WODONGA WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1943.

THE Wodonga Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and nine pence in the £1 (pound) of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Wodonga Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of the rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Fifty-two shillings and six pence, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Twenty-seven shillings and six pence.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1943, and shall be payable on the 10th day of February, 1943, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

BOROUGH OF DAYLESFORD WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1943.

THE Borough of Daylesford Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the following rates for the supply of water for domestic purposes to the lands and tenements liable to be rated within the waterworks district of the Trust:—

1. On such lands and tenements—a rate of One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual municipal valuation not exceeding £200, and Eleven pence in the pound of the amount of the valuation exceeding £200:

Provided that the minimum amount payable shall be Twenty-one shillings on land on which there is a building, and Ten shillings on land on which there is no building.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupier or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1943, and shall be payable on the 16th day of February, 1943, at the office of the said Trust.

3. (a) The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons.

(c) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 7,000 gallons.

(d) For water supplied to buildings in course of erection the charge shall be Twenty shillings per cent. on the amount of the contract for brick work, stone, or plastering; or, should the Trust require a meter to be put on, the rate shall be One shilling and six pence per 1,000 gallons, none being allowed without charge.

(e) The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

4. Such person or persons as the Trust may appoint for the purpose are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the said rates and charges.
