PUBLIC SERVICE EXAMINATION.

NOTICE is hereby given that an examination of male candidates for appointment to the Clerical Division of the Public Service of Victoria will be held in conjunction with the University examinations commencing on Friday, the 1st December, 1944.

The examination will be open to persons who, on the 1st December, 1944, are between the ages of 15 and 21 years at last birthday, but a candidate 22 years of age or over cannot be appointed.

The limitation as to maximum age does not apply, however, to any person who is a discharged serviceman within the meaning of the *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act 1943*.

A candidate will be required to enter for competitive examination in handwriting and in at least three of the subjects for the University examinations (Matriculation or School

Leaving) as prescribed; but will not be eligible for appointment unless he shall have passed the School Leaving examination in English and either the School Intermediate examination in Arithmetic or Mathematics B, or the School Leaving examination in a branch of Mathematics, or such other examinations in these subjects as may be deemed by the University of Melbourne as equivalent thereto.

The conditions and subjects of examination are set out on the printed form, obtainable at the office of the Public Service Board, Public Offices, Treasury-place, Melbourne.

Two hundred (200) candidates will be selected for appointment as vacancies occur.

Entries for examination must be lodged—

(1) at the Board's office, on or before Wednesday, the 11th October, 1944; and

(2) with the Registrar, Melbourne University, on or before Friday, the 20th October, 1944. University entry forms are obtainable at the Registrar's office.

PORT OF GEELONG—OUTER HARBOR.**

(a) *Temporary Alteration in Light Buoy.*

Date.—On or about 30th August, 1944.

Position.—No. 1 Buoy—Point Richards' Channel. Lat. 38 deg. 5 min. 10 sec. South, Long. 144 deg. 37 min. 36 sec. East (approximate).

Details.—The above buoy will be temporarily removed for cleaning and repairs, and will be replaced by a smaller buoy exhibiting at a height of 13 feet a flashing red light, showing one flash every four seconds.

(b) *Buoys Established.*

Position.—Point Wilson White Beacon. Lat. 38 deg. 5 min. 30 sec. South, Long. 144 deg. 30 min. 30 sec. East (approximate).

(a) 070 deg.—distant 0.944 miles from above position.

(b) 038 deg.—distant 1.576 miles from (a).

(c) 038 deg.—distant 3.017 miles from (a).

Description.—(a), (b), and (c) Black and Yellow vertically striped barrel buoys with ball topmarks.

Remarks.—These buoys delineate the base of the triangular Air Gunnery Area "A.D.", the apex of which is situated approximately 267 deg.—distant 2.7 miles from Kirk Point.

All vessels and boats should keep to the eastward of the line of buoys.
