W. 350 links, S. 16 deg. 50 min. W. 700 links, and S. 41 deg. 30 min. 4. If any owner or occupier on whom any such notice is served under this By-law makes default in complying therewith, it shall be lawful for the Council at the expiration of the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, to enter upon the land on which

of the time therein limited, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, to enter upon the land on which such undergrowth, weeds or grass may be, and to remove the same, and all expenses incurred by the Council in so doing may be recovered from the owner or occupier so defaulting in any court of competent jurisdiction.

5. Every person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £20 for each and every offence, and in the event of any offence being continued after conviction, to a further penalty of not more than £2 for each day such offence is continued after conviction, or order imposed or made upon or against any such person by any court.
