ADDITION TO WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935 (No. 4337).

DECLARING THAT EGGS SHALL BECOME THE PROPERTY OF THE EGG AND EGG PULP MARKETING BOARD FOR A FURTHER PERIOD OF TWO YEARS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (1) of section 16 of the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, it is enacted that when a product has been declared a commodity and a board has been appointed in relation thereto, the Governor in Council may by Proclamation—

- (a) provide and declare that the commodity shall forthwith upon the date of publication of the proclamation or on from and after a later date specified in the proclamation be divested from the producers of the commodity and become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof, and that upon any of the commodity coming into existence within a time specified in the same or a subsequent proclamation it shall by virtue of this Act become vested in and be the absolute property of the board as the owner thereof; and
- (b) make such further provisions as will enable the board effectively to obtain possession of the commodity as such owner and to deal with the same: And whereas by a proclamation made on the 16th day of June, 1936, under the provisions of section 6 of the said Act the Governor in Council declared eggs to be a commodity under and for the purposes of the said Act: And whereas by an Order made on the 8th February, 1937, the Governor in Council appointed a marketing board in relation to eggs and egg pulp and assigned to such board the name of "The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board": Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation hereby provide and declare that on from and after the sixteenth day of August, 1943, all eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the *Marketing of Primary Products Act 1935*, be divested from the producers of eggs and become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof and that upon any eggs coming into existence within two (2) years from the sixteenth day of August, 1943, they shall by virtue of and subject to and in accordance with the said Act become vested in and be the absolute property of The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as the owner thereof: And to enable The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board as owners of the above-mentioned commodity effectively to obtain possession thereof and to deal with the same I do further provide that all such eggs shall, subject to and in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, be delivered by the producers thereof to The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board or its authorized agent within such times at such places and in such manner as The Egg and Egg Pulp Marketing Board by public notice, or in a particular case in writing, directs or as prescribed by regulations made under the said Act.

CITY OF HAWTHORN.

BY-LAW No. 140.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and every other power thereunto enabling, and numbered 140, for repealing By-law No. 138 and for altering By-law numbered 55, as amended by By-law numbered 101, and for the management and use of the Sports Ground, and for imposing, collecting, and receiving charges or entrance fees for clubs, associations, or persons using or entering in or upon the said Sports Ground.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and any power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. *Repeal:* The By-law numbered 138, made by the Council of the City of Hawthorn under the provisions of the *Local Government Act 1928*, passed by the Council on 27th May, 1942, and confirmed on the 24th June, 1942, is hereby repealed.

2. That the By-law of the City of Hawthorn made under section 197, sub-section (7), section 222, and section 604 of the *Local Government Act 1903*, and *Municipal Grounds Act 1905*, and numbered 55, as amended by a By-law of the said city numbered 101, shall be altered as follows:—

In clause 1 at the end of the paragraph reading "On the occasion of football or cricket matches when a charge is made for admission to the grounds the revenue derived shall be dealt with in accordance with the rules of the league, association, or other organization under which the clubs in such matches play," there shall be added the following words:—

"But this provision shall not apply to matches of the Hawthorn Football Club to be held at the Sports Ground during the year 1943, the revenue from which matches, after paying ground management expenses and administration charges, shall be divided between the Hawthorn Football Club and the visiting clubs by paying to the visiting clubs the amount to which such clubs would ordinarily be entitled, and paying to the Hawthorn Football Club the remainder of such revenue, less an amount equal to 6d. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the Sports Ground, and 50 per cent. of the balance of the amount which, but for the provisions of this By-law would have been payable to the Council, the sum so deducted as representing 6d. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the Sports Ground, and 50 per cent. of the balance of the proportion payable under the rules of the Victorian Football League to the Council as the Grounds Management Committee, to be retained by the Council and, in the event of the amount payable to the Hawthorn Football Club during the year 1943 under the provisions hereof reaching an amount of £225 in excess of the amount to which the Hawthorn Football Club would ordinarily be entitled under the rules of the Victorian Football League, then the arrangement for the division of revenue from matches of the Hawthorn Football Club at the Sports Ground hereunder shall cease, and such revenue shall thereafter be divided in accordance with the rules of the Victorian Football League."

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council on the 19th day of May, 1943, and confirmed on the 30th day of June, 1943.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE FLOCK BOARD.

NOTE.—(a) This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and the Order in Council made hereunder; such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which since the 22nd November, 1937, has had the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed—

(a) in the process, trade, or business of—

(i) making flock, mungo, felt, or wadding;

(ii) cleaning wool by beating, blowing, or similar machines where such work is not subject to the Determination of any Wages Board heretofore appointed;

(b) in connexion with any process, trade, or business set out in paragraph (a)—

(i) as a storeman, packer, or sorter;

(ii) in assisting a storeman, packer, or sorter;

(iii) as an assembler, collector, or checker of goods in course of receipt or despatch—

has made the following Determination, namely:—

(1) That as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in August, 1943, the adjusted Determination of this Board which came into operation as from the beginning of the first pay period to commence in February, 1943, shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

(3) **SHIFT WORK.**—(a) By mutual agreement between the employer and employees, shifts may be worked between 11 p.m. on Sunday and midnight on the following Saturday.

In addition to the rates set out in clause (2) of this Determination employees engaged on shift work shall be paid as follows:—

(c) Shift workers shall not be required to work in excess of 56 hours in any one week.

(4) **TIME OF BEGINNING AND ENDING WORK.**—For workers other than shift workers:—

On the other working days of the week	7.30 a.m. ..	5.30 p.m.

(5) **ORDINARY HOURS FOR A WEEK'S WORK.**—(a) The ordinary hours for a week's work shall be 44 except in the case of any week in which any of the holidays specified in clause (15) occur.

(b) In any such week the ordinary hours of work shall be reduced by the number of hours regarded as an ordinary day's work for any day on which any of the said holidays occur.

(6) **OVERTIME.**—The following rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(a) By Shift Workers—

- (i) In excess of 8 hours per shift during weeks in which six shifts are worked ..
- (ii) In excess of 8 hours 48 minutes per shift during weeks in which less than six shifts are worked ..

Time and a half for the first three hours and thereafter double time.

(b) By Other Workers—

- (i) Outside the times of beginning and ending work prescribed on clause (4) herein in any day ..

Time and a half for the first three hours and thereafter double time.

- (ii) Within such times of beginning and ending work in excess of the hours prescribed as an ordinary week's work in clause (5) ..

Time and a half.

(7) **PROHIBITION OF EMPLOYMENT.**—No person under the age of eighteen years shall be engaged in the operation of feeding a rag machine.

(8) **REST PERIODS.**—A rest period of ten minutes in the forenoon and ten minutes in the afternoon shall be given all female workers without any deduction from wages.

(9) **MEAL BREAK.**—Where three shifts are worked an employee shall not be required to work more than four and a half hours without being permitted a break of twenty minutes which shall be regarded and paid for as time worked.

(10) **MEAL MONEY.**—Any employee required to work overtime for a period in excess of one hour after the time fixed in clause (4) for ending work shall be allowed 2s. meal money in addition to overtime rates as prescribed for in this Determination. Provided that this clause shall not apply where the employee was notified 24 hours previously of the intention to work overtime.

(11) **TERMS OF ENGAGEMENT.**—(a) Employees are to be engaged as weekly or casual employees. A weekly employee is one engaged by the week and paid by the week, and whose engagement shall be terminable by one week's notice on either side, such notice not to be continued from week to week.

(b) After one full week's work, such notice may be given to a weekly employee at any time, but an employer may pay one week's wages in lieu of notice.

(c) Casual employees shall be guaranteed not less than two hours' engagement every start.

(d) A weekly employee to be entitled to the weekly wage shall be available, ready, and willing to perform his or her usual work during the days and hours usually worked by such class of employee, and may be summarily dismissed for dishonesty, misconduct, neglect of duty, or for absence from work without reasonable cause, and in the event of such dismissal the employee shall be paid only for the time actually worked.

(e) Where an employer is not observing the provisions of the Wages Board Determination and declines to observe such provisions, or where an employer or his representative is insulting or uses abusive language to an employee, or where an employer or his representative acts violently towards an employee, or threatens violence to an employee, then the employee shall be under no obligation to give a week's notice of termination of employment, but may leave his employment instantly.

(12) **CASUAL WORK.**—Casual work, i.e., work for less than two full weeks, shall be paid for at the rate of time and a quarter.

(13) **SICK PAY.**—Any weekly employee not attending for duty shall lose his or her pay for the actual time lost unless such employee has had not less than six months' service and he or she produces or forwards satisfactory evidence to the employer that his or her non-attendance was due to personal ill health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill health or accident for more than four days in each year.

(14) **ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.**—Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday exclusive of the holidays mentioned in clause (15) in each year on full pay.

Provided that if an employee is given as holidays on full pay all working days between Boxing Day and New Year's Day such ordinary working days may be regarded as part of the week's holiday to which the employee is entitled under this clause, and such other working days as will make up the balance of a week shall be granted at some other time as holidays on full pay.

Any such holiday shall be given within six months of the completion of twelve months' service.

Provided further that any employee, who after not less than six months' service leaves or is dismissed before the expiration of any twelve months' service, or who leaves or is dismissed after having completed twelve months' service without receiving holidays under this clause, shall be paid for holidays pro rata in accordance with the length of service, viz., 11 hours' pay for each completed three months of service.

(15) **HOLIDAYS.**—(a) An employee shall be entitled to be absent from his employment without deduction of pay on any of the following holidays, viz.:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day.

(b) An employer shall not terminate the employment of a weekly employee for the purpose of evading payment for the holidays prescribed by this Determination.

(c) Where an employee is dismissed within a week of any such holiday the re-engagement of such employee within three days of such holiday shall be prima facie evidence that the employment was terminated for the purpose of evading payment for such holiday.

(d) Where the employer terminates the employment within one week of a day on which a holiday occurs, the employee shall be paid for such holiday or holidays prescribed by this Determination, provided that such employee had been employed by the employer for a period of at least a week prior to the termination of the employment.

(e) Where an employee is absent from his or her employment on the day before or the day after a public holiday without reasonable excuse or without the consent of the employer, the employee shall not be entitled to payment for such holiday.

(16) **SPECIAL RATES.**—Double time shall be the special rate for all work done on Sunday, New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Christmas Day, and Boxing Day; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the abovenamed holidays, then the special rate shall be payable only for the day so substituted. Provided that a shift worker who commences work not earlier than 11 p.m. on a Sunday shall only be entitled to be paid at ordinary rates for work done on such Sunday.

(17) **RIGHT OF ENTRY OF UNION OFFICIAL.**—A duly accredited representative of the Federated Storemen and Packers' Union of Australia shall have the right to enter employers' establishments during the midday meal hour for the purposes of interviewing employees on legitimate Union business on the following conditions:—

(a) That he produces his authority to the employer or his representative.

(b) That he interviews employees only at the place where they are taking their meal.

(c) That not more than one representative in all be in any establishment at any one time.

(d) That no one representative visit an establishment more than once a fortnight.

(e) That if an employer alleges that a representative is unduly interfering with his establishment or is creating disaffection amongst his employees or is offensive in his methods or is committing a breach of any of the previous conditions, such employer may refuse the right of entry, but the representative shall have the right to bring such refusal before this Wages Board.

(18) **PIECEWORK.**—That the lowest piecework prices to be paid to persons for doing work of the kinds specified in the following Schedule shall be:—

(19) **PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.**—The wages rates for males set out in clause (2) are based upon the following basic wage, and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such rates shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of improvers and of females shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause (20).

(20) **ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.**—(a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1943, the amount of the basic wage shall be prescribed as in clause (19).

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—
