By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 4972. "An Act to provide for the Pasteurization of Milk."

PROCLAMATION RESCINDED AS TO PART.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of provisions contained in section 25 of the *Land Act 1928*, do hereby rescind the Proclamation dated the 20th day of September, 1892, and extended by Proclamation on the 18th day of June, 1900, whereby certain land in the Parish of Kunat Kunat was defined as the Township of Lake Boga, so far as regards the portion thereof hereinafter described, viz.:—

Township at Lake Boga, Parish of Kunat Kunat, County of Tatchera: Commencing at a point bearing N. 33 deg. 3 min. W. 300 links from the north-western angle of the Recreation Reserve; bounded thence by a line, the Recreation Reserve, and a line bearing S. 33 deg. 3 min. E. 1,425 6/10 links, by allotment 6, section 3A, Parish of Kunat Kunat, bearing S. 56 deg. 57 min. W. 1,104 2/10 links, by the said allotment 6, a line, allotment 6A, and a line bearing N. 33 deg. 3 min. W. 1,425 6/10 links, and thence by the Lake Boga Pre-emptive Right bearing N. 56 deg. 57 min. E. 1,104 2/10 links to the point of commencement.—(L.S.), K.178(*) (C.88515).

WHEREAS by sub-section (2) of section 10 of the *Grain Elevators Act 1934*, it is amongst other things enacted that when an elevator is constructed, operated, maintained, or controlled by the Grain Elevators Board in any place, the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* define an area as the area with respect to which the elevator has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat grown or being therein: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in exercise of the powers conferred by the said Act, doth by this Order hereby define each of the respective areas set forth in the subjoined Schedule as the area with respect to which the elevator specified in respect of such area has been constructed to provide facilities for handling wheat grown or being in such area, and doth hereby specify the eighth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three as the date from and after which any person, who without the consent of the Grain Elevators Board, delivers for transport or for storage within any area so defined any wheat grown in Victoria, except through the agency of the Grain Elevators Board, shall (unless exempted by the By-laws made under the said Act or otherwise by the said sub-section) be guilty of an offence.
