Land Act 1928.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I, Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

CERTAIN PLANT DECLARED TO BE A NOXIOUS WEED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of section 6 of the *Vermin and Noxious Weeds Act 1928* (No. 3799), I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation declare the plant named hereunder to be a noxious weed for the purposes of the above Act throughout the whole of the State of Victoria, viz.:—

Tribulus terrestris L. ("Caltrop").

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire districts respectively specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire districts: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly:—

SOUTH CENTRAL FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Gisborne, Parish of Gisborne, County of Bourke.—Commencing at the north-eastern angle of Crown allotment 7 of section 34, Parish of Gisborne; thence southerly by the eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and allotment 6 and a road to the south-eastern angle of lot H of allotment 5; thence south-easterly and easterly by a road to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 2 of section 33; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotments 2 and 3 and south-westerly by a line to the north-western angle of allotment 4; thence southerly by the western boundaries of allotments 4, 5, 17, and 16 and a line to the Melbourne-road; thence south-easterly by the road last mentioned to a point in line with the eastern boundary of lot D of allotment 28; thence southerly by a line and the eastern boundaries of the last-mentioned allotment and lot H to a road forming the south boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by that road to the eastern boundary of allotment 24 of section M; thence northerly by the boundary last mentioned, a road, and the eastern boundary of allotment 5 of section E and the eastern boundaries of allotments 5, 3 and 2 of section 34A to the Racecourse and Recreation Reserve; thence generally in a north-easterly and north-westerly direction by the Racecourse and Recreation Reserve to a point in line with the south boundary of allotment 6 of section 34; thence north-easterly by a direct line through allotment 18 to the south-eastern angle of allotment 23 of section 34; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the northern railway line; thence south-easterly by the railway line to the point of commencement.

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Mulgrave, Parishes of Mulgrave and Mordialloc, County of Bourke.—Commencing at the most northerly angle of Crown allotment 16, Parish of Mulgrave; thence south-easterly by a road to a point in line with the western boundary of allotment 17; thence northerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary to a point on a line parallel with the north-eastern boundary of the Prince's Highway, and distant therefrom 5 chains; thence south-easterly by the line last mentioned, Parishes of Mulgrave and Mordialloc, to a road forming the eastern boundary of the Parish of Mordialloc; thence southerly by the road last mentioned to Centre-road; thence easterly by Centre-road to the eastern boundary of allotment 10 of section II; thence northerly by allotments 10, 9, 5, and 4 to the north-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly by a line and the western boundary of allotment 16, Parish of Mulgrave, to the point of commencement.

GEELONG WATERWORKS AND SEWERAGE TRUST.

BY-LAW No. 75.

A By-law for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year Commencing on the First Day of July, 1944.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the *Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928*, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes:—

- (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £20—Twenty shillings per annum.
- (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £20—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £5—Five shillings per annum.
- (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £5—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1944, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1945, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the fourth day of October, 1944, and the first day of January, 1945.

3. Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.

4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

Except where definite quantities are specified the Government will not be bound to order from the contractor all the articles enumerated in the schedule, but only those articles, and such quantities of those articles, as it may be found necessary to order. Should the Government, however, require a larger supply of any article than the estimated quantity stated in the schedules, the contractor will nevertheless be bound to supply the same at contract rates.

The Government reserves the right to purchase otherwise than from the contractor articles of any of the several kinds enumerated in the schedules the purchase of which is, in the opinion of the Tender Board, necessary in order to meet special circumstances or special requirements.

2. The supplies are to be the same as sample where so stated, and of the particular manufacture indicated in the schedule of tenders. In the case of different makers' goods, the contractor will be required to supply the kind ordered. *The supplies are*

to be the best quality of their several kinds or manufacture. In the event of the tender having been accepted for goods manufactured within the Commonwealth or manufactured within any other part of the British Empire (as the case may be), all such goods supplied shall, if required by the Government, bear evidence that they are of the particular manufacture tendered for, and, in addition, the contractor may at any time during the currency of the contract be called on to furnish a statutory declaration as to the country of origin of the goods supplied.

3. Except where otherwise stated in the schedule, the value of all packages, cases, casks, &c., whether bulk be broken or not, must be included in the prices stated in the contractor's tender; all such packages, &c., to be considered the property of the Government, and no charges or expenses whatsoever beyond the price tendered and set out in the schedule will be allowed to the contractor for any articles or packages, cases, casks, &c. The net weight or quantity only will be paid for. Contractors must provide, without extra charge, whatever labour may be required in the packing of stores, and the stores shall be packed in such a manner as shall secure them from injury during transit, and until delivery such stores shall be at the risk of the contractor.

4. All orders for supplies will emanate from the Education Department. The goods shall be delivered as may be directed by the officer ordering the supply.

5. Supplies ordered for delivery in the Melbourne District are to be delivered free of all charges (whether cartage, freight, &c.), and, for the purposes of these contracts, Melbourne District will include a radius of 6 miles from the Elizabeth-street Post Office. For supplies outside that radius the goods must be delivered free on rails at Flinders-street or Spencer-street Railway Stations as required.

6. Arrangements as to time of delivery and inspection of goods will be made by the Secretary, Education Department, or such other officer whom he may appoint.

7. Orders must receive prompt execution; and in the event of the goods not being delivered within forty-eight hours after the contractor shall have received the order, or within such other time as the order may specify for delivery, it will be competent for the officer named in Clause 6, or the head of the department to whom the goods are to be supplied, on giving the contractor twenty-four hours' notice, to purchase the supplies, or any like supplies that are suitable for the service, at the contractor's risk, and the extra expense incurred over and above the contract price (if any) will be deducted from the contractor's account or from the security money.

8. Delivery will not be deemed to have been made until the goods have been approved. In case of the rejection or return of any supplies, the contractor shall bear the whole cost of replacing the supplies rejected or returned, otherwise purchases will be effected at the contractor's risk and the extra expense deducted as in Clause 7.

9. The official order issued by the Education Department shall be forwarded by the contractor to the officer authorized to accept delivery, who shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods accepted and return the order to the contractor, who will attach same to his claim for payment.

10. All orders, duly receipted, shall be returned to the Education Department at the end of each month, accompanied by an account in the prescribed form for the articles supplied during the month, and, on receipt of same, the contractor shall be entitled to payment, due time to be allowed for the examination and verification of the claim.

11. The acceptance of the supplies shall be subject to the approval of the officer authorized to take delivery of the stores, or such other officer as shall be named in the schedules. Delivery of the articles will not be deemed to have been made until they have been handed in good order and condition to the head teacher of the school or such other person as may be authorized to accept delivery, &c. The contractor may, however, claim a survey on any goods objected to but in that case he must, within twenty-four hours after objection is made, give notice thereof, in writing, to the officer rejecting the goods. If, after the delivery of the supplies has been taken, any deficiency or defect is discovered therein, such deficient or defective stores may be returned to the contractor.

12. The members of Boards of survey will be appointed by the Treasurer of the State for the time being, and the decision of the Board is to be considered as final. If the Board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality it must be immediately replaced by the contractor, failing which it, or any like supply that is suitable for the service, will be procured elsewhere, and the survey fees and extra expense (if any) will be deducted as in Clause 7.

13. All goods forwarded under these contracts shall, where practicable, be forwarded by rail, and all consignments shall bear the number of the consignment notes under which they are forwarded, and also the name of the contractor, by whom consigned, on a legibly-written business label.

14. When the contractor is required to make delivery of goods at a railway station for transmission by rail, he shall obtain a receipt for the goods in duplicate on the Stores and

Transport consignment note, at the same time handing in a triplicate and quadruplicate of the form as an authority for the Railways to act as agent for, and charge the freight to, the Stores and Transport Office or such other Department as shall be named therein. He shall as soon as possible, and not later than twenty-four hours thereafter, deliver the original at the Tender Board Offices, the duplicate to be forwarded to consignee in accordance with Clause 15, and the quintuplicate to be retained by himself. Should the goods thus forwarded be rejected, the contractor must bear the cost of replacing such goods, for which service the departmental consignment note is not to be used. Any infringement of this condition will subject the contractor to such mulct as the Tender Board may recommend under Clause 17 of these conditions. Such mulct may be deducted as in clause 7.

15. Immediately after the consignment of the goods, the officer to whom they are forwarded shall be notified by the contractor, on the duplicate consignment note provided for the purpose, that the goods have been sent. On receipt of this document, the officer to whom it has been forwarded shall acknowledge thereon the receipt of the goods without delay to the Stores and Transport Office. In the event of loss through failure on the part of the contractor to comply with this condition he will be held responsible, and the amount of the loss incurred for same will be deducted as in Clause 7.

16. Should the order on the contractor specially provide that goods of a fragile character, or such as are liable to suffer loss by leakage, shall be consigned at the risk of the Railways Commissioners under special freight conditions, the contractor shall in such instance provide, in writing, on the consignment note an intimation to that effect, failing which, in the event of loss, he shall bear the whole cost of replacing the goods, the amount being deducted from the contractor's account or the security money.

17. A refusal to execute orders, irregularity in the quantity or quality of the supplies, delay in delivering or replacing them when required, or non-compliance with the terms of Clauses 14 and 15 of these conditions respecting the forwarding of consignment notes, &c., will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct not exceeding Fifty pounds as the said Treasurer may direct and the amount may be deducted as in Clause 7. It will also be in the power of the said Treasurer upon such refusal, irregularity, or delay, to terminate the contract forthwith, and declare forfeit the whole or any portion of the security money; and, in addition, the contractor will be disqualified from tendering or holding any future contract or contracts for a period of one year from the date of such disqualification.

18. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power of attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government. If it is found during the currency of the contract that the contractor has not conformed to the condition of advertisement—which stipulates that if a tenderer be a member of a firm, and such firm be interested in the contract, the tender shall be in the name of the firm, and not in that of the individual—then the said Treasurer may, on the recommendation of the Tender Board, determine the contract, and forfeit the security money.

19. The contracts entered into under these conditions are not to be considered as being broken, infringed, or vitiated by the importation of stores for the Government service, or by any contracts or purchases made by the Agent-General for Victoria, or by any contracts or agreements made for supplies to Technical Schools, or by any article being made at any Government establishment and supplied for the use of the Education Department, or by the consumption of the surplus stock of any Government establishment.

20. Notwithstanding anything contained to the contrary in section 152 of the Customs Act 1901-36, it is hereby expressly provided that upon any alteration of the duty collected affecting the goods included in this contract, the contract price shall not be altered, and the contract may be terminated at the option of either party by two months' notice in writing from the first day of the calendar month next ensuing, and within the period for which the contract is made. The contract for the unaffected items shall remain in full force and effect. Any notice to be served under this condition shall be deemed to have been duly served if sent to the contractor in a registered letter to his last-known place of business or abode.

21. Under no circumstances, other than those mentioned in Clause 20, will a contractor be permitted to abandon his contract. In the event of the contractor failing to carry on the contract, the contract security money will in that case be absolutely forfeited; and, in addition, the contractor will be held liable for any loss which the Government may sustain in consequence of such failure.

22. Should the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being decide to discontinue the use of any book, map, or any other article in the schedule, or to direct that any book, map, or any other article other than those enumerated therein be

taken into use, he shall at any time give six months' notice of such intention or decision to the contractor, and after the expiration of the period of such notice the Education Department shall not be bound to take any further supply of such book, map, or any other article, nor shall the contractor be bound to supply the same, and all books or maps not in the schedule, but which it may be decided to introduce, shall be supplied by the contractor after expiration of such notice at a price to be agreed on between the Minister of Public Instruction for the time being and the contractor.

SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

BY-LAW No. 25.

A By-law of the Shire of Cranbourne, made under the Health Acts and numbered 25, relating to the collection, disposal, and removal of refuse and rubbish.

IN pursuance of the power contained in the Health Acts and of any power thereunder enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Acts into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law, that is to say—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following areas:—

Cranbourne.—The whole of the Township of Cranbourne, together with Crown allotments 9, 10, 11, 12, 13, 14, 15, 16, Parish of Cranbourne, County of Mornington.

Koo-wee-rup.—The whole of the area described as Crown allotment 3A, Parish of Yallock, County of Mornington, and part of Crown allotments 4 and 3 as described hereunder. Commencing at a point 39 chains (opposite Denham's-road) on a line bearing S. 62 deg. 40 min. W. from the most northern corner of the aforesaid Crown allotment 4; thence bounded by lines bearing S. 27 deg. 20 min. E. 30 chains, S. 62 deg. 40 min. W. 96 chains, N. 27 deg. 20 min. E. 30 chains, N. 62 deg. 40 min. E. 96 chains to the commencing point.

Bayles.—The whole of the area described as Crown allotments 43, 43A, 43B, 17, 18, Parish of Koo-wee-rup, County of Mornington.

Lang Lang.—The whole of the Township of Lang Lang—and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

Tooradin.—Commencing at a point 6 chains west of the south-eastern corner of allotment 70, Parish of Sherwood; thence bounded by lines bearing south 80 deg. 54 min. east for a distance of 82 chains to a point on the east of Sawtell's Creek, in the Parish of Koo-wee-rup; thence by a line bearing south to Western Port Bay; thence westerly bounded by the Bay to a point directly south of the south-eastern corner of allotment 101B, Parish of Sherwood; thence along the eastern boundary of the aforesaid allotment to the north-eastern corner; thence bounded by a line bearing north 26 deg. 5 min. east 11 chains in length to the creek, and bounded by the creek north-westerly to the commencing point.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, "Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, and any person having the management thereof.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all rubbish or refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be approved by the Council, and shall be constructed of galvanized iron not less than twenty-four gauge or other approved material in such a manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than two and a half nor more than four cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. Such receptacle shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a tight-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when such refuse or rubbish is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse or rubbish in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle unless such moist refuse or rubbish has been previously strained and effectually wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council.

12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse or rubbish such receptacle to be deposited close to and on the inside of the entrance of such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse or rubbish shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into the vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council. Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle properly covered with its lid, and shall also close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle is taken.

14. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way unless with the consent, in writing, of the Council, which consent shall be only given in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such business premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for emptying.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse or rubbish shall at least once a week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse or rubbish in a suitable vehicle in such manner as not to cause a nuisance, a danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicles shall be as far as is practicable rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

17. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the depot incinerator or destructor, where as soon as practicable, the refuse and rubbish shall be re-rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method in such a manner as not to create a nuisance.

18. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse or rubbish shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse or rubbish to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

19. If any refuse or rubbish is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture such refuse and rubbish shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons employed or authorized by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved materials so as not to create a nuisance.

20. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five Pounds (£5).
