### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5001. "An Act to amend Sections Seventy-two and Ninety-three of the *Police Offences Act 1928*."

No. 5002. "An Act to amend Part IV. of the *Hospitals and Charities Act 1928*."

No. 5003. "An Act to provide for the Abolition of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust and the Constitution of certain Waterworks Districts, and for other purposes."

### ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country

Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portion of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portion of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

#### NORTH-CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of East Loddon, Parishes of Mitiamo and Hayanmi, County of Bendigo: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 1B, Parish of Mitiamo; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment, a line, and the eastern boundary of allotment 61 to a road forming the south-eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence south-westerly by that road to a road forming the south boundary of allotment 64; thence westerly by the last-mentioned road, Parishes of Mitiamo and Hayanmi, to the south-western angle of allotment 26, Parish of Hayanmi; thence northerly by a road to a road forming the north boundary of the Parish of Hayanmi; thence easterly by the last-mentioned road, Parishes of Hayanmi and Mitiamo, to the point of commencement.

## URBAN DISTRICTS DEFINED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 4 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1943 (No. 4997)*, it is provided that Part 1 of the said Act shall apply with respect to any urban district as defined by Proclamation of the Governor in Council: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation define the urban districts specified hereunder to be subject to the provisions of the said Act on and from the thirty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four:—

- (A) The whole of City of Bendigo.
- (B) The whole of the City of Geelong.
- (C) The whole of the City of Geelong West.
- (D) The whole of the Town of Newtown and Chilwell.
- (E) The part of the Shire of Huntly specified hereunder:—

"Commencing at the north-east corner of allotment 5, section XIII., Parish of Huntly; thence westerly to the north-west corner of allotment 3, section XIII., Parish of Huntly; thence south-westerly to the north-east corner of allotment 2c, section XVI., Parish of Huntly; thence westerly to the north-west corner of allotment 1, section XVI., Parish of Huntly; thence southerly along road being the boundary of the Shires of Huntly and Marong to the south-west corner of allotment 17, section XX., Parish of Huntly; thence easterly along Boundary-road to Bendigo Creek; thence southerly along the shire boundary (Bendigo Creek) to the boundary of the City of Bendigo; thence south-easterly along boundary of the City of Bendigo to the intersection of the boundaries of the City of Bendigo and the Shires of Strathfieldsaye and Huntly; thence easterly along the boundary of the Shires of Huntly and Strathfieldsaye to the eastern boundary of the Parish of Sandhurst; thence northerly along the boundary road between the Parishes of Sandhurst and Huntly on the west and the Parishes of Wellsford and Bagshot on the east to the commencing point."

- (F) The parts of the Shire of Marong specified hereunder:—

No. 1. "All that part of the Township of Kangaroo Flat which is situated within the Marong Shire."

No. 2. "Commencing at a point being the junction of the Calder Highway at Specimen Hill with the western boundary of the City of Bendigo and the Shire of Marong; thence north-westerly along the said boundary to the junction with the Borough of Eaglehawk; thence north-westerly along the boundary of the Borough of Eaglehawk with the Shire of Marong to the boundary of the Parish of Nerring; thence southerly along the eastern boundaries of the Parishes of Nerring and Marong to the Calder Highway; thence easterly to the commencing point."

- (G) The part of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye specified hereunder:—

"That portion of the Parish of Sandhurst which lies within the municipal district of the Shire of Strathfieldsaye."

## MUNICIPAL DISTRICTS INCLUDED IN THE METROPOLIS.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by sub-section (3) of section 2 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1943 (No. 4997)*, it is provided that the Governor in Council may by Proclamation declare any municipal district or part thereof specified in such Proclamation to be included in the metropolis: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of Part 1 of the said Act do by this my Proclamation declare the municipal district and parts of the municipal districts specified hereunder to be included in the metropolis on and from the thirty-first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four:—

- (A) The whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Braybrook.

- (B) The part of the municipal district of the Shire of Dandenong specified hereunder:—

"Commencing at the intersection of Heatherton-road and Chandler-road; thence easterly by Heatherton-road to the shire boundary; thence southerly by the shire boundary to Princes Highway; thence westerly by Princes Highway and Kirkham-road to Chandler-road; thence northerly by Chandler-road to the commencing point."

- (C) The part of the municipal district of the Shire of Frankston and Hastings specified hereunder:—

"Commencing from Port Phillip Bay; thence easterly by the Frankston-Chelsea and the Frankston-Dandenong shire boundaries to the intersection of Boundary-road and the Frankston-Dandenong road; thence southerly, easterly and southerly by the Dandenong-Frankston and Cranbourne-Frankston shire boundaries to Golf Links-road; thence southerly and westerly by the railway to the Three Chain-road; thence north-westerly by the Mornington-Frankston shire boundary to Port Phillip Bay; and thence to the commencing point."

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

FURTHER REGULATIONS.

UNDER and by virtue of the powers in that behalf conferred by the Medical Act 1928, the Pharmacy Board of Victoria, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth make the following Regulations:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as "The Pharmacy Regulations 1944," and shall be read and construed as one with the Pharmacy Regulations 1930, 1931, 1933, 1934, 1935, 1939, and 1941, which Regulations and these Regulations may be cited together as "The Pharmacy Regulations."

2. After Regulation 43 of the Pharmacy Regulations 1930, as amended by the Pharmacy Regulations 1931, there shall be inserted the following Regulation, namely:—

"43A. The Board may, in its absolute discretion, exempt either partially or in full from the requirements of the next preceding Regulation any person who has served in or with the Defence Forces of the Commonwealth of Australia or in any of the women's services or bodies auxiliary to any of those forces during the war which commenced in the year One thousand nine hundred and thirty-nine and who possesses educational qualifications which in the opinion of the Board are sufficient to enable him to enter upon the course."

The preceding Regulations were made at a meeting of the Pharmacy Board of Victoria held at Melbourne on Thursday, the 13th day of July, 1944.

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES CHARGES FOR THE YEAR 1944.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at the charge of Thirteen and one half pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Thirteen and one half pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Thirteen and one half pence per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust, Shire Hall, Yea.

## AMENDMENT OF REGULATION XVIII.—ALLOWANCES FOR CONVEYANCE OF PUPILS TO POST-PRIMARY SCHOOLS AND CLASSES.

**HIS** Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1928* and of all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XVIII.—Allowances for Conveyance of Pupils to Post-Primary Schools and Classes—in the manner following, that is to say:—

The Regulation shall be known in future as Regulation XVIII.—Conveyance of Pupils to Post-primary Schools and Classes.

Clauses 1, 4, 5, 6, 7, 8, 9, 10, 11, and 12 shall be rescinded, and in lieu thereof the following clauses shall be substituted:—

1. (a) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, allow to a pupil attending a district high school, a higher elementary school, a central school, central classes, a girl's school, or a technical school such sum as will cover the cost of conveyance to and from school, provided that the place of residence of the pupil is not less than 3 miles from the nearest State school or State educational centre providing the required standard of education.

(b) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, allow to a pupil attending a registered secondary school such sum as will cover the cost of conveyance to and from school, provided that the place of residence of the pupil is not less than 3 miles from the school attended and provided that there is not within 3 miles of his place of residence a State school or State educational centre providing the required standard of education.

4. (a) The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, provide the full cost of conveying a group or groups of pupils to a district high school, a higher elementary school, a central school, central classes, a girl's school, or a technical school by means of an approved transport service, provided that all pupils so conveyed shall attend the nearest centre of State secondary education providing the required standard of education and that pupils who reside less than 3 miles from the school will not be conveyed unless there is accommodation for them in the vehicle used for the transport service.

(b) Where arrangements have been made for the establishment of a transport service under sub-clause (a) of this clause, the Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, permit pupils attending a registered secondary school to travel by the same transport service, provided that pupils so permitted to travel reside at least 3 miles from the school attended, and attend the nearest centre of secondary education providing the required standard of education. Pupils who reside less than 3 miles from the school attended shall not be conveyed under the provisions of this sub-clause unless there is accommodation for them in the vehicle used for the transport service.

5. Applications for the establishment of an approved transport service shall be made by the head teacher of the school to which pupils are to be conveyed, and shall contain full particulars of the proposed service, including the full names, ages, classification, qualifications, and addresses of the pupils, and the distances to be travelled.

6. No provision under clause 1 or clause 4 above shall be made in respect of any pupil who has not successfully completed the course of study for Grade VI. prescribed for State primary schools or obtained an approved equivalent or a higher qualification.

7. (a) The head teacher and the district inspector of State primary schools and a representative of the Transport Regulation Board shall confer as to the requirements of a transport service for the conveyance of pupils to a school, and when necessary the head teacher shall invite tenders for such service.

(b) All tenders shall be forwarded to the Minister for his consideration.

8. (a) The arrangements for the conveyance of pupils under clause 4 above shall be incorporated in an agreement entered into by the owner of the vehicle of the first part and the Minister of the second part.

(b) The owner of the vehicle referred to in sub-clause (a) of this clause shall comply with the provisions of the Transport Regulation Acts and with the provisions of any statute, regulation, or by-law from time to time in force relating to the conduct of his vehicle.

9. Payments for the conveyance of pupils under clause 4 above shall be made to the owner of the vehicle at the end of each calendar month.

10. In a case where the owner of the vehicle fails to operate the service in accordance with the arrangements agreed upon, the head teacher shall report such failure immediately to the Education Department.

11. Provision for the cost of transport under these Regulations shall be conditional on moneys being placed by the legislature at the Minister's disposal.

DECLARATION OF THE BIRREGURRA-FORREST ROAD

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the seventeenth day of July One thousand nine hundred and forty-four the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a main road and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a main road: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

## Resolution for Declaration of Main Road under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highway within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written is of sufficient importance to be a main road acting under the powers conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highway to be a main road within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

REGULATION XVII.—ALLOWANCE FOR CONVEYANCE  
OF PUPILS TO PRIMARY SCHOOLS—RESCINDED AND  
RE-MADE.

**HIS** Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Education Act 1928* and all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby rescind Regulation XVII.—Allowance for Conveyance of Pupils to Primary Schools, and in lieu thereof doth make the following regulation, that is to say:—

1. The Minister may, if he considers the circumstances warrant it, grant allowances for the conveyance of pupils to State or registered primary schools under the conditions mentioned hereunder.

2. For each pupil between the ages of six and fourteen years who resides more than 3 miles from the nearest existing State school by the shortest practicable route the allowance, if granted, shall be six pence for each day's attendance.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 2 above the Minister may, in special circumstances, grant an allowance for conveyance to any pupil in attendance at a State or registered primary school who is over fourteen years of age and resides more than three miles from the nearest existing State school.

4. (a) Pupils who are eligible to receive an allowance under clause 2 or 3 above may be issued special tickets\* by the Railways Department for transit by train to and from certain stations.

(b) These tickets shall be paid for by the pupils at the time of issue.

(c) The return half of the ticket shall not be available unless it is initialed by the head teacher as evidence that the pupil has been in attendance.

(d) Head teachers shall—

(i) keep a record of the number of tickets issued to each pupil, and

(ii) furnish, at the end of each quarter, a return to the Education Department showing the number of tickets issued to each pupil.

(e) Subject to compliance with the prescribed conditions, the amount of the fares shall be re-imbursed to the parents or guardians at the end of each quarter.

\*NOTE.—The fares at present are as follows:—Up to 6 miles, 2d. daily; from 6 to 12 miles, 4d. daily.

5. Application for an allowance under clause 2 or 3 above shall be made on a prescribed form by the parent or guardian, and shall be forwarded, wherever possible, before the end of February in each year.

6. Payments of the allowance under clause 2 or 3 above shall be made at the end of each quarter to the parents or guardians, subject to a certificate, in a prescribed form, by the head teacher.

7. The parents or guardians shall make all arrangements for the conveyance of their children and shall accept all responsibility in connexion therewith.

8. Notwithstanding anything contained in clause 7 above the Minister may, at his discretion, and in very special cases permit children in attendance at State or registered primary schools to travel free by means of a transport service established for the conveyance of pupils to post-primary schools under the following conditions:—

(a) That there is accommodation available on the existing bus without overcrowding;

(b) that children so permitted to travel shall attend the nearest primary school on the route;

(c) that children so permitted to travel shall reside more than three miles from the nearest existing State primary school;

(d) that an undertaking shall be given by the parents or guardians of children so permitted to travel to make other arrangements should the bus accommodation become insufficient; and

(e) that preference shall be given to children who have the furthest distance to travel or who have physical disabilities.

9. Payments of allowances granted under this regulation shall be conditional on moneys being placed by the legislature at the Minister's disposal.

## CITY OF SOUTH MELBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 358.

A By-law of the City of South Melbourne, made under section 197 (5) (d) of the *Local Government Acts* and numbered 358, for requiring the removal of undergrowth, weeds, or grass from land where such undergrowth, weeds, or grass constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of South Melbourne order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district, the whole area of which is hereby declared to be a populous area.

2. If and whenever the Council of the City of South Melbourne, by Resolution, declares that in its opinion undergrowth, weeds, or grass upon any land within the municipal district constitutes a fire menace to neighbouring property, it may, by notice, under the hand of the Town Clerk of the municipality specifying the land affected and served upon the owner or occupier require such owner or occupier forthwith to remove all such undergrowth, weeds, or grass therefrom.

3. Any owner or occupier who fails or neglects to comply with such notice shall be guilty of an offence.

4. If the owner or occupier, who has been served with such notice, fails or neglects to comply with the requirements thereof, the Council by its officers and servants may enter upon the land and remove the undergrowth, weeds, or grass found thereon, and may recover the cost of so doing from the owner or occupier.

1. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Upper Yarra.

2. No person being the owner or having the possession, care, charge, custody, control, or supervision of any cattle shall allow such cattle to graze or wander upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence.

3. Any person who shall be guilty of any breach of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty for each head of cattle of not more than One pound, and not less than Five shillings, for the first offence, and not more than Two pounds nor less than Ten shillings for the second offence, and not more than Five pounds nor less than One pound for the third or any subsequent offence.
