Land Surveyors Act 1942.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE LAND SURVEYORS ACT 1942.

WHEREAS by section 15 of the *Land Surveyors Act 1942*, power is given to the Surveyors Board, constituted under such Act, to make Regulations for certain stated purposes, with the approval of the Governor in Council: Now therefore the said Board doth hereby make the Regulations following, to take effect from the date of their publication in the *Government Gazette*, in lieu of the Regulations relating to the Examination and Licensing of Land Surveyors previously made and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 21st November, 1934, pages 2750-2752, the 7th August, 1935, pages 2089-2090, and the 20th October, 1937, page 3318, which are hereby revoked.

These Regulations may be cited as the *Land Surveyors Act 1942* Regulations, Part I.

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Interpretations.

In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, the following terms shall have the meaning set out against each respectively:—

“Act.”—The *Land Surveyors Act 1942*.

“Board.”—The Surveyors Board constituted under the Act.

“Examination.”—The examination conducted by the Board of a person for a Certificate of Competency.

“Indentures of Apprenticeship.”—Any writing containing a contract or agreement for tuition in surveying made between a licensed surveyor and a person seeking to qualify himself for registration as a Licensed Surveyor.

“Licensed Surveyor.”—Any person registered under this Act or any corresponding previous enactment and whose registration is for the time being in force.

“Office Experience.”—That period of service under Indentures of Apprenticeship spent on office work, such as computations and plans, appertaining to surveying.

“Pupil.”—A person who is serving under Indentures of Apprenticeship registered by the Board.

“Real Property Acts.”—The *Transfer of Land Act 1928* and the *Property Law Act 1928*.

“Reciprocating Board.”—The duly constituted Board in a reciprocating State.

“Reciprocating State.”—Any part of His Majesty's Dominions (including the United Kingdom) with the Surveyors' Board or other similar authority of which the Board has entered into reciprocal arrangements which are for the time being in force.

“Schedule.”—Schedule to these Regulations.

“Subject.”—Subject as set out in Regulation 23 hereof, and numbered accordingly.

“Secretary.”—The Secretary to the Board.

“University.”—

- (a) The University of Melbourne.
- (b) The University in a reciprocating State recognized by the reciprocating Board of that State; and
- (c) Any University elsewhere than in a reciprocating State, recognized by the Board for the purpose of the Regulations.

Indentures of Apprenticeship.

1. Every pupil shall serve professionally under Indentures of Apprenticeship for a period of four years, of which not less than three years shall be spent in professional service in the field and the balance of the period shall be in office experience.

Such respective periods may be reduced in accordance with Regulations 10 and 11, provided that the pupil serves at least two years or (if so entitled under Regulation 10 (1) (e)) one year and six months on title surveys (land boundary definition).

2. Before entering into Indentures of Apprenticeship the candidate shall have passed—

- (a) the matriculation examination at a University, or
- (b) an examination accepted by a University as being equivalent to such matriculation examination, or
- (c) the Leaving Certificate examination at the University of Melbourne or the corresponding examination in any reciprocating State, or
- (d) in five subjects, approved by the Board, at such Leaving Certificate examination or corresponding examination.

Provided that in all these cases, the candidate shall have passed in English, Algebra, Geometry and Trigonometry at a standard not below that of the Leaving Certificate examination of the University of Melbourne.

3. The Indentures of Apprenticeship shall be drawn in the form prescribed in Schedule VI., subject to such alterations or omissions as may be approved by the Board, and shall have neither force nor effect for the purposes of the Act unless registered by the Board.

4. (1) The Indentures of Apprenticeship duly completed shall within three months after the date of commencement of the apprenticeship specified therein, be forwarded to the Secretary by the Licensed Surveyor who is a party thereto, together with the following requirements:—

- (a) evidence that the candidate for apprenticeship has obtained the educational qualifications prescribed in Regulation 2 hereof,
- (b) evidence of date of birth of the candidate, and
- (c) the fee for registration of Indentures of Apprenticeship as prescribed in Schedule V.

(2) Application for Assignment of Indentures of Apprenticeship in the form prescribed in Schedule VII., subject to such alteration as may be approved by the Board, shall be made to the Board by the Licensed Surveyor to whom such indentures are to be assigned, and shall be lodged with the Secretary within three months from the date of assignment, together with the following requirements:—

- (a) certificate by the assignor as to the service of the pupil and the nature of the work engaged upon, and
- (b) the fee for registration as prescribed in Schedule V.

5. The Board shall, as soon as possible after receipt of any Indentures of Apprenticeship or Assignment of Indentures of Apprenticeship proceed to consider the same, and may accept or reject or defer consideration of them—

- (a) If the Board decides to accept the Indentures of Apprenticeship or the Assignment of such Indentures, as the case may be, it shall direct the Secretary to register the same in accordance with Regulation 30 hereof and endorse them and all copies of them submitted to it, to the effect that they have been registered.
- (b) If the Board decides to reject, or defer consideration of, the Indentures of Apprenticeship or Assignment of such Indentures, it shall inform the Licensed Surveyor concerned of its reasons for so doing.

6. The Board shall refuse to register Indentures of Apprenticeship—
- (a) if such indentures do not, in its opinion, sufficiently provide for the theoretical instruction and/or practical training of the candidate in the profession of surveying, or
 - (b) if the provisions of Regulations 2, 3, and 4 are not complied with, or
 - (c) if the Licensed Surveyor who is a party thereto has another pupil who has had less than two and a half years' service under Indentures of Apprenticeship—provided that in any special case the Board may register an additional pupil for a period not exceeding six months, or
 - (d) for any other reason or reasons to be stated in writing by the Board.

7. In any special case arising, in the opinion of the Board, from inadvertence or accident, the Board may register Indentures of Apprenticeship or an Assignment of such Indentures received after the period prescribed by Regulation 4.

8. The Board may annul the registration of any Indentures of Apprenticeship, if such registration has been obtained consequent upon any misrepresentation of fact.

9. (1) During the currency of his Indentures of Apprenticeship the Board may require any pupil to produce such evidence as it deems necessary that he is receiving instruction and gaining experience, of a nature satisfactory to the Board, in the profession of surveying.

If the Board, after making full inquiry, is of the opinion that the pupil is not receiving instruction and/or experience of a satisfactory nature, it shall take such action as it considers appropriate

(2) Service under Indentures of Apprenticeship outside Victoria by any pupil registered with the Board may be accepted, provided that the Board is satisfied with the experience gained by him and that he produces satisfactory certificate or certificates of service.

Exemptions from Service under Indentures of Apprenticeship.

10. (1) If a pupil produces documentary evidence satisfactory to the Board that he possesses the qualifications or experience detailed hereunder, he shall be granted exemption to the appropriate extent herein set out.

<i>Qualification.</i>	<i>Exemption.</i>
(a) An experience of not less than twelve months in the field under the supervision of a Civil Engineer approved by the Board.	Six months' professional service in the field.
(b) A certificate or diploma in surveying granted after an examination of a standard approved by the Board, or by the reciprocating Board in the State where such examination is held, at which a person appointed or approved by the Board or by such reciprocating Board is a co-examiner.	Nine months' office experience.
(c) A certificate granted by a University upon passing an examination consequent upon completing a special course of surveying within the University.	Nine months' office experience.
(d) A degree or diploma granted by a University upon passing an examination consequent upon completion of a course which, in the opinion of the Board, provides sufficient training and instruction in the principles and practice of surveying.	Twelve months' office experience and twelve months' professional service in the field.
(e) A degree or diploma granted in accordance with paragraph (d) hereof when a representative of the Board, or of a reciprocating Board acts as co-examiner in those subjects relating to surveying.	Twelve months' office experience and eighteen months' professional service in the field.

(2) No candidate shall be granted an exemption under paragraph 1 (d) or paragraph (1) (e) of this regulation unless he serves two years or one year and six months (as the case may be) under Indentures

of Apprenticeship with a licensed surveyor or engaged primarily on title surveys (land boundary definition) and no candidate shall be granted an exemption under more than one of the paragraphs 1 (a), (b), (c), (d), or (e) of this Regulation.

Concessions to Pupils Serving in the Defence Forces.

11. Any pupil who produces evidence satisfactory to the Board that he has enlisted or has been called up for Defence Service shall be granted concessions as follows:—

- (a) credit towards the period of his Indentures of Apprenticeship—
 - (i) of his full period of service abroad up to a maximum of two years,
 - (ii) of his period of service at home on survey work approved by the Board,
 - (iii) of half his period of service at home on other work
Provided that the credit under (ii) and (iii) shall not together exceed two years.
- (b) an additional period for the completion of the examination equal to his period of service, whether at home or abroad,
- (c) permission if he has completed two years under Indentures of Apprenticeship prior to service abroad, to present himself at any examination for any subject other than subjects numbered 11 to 14 inclusive.

Conduct of Examinations.

12. The Board shall conduct examinations of candidates for Certificates of Competency as Surveyors in the months of March and September in every year and at such other times as the Board deems necessary and shall appoint a supervisor for each examination.

13. Notice of the date of commencement of the examination and closing date for entry by candidates shall be published by the Board in the *Government Gazette* at least one month before such date of commencement.

14. (1) Pupils who have completed one or more of the terms of service specified in Regulation 24 (a) and desire to sit for corresponding subjects in the examination, shall forward a written application to reach the Secretary on or before the closing date for entry, together with the following:—

- (a) a certificate of service in the form and to the effect of Schedule I. from the Licensed Surveyor with whom he served under Indentures of Apprenticeship or under whose supervision he gained the additional experience required in accordance with Regulation 15.
- (b) a statement by the surveyor, whose pupil he is, detailing the classes of professional work in which he was engaged during the period of his Indentures of Apprenticeship.
- (c) the examination fee prescribed in Schedule V.

(2) Candidates whose applications include subjects 11, 12, 13, and 14 shall, in addition—

- (a) submit to the Board satisfactory field notes and plans drawn therefrom of—
 - (i) the survey of a country area of not less than 80 acres, together with relevant essential calculations, two of the boundaries of which shall coincide with and shall be reinstated from previous surveys, and one of the boundaries shall be a water-course or other natural feature or an irregular road,
 - (ii) the survey of a town lot with buildings on or near the boundaries, together with the technical description thereof as made for the purpose of an application under the provisions of the Real Property Acts, and
 - (iii) of a proposed road, railway, or drainage work not less than 20 chains in length, with the requisite longitudinal and cross sections thereof.

Each plan shall bear the following certificate signed by the candidate:—

"I hereby certify that this survey was made by me personally under the supervision of Mr. Licensed Surveyor.....between the.....day of.....19.....and the.....day of.....19....., and that this plan and the accompanying field notes are entirely my own work.

(Signed)....."

and shall be countersigned by the Surveyor; and

- (b) give to the Board such additional information as it may require in regard to his professional service, fields notes, and plans; and
- (c) produce evidence that during his professional service in the field in accordance with Regulation 1 he had at least six months' practice in surveying in rural areas and at least six months' practice in urban areas; and
- (d) produce evidence that he has obtained such further training and experience required by the Board in accordance with Regulation 15 hereof.

(3) No candidate shall be allowed to sit for any of the subjects 11, 12, 13, and 14 until he has received credit for a pass in all subjects 1 to 10 inclusive.

15. Where the Board is of opinion that a candidate has not received sufficient training or gained sufficient experience in the profession of surveying during the period of his Indentures of Apprenticeship the Board may require the candidate to obtain such further training and experience as it deems necessary.

Unless the Board otherwise directs, such additional service need not be under Indentures of Apprenticeship.

16. A candidate may sit for examination in a reciprocating State or Dominion other than that in which he is registered and in which he has served under Indentures of Apprenticeship, provided that the respective Boards in the States or Dominions concerned are satisfied as to the character and length of service under such indentures, and that he submits himself to all written papers and to the usual practical test and *viva voce* as to the practice of the State in which he desires to sit.

17. The Board may for sufficient cause permit any candidate to withdraw his application to sit for examination and may refund the whole or part of any fee paid by him.

18. If the Board declines to permit any candidate to present himself for examination, it shall refund any fees paid by such candidate when entering for the examination.

19. For the purposes of the examination the Secretary shall allot to each candidate a distinguishing number, and the candidate shall put this number on each page of all workings, plans, and papers submitted by him but shall not otherwise reveal his identity on such workings, plans, and papers.

20. Each candidate, when presenting himself for the examination, shall provide for his own use therat, the following:—

- A Nautical Almanac for the current year (when required).
- A book of mathematical tables, approved by the Board.
- A set of standard scales.
- A parallel ruler.
- A planimeter.
- A protractor and other appliances necessary for plan drawing.

The Board will provide all paper free of cost. The use of traverse tables will be allowed, but not calculating machines, other than slide rules.

21. The Supervisor, during the currency of the examination, may require the candidate to produce for inspection any book of tables or papers used by him and, for sufficient cause, may prohibit the candidate from using certain of them at the examination.

22. If the Supervisor considers the conduct of any candidate during the progress of the examination to be inconsistent with generally accepted ethical standards, he shall suspend the candidate and refuse

to permit him to continue with the examination, and such Supervisor shall report the matter to the Board, which shall take such action as it deems appropriate.

SUBJECTS OF EXAMINATION.

23. The subjects of examination shall be—

Written Section.

(1) *Physics, Geology, and Forestry.*

Physics.—The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book, with a more detailed knowledge of the laws underlying the construction and use of surveying instruments, e.g., the pressure of liquids and gases as affecting the barometer, thermometer, and level; the allowance to be made for the effects of heat in the practical work of the surveyor; the reflection and refraction of light, lenses, mirrors; terrestrial magnetism and variation of the compass.

Geology.—The subject generally as contained in any good elementary text-book with special reference to the classification of areas of land according to their formation, rocks, soils, and their adaptability for industrial purposes. Specimens of rock may be submitted for classification and description.

Forestry.—The distribution of native timbers; their economic values; the influence of forestry on climate, water supplies and soil erosion; the principles of afforestation; the measurement of logs and sawn timbers; destructive agents and pests.

(2) *Plotting and Plan Drawing.*

The plotting and drawing of plans from field notes and official data of surveys for title; the plotting of sections and contours; the determination of areas by mechanical means; the technical description of boundaries; the enlargement and reduction of plans; lettering on maps and plans and use of conventional signs.

(3) *Computations A.*

Problems regarding standardization of steel tape, determination of working tension, sag and temperature corrections; reduction of traverses and co-ordinates; calculation of areas by double longitude and offset areas; calculation in connexion with areas and dimensions of figures having rectilinear or curved boundaries; calculations in connexion with setting out of circular and parabolic curves; mensuration of surfaces and solids. All classes of road secants.

(4) *Computations B.*

Computations connected with triangulation surveys; three point and similar problems; calculation of heights and distances; calculations in connexion with mine surveying; adjustment of discrepancies in surveys; problems in connexion with setting out of areas; elementary problems in aerial surveying; simple adjustment of figures.

(5) *Engineering Surveying.*

Method of determination of mean tidal levels on the coast; barometric measurement of heights; levelling, contouring, stadia surveying, tacheometry and preparation of relevant plans and sections; location, grading, and setting out of roads, railways, irrigation works, drainage and water supply channels; setting out of banks, cuttings, and other earth works; setting out of vertical curves (parabolic and circular) at change of grades; gauging of streams, rivers, and other waterways and the use of current meters for determining velocity of current and discharge of rivers; elementary theory of hydraulics; hydraulic terms and constants; the use of pipe channel and mean flow velocity formulae; calculation of run off and flood discharge; determination of waterways for bridges and culverts; simple problems relating to irrigation, reclamation, and drainage of land; harbor and river surveys; hydrographic surveying.

(6) *Town Planning.*

The elementary principles of regional planning and of town planning; zoning; communications and transport; the design and allocation of open spaces and recreational areas; by-laws; public services; amenities; preparation of civic survey and scheme plans inclusive of details of town design.

(7) *Laws and Regulations Affecting Surveys.*

The Acts and Regulations relating to—

- (a) Surveys of land for purposes of title; the subdivision of land; opening and closing of roads and rights-of-way; the taking of land for special purposes.
- (b) Surveys of mines, both surface and underground.
- (c) Identification surveys.

(8) *Astronomy and Geodesy.*

Solution of spherical triangles; azimuth, altitude, hour angle, right ascension, declination and the relations between them, use of Nautical Almanac; time; corrections to star or sun observations; effect of errors of adjustment of instruments; determination of latitude, longitude, azimuth, and time; the figure of the earth reduction of length to sea level, correction for curvature and refraction, trigonometrical height to stations; spherical excess; computation of geodetic positions, formulae for difference of latitude, longitude, reverse azimuth, and convergence of meridians; laying down parallels of latitude; elementary theory of projection of maps and charts. (Special formulae in geodesy and mapping will be given.)

(9) *Land Surveying Design.*

Generally the application of planning principles to the design of areas for rural and urban subdivisions, including provision for access, drainage, amenities, and other reservations for public purposes.

(10) *Preparation of Field Notes.*

The taking and recording of observations and notes in the field for the purpose of preparing plans for title surveys, underground engineering, topographical, trigonometrical, and standard traverse surveys.

(10A) *Principles of Land Valuation and Land Classification (optional).*

A general knowledge of the following will be required:—

Classification of soils according to productivity and stock carrying capacity.

Cost of development of the various types of country and methods of valuing all improvements.

Valuation of buildings, roads, drains, clearing, and earth-works.

Influence of existing laws on values of land and methods of estimating compensation for land resumed by the Commonwealth or State Governments.

Oral and Practical Section.(11) *Field Practice.*

The practice of surveying, with a knowledge of the Acts and Regulations bearing thereon, together with a practical test involving measurement of a line or lines, reading of horizontal and vertical angles, re-establishment of a corner, and such further practical work as the Board may require.

(12) *Adjustment and Use of Instruments.*

The principles of construction and practical tests in the adjustment and use of all instruments required in modern field practice and office work.

(13) *Practical Field Astronomy.*

Field astronomy; practical determination of not less than two of the following:—azimuth, time, and latitude.

(14) *Practical Levelling.*

Practical levelling of a section at least 20 chains in length.

ORDER OF TAKING SUBJECTS.

24. (a) Subject to compliance with the provisions of Regulation 14, any pupil who has completed to the satisfaction of the Board not less than the term of his indentures of Apprenticeship specified below, or

an equivalent term as provided in this Regulation, may be permitted to sit for one or more of the subjects as herein set out:—

<i>Term of Service.</i>	<i>Subjects.</i>
One year	1 to 3.
Two years	1 to 6.
Three Years	1 to 10.
Four years	1 to 14.

Provided that this may be varied in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 11 (c) hereof.

(b) The eligibility of pupils who have received exemptions from service under Indentures of Apprenticeship in accordance with Regulation 10 to sit for subjects shall be determined by adding the period of exemption to the period served under such Indentures.

EXAMINATION CREDITS.

25. (1) In order to pass in any subject a candidate shall obtain not less than 60 per centum of the marks in that subject.

(2) A candidate shall obtain a pass in each of the three parts of Subject 1 (Physics, Geology, and Forestry) provided that a candidate who submits in respect of one or more of the separate parts of such subject a certificate or diploma, satisfactory to the Board, from a University or from a technical school recognized by the Board, or a leaving certificate which includes one or more of the separate parts in such subject, shall be credited with a pass in that part or those parts, and shall be exempt from further examination therein.

(3) Any candidate who submits a degree or diploma granted by a University after an examination upon completion of a course which, in the opinion of the Board, has provided sufficient training in the principles and practice of surveying, and in connexion with which a representative of the Board or of a reciprocating Board was a co-examiner in the subjects relating to surveying, shall, without further examination therein, receive credit for a pass in such of the following subjects in which he passed the examination for the purpose of obtaining the aforesaid degree or diploma:—

1. Physics, Geology, and Forestry.
2. Plotting and Plan Drawing.
3. Computations A.
4. Computations B.
5. Engineering Surveying.
6. Town Planning.
8. Astronomy and Geodesy.

(4) Any candidate who passes in any subject shall be credited with a pass in that subject until five years after the completion of his Indentures of Apprenticeship, or, if he has passed in no subject during the period of such Indentures, until five years after the first examination for which he sat after the completion of his Indentures.

Unless he has passed in all subjects before the completion of the five years so specified, he shall lose all credits. He may enter for examination again, but shall be required to pass in all subjects within five years after the first date on which he again sits.

Provided that the said period of five years may be extended in accordance with Regulation 11 (b).

CERTIFICATE OF COMPETENCY.

26. Each candidate who has been credited with a pass in all the subjects numbered 1 to 14 inclusive shall be issued with a Certificate of Competency as a Surveyor in the form or to the effect of Schedule II.

The Certificate of Competency shall be signed by the members of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary.

LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION.

27. Upon application in writing, and either without further examination, or after such oral examination as the Board may deem necessary, the Board may grant a letter of recommendation in the form or to the effect of Schedule IV., to any person to whom a Certificate of Competency has been issued or to any person licensed as a Surveyor who desires to become licensed as a Surveyor in a reciprocating State.

An application for a letter of recommendation shall be accompanied by the fee therefor prescribed in Schedule V.

LICENCE.

28. Upon production of evidence that he is at least 21 years of age and is a natural-born or naturalized subject of His Majesty, and of two recent testimonials of good character from approved persons and after payment of the fee therefor prescribed in Schedule V., the Board shall grant a licence to any person who holds a Certificate of Competency issued by the Board.

The licence shall be in the form or to the effect of Schedule III. and shall be signed by the Chairman and two other members of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary.

No licence granted under this Act shall be of any force or effect until the person to whom such licence is granted is registered in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

LICENCE UPON QUALIFICATIONS OBTAINED IN A RECIPROCATING STATE.

29. A person who applies to the Board for a licence on qualifications obtained in a reciprocating State shall submit—

- (a) evidence that he holds a Certificate of Competency or a Licence issued by a reciprocating Board;
- (b) evidence as to identity and good character;
- (c) evidence that he is at least 21 years of age and is a natural-born or naturalized subject of His Majesty; and
- (d) a letter of recommendation, dated not more than twelve months previously, from the reciprocating Board which granted his Certificate of Competency or Licence or with which he was last registered, provided, however, that if for any reason the applicant is unable to produce a letter of recommendation, he shall, before being licensed, pass such examination under these Regulations as the Board may require.

Subject to compliance with the foregoing provisions, and after payment of the fee therefor prescribed in Schedule V., the Board shall grant him a licence.

REGISTER.

30. The Secretary shall keep a register or registers setting out—

- (a) the names and addresses of all pupils together with the names of the licensed surveyors with whom they are under Indentures of Apprenticeship, and a complete record of all assignments of such Indentures;
- (b) the names, addresses, and qualifications of all persons to whom Certificates of Competency have been issued, together with the dates of issue;
- (c) the names and addresses of all persons licensed by the Board as Surveyors, together with the dates of issue of their licences;
- (d) all letters of recommendation, with dates of issue;
- (e) the making of any order by the Board after inquiry into a charge laid against a Licensed Surveyor; and
- (f) any appeal made against a decision of the Board and the finding of the Court thereon.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

31. Meetings of the Board shall be held on such dates and at such places as may be determined by the Chairman, or upon the request of three members addressed in writing to the Secretary.

Notice of meeting shall be given in writing to each Board member at least seven days before the date set for the meeting.

32. All moneys due to and received by the Board shall be deposited by the Secretary in a bank or banks approved by the Board to the credit of an account entitled "Surveyors' Board Account" to be operated upon by cheques signed by any two members of the Board and countersigned by the Secretary. Such moneys shall be applied by the Board in accordance with the provisions of the Act.

33. The Secretary shall conduct the correspondence of the Board and keep all necessary books of accounts, and record all proceedings of the Board with the names of the members who attend each meeting. Such record shall at the same or the next or some subsequent meeting of the Board be confirmed and be signed by the Chairman of such meeting.

34. No resolution or other act of the Board at any meeting shall be revoked or altered at any subsequent meeting unless notice to move its revocation or amendment has been given to the Secretary, in writing, a copy of such notice has been forwarded to all members, and such revocation or alternation is determined upon by a majority consisting of at least two-thirds of the members present at such subsequent meeting.

35. At all meetings of the Board—
 All members present shall vote.
 All questions shall be decided by open voting and by the majority of the members present.
 If there be an equal division of votes upon any question the Chairman presiding at the meeting shall have a second or casting vote in addition to his vote as a member.

The apprentice of his own free will (with the consent of the parent or guardian testified by him being a party hereto) binds himself apprentice to the surveyor to be taught and instructed in the profession of a land surveyor for the term of _____ years _____ months which term shall be deemed to have commenced on the _____ day of _____ One thousand nine hundred and _____

2. The apprentice covenants with the surveyor as follows:—
- (a) That he will during the said term of _____ years months well and truly serve the surveyor as apprentice in the profession of a land surveyor carried on by him at aforesaid or at such other place or places where the surveyor may from time to time carry on the same.
 - (b) That he will not at any time during the said term obliterate destroy waste embezzle spend or make away with any books papers plans drawings documents moneys stamps or other property of the surveyor or of his partner or partners or any of his or their clients or employers.
 - (c) That he will at all times during the said term keep the secrets of the surveyor and of his partner or partners and clients.
 - (d) That he will readily and cheerfully obey and execute the lawful and reasonable demands of the surveyor and will not depart or absent himself from the service or employ of the surveyor during the said term without the consent of the surveyor first had and obtained except in the case of sickness.
 - (e) That he will in all respects during the said term acquit and demean himself as an honest and faithful apprentice ought to do.
 - (f) That he will do no damage or injury to the surveyor or knowingly suffer the same to be done without acquainting the surveyor thereof.
3. In consideration of the premises and in further consideration of the premium of £ _____ paid by the parent or guardian to the surveyor (the receipt whereof the surveyor hereby acknowledges) the surveyor covenants with the apprentice and the parent or guardian and with each of them severally as follows:—
- (a) That he will during the said term according to the best of his power skill and knowledge instruct the apprentice or cause him to be instructed in the profession of a land surveyor and in all things incidental thereto in such manner as he now practises or at any time hereafter during the said term shall practise the same.
 - (b) That he will permit the apprentice during the said term to attend such lectures or examinations as may be requisite or proper for his better instruction in the profession of a land surveyor and to enable him to obtain a certificate entitling him to practise as a licensed surveyor.
 - (c) That he will by weekly or fortnightly payments pay to the apprentice during the said term the following rates of pay:—

for the first year of the said term	per week;
for the second year of the said term	per week;
for the third year of the said term	per week;
for the fourth year of the said term	per week.
 - (d) That if at any time during the currency of the said term the apprentice should die or if the surveyor should cease to practise as a surveyor or die the surveyor his executors or administrators will repay to the parent or guardian the sum of £ _____ for every complete year of the said term which then remains unexpired together with a proportionate part of such yearly sum for any period so unexpired which is not less than six months.
4. The parent or guardian covenants with the surveyor as follows:—
- (a) That he will use his best endeavours to ensure that the apprentice will honestly and faithfully serve his apprenticeship with the surveyor in the manner aforesaid.

Regulation of Traffic, &c.

- (i) The prohibition of the discharge of dust or water on footways during certain hours.
- (j) The prohibition of the distribution of handbills, &c., on streets, footways, or other public places.
- (k) The regulations of the use of loud speakers.
- (l) The regulation of the use of streets or footways for the sale of goods.
- (m) The prohibition of trees, hedges, vines, shrubs, creepers, or other plants from overhanging streets or footways, and requiring owners or occupiers of lands to keep streets and footways clear of all seedlings, suckers, and other offsets from such trees, &c.
