ACTS OF PARLIAMENT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, do hereby declare that I have this day assented, in His Majesty's name, to the Bills passed by the Parliament of the said State, the titles whereof are hereunder set forth, that is to say:—

No. 5015. "An Act relating to the Construction of a Railway Bridge across the River Yarra between the Railway Stations at Richmond and South Yarra, and for other purposes."

No. 5016. "An Act relating to the Borrowing Powers of the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners."

No. 5017. "An Act to amend the Water Acts."

No. 5018. "An Act to apply out of the Consolidated Revenue the sum of Eight hundred and thirty-three thousand one hundred and twelve pounds to the service of the year One thousand nine hundred and forty-three and One thousand nine hundred and forty-four."

No. 5019. "An Act to authorize the First Mildura Irrigation Trust and the Mildura Urban Water Trust to remit or excuse the Payment of Rates on account of Poverty."

4. If any person supplied with water by the Commission wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Commission may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Commission to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

Light Buoy Re-Established.

Previous Notice.—No. 9 of 1944, Victoria.

Position.—Lat. 38 deg. 5 min. 10 sec. South. Long. 144 deg. 37 min. 36 sec. East (approximate).

Details.—No. 1 Buoy, Point Richards Channel, has been re-established in above position. This buoy exhibits, at a height of 20 feet, a group flashing red light, showing two flashes every six seconds, visible 6 miles. The temporary buoy, exhibiting a flashing red light every four seconds, has been withdrawn.

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 4137.—URBAN DISTRICTS.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, hereinafter referred to as "the Commission," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following, for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Commission within the under-mentioned Urban Districts:—

1. This By-law shall apply to and have force in the Antwerp, Berriwillook, Beulah, Birchip, Brim, Chillingollah, Chinkapook, Culgoa, Dimboola, Dooen, Hopetoun, Jeparit, Jung Jung, Lalbert, Lascelles, Manangatang, Marnoo, Minyip, Nandaly, Natimuk, Nullawil, Ouyen, Patchewollock, Quambatook, Rainbow, Rupanyup, Sea Lake, Speed, Tempy, Ultima, Waitchie, Walpeup, Watchem, Woomelang, Woorinen, Wyche-
proof, and Yaapeet Urban Districts.

2. During the period commencing with the 21st day of October, 1944, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1945, no person shall—

(a) water any garden in any of the said Urban Districts, except between the hours of 5.30 o'clock in the afternoon and 7.30 o'clock in the afternoon of the same day;

(b) water any garden in any of the said Urban Districts other than by means of a hose held in the hand or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand.

3. Every person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Commission to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable

STATE RIVERS AND WATER SUPPLY COMMISSION.

BY-LAW No. 4138.—REVOKING BY-LAW No. 3921 AND AMENDING BY-LAW No. 3875.

THE State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

MINERAL EARTHS BOARD.—VARIATION OF POWERS.

WHEREAS, in pursuance of the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts for the time being in force, the Governor in Council did by an Order made on the 18th October, 1943, appoint a Wages Board described as the Mineral Earths Board, and did by subsequent Order vary the powers of the said Board: And whereas it is expedient to further vary the powers of the said Board in the manner hereinafter appearing: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, under the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, doth hereby vary the said Orders so that in substitution for the powers conferred thereby the said Mineral Earths Board shall exercise the following powers, that is to say:—

To determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed—

- (i) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing mineral earths by milling, grinding, or pulverizing rocks, earths, or clays other than mineral ores;
- (ii) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of pulverizing wood;
- (iii) in the process, trade, business, or occupation of manufacturing or preparing any insulating material fabricated from molten stone.

EXTENSION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE CHARWORKERS BOARD IS TO BE OPERATIVE AND APPOINTMENT OF A CHARWORKERS BOARD TO TAKE THE PLACE OF THE CHARWORKERS BOARD APPOINTED ON THE 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1919.

WHEREAS—

- (1) Under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts a Wages Board described as the Charworkers Board was, by Order of the Governor in Council dated the 30th September, 1919, appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Hotel Employees Board) employed at charring work in any building in which any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on;
- (2) the powers of the said Board were, by subsequent Orders varied so that the said Board shall be given power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boarding Houses Board, of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board, or of the Hotel and Restaurant Board) employed at office cleaning or general cleaning work of a like character in or about any building in which any process, trade, business, or occupation is carried on for profit;
- (3) the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Board shall be operative has been defined as the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Sandringham, and Warrnambool, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol;
- (4) it is by the Factories and Shops Acts provided that where the area or locality within which the Determination of any Wages Board is to be operative is extended the Governor in Council may, if he thinks it necessary, appoint a new Wages Board to take the place of the Wages Board the operation of whose Determination is so extended.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Extend the area or locality within which the Determination of the Charworkers Board is to be operative to include all parts of Victoria;
- (2) Order that a new Wages Board to consist of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees be constituted and appointed to take the place of the Charworkers Board appointed on the 30th September, 1919, and to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (other than persons subject to the jurisdiction of the Boarding Houses Board, of the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board, or of the Hotel and Restaurant Board) employed at office cleaning or general cleaning work of a like character in or about any building in which any process, trade, business or occupation is carried on for profit, also that such Wages Board may, in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Charworkers Board, and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

ROAD TRAFFIC (COUNTRY) REGULATIONS 1944.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Road Traffic Acts, and after consideration by the Chief Secretary of Victoria (the responsible Minister of the Crown administering such Acts) of representations made to him by the Municipal Association of Victoria, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Citation:

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Road Traffic (Country) Regulations 1944" and—

Commence-
ment.

(a) shall apply with respect to the municipal districts of all municipalities in Victoria (other than the municipalities set forth in or added to, whether before or after the commencement of the *Road Traffic (Amendment) Act 1941*, the Schedule to the *Road Traffic Act 1935*),

Interpreta-
tion.

(b) shall come into operation upon the date of the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Act" means the *Road Traffic Act 1935* and any Act amending the same.

"Driver" means the person in charge of a vehicle or a horse.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, or other place habitually used by pedestrians and not by vehicles.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Intersection" means the area embraced within the prolongation of the property lines of two or more streets which join at an angle whether or not such streets cross.

"Motor Car" has the same meaning as in the *Motor Car Acts*.

"Safety Zone" means a place of refuge for pedestrians established by the council of any municipality on any street and indicated by a post or standard placed or erected at the end thereof which is the nearer to approaching vehicular traffic and bearing the words "Safety zone" clearly visible to such traffic.

"Standard Stop Sign" means an octagonal sign not less than 2 feet between parallel sides erected so as to face oncoming traffic and so as to be clearly visible, and having on a yellow background the word "Stop" in black letters not less than 7 inches high across the face of such sign.

"Street" includes any highway, road, lane, bridge, culvert, ford, or thoroughfare other than a footway.

"Traffic-control Signal" includes any device using coloured lights or words or any combination thereof, whether operated mechanically, electrically, manually or otherwise by which traffic is directed to stop and proceed.

"Vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by human, animal, mechanical, electrical, or other power, and includes a tram motor and tram-car, but does not include a railway locomotive or other railway rolling stock.

Vehicle to
keep to the
left.

3. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street shall keep such vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the left side of the carriageway of such street. Penalty, £5.

4. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street shall—

Meeting or
passing
vehicle, &c.

(i) when such vehicle or horse approaches a vehicle, horse, or pedestrian proceeding or headed in the opposite direction keep such first-mentioned vehicle or horse on the left side of such street;

(ii) when causing such vehicle or horse to pass a vehicle (other than a tram-car), horse, or pedestrian proceeding or headed in the same direction, do so on the right side of the other vehicle, horse, or pedestrian;

- (iii) when causing such vehicle or horse to pass a tram-car proceeding or headed in the same direction, do so on the left side of such tram car.

Penalty, £5.

5. Subject to the provisions of these Regulations—

(1) The driver of a vehicle or horse upon any street, the carriageway of which has been divided into two traffic lanes by marks, lines, or other indications placed at or near the centre of such carriageway shall keep such vehicle to the left side of such marks, lines, or other indications:

Two traffic lanes.

Provided, however—

(i) That the driver of such vehicle or horse may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle or horse to or on the right side of such marks, lines, or other indications when he is overtaking or passing another vehicle or horse proceeding in the same direction;

(ii) That the driver of such vehicle or horse may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle or horse across such marks, lines, or other indications for the purpose of turning to the right into another road or street, or when crossing from the left side to the other side of such carriageway.

(2) When the driver of such vehicle or horse has driven the vehicle or horse to or on the right side of such marks, lines, or other indications for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to sub-clause (1) hereof, he shall return to the left side of such marks, lines, or other indications as soon as practicable after he has passed the other vehicle or horse proceeding in the same direction as he is proceeding.

Return to left side after passing.

(3) Whenever the carriageway of any street has been divided into more than two traffic lanes by marks, lines, or other indications placed thereon, the driver of a vehicle or horse shall keep such vehicle or horse within the lane on the left side of such carriageway:

More than two traffic lanes.

Provided that—

(i) The driver of such vehicle or horse may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle or horse into and along the next adjoining lane on his right side when he is overtaking or passing another vehicle or horse proceeding in the same direction;

(ii) The driver of such vehicle or horse may, when it is safe to do so, having regard to all the circumstances of the case, drive the vehicle or horse across the other traffic lanes on his right side for the purpose of turning to the right into another road or street or for the purpose of crossing from the left side of the carriageway to the other side.

(4) When the driver of such vehicle or horse has driven the vehicle or horse along the next adjoining lane for the purpose mentioned in paragraph (i) of the proviso to sub-clause (3) hereof, he shall go back to the traffic lane on the left side of such carriageway as soon as practicable after he has passed the other vehicle or horse proceeding in the same direction as he is proceeding.

Return to left lane after passing.

(5) Notwithstanding anything contained in this clause, the driver of a vehicle or horse upon any street the carriageway of which has been divided into traffic lanes by double longitudinal lines, comprising—

Leaving lane in which proceeding prohibited in certain cases.

(a) two continuous lines, or

(b) one continuous line and one broken or dotted line—

shall, except where a continuous line is on the right of a broken or dotted line, keep such vehicle or horse to the left side of the aforesaid double lines.

(6) The driver of a vehicle or horse shall not stop such vehicle or horse nor allow such vehicle or horse to remain stationary on any part of the carriageway of any street on which double longitudinal continuous lines or a double line comprising a continuous line and a broken or dotted line have been placed.

Stopping prohibited.

Penalty, £20.

Stop at

6. Where in any street a standard stop sign is erected near the intersection of such street with another street, the driver of any vehicle or horse proceeding along such first-mentioned street shall, on approaching the said intersection, stop such vehicle or horse before entering such intersection, except when traffic is being controlled by a member of the Police Force. Penalty, £10.

Stop before
entering

&c.

7. The driver of a vehicle or horse about to enter any street from a right-of-way, passage, yard, private drive, or building shall stop such vehicle or horse before crossing the property line of such street. Penalty, £5.

Rate of speed
to permit
immediate
stop.

8. Except as provided in clause 6 of these Regulations, the driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along any street shall, on approaching and crossing the intersection of such street with another street, proceed at such a rate of speed that he shall be able to stop immediately such vehicle or horse. Penalty, £20.

Give way to
vehicle
in or on
intersection.

9. The driver of a vehicle or horse approaching an intersection shall give the right of way to a vehicle or horse which has entered the intersection from a different street. Penalty, £5.

Give way to
vehicle
approaching
from right.

10. The driver of a vehicle or horse proceeding along any street and reaching the intersection of that street with another street at approximately the same time as another vehicle or horse approaching from his right along such last-mentioned street shall give the right of way to such other vehicle or horse:—

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply in respect of any intersection where the driver of a vehicle or horse is required, in conformity with these Regulations, to stop such vehicle or horse before entering the said intersection, or where traffic is being controlled by a member of the Police Force.

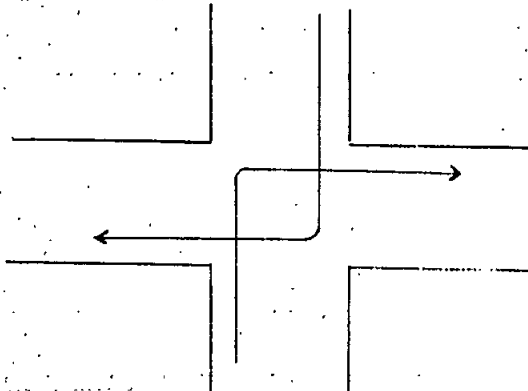

11. The driver of a vehicle or horse on any street approaching a tram-car which is stationary and headed in the same direction shall not permit any portion of such first-mentioned vehicle or horse to proceed in advance of an imaginary straight line drawn from the rear of such tram-car to the nearest point on the adjacent kerb until such tram-car has resumed its journey, and that portion of the street between the position which was occupied by such tram-car when stationary and the adjacent kerb is clear of pedestrians: Provided that it shall not be an offence under this Regulation for a driver of a vehicle or horse to cause such vehicle or horse to pass a tram-car which is stationary upon being directed so to do by a traffic control signal or by a member of the Police Force controlling traffic, or a person in uniform employed by any authority controlling tramways engaged in the discharge of his duties: Provided further that this Regulation shall not apply to that portion of Sturt-street, Ballarat, between Grenville-street and Hamilton-avenue, nor to Wendouree-parade, Ballarat, nor to Albert-street, Sebastopol. Penalty, £25.

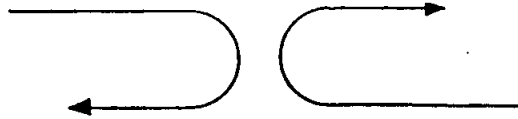
Turning to

12. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street shall, before turning such vehicle or horse to the right from such street into another street, cause such vehicle or horse to proceed along the left side of the carriageway of the street which it is leaving until such vehicle or horse is opposite the point of turning, as shown in the diagram following:—



Penalty, £10.

13. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street shall, when causing such vehicle or horse to cross from one side of such street to the other side, cause such vehicle or horse to make a complete turn, as shown in the diagram following:—



Penalty, £5.

14. No person shall drive, ride, or lead a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street in such a manner or in such order that more than two vehicles or horses are travelling side by side in the same direction: Provided that this Regulation shall not prevent three horses abreast being attached to one vehicle or a vehicle or horse from passing two bicycles travelling side by side in the same direction. Penalty, £10.

Travelling side by side.

15. No person shall, within an intersection drive, ride or lead a vehicle or horse in front of and across the course of a tram-car which has commenced to cross such intersection. Penalty, £10.

Driving in front of moving tram at intersection prohibited.

16. No person shall drive, ride, or lead a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse or any portion thereof over, along, through or on the right side of a safety zone. Penalty, £10.

Driving over through or on right of safety zone prohibited.

17. The driver of a vehicle or horse on any street shall, on the sounding of a warning instrument by a fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car, give the right of way to such fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car, and the driver of any such first-mentioned vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse shall draw such vehicle or horse as near as practicable to the left side of the carriage-way of such street and parallel thereto in order to allow such fire brigade vehicle, ambulance, or police patrol car to pass. Penalty, £10.

Give passage to fire brigade, &c.

18. The driver of a vehicle on any street shall not cause such vehicle to travel backwards unless such movement can be made with safety, having regard to the movement of traffic at the time. Penalty, £10.

Driving in reverse.

19. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse—

- (i) before stopping such vehicle or horse shall, at a distance of not less than 25 yards from the place at which he proposes so to stop, indicate his intention of so doing either by extending his right arm and raising his right hand with fingers extended and pointing upwards or by means of a mechanical signal or device approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police so that such hand signal or mechanical signal or device shall be clearly visible to the driver of any following vehicle or horse;
- (ii) before turning such vehicle or horse to his right shall, at a distance of not less than 25 yards from the point at which he proposes so to turn, indicate his intention of so doing either by extending his right arm horizontally or by means of a mechanical signal or device approved by the Chief Commissioner of Police so that such hand signal or mechanical signal or device shall be clearly visible to the driver of any following vehicle or horse.

Signal when about to stop or turn to right.

Penalty, £10.

20. No person shall drive a vehicle on any street unless such vehicle is so constructed as to enable the driver thereof to have a full and uninterrupted view of the traffic in front of him and abreast of him on each side of such vehicle, and no person, while driving a vehicle on any street, shall occupy such a position as will interrupt or interfere with his having such full and uninterrupted view as aforesaid. Penalty, £5.

Driver to have full view of traffic.

21. No person shall, on any street at one and the same time, act as driver or have sole charge of more than one vehicle drawn by animal power: Provided that the driver of a vehicle may tow one other vehicle if such last-mentioned vehicle is fastened to such first-mentioned vehicle in such a manner as to be not more than 12 feet therefrom and under the complete control of the said driver. Penalty, £5.

Driver not to have charge of more than one vehicle. Towing.

Obedience to
traffic control
signal, &c.

22. (1) Every person shall at all times observe and comply with any traffic-control signal and any signal by hand of a member of the Police Force in uniform controlling traffic on any street or footway.

(2) The display by any traffic-control signal at an intersection of—

(a) the colour amber is a signal that—

(i) the driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic-control signal shall not cause such vehicle or horse to proceed beyond the stop mark (if any) on the approach side of such intersection nor to enter such intersection until such traffic-control signal changes so as to display the colour green;

(ii) a pedestrian facing such traffic-control signal shall not proceed beyond the kerb alignment of the footway of the street which he is approaching until such traffic-control signal changes so as to display the colour green;

(b) the colour green is a signal that—

(i) the driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic-control signal shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, proceed forthwith;

(ii) a pedestrian facing such traffic-control signal and about to cross such intersection shall, subject to the provisions of these Regulations, proceed forthwith;

(c) the colour red is a signal that the driver of a vehicle or horse facing such traffic-control signal or a pedestrian facing such traffic-control signal and about to cross such intersection shall remain stationary until such traffic-control signal changes so as to display the colour green.

Penalty, £20.

Pedestrians

23. In the event of an accident, collision, commotion, congestion or obstruction to traffic on any street, any pedestrian or the driver of any vehicle or horse within the immediate vicinity shall obey the reasonable direction or instruction of a member of the Police Force. Penalty, £5.

Stopping
vehicle.

24. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) or horse on any street shall, when stopping such vehicle or horse, keep it as near as practicable to the edge of the carriageway on the left side of such street. Penalty, £5.

Unattended
vehicle to
leave ten
feet of
carriageway.

25. No person shall leave a vehicle unattended on any street in such a manner or under such conditions as to leave less than 10 feet of the width of the carriageway of such street available for the free movement of traffic. Penalty, £10.

Vehicles not
to be left
unattended
in certain
places.

26. The driver of a vehicle (other than a tram-car) shall not permit such vehicle to remain stationary in any of the following places:—

(i) within 30 feet of an intersection;

(ii) within 30 feet of a place on a tram route indicated by either of the notices "Cars Stop Here" or "Hail Cars Here" and on the side thereof which is the nearer to approaching vehicular traffic;

(iii) between a safety zone and the adjacent footway or within 20 feet of points on the kerb immediately opposite the ends of a safety zone;

(iv) within 15 feet of a fire hydrant or a postal pillar box or a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street;

(v) in front of a right-of-way, passage, or private drive;

(vi) alongside or opposite any street, excavation, or obstruction when traffic would be thereby obstructed:

Provided that this Regulation shall not apply to a fire brigade vehicle standing at or near a fire hydrant or to a postal vehicle standing at or near a postal pillar box or to a motor car whilst being supplied with petrol from a petrol pump erected on the kerb of any street or to a horse or horse-drawn vehicle which is standing at or near a trough or other fixed receptacle for the purpose of watering such horse, or to a bicycle standing in a bicycle rack erected by the Council of any municipality. Penalty, £10.

27. No person shall stop, stand, or leave a vehicle on any street for the primary purpose of displaying an advertisement. Penalty, £5.

Stopping vehicle to display advertisement prohibited.

28. No person shall, while riding a bicycle, coaster, or any toy vehicle on any street, hold on to or attach himself or such vehicle to any other vehicle. Penalty, £5.

Cyclist not to attach himself to another vehicle.

29. Every pedestrian on a footway or crossing an intersection shall keep to the left side and shall, when passing any other person, do so on the right side of such other person. Penalty, £5.

Pedestrians to keep to left.

30. Except in the case of a person passing to a safety zone or vehicle, every pedestrian shall, on leaving the footway of a street, proceed by the shortest and most direct route to the footway on the opposite side of such street. Penalty, £5.

Pedestrians crossing street.

31. Any person may at any time, when the exigencies of traffic permit, proceed across any street to or from a safety zone, and in doing so shall proceed by the shortest and most direct route from or to the footway or vehicle which he is leaving or joining. Penalty, £5.

Person passing to or from safety zone.

32. (1) Every person alighting from a vehicle on any street and not desiring to board or join another vehicle on such street shall, as soon after alighting as the exigencies of traffic permit, proceed by the shortest and most direct route to the nearest footway of such street.

Person alighting from vehicle.

(2) No person, while waiting to board or join a vehicle on any street, shall stand on any portion of the carriageway of such street (other than on a safety zone), and no person (other than a person passing to a safety zone) shall proceed towards a vehicle on any street for the purpose of boarding or joining such vehicle until it has stopped, and every person shall, when crossing any street for such purpose, proceed by the shortest and most direct route.

Person waiting to board vehicle.

(3) This Regulation shall not apply to any person employed by any authority controlling tramways engaged in the discharge of his duties. Penalty, £5.

33. No person shall alight from or board or join a vehicle which is in motion: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply in the case of any person employed by an authority controlling tramways engaged in the discharge of his duties. Penalty, £5.

Alighting from or joining vehicle in motion prohibited.

34. No person shall ride on any portion of a tram-car not designed or intended for the carriage of passengers: Provided that this Regulation shall not apply in the case of any person employed by any authority controlling tramways engaged in the discharge of his duties. Penalty, £5.

Riding on certain portions of tram-car prohibited.

35. No person shall place, maintain, or display on any street or in view of any person on any street any light, sign, signal, or design which purports to be or is an imitation of or resembles a traffic-control signal or which obscures from view a traffic-control signal. Penalty, £10.

Imitation of or obscuring traffic control signal prohibited.

36. No unauthorized person shall wilfully deface, injure, move, obstruct, or interfere with any traffic-control signal or traffic sign or notice. Penalty, £10.

Interference with traffic control signal prohibited.

37. Every person who fails to comply with or commits a breach of any of the provisions of these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence.

Offences.

38. Where a penalty is set out in any clause of these Regulations, it is the maximum penalty prescribed in respect of any person committing a breach of such clause.

Penalties.

And the Honorable Herbert John Thornhill Hyland, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

CITY OF KEW.

BY-LAW No. 76.

Further amending By-law No. 66 (as that By-law was amended by By-law No. 74) relating to the Erection, &c., of Buildings.

A By-law of the City of Kew, made under sections 197, 198, and 217 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by the *Local Government Acts 1934, 1938, 1941, and 1942*, the *Health Act 1928*, and every other power enabling the making of this By-law, for the purposes of repealing, altering, and substituting other provisions in place of certain provisions in By-law No. 66 (as that By-law was amended by By-law No. 74) of the City of Kew relating to the following purposes, namely:—

- (a) regulating, restricting, restraining, or prohibiting the erection, construction, use, occupation, conversion, and alteration of, and every addition to, buildings or erections, and regulating, restraining, or prohibiting the erection and construction of hoardings;
- (b) prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of buildings, roofs, or chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes;
- (c) requiring any work or thing to be executed or done of such materials within such time or in such manner as may be directed or approved in any particular case by the Council or any officer or person authorized in that behalf by the Council;
- (d) leaving any matter or thing in relation to the erection and construction of buildings to be from time to time determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council by resolution or by any officer authorized in that behalf by the Council either generally or for any class of cases or in any particular case.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, as amended by the *Local Government Acts 1934, 1938, 1941, and 1942*, the *Health Act 1928*, and every other power enabling them in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Kew order as follows:—

Operation.

This By-law, save as is otherwise expressed in any clause hereof, shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the City of Kew.

Flats.

1. In clause 22 of By-law No. 66, as amended by By-law No. 74, there shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (b) of paragraph (3) the following new sub-paragraph:—

Walls, &c., to be Fire-resisting.

- (ba) Every portion of the external and party walls, the floors (other than the ground floor), and the stairways, partitions of the building shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or other similar hard fire-resisting material, as approved by the Surveyor.

Attached Houses.

2. In clause 24 of By-law No. 66, as amended by By-law No. 74, there shall be inserted after sub-paragraph (d) of paragraph (2) the following new sub-paragraph:—

Walls, &c., to be Fire-resisting.

- (da) Every portion of the external and party walls, the floors (other than the ground floor), and the stairways, and partitions of the building shall be constructed of brick, stone, concrete, or other similar hard fire-resisting material, as approved by the Surveyor.

This By-law and By-laws 66 and 74 to be Read Together.

From and after the coming into operation of this By-law By-law No. 66 as amended by By-law No. 74 and by this By-law shall be read and construed together and take effect as one By-law, and in particular, wherever the context so admits, the expression "This By-law" wherever used in By-law No. 66 as amended by By-law No. 74 shall mean By-law No. 66 as amended by By-law No. 74 and by this By-law.

BY-LAW No. 265.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 265, to amend or add to By-law No. 220.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts* and every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne orders as follows:—

1. This By-law shall from and after the date of the same coming into operation be read and construed as one with By-law No. 220 intitled—

"A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act 1928* (19 George V., No. 3720) and Part IV. of the *Health Act 1928* (19 George V., No. 3697), and numbered 220, to amend and consolidate the By-laws for regulating and restraining and erection and construction, or alteration of buildings, erections, or hoardings, and for other purposes" and any By-laws amending the same.

2. A builder may, with the consent in writing of the Council, erect or construct on any open space exclusively belonging to a dwelling house erected prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and having immediately prior to such coming into operation no bathroom or washhouse, a building or addition for use as a bathroom or washhouse by the occupiers of such dwelling house notwithstanding that the area of such open space may be less than or may by such erection or construction be reduced to an area less than the area of such open space which would be required by By-law No. 220 or any By-law amending the same in respect of a new dwelling house to be erected on the same site.

A By-law of the Shire of Berwick, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for regulating the lighting or burning of inflammable and other materials and suppressing nuisances caused by the lighting or burning of inflammable and other materials.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and of any other power in that behalf of enabling, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Berwick order as follows:—

1. In this By-law unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter:—

"Inflammable material" shall include sawdust, bark, bark strippings, and waste materials from timber mills.

2. No owner or occupier of any land within the Shire of Berwick shall keep, store, light, burn, or permit to be kept stored, lit, or burnt on such land any inflammable material or substance or any material or substance which is likely to burn or smoulder, unless such material or substance is placed in a furnace, chimney, fireplace, receptacle, or other container so designed as to make impossible the escape therefrom of any smoke, dust, grit, ash, or other particles of solid matter.

Provided, however, that nothing herein contained shall apply to any material or substance lit or burnt in a chimney, fireplace, or furnace forming part of a private dwelling-house or shop in the Shire of Berwick.

3. Any person doing or causing or permitting to be done anything forbidden under this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

SHIRE OF DANDENONG.

BY-LAW No. 81.

A By-law of the Shire of Dandenong, made under Part VII., Division 1, of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 81, for regulating traffic and the driving of cattle to and from the Dandenong Market, and within the East and West Ridings of the said Shire.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other Act or power enabling in that behalf, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Dandenong order as follows:—

1. By-law No. 64 is hereby repealed.
2. Cattle.—In this By-law "cattle" includes horses, mares, fillies, foals, geldings, colts, bulls, bullocks, cows, heifers, steers, calves, asses, mules, sheep, ewes, wethers, rams, lambs, goats, and swine.
3. No person shall drive or cause any cattle to be driven through or in any portion of the East and West Ridings of the Shire of Dandenong, save and except as hereunder mentioned, that is to say—
 - (a) The streets set forth in the First Schedule of this by-law may be used for such purposes at any time.
 - (b) The streets set forth in the Second Schedule of this By-law may be used for such purposes only between the hours of six o'clock in the afternoon and nine o'clock in the forenoon.
4. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the East and West Ridings of the Shire of Dandenong, and shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
5. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five Pounds.

SHIRE OF WOORAYL.

BY-LAW No. 24.

Removal and Destruction of Refuse or Rubbish.

A By-law of the Shire of Woorayl, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Acts*, and numbered 24, for:—

- (i) Prohibiting the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (ii) prohibiting or regulating the deposit or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
- (iii) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Acts*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Woorayl order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any street, road, lane, or passage within the municipal district of the Shire of Woorayl.
2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land within the said Municipal District.
3. The owner or occupier of any land upon which any refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left shall remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish within four days after the service on such owner or occupier of a notice, in writing, from the Council over the signature of the Shire Secretary, requiring such owner or occupier so to do.
4. In the event of default being made by such owner or occupier in complying with such notice within the time aforesaid, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the Council may, by its Inspector, with a sufficient number of workmen, enter upon any land upon which refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left, and for that purpose break down any fence surrounding the said land on which such refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left, and remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish, and any expenses incurred by the Council in so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the Council on demand, and in default of payment such expenses may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier in a Court of Petty Sessions.

5. Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction, or order imposed, or made on, or against such person by any Court, such person shall be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day such offence is continued.

6. In this By-law the words "street," "road," "lane," or "passage" shall mean and include any street, road, lane, or passage within the said municipal district, whether or not the same be a public highway or set out on private property, or made or unmade, or under the care and management of the Council.

7. (a) Every notice which by this By-law is required to be given to the owner or occupier of any land shall be addressed to the owner or occupier of such land, and shall:—

- (i) If such owner or occupier and his residence in either case are known to the Council, be served on such owner or occupier, or left with some adult inmate of his abode.
- (ii) If such owner and his residence are not known to the Council, be served on the occupier (if any) of such land or left with some adult inmate of his abode, or if there is no occupier, be put up on some conspicuous part of such land.
- (iii) If such occupier and his residence are not known to the Council, be put on some conspicuous part of such land.

7. (b) But any such notice may also be served by post, by prepaid letter addressed to such owner or occupier; and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was addressed to the usual or last known place of abode or business of such owner or occupier, and was put into the post.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Shire of Woorayl.
