VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING FISHING IN CERTAIN STREAMS FROM 1st SEPTEMBER TO 30TH NOVEMBER IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

2. In the tenth line, after the word "wharf," insert the words "or area of land annexed to a wharf as aforesaid."

4. Regulation No. 311 is amended by inserting at the commencement the words "subject to Regulation No. 311B."

5. After Regulation No. 311 of the principal Regulations, the following Regulation is inserted:—

311A. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel occupying any berth at a wharf, or part of a wharf to which is annexed an area of land for the storage of timber, and using such wharf for the unshipping of timber shall, unless otherwise agreed upon, pay to the Commissioners for the right to place timber on such area the sum of £14 for the first day, and for each subsequent quarter of a day on which the vessel is so berthed the sum of 10s.

The master, owner, or agent of a vessel occupying any berth at a wharf, or part of a wharf to which is annexed an area of land for the storage of timber and using such wharf for the shipping of timber, shall, unless otherwise agreed upon, pay to the Commissioners for the right to place timber on such area the sum of £2 for the first day, and for each subsequent quarter of a day on which the vessel is berthed the sum of 10s.

Provided always that the charge for any part of a day of or less than six hours shall be that specified for a quarter of a day, and the minimum charge shall be for one day. Provided further that in the case of vessels trading solely between ports within the Commonwealth the charges payable under this Regulation shall be only 50 per cent. of those hereinhefore specified, and in the case of vessels trading solely within Port Phillip Heads the charges under this Regulation shall be only 25 per cent. of such specified charges. The master, owner, or agent of a vessel requiring any wharf, to which is annexed an area of land for ing any wharf, to which is annexed an area of land for the storage of outward timber prior to the berthing of the vessel by which it is to be shipped, shall pay to the Commissioners for the use of such wharf or part thereof from the time such wharf is set apart for the storage of such timber until the berthing of the vessel, the sum of 22 for the first day and 10s, for each subsequent quarter of a day, and in the event that all of such timber is not shipped by the vessel 10s, for each quarter day after the departure of the vessel until all the timber stored has been removed from the wharf or land.

Provided always that the charge for any part of a day of or less than six hours shall be that specified for a quarter of a day, and the minimum charge shall be for one day. The granting of the use of any wharf and/or land for the storage of outward cargo shall be in the discretion of the Commissioners, and any such grant may

1. No person shall do or permit to be done any of the following matters at any refuse tip or incinerator under the control of the Port Melbourne City Council—

(a) Trespass on any part of such area.

(b) Deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish except as directed by the City Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas.

(c) Obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any person lawfully using such area.

lawfully using such area:

(d) Neglect or refuse to obey the lawful directions of the City Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas.

(e) Deposit or leave any refuse, rubbish, factory waste, or any other material which, in the opinion of the City Engineer or other officer in charge of any such areas, is inflammable or subject to spontaneous combustion, or liable to ignite or if ignited to cause smoke or fumes.

(f) Bring, deposit, or leave any refuse or rubbish obtained from any place outside the limits of the City of Port Melbourne without the written authority of the City Engineer.

(g) Light any fire in any part of the tip.
(h) Remove any sand or other material.
(i) Interfere with the surface of the tip or with any materials deposited or about to be deposited at

the tip.

(i) Behave in an unseemly, indecent, or improper manner or use any profane or indecent language or commit any nuisance at the tip.

any nuisance at the tip.

(k) Disfigure, damage, destroy, or interfere with any notice board, post, fence, building, appliance, tree, gate, or other equipment at the tip.

2. No person in or upon any road, street, footway, or public place within the limits of the City of Port Melbourne shall—

(a) drive any vehicle laden with sand, dust, paper shavings, iron, steel, or metal shavings, or waste or any other material which may drop or be blown about unless the same is close covered to the satisfaction of an officer of the Council; or

(b) make or cause to be made any loud outcry, noise, or sound; or

or sound: or

(c) sound or play upon any musical or noisy instrument or operate or control any wireless set, loud speaker, or other instrument, or continue emitting loud

or other instrument, or continue emitting loud sounds; or
(d) harangue or sing.
3. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.
4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable on conviction to a penalty of not more than Twenty (20) pounds.
5. This By-law shall apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the City of Port Melbourne.
