STATE OF VICTORIA.

DIRECTIONS UNDER STATE EMERGENCY SERVICES
ORDER (VICTORIA).

METHODS OF IDENTIFICATION OF CERTAIN MEMBERS OF THE
PERSONNEL AND OF CERTAIN VEHICLES OF STATE
EMERGENCY AND OTHER SERVICES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred on me by clauses 106b and 106c of the State Emergency Services Order (Victoria) I, Alexander Mitchell Duncan, Chief Warden for Victoria, do hereby make the following directions:—

1. The directions made on the 24th day of March, 1943, and published in the *Victoria Government Gazette* on the 30th day of March, 1943, are hereby revoked.

2. The method of identification of members of the personnel of the State Emergency Services and other services specified in the first column of Parts I. and II. of the First Schedule to this direction shall be as specified respectively in the second and third columns of those Parts of the said Schedule.

3. The identification labels to be used as methods of identification of vehicles of the classes mentioned in the first column of paragraph 2 of the Second Schedule to this direction shall be as specified in the said Schedule.

SECOND SCHEDULE.

Identification Labels for Vehicles.

1. Identification labels shall be printed in red ink on white paper and shall bear the following words and lettering:—

- (a) On the first line the words "State Emergency Services";
 (b) On the second line the lettering applicable—
 (i) to the service for which the vehicle has been appropriated; or
 (ii) to the authority by which the vehicle is being used;
 (c) On the third line the registered number (if any) of the vehicle and the expression "Alex. M. Duncan";
 (d) On the fourth line and immediately under the expression "Alex. M. Duncan" the expression "Chief Warden."

2. The letters applicable to the various classes of vehicles shall be as follows:—

STATE OF VICTORIA.

COUNCIL OF AGRICULTURAL EDUCATION ELECTIONS ORDER
(VICTORIA)

ORDER No. 48.

WHEREAS by Regulation 35A of the Commonwealth National Security (General) Regulations it is provided, *inter alia*, that the Premier of any State, after consultation with the Minister of State for Home Security or an officer of the Department of Home Security authorized by that Minister to act on his behalf and with the Commander of a Lines of Communication Area or an officer authorized by the Minister of State for the Army to act on behalf of such a Commander, may by Order make such provision with respect to the rights, powers, privileges, obligations or liabilities of the civil population, or any part thereof, as appears to him to be reasonably incidental to the operation of any regulation made under the *National Security Act 1939* or under that Act as subsequently amended:

Now therefore I, Albert Arthur Dunstan, Premier of the State of Victoria, having duly held such consultations, do hereby make the following Order:—

1. This Order may be cited as the Council of Agricultural Education Elections Order (Victoria).
2. In this Order, "Council" means the Council of Agricultural Education set up under the provisions of the *Agricultural Colleges Act 1928* of the State of Victoria and "the Act" means the said *Agricultural Colleges Act*.
3. There shall be no election by members of agricultural societies of any members of the Council before the fourth Wednesday in the month of June in the year 1946.
4. The respective terms of office of those members of the Council in office at the commencement of this Order who were elected by members of agricultural societies shall be extended so that each such member shall, subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Act, continue in office until the 30th day of June, 1946.

5. If the office of any such elected member becomes vacant by reason of his death, resignation, bankruptcy, or insolvency, or failure to attend three consecutive meetings of the Council without leave of absence granted by the Council, the Governor in Council of the State of Victoria may appoint any person to be a member in place of the person whose office has so become vacant and the person so appointed shall, subject to the provisions of section 19 of the Act, hold office until the 30th day of June, 1946.
