#### REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Workers' Compensation Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):

The "Worker's Compensation Regulations 1942," made by the Governor in Council on the 13th day of January, 1942, and published in the Government Gazette of the 14th day of January, 1942, are hereby amended as follows:—

(1) Clause 11 of the said Regulations is hereby revoked, and the following substituted therefor:—

11. Subject to the minima provided in Regulation 12 of these Regulations, the rates of premium to be charged in connexion with State Accident Insurance Contracts in ordinary cases shall not exceed in respect of every £100 or fraction thereof paid in wages, salaries, and other earnings, the maximum rate shown in the table following according to the category in which, in the opinion of the Commissioner, the risk should be classified. Provided always that the Commissioner shall have power to vary any rates where in his discretion it appears necessary or desirable so to do.
