ACT OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

No. 5000. "An Act to amend Section One hundred and thirty-one of the *Local Government Act 1928*."

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts and every other power thereunto enabling, and numbered 143, for amending By-law numbered 130, and for prescribing the minimum area and the minimum depth and width of frontage of land upon which any dwelling house may hereafter be erected, and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. The following alteration shall be made in the By-law numbered 130, agreed to by the Council of the City of Hawthorn on the 8th March, 1939, and confirmed on the 5th April, 1939, namely:—

Clause 2 (areas) "F" of Schedule "E" (50 feet frontage prescribed) shall be deleted, and in lieu thereof there shall be inserted the following clauses:—

F. (i) The area commencing at a point on the east side of Auburn-road 150 feet north of Currajong-road; thence easterly by a line parallel to and distant 150 feet north of Currajong-road to the west side of Tooronga-road; thence southerly by the west side of Tooronga-road to a point 150 feet south of the south side of Miami-street; thence generally westerly by a line parallel to and distant 150 feet south of Miami-street to the east side of Auburn-road; thence northerly by the east side of Auburn-road to the point of commencement.

F. (ii) The area commencing at a point on the east side of Auburn-road 150 feet north of Rosslyn-street; thence easterly by a line parallel to and distant 150 feet north of Rosslyn-street to the west side of Tooronga-road; thence southerly by the west side of Tooronga-road to a point 150 feet south of the south side of Burgess-street; thence westerly by a line parallel to and distant 150 feet south of Burgess-street to the east side of Auburn-road; thence northerly by the east side of Auburn-road to the point of commencement.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council the 26th day of April, 1944, and confirmed the 7th day of June, 1944.

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW NO. 72.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under the provisions of the Local Government Act, and numbered 72, for—

1. Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
2. Prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
3. Requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section thirty-nine of the *Health Act* 1928).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any rubbish or refuse on any street, road, lane, or passage.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land.

3. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section thirty-nine of the *Health Act* 1928).

4. Any person who shall by any wilful act or default commit a breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable for any such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds and not less than One pound for each such offence, and in case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence is continued after conviction or order by the Court.

5. In addition to the aforesaid penalties, any expense incurred by the Council in consequence of a breach of this By-law, or in the execution of work directed by the By-law to be executed by any person and not executed by him, shall be paid by the person committing such breach or failing to execute such work.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 23rd day of October, 1939, and confirmed on the 27th day of November, 1939.

SHIRE OF FERN TREE GULLY.

BY-LAW NO. 46.

A By-law of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully, made under the Local Government Acts and the Health Acts, and numbered 46, for—

- (a) Prescribing areas within the Municipal District as residential areas, and prohibiting or regulating within the whole or any part of any such residential area the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building for the purposes of such classes of trades, industries, manufactures, business, or public amusements as are specified therein.
- (b) Regulating or prohibiting the keeping of any place or any animals (including birds) or the storage of any things in the opinion of the Council offensive, injurious to health, or dangerous.
- (c) Fixing, subject to part 4 of the *Health Act* 1928, the distance from any dwelling within which it shall be unlawful to keep any such place or animal or store any such thing, and—
- (d) For other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Health Acts and of every other power it thereunto enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 38 of the Shire of Fern Tree Gully is hereby expressly repealed.

2. The areas set out and described in the First and Second Schedules hereto are hereby prescribed as residential areas.

3. Save as is hereinafter provided, no person shall in any portion of any residential area described in the First Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building for the purposes of any class of trade, industry, manufacture, business, or public amusement: Provided always and notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained any person may use any land or erect or adapt for use or use any building in any portion of any residential area described in the First Schedule hereto for the purpose of a school or private hospital or may use any dwelling house for the purpose of carrying on the practice, profession, or business of a solicitor, doctor, dentist, architect, or music teacher.

4. No person shall in any portion of the residential area described in the Second Schedule hereto use any land or erect or adapt for use any building for the purposes of—

- (a) any of the trades specified in the Second and Third Schedules to the *Health Act* 1928;
- (b) any trade, industry, manufacture, or business, the operations of which usually cause the emission into the air of dust, grit, ash, or other particles of solid matter in such quantity or such manner as to be offensive;
- (c) any trade, industry, manufacture, or business, the operations of which usually cause such a volume of noise as to constitute a nuisance;
- (d) any woodworking business in connexion with which any circular saw, band saw, or any saw driven by mechanical power is used; or
- (e) the trade or business of a poultry farm.

5. No person shall in any part of the Municipal District keep any animal within a distance of 100 feet from any dwelling house.

6. No person shall in any part of the Municipal District keep any bull, cow, or calf on any land which, together with any other adjoining land owned or occupied by such person, has a lesser area than one acre.

7. In this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires, "animals" include horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine. "Poultry" includes fowls, ducks, geese, turkeys, pigeons, squabs, and any other edible birds, and "Poultry Farm" means any land or building used for the purpose of breeding, rearing, keeping, or confining any poultry beyond twenty-five in number for the purposes of trade or business.
