated the before-mentioned vent openings will not be required.
- (7) Be provided with rails and hooks secured to the upper portion thereof, and be of such dimensions that meat hung on such hooks shall be clear of the floor: Provided that this clause shall not apply to a vehicle used solely for retail delivery of meat.

Type 2.—Semi-enclosed Vehicle.

Every such vehicle shall—

- (1) Be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished smooth.
- (2) Have a complete floor of metal or of wood boards completely covered with a smooth impervious material and fitted with floating rails attached to the underside of the tray of the vehicle extending from front to rear ends on each side of the tray of vehicle.
- (3) Have a permanent roof, as specified for Type 1 vehicles.
- (4) Have permanent front and rear ends (including any doors therein) as prescribed above for roofs with floating rails at each corner extending from tray to roof and set 9 inches back from side of vehicle.
- (5) Have sides consisting of 21-oz. white duck screens hung from and sliding longitudinally on removable rods. Such screens shall be attached to rods by means of $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. internal diameter type S.P.7 brass washers and eyelets, and metal rings set at 6-in. centres. Screens shall overlap the ends and floor of vehicle at least 9 inches, and shall be secured at ends and under tray of vehicle to the before-mentioned floating rails by means of 1-in. circumference rope spliced to $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. internal diameter type S.P.7 brass washers and eyelets set at 24-in. centres. Screens if in two or more pieces shall overlap at their junctions at least 9 inches, and be so secured when closed that the body shall be flyproof. The roof of such vehicles shall be fitted on each side with a permanent valance at least 9 inches deep of similar material to screens.
- (6) Be provided with 21-oz. white duck under covers extending for the full length of the sides of the vehicle, and at least 36 inches in width and fitted with $\frac{1}{4}$ -in. internal diameter type S.P.7 brass washers and eyelets at 24-in. centres to which 1-in. circumference ropes are spliced. Provided that if any vehicle has close-fitting, dust-proof drop sides no such under covers will be required.

Type 3.—Open Tray Vehicle.

Every such vehicle shall—

- (1) Be constructed of wood or metal, and all internal surfaces shall be finished smooth.
- (2) Have a complete floor of wood or metal, all as specified for Type 2 vehicle.
- (3) Be provided with a 21-oz. white duck cover hung from a ridge pole properly supported. Cover to be of such dimensions as to overlap the floor at least 9 inches, and if in two or more pieces shall overlap at their junctions at least 9 inches and be so secured when closed that the body shall be fly-proof.
- (4) Be provided with 21-oz. white duck under covers at sides and rear ends as specified for type 2 vehicles. Provided that if a vehicle is fitted with close-fitting dust-proof drop sides and tail-board no such under covers will be required.

DECLARATION OF THE ARARAT-WARRNAMBOOL ROAD
IN THE TOWN OF ARARAT.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the eighteenth day of May One thousand nine hundred and forty-three the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a main road and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for Declaration of a Main Road under the Country
Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highway within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written is of sufficient importance to be a main road acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

CONDITIONS OF CONTRACT.

1. In these conditions and in the form of contract and schedule hereto annexed the words "Government Printer" shall include the officer bearing or acting under that title, or such other officer as the Government may from time to time appoint to perform the duty in the matter in relation to which the expression is used. The word "Storekeeper" shall mean the officer (or officers) of the Government who inspects and takes delivery of the stores. The word "Schedule" shall mean and embrace the schedule or schedules hereunto annexed.

2. Under no circumstances will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

3. The Government will order from the contractor those articles enumerated in the schedule for which his tender is accepted.

4. The first delivery under this contract, equal to one half the quantity contracted for, shall be made not later than 30th November, 1943, and the remainder shall be delivered not later than 28th February, 1944. Should the contractor so desire, the whole quantity contracted for may be delivered by the date first specified.

5. The supplies are to be in accordance with schedule conditions where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule.

6. All packages, cases, wrappings, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, shall be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever, beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the

contractor. The net weight only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour, &c., may be required in the packing and delivery of the supplies.

7. All supplies shall be made to the Government Printer. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by that officer in terms of contract. At the time of delivering the supplies, the contractor shall produce an invoice and specification showing the number and contents of each package in duplicate to the officer authorized to accept delivery, and such officer shall give an acknowledgment to the contractor of the receipt of the stores delivered by him.

8. All papers supplied, excepting Item 38, must be supplied in reams, and must be according to the specification as set out in the Schedule, and cut to the true size ordered. Each ream must contain 500 sheets, and must be supplied flat (unless otherwise specified). No creased or damaged paper will be accepted.

9. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the Government Printer, whose decision shall be final. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor. All rejected goods must be removed by the contractor within forty-eight hours after notice has been given to him by the Government Printer of such rejection, and if not so removed the Government Printer is hereby empowered to send same to any store in Melbourne, there to be stored at the contractor's risk and expense, such expenses to be deducted as in clause 10. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. 10. CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

BY-LAW No. 96.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 96, for the purpose of suppressing nuisance hereinafter described existing throughout the whole of the municipal district.

WHEREAS there exists throughout the whole of the municipal district a nuisance caused by the dropping on the roads and streets from vehicles and/or containers in which the same were being conveyed over such roads or streets of filings, turnings, trimmings, and other scraps, and/or particles of iron, steel, tin, and other metals, and/or minerals, and/or other hard substances: And whereas it is considered by the Council of the said City to be necessary for the purpose of suppressing such nuisance to make this By-law: Now, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and of all other powers (if any) in that behalf existing, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray do order as follows:—

1. No person shall, within the municipal district of Footscray, convey or cause to be conveyed upon any road or street any filings, turnings, trimmings, and other scraps and/or particles of iron, steel, tin, and other metals, and/or minerals, and/or other hard substances (hereinafter referred to as "such substances") unless—

- such substances are contained in an impervious container which is completely enclosed, or
- the vehicle in which such substances are so conveyed is completely enclosed so as to make it impossible for any of such substances to escape therefrom and fall upon any road or street within the municipality, or
- Where the vehicle in which such substances are being so conveyed is not completely enclosed, the highest part of the load being conveyed is at least three inches below the level of the sides of such vehicle.

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of Footscray.

3. EXTRA RATES.—(a) Any person in Cement Works who is employed to re-line kilns or mills or who is required to work in Cement, Clinker, or Slurry Silos, shall be paid 6d. per hour in addition to the ordinary rate.

(b) Any person employed as an Underground Quarryman shall, when it becomes necessary for him to work in wet conditions, be paid 1s. per day extra.

(c) Any person employed on refractory work on new kilns shall be paid 6s. per week above the minimum wage.

4. EMPLOYMENT FOR LESS THAN FULL WEEK.—Employees who work less than 44 hours in any week may be paid the ordinary wages rate calculated pro rata according to the number of hours worked.

5. SHIFTS.—(a) The hour of beginning and the hour of ending each shift shall be as follows :—

Day Shift	7.30 a.m.	5 p.m.
Afternoon Shift	4 p.m.	2 a.m.
Night Shift	12 midnight.	8 a.m.

When any of the employees performing the work of a tester on slurry controls is a female the hours of beginning and ending shifts may be varied as required after consultation with the employees concerned.

Provided that the hours of work on Saturday in Cement Works for persons employed continuously on day shift shall be as follows 7.30 a.m. 12 noon.

(b) The higher rate to be paid for each hour or fraction of an hour worked by an employee, other than an Underground Drainer, before or after his shift, shall be time and a half.

6. COAL HANDLING.—Persons employed handling coal at siding shall, for the first twenty-four hours of any week, be paid at the rate of 2s. 1½d. per hour, and for each hour thereafter at the rate of 1s. 9½d. per hour.

For the purpose of this clause the week shall consist of seven days commencing on the particular day on which an employee starts work.

7. SPECIAL RATES.—Time and a half shall be the rate payable for all work done by persons (other than Underground Drainers), on Sundays, and by all persons on New Year's Day, Australia Day, Labour Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, the special rate shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

8. ANZAC DAY.—Where the incidence of Anzac Day is such as to prevent an employee from working his ordinary normal hours of work, then he shall be paid for the time so lost.

9. SICK LEAVE.—Where an employee is disabled by personal ill-health, proof of which sickness is given to the employer by medical certificate or other satisfactory evidence within 24 hours of the employee's consequential absence, he shall, on account thereof, be entitled without deduction of pay to absent himself from work one day in each two months, or for a proportionate aggregate in a longer period, but not exceeding six days in any year of employment.

10. ANNUAL LEAVE.—(a) A period of six consecutive days' leave on full pay shall be allowed annually to all employees continuously employed on day shift after twelve months' continuous service (less the period of annual leave).

(b) Annual leave shall be given at a time to be mutually agreed upon between employer and employee.

(c) If after six months' continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period an employee leaves his employment or his employment is terminated by the employer through no fault of the employee, the employee shall be paid one-sixth of a week's wages in respect of each completed two months of continuous service.

(d) For the purpose of this clause, the twelve months' period shall be deemed to commence on the 25th September in each year.

11. RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIALS.—A duly accredited representative of the Australian Worker's Union not more than once a fortnight shall have the right to enter during the midday meal hour, the portion of any employer's establishment in which any of the classes of labour covered by this Determination are employed for the purpose of interviewing employees on legitimate union business.

If any representative is unduly interfering or is creating disaffection amongst the employees or is offensive in his methods, the employer may refuse the right of entry.

12. PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.—The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rate shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of apprentices and improvers shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 13.

13. ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.—(a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1943, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 12.

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in an August, a November, a February, or a May the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method, according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied to a place is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of or near a quarter for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (3) The amount assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising that number is to be ascertained.
- (4) The basic wage shall be of that assigned amount during such successive period plus the additional constant loading as prescribed in clause 12.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE WHOLESALE GROCERS BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) On the 23rd December, 1912, the powers of the Wholesale Grocers Board were extended to enable it to fix rates for persons employed in the business of a wine and spirit merchant.

This Determination applies to the whole of the State of Victoria.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board appointed to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the business of a wholesale grocer, including a seller of tea," has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence after the 17th May, 1943, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

NOTE.—"Leading hand" means an adult employee who, notwithstanding that he may be under the orders of a superior, has by the instructions of his employer one or more adult employees usually under his direction.

(3) HOURS OF WORK.—The number of hours to constitute an ordinary week's work shall be 44.

(4) TIMES OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK—

(5) OVERTIME.—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

Outside the times of beginning and ending work in any day	First two hours—Time and a half, thereafter—Double time.
Within the times of beginning and ending work, in excess of the maximum number of hours prescribed in clause (3)	Time and a half.

(6) **TEA MONEY.**—Any employee required to work overtime for a period in excess of one hour after the time fixed for ending work shall be allowed 2s. tea money in addition to overtime rates as prescribed for in this Determination. Provided that this clause shall not apply where the employee was notified 24 hours previously of the intention to work overtime.

(7) **RATIONING.**—Where because of the exigencies of the trade it is intended to ration employees, not less than seven days' and not more than ten days' notice shall be given by the employer to the employees affected.

(8) **TIME RATE.**—Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to one half of the maximum number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work be paid at the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum, and for each hour worked beyond the one-half aforesaid shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(9) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sundays, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted.

(10) **TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. If such notice be not given, a week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, in lieu thereof.

(11) **REST INTERVAL.**—There shall be a rest interval of 10 minutes at a time fixed by the employer between 10 a.m. and 11.30 a.m. on each day (Monday to Friday inclusive in each week) for each employee, such time to count as time worked.

(12) **CERTIFICATE OF SERVICE.**—Any worker when leaving or being discharged from his or her employment shall be given by the employer a certificate stating the date when such employment began and the date when such employment terminated.

(13) **PAY DAY.**—Payment of wages shall be made not later than Thursday of each week and during the ordinary working hours.

(14) **PICNIC DAY.**—Double time shall be paid for all work done in the Metropolitan District on the day on which the employees hold their Annual Picnic.

(15) **SICK PAY.**—Any employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer, and he or she produces or forwards within twenty-four hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill health or accident for more than six days in each year.

(16) **ANNUAL LEAVE.**—(a) A period of one week's leave on full pay (exclusive of the holidays mentioned in clause (9)) shall be allowed annually to all employees after twelve months' continuous service.

(b) Annual leave shall be given at a time fixed by the employer within a period not exceeding three months from the date when the right to such annual leave accrued due.

(c) If after six months' continuous service an employee leaves or is dismissed he shall be paid one-twelfth of an ordinary week's wage for each completed month of service in respect of which leave has not been granted hereunder.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause an employer may require any employee to take such holiday inclusive of Christmas Day, Boxing Day, or New Year's Day, in which case an employee so required shall be granted within three months thereafter one day in lieu of each of such public holidays aforementioned as was included in his week's annual leave.
