Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the

Fire Brigades Act 1928, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

NORTH-EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Numurkah, Parish of Drumanure, County of Moira:—Commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 1 of section C, Parish of Drumanure; thence northerly by a line to the southern boundary of the Township of Wunghnu; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary to the Shepparton-Numurkah railway line; thence south-westerly by the railway line to its intersection with the western boundary of allotment 1 aforementioned; thence northerly by the last-mentioned boundary to the point of commencement.

Shire of Waranga, Township of Stanhope, Parish of Girgarre, County of Rodney.—Boundary comprising a circle with a radius of eighty (80) chains from the south-western angle of Crown allotment 10 of section 8, Township of Stanhope.

EXEMPTIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and upon the recommendation of the Public Service Board, has, by Orders made on the 7th day of August, 1944, exempted the officers specified hereunder from the provisions of sections 90 and 91 of the Public Service Act 1928 (No. 3757):—

DEPARTMENT OF AGRICULTURE.

Officers who are required to work overtime in connexion with the inspection of fruit, grain, seeds, plants, and sea-borne stock—such exemption to be operative for the period from the 1st July, 1944, to the 30th June, 1945, both dates inclusive.

DEPARTMENT OF STATE FORESTS.

Officers who are required to work overtime—such exemption to be operative for a period of three (3) months from and inclusive of the 1st July, 1944.

DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH.

(1) Augustus T. M. Mahony, Inspector of Liquor, and Joseph H. Nott, Inspector of Wine, when required to work overtime in connexion with the inspection of liquor on Saturday afternoons, public holidays, and between the hours of 5 p.m. and 6 p.m. (Monday to Friday) when engaged in the country.

(2) Officers of the Professional Division who are required to make inspections of public buildings on Saturday afternoons, public holidays, and in the evenings, for the purpose of seeing that the regulations in regard to overcrowding, fire-prevention, ventilation, &c., are complied with.

- (i) to make inspections in connexion with Racecourse Luncheon Booths on Saturday afternoons;
- (ii) to make inspections of hotels on Saturday afternoons in order to check glass washing;
- (iii) to make inspections in connexion with the sampling of milk between midnight and the ordinary hour of commencing duty;

(iv) to make night inspections in connexion with the bottling and sale of milk, the illegal slaughtering of animals, and the illegal manufacture, preparation, and sale of food.

(4) The domestic and nursing staffs of the Gresswell and Greenvale Sanatoria when required to work overtime—

such exemption to be operative for the period from the 1st July, 1944, to the 30th June, 1945, both dates inclusive.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "GEELONG EAST PUBLIC HALL, FREE LIBRARY, AND RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated the 11th April, 1906, as a site for a Public Hall, Free Library, and Recreation purposes at Geelong, and known as the "Geelong East Public Hall, Free Library, and Recreation Reserve."

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

2. The Committee of Management, or any member or servant thereof, may at any time remove from the Reserve any person guilty of misconduct or of any offence against these or any of these Regulations.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, flowers, or shrubs in the Reserve, or shall fires be lighted therein.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, affix bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any buildings, gates, fences, or seats in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll nor throw stones or any missile of any kind therein.

5. No person shall affix, print, post, paint, or cut, or mark any advertisement, sign, picture, bill, placard, notice, words, letters, or figures, to or upon any wall, notice board, or fence in or enclosing the Reserve, or to or upon any tree, building, barrier, railing, seat, structure, erection, flagging, or path in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management.

6. No person shall in the Reserve wilfully obstruct, disturb, interrupt, or annoy any other person in the proper use of the Reserve, or any part thereof, or any servant of the Committee of Management in the proper execution of his duty or work.

7. No person shall hawk or offer for sale in the Reserve any goods or articles of any description without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or booths or other structure for any purpose whatsoever without the permission, in writing, of the Committee first obtained.

9. No person shall conduct or take part in any public entertainment of any sort without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

10. No person shall park a motor vehicle, cycle, or bicycle within the Reserve, except at such places as may be set apart for the purpose by the Committee of Management.

11. No person shall put nor allow to remain in the Reserve any cattle, sheep, horses, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained, and the said Committee, or any member or servant thereof, may remove without being liable for loss of or damage thereto any such cattle, sheep, horses, goats, or other animals, or have them impounded, and for that purpose the Committee of Management shall be deemed to be the occupier of the Reserve within the meaning of any law for the time being in force in relation to the impounding of cattle or dogs.

12. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve.

13. No person shall bring into the Reserve, without the permission of the Committee of Management, any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

14. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful entertainment, game, or sport, and from time to time grant to any club or association, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may deem to be consistent with these Regulations, the use of the portion so set apart. The Committee of Management shall have power to revoke or cancel such grant if it considers it expedient so to do. The Committee of Management may demand and sue for such fees as it deems just for the use of any part of the said Reserve, and all fees collected therefor, or by virtue of these Regulations, shall be held by the said Committee and used for the purpose of maintaining and improving the Reserve and any buildings, fences, or amenities thereon.
