Dietitians Registration Act 1942.

DIETITIANS REGISTRATION BOARD.

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Dietitians Registration Act 1942*, the Dietitians Registration Board of Victoria doth make regulations as set forth hereunder, that is to say:—

General.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Dietitians Regulations 1944 and shall take effect from the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

“Act” means the *Dietitians Registration Act 1942*;

“Board” means the Dietitians Registration Board of Victoria;

“Dietitian” means a person registered under the Act whose registration is for the time being in force;

“Member” means member of the Board;

“Register” means the Register of Dietitians;

“Registrar” means the Registrar of the Board.

Words importing the masculine gender shall be deemed and taken to include females, and the singular shall be deemed to include the plural and the plural the singular.

Proceedings of Board.

3. The Board shall meet for the transaction of business at such times and places as the Board decides.

4. A quorum of the Board shall consist of not less than three members.

5. At any meeting of the Board at which the chairman is absent some other member shall be elected by the members present to act as chairman and to preside at such meeting during the absence of the chairman.

6. Every question before the Board shall be decided by a majority of the members present and voting, and the chairman, or in his absence the member elected to act as chairman at the meeting, in the case of an equality of votes shall have a second or casting vote.

Registration of Dietitians.

7. Every person claiming to be entitled to be registered shall make application in the form contained in the First Schedule hereto:

8. No person shall be registered unless he—

(1) is at least 21 years of age;

(2) has paid the prescribed fees of £3 3s. for registration and 10s. 6d. for a certificate of registration;

(3) has lodged with the Registrar two certificates of good character satisfactory to the Board;

(4) has lodged with the Registrar a recent photograph containing a likeness of the applicant satisfactory to the Registrar.

9. The Board may, if it thinks fit, require an applicant for registration to lodge with the Registrar a certificate of his birth.

10. Every applicant for registration shall—

(a) produce evidence satisfactory to the Board that he is entitled to registration under the Act;

(b) furnish the Board with such information as it may require.

11. Every certificate of registration shall be in the form contained in the Second Schedule and shall be signed by the chairman and the Registrar.

The Register.

12. The Register shall be kept in the following form and shall contain the particulars hereunder set forth:—

(a) Number of certificate of registration;

(b) Date of registration;

(c) Name in full;

(d) Address;

(e) Description and dates of qualifications;

(f) Further particulars.

Salaries and Remuneration.

13. The remuneration to be paid to the Registrar by way of salary shall be not less than £50, nor more than £100, in any one year; together with a further amount for clerical assistance not exceeding £25 in any one year.

Elections.

14. Returning Officer.—The Board shall from time to time appoint some fit and proper person who, not being a member of the Board and not being a candidate for election as a member of the Board, is registered as a dietitian in the State of Victoria to be the Returning Officer to conduct elections of members of the Board in accordance with the provisions hereinafter made in that behalf, and such person may be removed by the Board. The Board shall pay to the Returning Officer for his own use out of the moneys accrued or accruing under the Act a fee of £2 2s. for each and every election conducted by such Returning Officer, together with the sum of money sufficient to recoup him all expenses incurred for the purpose of holding and conducting such election.

15. Periodical Vacancies.—In the month of September in every year in which vacancies on the Board are filled by election by the dietitians of Victoria, the Returning Officer shall proceed with the election of three dietitians as members of the Board. At least one of such dietitians shall be a full member of the Dietetic Association, Victoria, elected at a separate election held concurrently with the election to fill other periodical vacancies. The ascertainment of the result of the election of a full member of the Dietetic Association, Victoria, shall precede the ascertainment of the result of the election to fill other vacancies.

16. Extraordinary Vacancies.—When any member who has been elected by the Dietitians of Victoria is absent without permission from the Board for four consecutive meetings of the Board, or becomes bankrupt or insolvent or compounds with his creditors, or is convicted of any indictable offence or becomes insane or is removed or resigns or dies his seat shall thereupon become vacant and the Returning Officer shall proceed to the election of a proper person eligible under the Act to fill such vacancy and the person so elected shall hold office only for the remainder of the term of office of the person in whose place he is so elected. Provided that any such vacancy occurring within two months prior to the first day of September in any year in which a periodical election will be held may, at the option of the Board, be filled at such periodical election.

17. Returning Officer to Give Notice of Day of Election and Day of Nomination—Time and Place When and Where Nominations will be Received.—At every election of a member or members to serve on the Board the Returning Officer shall give twenty-one days' notice, by advertisement in such paper or papers as may be approved by the Board, of his intention to proceed on a certain day, to be named in such advertisement, to hold an election of a fit and proper person or fit and proper persons (as the case may be) to serve as a member or members of such Board; and shall also in such advertisement name a day being not less than fifteen days nor more than eighteen days prior to the day named for holding such election, on or before which all candidates for election must be nominated as hereinafter provided; and he shall also, in such advertisement, name the time and place when and where such nominations will be received, and shall sign such notice and thereto affix the date it is given.

18. Who May Nominate, and How.—Any person registered as a dietitian in the State of Victoria desirous of nominating as a candidate for any election any other person so registered, shall fill up a nomination paper in the appropriate form of the Third Schedule hereto, stating therein the Christian name and surname of such candidate, together with the other particulars required by such schedule, and such nomination paper shall be signed by not less than five persons duly qualified to vote at such election and the person therein named as a candidate shall signify his acceptance of such nomination by notification, in writing, to the Returning Officer. Such acceptance may be inserted at the foot of the nomination paper.

19. If after the close of nominations and before the day of election the number of duly nominated candidates be reduced by death to the number or less than the number to be elected, the Returning Officer shall declare the remaining candidates duly elected. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate before the voting papers are printed, he shall omit the name of such candidate from the voting papers, or if any of such papers have been printed but

not issued, he shall erase or cross out therefrom the name of the deceased candidate. If the Returning Officer is satisfied of the death of a duly nominated candidate after the voting papers are issued and before the day of election, the name of the deceased candidate and the figure placed opposite such name as hereinafter provided, shall be regarded as having been deleted from all voting papers, and every such voting paper shall be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were, when necessary, altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voter's order of preference in respect of such remaining candidates.

20. When Returning Officer may declare Members Elected without a Poll—When a Poll shall be taken—Preparation of a Roll, &c.—Subject to the provisions of these Regulations the Returning Officer shall, in the event of there not being a greater number of qualified persons nominated than is required to fill the vacancies created, make a return to the Board, and declare such person or persons to have been duly elected as a member or members of the Board; but if the number of such persons nominated is greater than the number of persons required to fill such vacancies, a poll shall be taken. For this purpose the Registrar shall prepare a Roll of Dietitians in alphabetical order of surnames, and shall prefix to each name on the roll a number, beginning at the first name with the number one and continuing the numbers consecutively to the last name on the roll, and the Returning Officer shall at least ten days before the date named for holding the election, forward to each dietitian entitled to vote at the address stated in the roll, a voting paper in the form indicated by the Fourth Schedule hereto, enclosed in a small envelope endorsed—"Voting Paper"—to be placed in this envelope and then enclosed in the envelope endorsed 'voting paper' on the inside of the flap of which latter envelope is to be placed the signature of the voter" together with a large envelope (hereinafter referred to as the "addressed envelope") endorsed "Voting Paper" and addressed to the Returning Officer, and such dietitian shall mark his vote according to the direction on the voting paper, shall write his signature inside on the flap of the addressed envelope, shall enclose the small envelope (containing the voting paper) in the addressed envelope, and shall post or deliver the same so that it shall be received by the Returning Officer not later than 10 o'clock of the morning of the day fixed for holding such election.

21. (a) Voting Papers Invalid if Envelope Unsigned.—If any voter shall fail to write his signature on the addressed envelope as prescribed in clause 20 hereof or to comply with the directions on the voting paper the vote given by such voter shall be void and of no effect, and shall not be counted by the Returning Officer.

(b) Appointment of Scrutineers.—Each candidate shall be entitled to appoint, in writing, one scrutineer to be present when the Returning Officer opens the envelopes containing the voting papers on the day of the election.

22. The Returning Officer shall in the presence of the Registrar or, in his absence, in the presence of any person appointed on that behalf by the Board, and of any scrutineers appointed by any candidates, on the day named in such advertisement for holding any election, open the addressed envelopes which have been returned to him, and in the case of all such envelopes as contain the signature of the voter on the flap thereof, take out the small envelopes (enclosing the voting papers) therein contained and shall insert such small envelopes in a separate ballot-box; and when all such envelopes have been so inserted he shall open the same, extract the voting paper contained therein and shall count the votes given for each candidate in accordance with the provisions of these Regulations.

23. (1) Where it is required to elect one candidate only —

(a) if there are only two candidates, the candidate who has received the greater number of first preference votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary) shall by the Returning Officer be declared duly elected;

(b) if there are more than two candidates, the following provisions shall apply:—

(i) The candidate who has received the greatest number of first preference votes, if such number constitutes an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary), shall by the Returning Officer be declared duly elected;

- (ii) If no candidate has an absolute majority of votes, the Returning Officer shall exclude the candidate who has obtained the fewest first preference votes, and each voting paper counted to him shall (unless exhausted) be counted to the candidate next in order of the voter's preference, and the process of excluding the candidate who has the fewest votes and distributing his voting papers (unless exhausted) amongst the remaining candidates shall be continued until one candidate obtains an absolute majority of votes (including the casting vote of the Returning Officer if necessary), and such candidate shall by the Returning Officer be declared duly elected;
- (c) In any count of votes the Returning Officer shall decide which of two or more candidates having an equal number of votes is to be excluded, or shall give a casting vote in any final count where two candidates have an equal number of votes;
- (d) An absolute majority of votes means a number greater than one-half of the whole number of ballot-papers, other than exhausted and informal ballot-papers;
- (e) Every ballot-paper not rejected as informal shall be counted in every count until it becomes exhausted, when it shall be rejected in all further counts. When a candidate is excluded, any ballot-paper counted to him shall be deemed exhausted if there is not indicated thereon a consecutive preference for an unexcluded candidate.
- (2) Method of counting votes where more than one member has to be elected:—
- (i) (a) The ballot-papers recording votes for any candidate, being a full member of the Dietetic Association, Victoria, who has already been elected to the Board, shall be distributed to the remaining candidates according to second choice;
- (b) the votes indicated on such ballot-papers so distributed shall be deemed to be first choices, and such ballot-papers shall be given effect to as if the numbers opposite the names of the remaining candidates were altered to the appropriate numbers indicated by the voter's order of preference in respect to such remaining candidates; and
- (c) the number of first choices (other than informal votes) recorded for such remaining candidates shall then be counted.
- (ii) The aggregate number of such first choices shall be divided by a number one more than the number of candidates required to be elected and the quotient increased by one, disregarding any remainder, shall be the quota and (except as hereinafter provided in paragraph X) no candidate shall be elected until he obtains a number of votes equal to or greater than the quota.
- (iii) Any candidate who has, upon the first choices being counted, a number of votes equal to or greater than the quota shall be duly elected.
- (iv) When the number of such votes obtained by any candidate is equal to the quota, the whole of the voting papers on which a first choice is recorded for such elected candidates shall be set aside as finally dealt with.
- (v) Where the number of such votes obtained by any candidate is in excess of the quota, the proportion of votes in excess of the quota shall be transferred to the other candidate not yet declared elected, next in the order of the voter's respective preferences, in the following manner:—
- (a) All the voting papers on which a first choice is recorded for the elected candidate shall be re-examined and the number of second choices or (in the case provided for in paragraph XII.) third or next consecutive choices, recorded for each unelected candidate thereon shall be counted.
- (b) The surplus of the elected candidate shall be divided by the total number of votes obtained by him on the counting of the first choices, and the resulting fraction shall be the transfer value.

- (c) The number of second or other choices, ascertained in sub-paragraph (a) hereof to be recorded for each unelected candidate, shall be multiplied by the transfer value.
- (d) The resulting number, disregarding any fractional remainder, shall be credited to each unelected candidate, and added to the number of votes obtained by him on the counting of the first choices.
- (vi) Where on the counting of the first choices or on any transfer more than one candidate has a surplus, the largest surplus shall be first dealt with, and so on. If two or more surpluses are equal the Returning Officer shall decide which candidate's surplus shall be first dealt with.
- (vii) (a) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised up to or above the quota by a transfer as aforesaid he shall thereupon be declared elected. And in such case, notwithstanding the fact that he may have reached the quota, such transfer shall be completed, and all the votes to which he is entitled therefrom shall be transferred to him, but no votes of any other candidate shall be transferred to him.
- (b) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised up to, but not above the quota by a transfer as aforesaid, the whole of the voting papers on which such votes are recorded shall be set aside as finally dealt with.
- (c) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised above the quota by a transfer as aforesaid, his surplus shall be transferred to the candidates next in the order of the voter's respective preferences, in the following manner:—
1. The voting papers on which are recorded the votes obtained by the elected candidate in the last transfer shall be re-examined and the number of third or (in the case provided for in paragraph xii.) next consecutive choices recorded for each unelected candidate thereon counted.
 2. The surplus of the elected candidate shall be divided by the total number of voting papers mentioned in paragraph 1, and the resulting fraction shall be the transfer value.
 3. The number of second (or other) choices ascertained in paragraph 1 to be recorded for each unelected candidate, shall be multiplied by the last-mentioned transfer value.
 4. The resulting number, disregarding any fractional remainder, shall be credited to each unelected candidate, and added to the number of votes previously obtained by him.
- (viii) (a) Where, after the first choices have been counted and all surpluses, if any, have been transferred as hereinbefore directed, no candidate, or less than the number of candidates required to be elected, has or have obtained the quota, the candidate who is lowest in the poll shall be excluded, and all votes obtained by him shall be transferred to the candidates next in order of the voter's preferences, in the same manner as directed in paragraph v.
- (b) The votes obtained by such excluded candidate as first choices shall first be transferred, the transfer value of each vote in this case being 1.
- (c) The other votes of such excluded candidates shall then be dealt with in the order of the transfer in which, and at the transfer value at which, he obtained them.
- (d) Each of the transfers which takes place under the two previous clauses of this paragraph shall be deemed for all purposes to be a separate transfer.
- (ix) (a) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised up to or above the quota by any such transfer as aforesaid he shall, thereupon be declared elected. And in such case, notwithstanding the fact that he may have reached the quota, such transfer shall be completed, and all the votes to which he is entitled therefrom shall be transferred to him, but no other votes shall be transferred to him.

- (b) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised up to, but not above, the quota by any such transfer as aforesaid, the whole of the voting papers on which such votes are recorded shall be set aside as finally dealt with.
- (c) Where the number of votes obtained by a candidate is raised above the quota by any such transfer as aforesaid, his surplus shall be transferred to the candidates next in the order of the voters' preferences in the same manner as is directed in sub-paragraph (c) of paragraph (vii): Provided that such surplus shall not be dealt with until all the votes of the excluded candidate have been transferred.
- (d) Where any surplus exists it shall be dealt with before any other candidate is excluded.
- (x) The same process of excluding the candidate lowest on the poll and transferring to other candidates his votes shall be repeated until all the candidates, except the number required to be elected, have been excluded, and the unexcluded candidates who have not already been so declared, shall then be declared elected.
- (xi) Where at any time it becomes necessary to exclude a candidate, and two or more candidates have the same number of votes and are lowest on the poll, then whichever of such candidates was lowest on the poll at the last count or transfer at which they had an unequal number of votes shall be first excluded, and if such candidates have had an equal number of votes at all preceding counts or transfers the Returning Officer shall decide which candidate shall be first excluded.
- (xii) In determining what candidate is next in the order of the voter's preference, any candidates who have been declared elected or who have been excluded shall not be considered and the order of the voter's preference shall be determined as if the names of such candidates had not been on the voting paper.
- (xiii) Where on any transfer it is found that on any voting paper there is no candidate opposite whose name a number is placed, other than those who have been already declared elected or excluded, such voting paper shall be set aside as exhausted.
- (xiv) In this regulation—
 "Quota" means the number of votes sufficient to elect a candidate.
 "Surplus" means the number of votes which a candidate has obtained, at any stage of the scrutiny over and above the quota.
 "First choice recorded for a candidate" means a voting paper on which the number 1 is placed opposite his name.
 "Second choice recorded for a candidate" means a voting paper on which the number 2 is placed opposite his name.
 "Transfer value" means that portion of a vote which is unused by—
 (a) An elected candidate who has obtained a surplus;
 (b) a candidate excluded on account of his being lowest on the poll, and which is therefore transferred to the candidate next in order of the voter's preference. The transfer value of all votes is either 1 or some fraction of 1.

24. As soon as conveniently may be after the day of holding such election, the Returning Officer shall give public notice by advertisement of the number of first preference votes given to each candidate and (if the case so requires) the details of the distribution of preference votes, and shall declare the result of the election.

Appeals.

25. An appeal to a Judge of the Supreme Court under section 15 (4) of the Act shall be instituted by a notice of appeal setting out the grounds of the appeal and supported by an affidavit or affidavits setting out the nature of the case and the evidence on which the decision appealed from was given. An appellant desirous of adducing additional evidence to the Supreme Court shall set this out in his notice of appeal.

SHIRE OF BENALLA.

BY-LAW 41.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla, made under and in pursuance of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Local Government Acts, and numbered 41. (a) For regulating the market places in the Shire of Benalla and the buildings, stalls, pens, and standings therein, and for preventing nuisances or obstructions therein, or in the immediate approaches thereto; (b) for fixing the days and the hours during each day on which the market shall be held; (c) for fixing tolls to be paid by persons, exposing or offering for sale any cattle in any markets licensed by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla (hereinafter referred to as the Council), order as follows:—

This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipality of the Shire of Benalla, and shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Council of the Shire of Benalla, and immediately after its publication in the Victoria Government Gazette:

1. By-law No. 24, 25, and 26, and all former By-laws affecting the Benalla Corporation Saleyards are hereby repealed excepting as to Acts done, penalties incurred and proceeding at law pending at the time of this By-law coming into operation.

2. The market shall be known as the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and shall be held at the place and in the buildings and yards appointed to be used for the purpose of such market situated in the Shire of Benalla, and the said market shall be used for the sale of cattle and other things.

3. (a) A fortnightly market shall be held at the said market on every alternate Tuesday, commencing on Tuesday, the 27th day of June, 1944, for the sale of cattle, other than calves and pigs.

(b) A fortnightly market shall be held at the said market on every alternate Friday commencing on Friday, the 23rd day of June, 1944, for the sale of calves and pigs, provided that in the event of any of the aforesaid market days in clauses (a) and (b) above falling on Christmas Day, New Year's Day, Good Friday, Anzac Day, or any other public holiday, the President and Secretary of the Council for the time being shall appoint some other day in lieu of the said holiday.

4. (a) Application, in writing, may be made to the Shire Secretary for the time being for permission to hold a special sale for a special class of cattle on a day other than fortnightly market days provided that no application may be granted for a sale which, but for this proviso, would be held less than one clear day after any other special sale.

(b) The President and Secretary for the Shire of Benalla for the time being may refuse or grant such application at their discretion.

(c) Each application, accompanied by a deposit of £5, shall contain particulars of the cattle to be sold at the proposed sale. If the special sale be held the aforesaid deposit shall be refunded, but if such special sale be not held the deposit shall be forfeited and become the property of the Council, excepting in cases of strikes, fires, flood, or other circumstances over which, in the Council's opinion, the agent has no control.

5. No sale shall be held in the said market on any day other than one of the said fortnightly market days or on a special sale day as herein before provided.

6. On the days appointed (or in respect of which an application to hold a special sale has been granted) the market shall be open from sunrise to sunset for the reception, delivery and sale of cattle.

7. (a) The sales of cattle, other than calves and pigs, whether at a fortnightly or special sale, shall be commenced not earlier than nine o'clock a.m. and shall be conducted in the following order:—1st: fat sheep; 2nd: dairy cattle; 3rd: fat cattle; 4th: store sheep; 5th: store cattle; 6th: horses of all classes; 7th: sundries.

(b) The sales of calves and pigs, whether at a fortnightly or special sale, shall be commenced not earlier than 1 o'clock in the afternoon, and shall be conducted in the following order:—1st: calves; 2nd: fat pigs; 3rd: store pigs; 4th: sundries.

8. Auctioneers shall draw lots for precedence of selling the various classes of stock in the order set out in clause seven (7) of this By-law. Each auctioneer shall exercise his right to sell in the order of precedence determined by the draw, provided always that the auctioneer drawing first sale shall in the case of sales of cattle, other than calves and pigs, commence selling at 11 a.m. and in the case of sales for calves and pigs at one (1) p.m. If the auctioneer having the right to sell first does not commence at the aforesaid time (as the case may be), then the auctioneer drawing the second sale shall have the right to sell first for the day. Where stock or other goods of a class other than set out in clause seven (7) above is offered for sale the order of selling each such class by each auctioneer shall be the same as for all preceding sales of that day.

9. The following limit of times shall be allowed each auctioneer to offer the various classes of stock:—

Fat sheep—two minutes per pen.

Fat cattle—120 per hour.

Dairy cattle—one and a half minutes per head.

Store sheep—two minutes per pen.

Store cattle—200 per hour.

Fat pigs and store pigs—120 per hour.

Calves—200 per hour.

Horses, or any single horse, a limit of 10 minutes.

Providing always that one hour shall be the limit of time permitted each auctioneer for selling each class of stock.

9. Five minutes shall be allowed after one auctioneer ceases selling and the next in turn commences, and in the event of the auctioneer next in turn failing to commence selling on the expiration of the time allowed, then the next in turn shall have the right to sell.

10. The Council shall appoint a Market Inspector whose duties shall be as follows:—

(a) To see that this By-law and the provisions of the Local Government Act 1928 and any amendment or amendments thereto relating to the markets are duly observed.

- (b) To demand and collect all market tolls and dues.
- (c) To allot the principal and drafting yards to the use of persons bringing cattle to the market for sale in such manner as in each particular case they seem to such Inspector to be most convenient and to prevent any unbroken horses or cattle being roped within the market yards before five o'clock p.m. on the day of sale except with the consent of such Inspector.

11. No person shall obstruct the Market Inspector in the performance of his duty, or release or remove any cattle from the said market, or release or remove cattle from one part of the said market to another part of the said market without the consent of the Market Inspector, nor shall any person wilfully break down or damage any of the gates, fences, buildings, or appurtenances of the said market, or cause any riot or disturbance, or curse or swear, or use any indecent language, or be guilty of any indecent conduct within the said market, or upon the immediate approaches thereto.

12. Every person placing cattle in the market for sale shall be responsible for all tolls and dues accruing thereon, and in no case shall any cattle be taken out of the market until all tolls or dues payable in respect thereof shall have been first paid and satisfied, and if any cattle be not removed within 24 hours of the close of the market another toll shall become due in respect of the cattle so omitted to be removed.

13. In the case of any dispute arising as to the priority of right to offer by auction, the Market Inspector's decision shall be final.

14. All horses for disposal by auction shall be paraded in the shed or ring provided for the purpose.

15. The Council may licence any yards or premises for the sale of cattle outside a radius of seven (7) miles from Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and the annual licence fee shall be twenty shillings (20s.) for each yard or premises so licensed.

16. Any person or persons guilty of any wilful act or breach of this By-law shall on conviction before two or more justices, be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds (£5).

17. When the Auctioneer realizes that he has reached the limit of bidding, subject to the times set out in Clause 9 of this By-law, he shall knock down to the last bidder, reserving the right of the vendor to accept or reject before completion of sale of next pen.

Appointing Tolls and Dues.

1. The Council of the Shire of Benalla shall demand, receive, and have of and from every person selling any cattle in the Benalla Corporation Saleyards, and from every person who shall at any time use for the sale of cattle, and/or the use of any licensed yards or premises within the municipal district and outside the said Benalla Corporation Saleyards, the several sums of money, as for tolls or dues hereinafter appointed in that behalf, that is to say:—

For the Use of the Market Yards on Other than Market Days.

For branding, inoculating, speying, castrating, or ringing, a minimum charge of 10s., or 3d. per head.

For the use of the yards for drafting, camping, or any other purpose not specified in the above schedule, the charge per day or part thereof shall be:—In the case of sheep, 4d. per head; and in the case of all other cattle, 3d. per head, provided always that the minimum charge in all cases shall be 10s.

2. All cattle of whatever class left in the market yards and not removed within twenty-four (24) hours of the close of the market or special sale (as the case may be), may be removed by the Market Inspector at the risk and expense of the owner, or agent of the owner, and impounded.

The foregoing By-law, being No. 41 of the Shire of Benalla, was passed by the Council of the Municipality on the 8th day of May, 1944, and confirmed by the said Council this 5th day of June, 1944.

A By-law of the Shire of Benalla, and numbered 40, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by section 14 of Act No. 4869 of the State of Victoria and all other powers and authorities thereunto it enabling for requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land within any area within the municipal district set forth in the By-law and declared therein to be a residential area in cases where in the opinion of the Council such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, and enabling the Council, in the event of default by the owner or occupier, to remove the same, and to recover the cost thereof from the owner or occupier.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, and the said Act number 4869 of the State of Victoria, and all other powers and authorities thereunto it enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Benalla order as follows:—

1. In the case of any undergrowth, weeds, or grass on any land within that area in the municipal district of the Shire of Benalla bounded as follows, namely:—

All that portion of the Central Riding of the Shire of Benalla being situated in the Town and Parish of Benalla, and included in the area bounded by the following lines:— Commencing at the south-west corner of allotment 7, section XIII.; thence northerly by a line forming the eastern boundary of a Government road to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section XVI.; thence north-easterly by a straight line to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section I; thence easterly by a line forming the southern boundary of a Government road to the north-east corner of allotment 5, section IV.; thence southerly by a line forming the west boundary of a Government road to the south-east corner of allotment 14, section VI.; thence westerly by the south boundary of the said allotment 14 to its junction with the Benalla-Tatong railway line; thence southerly by the Benalla-Tatong railway line to its junction with Holland's Creek; thence in a general westerly direction by Holland's Creek and the Broken River to the south-east corner of allotment 7, section 1C.; thence westerly by a line forming the north boundary of a Government road to the point of commencement, which area is hereby declared to be a residential area, which undergrowth, weeds, or grass in the opinion of the Council constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property—

(a) The Council may serve on the owner or occupier of such land seven days' notice in writing (which notice may be signed by the shire secretary on behalf of the Council) requiring the removal of such undergrowth, weeds, or grass therefrom.

(b) All notices to owners or occupiers under this By-law shall be served in the manner provided by section 831 of the *Local Government Act 1928*.

(c) Every owner or occupier of any land on whom a notice is served under this By-law in respect of the undergrowth, weeds, or grass on such land shall, within seven days from the service of such notice, remove such undergrowth, weeds, or grass from such land.

(d) In the event of default by the owner or occupier of any land in the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass as required by this By-law, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, it shall be lawful for the Council to enter upon the land on which such undergrowth, weeds, or grass may be and to remove the same, and all expenses incurred by the Council in so removing such undergrowth, weeds, or grass may be recovered from the owner or occupier so in default in any court of competent jurisdiction.

(e) Any person who is guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds for each offence.

2. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of that part of the municipal district set out in clause 1 of this By-law.
