Marine Act 1928.

AMENDMENT OF PILOTAGE RATES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 79 of the *Marine Act 1928* and under all other powers it in that behalf enabling, the Marine Board of Victoria, with the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council, doth ordain and determine as follows:—

"That on and after the eighteenth day of October, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, the pilotage rate from without Port Phillip Heads to an anchorage or pier in Hobson's Bay or Corio Bay, or vice versa, for steamships and ships propelled by electricity or other mechanical power up to and including 5,000 tons of the vessel's burthen, shall be Two pence half-penny (2½d.) per ton calculated on the vessel's net registered tonnage, from 5,001 tons up to and including 10,000 tons One penny farthing (1¼d.) per ton, and for every additional ton over 10,000 tons one-sixteenth of one penny (1/16d.), subject in any case to a minimum charge of Two pounds ten shillings (£2 10s.)."

The foregoing ordinance and determination was passed at a meeting of the Marine Board of Victoria, held on the 1st day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-three.

No person shall take or use any water for or in connexion with the erection of any new building, or alteration to or addition to existing buildings, until he has obtained the receipt of the Trust's officer for payment of the amount payable for the use of such water, or the consent, in writing, of the Trust or its officer.

Any person offending against the provisions thereof shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for such offence.

All charges shall be additional, except when the supply is metered; to all rates or other charges payable by the owner or occupier of the premises upon which the building is being erected, and shall in the first instance be payable by the builder or contractor, and if unpaid by the builder or contractor, shall be charged to and paid by the owner of the premises whereon such building is being erected; but such

charge to the owner shall not prejudice the right of the Trust to proceed at its option against either the builder or contractor, or the owner or occupier, for the amount payable.

HOSPITAL NURSES BOARD.—VARIATION OF APPOINTMENT ORDER.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by Order appoint a Wages Board described as the Hospital Nurses Board and did by subsequent Order vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders above-mentioned, so that in substitution for the powers thereby conferred the said Hospital Nurses Board shall be given the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons employed as—

- (a) certificated nurses in public, private, intermediate, or community hospitals or in convalescent homes;
- (b) nurses in training in hospitals recognized as training schools by the Nurses Registration Board of Victoria;
- (c) registered infant welfare nurses engaged in infant welfare work or in work requiring an infant welfare certificate, and who are employed—
 - (i) by any municipality or industrial or commercial corporation; or
 - (ii) in any—
 - infant welfare training school,
 - mothercraft training school,
 - babies' home,
 - pre-school centre (including any crèche,
 - nursery school, kindergarten, or play group);
- (d) certificated nurses engaged in connexion with any industrial or commercial undertaking.

APPOINTMENT OF A MINERAL EARTHS BOARD.

WHEREAS, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, the Governor in Council did by Order dated the seventh day of April, 1937, appoint a Wages Board (to be known as the General Board) to determine the lowest rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in a trade specified as a trade to which section 6 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1936* shall apply: And whereas the Governor in Council did by further Order specify the trade of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding, or pulverizing rocks, earths, or clays other than mineral ores as a trade to which the said section 6 shall apply: And whereas the Minister of Labour is satisfied that a majority of employees in the said specified trade desire that a Wages Board be appointed in respect of the said trade under the provisions of section one hundred and thirty-six of the *Factories and Shops Act 1928*:

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the said Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby—

- (1) Declare that it is expedient to appoint a Wages Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding, or pulverizing rocks, earths, or clays other than mineral ores.
- (2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of four members and a chairman, two of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and two as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the trade of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding, or pulverizing rocks, earths, or clays other than mineral ores.

Also that such Wages Board may, in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Mineral Earths Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "DANDENONG NATIONAL PARK."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect to the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any Public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now, therefore, the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of that portion of the land permanently reserved by Order in Council dated the 22nd July, 1930, as a site for Public purposes in the Parish of Narree Worran, as is indicated by pink tint on plan marked D/3.2.1941, attached to Lands Department correspondence Rs. 4022, and known as the "Dandenong National Park," hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public at all times free of charge, except on such days (not exceeding 26 in any one year), as the Reserve, or part or parts thereof, may be set apart for such purposes as the Committee of Management may decide, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings and six pence (2s. 6d.) may be charged and taken for admission to the Reserve, or part or parts thereof, as hereinbefore mentioned. The Committee of Management may charge such fees as it thinks fit for the use by any person or persons using buildings, conveniences, or improvements in the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall disfigure, damage, injure, or destroy in any way, or take into or remove from the Reserve, or have in his possession while therein, any trees, shrubs, flowers, ferns, or other vegetation, or parts thereof.

4. No person shall shoot, poison, trap, snare, hook, catch, or otherwise destroy or interfere with or take away any animal, eggs, skins, or feathers of any description, or carry any firearms, airguns, poison, traps, snares, or gins within the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. No person shall climb or jump over any of the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills or advertisements, or cut, paint, or write names on the fences or within the Reserve, or in any way damage or otherwise disfigure or injure or remove any of the gates, fences, seats, buildings, or other improvements, or any survey pegs or permanent marks in the Reserve, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein, or do anything to cause any annoyance to any member of the public using the Reserve.

6. No person shall leave or deposit or cause to be left or deposited any glass, paper, or rubbish in the Reserve, except in such places as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management for the purpose.

7. No person shall put or cause to be put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, or other animals, save as hereinafter set out in Clause 8.

8. The Committee of Management may from time to time issue permits, in writing, to such persons and for such periods of time as it may deem fit, for the purpose of grazing cattle, horses, sheep, or goats on such portions of the Reserve, and under such conditions and on payment of such fees as the Committee of Management may determine; such terms, conditions, times, and fees to be set out on such permit, and the number of horses, cattle, sheep, or goats permitted to be grazed given in such permits, and the holders of such permits shall not be liable to the penalties incurred under these Regulations as regards wandering cattle, sheep, or goats so far as the locality fixed in their permits are concerned, during the currency of such permits and the payment of fees in connexion therewith.

9. No cattle, horses, sheep, or goats with any contagious disease shall be allowed to depasture in the Reserve.

10. No person shall depasture any bull or entire horse over the age of six months in the Reserve.

11. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect therein any building or any booth or other structure for any purpose whatsoever, or offer for sale therein any article, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first had and obtained, and then only subject to the payment of such fees and on such conditions as the Committee of Management may determine; such written permission shall, if required, be produced at any time to any person duly authorized by the Committee of Management to demand the production of same.

12. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

13. No person shall preach, declaim, harangue, or deliver any address of any kind to members of the public in any portion of the Reserve without the written consent of the Committee of Management first obtained.

14. No assemblies for sports, shows, fêtes, holiday amusements, concerts, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking for any purpose or meeting of a like character shall take place in any portion of the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and then only subject to such terms, conditions, and the payment of such fees as the Committee of Management may determine.

15. Persons renting or hiring any stand, building, erection, or enclosures on the occasions of any sports, fêtes, picnics, or any other purpose may be required to deposit any sum which the Committee of Management may at any time determine, not exceeding Ten pounds, by way of guarantee that due care shall be taken of such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, and such Committee, in its absolute discretion, may make good any damage or injury sustained by such stand, building, erection, or enclosure, or anything contained therein, during such occupancy or hiring, and deduct the cost of making good such loss or damage from the sum of money deposited by way of guarantee, and all persons so renting or hiring shall abide by these Regulations and by any order given by the Committee of Management.

16. The Committee of Management may provide and build such fireplaces in the Reserve as it may think necessary, and any person lighting or using fires, or causing or permitting fires to be used in the Reserve save in such fireplaces, shall be guilty of an offence under these Regulations.

17. No person shall play at cricket, hockey, golf, rounders, tennis or any other similar game, nor play football in the Reserve, except in such area or areas as may from time to time be set apart by the Committee of Management for such purposes, and such permission may be granted subject to such fees, terms, and conditions as may be imposed by the Committee of Management.

18. No person, except workmen employed by the Committee of Management, shall enter any plots in the Reserve which may be enclosed for plantations of trees or shrubs or for any other purpose.

19. Certain portions of the Reserve may be set apart by the Committee of Management for the accommodation of vehicles and horses in the care and custody of those using the same, for which a fee, not exceeding One shilling per day, shall be paid on demand, provided that the owner or user for the time being shall tie up such horse in such a way as not to cause any damage to fences, trees, seats or other improvements, and the owner or user for the time being of any horse found wandering without restraint on any portions of the Reserve shall be guilty of an offence against these Regulations.

20. No person or persons shall park motor vehicles within the Reserve, excepting at such places as are set apart by the Committee of Management for that purpose, and shall, on demand, pay a fee not exceeding One shilling per motor vehicle per day.

21. No person shall commit a nuisance on any part of the Reserve or in or on any part of any building therein.

The Reserve has been placed under the control of a Committee of Management, with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any Regulations made under section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5), and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 21 (BOOKSELLERS AND NEWSAGENTS).

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, viz.:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the city of Sandringham as are not included in the said District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which now has power "to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons employed—

- (a) in booksellers' or newsagents' shops,
- (b) in the trade of a wholesale bookseller or newsagent,
- (c) in a lending library conducted for profit,"

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That as from the first pay period to commence on or after the 24th September, 1943, the previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

OVERTIME.

3. (a) Any employee who in any week works for any time in excess of 47 hours within the City area and 48 hours elsewhere shall be paid for such extra time at the rate of time and a half.

(b) Any employee who is required to work between 12.45 p.m. and 4 p.m. on any Saturday shall be paid for such work at the rate of double time.

TIME WAGES.

4. (a) (This clause shall not apply to an employee at a Railway Bookstall sub-let to a newsagent.) Any person employed on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall for each hour worked up to 23½ hours within the City area and 24 hours elsewhere be paid at the ordinary wage rate with an addition of 33½ per cent. and thereafter the ordinary wage rate up to but not exceeding ordinary wages rates for an ordinary week's work.

(b) An employee at a Railway Bookstall sub-let to a newsagent who works less than 48 hours in any week shall only be entitled to be paid *pro rata* according to the number of hours worked.

HOLIDAYS.

5. (Nothing in this clause shall apply to any employee who is required to work on any day mentioned therein in connexion with the sale or distribution of newspapers.) Employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Saturday, Easter Monday, Anzac Day, Labour Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day (Metropolitan District only), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, and after 12.30 p.m. on Show Day in localities mentioned in the Twelfth Schedule to the *Public Service Act 1928* within the area to which this Determination applies; but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of the above-named holidays, this condition shall only apply for the day so substituted.

Any employee who is required to work on any day mentioned in this clause shall receive double time for such work.

MEAL MONEY.

6. Any employee who is required to work overtime in excess of one hour on any day shall receive an allowance of 2s. as meal money in addition to the rates provided in clause 3.

ANNUAL HOLIDAYS.

7. All employees shall be entitled to the following annual holidays (exclusive of the holidays mentioned in clause 5) on full pay:—

(a) At the end of the first year's continuous service with an employer—one week.

(b) At the end of each succeeding year's continuous service with an employer—two weeks.

(c) Notwithstanding anything contained in sub-clauses (a) and (b) an employee who has been in the continuous employment of an employer for not less than nine months either from the date of his first commencing work with such employer or from the date when he resumed work after a holiday as hereinbefore provided and who is dismissed for any reason (other than misconduct) shall be entitled to a half day's holiday pay for each month of such employment.

SICK PAY.

8. (a) Any employee not attending for duty who has had not less than twelve months' service with the same employer shall not lose his pay for the actual time lost if such employee produces or forwards within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence evidence satisfactory to the employer that his non-attendance was due to personal ill-health or accident necessitating such absence, but such employee shall not be entitled to payment for non-attendance on the grounds of personal ill-health or accident for more than six days in each year.

(b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed above is not taken in any year such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding 18 days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee may be entitled in any year without deduction of pay.

MEAL INTERVALS.

9. Employees shall be entitled to meal intervals as follows:—

(a) Between the 7th December and the 24th December }	Between the hours of 11.45 a.m. and 2.45 p.m., and on a late
each year—three-quarters of an hour	trading night between the hours of 5 p.m. and 7 p.m.
(b) At any other period of the year—one hour	

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

10. Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee or one week's wages shall be paid or forfeited in lieu thereof. This provision shall only apply where an employee has been in continuous employment of an employer for two months or more.

DEFINITION.

11. "City area" shall mean the Central Area of the City of Melbourne enclosed by and including Flinders, Spencer, Latrobe, Victoria, and Spring streets.

PAY DAY.

12. Employees shall be paid weekly on a regular pay day other than a Friday or a Saturday.

REST PERIOD.

13. A rest interval of ten minutes shall be given to all employees during each morning and afternoon, and shall be counted as time worked.

TIME AND WAGES RECORD.

14. Employers shall keep a Time and Wages Record, showing the name, age, and sex of each employee, the number of hours worked each day and each week, and the wages and overtime payments (if any) to each such employee. Such record shall be open for inspection by a duly accredited representative of the Shop Assistants and Warehouse Employees Federation of Australia (Victorian-Tasmanian Branch).

REFERENCE.

15. On an employee being dismissed or leaving his or her employment he or she shall be entitled to and shall receive from the employer a reference stating length of service and qualifications. This reference must be given to the worker immediately on the termination of his or her employment.
