## DETERMINATION OF THE HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM ATTENDANTS BOARD.

NOTE.—This Determination applies to the whole of the State.

IN accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which now has power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons (not including professional employees and not including nurses subject to the Hospital Nurses Board) employed in or about—

- (a) a hospital, benevolent asylum or convalescent home doing any kind of work connected with the carrying on of a hospital, benevolent asylum, or convalescent home;
- (b) a sanatorium for the treatment of persons suffering from any form of tuberculosis;
- (c) a hospital or home for the treatment of the mentally afflicted doing any kind of work connected with the carrying on of such hospital or home;

has made the following Determination, namely:—

1. That on the 27th September, 1944, the last previous Determination of this Board shall be revoked and replaced by this Determination.

- (ii) Apprentices bound to the trade of hospital cooking subject to the conditions prescribed hereunder:—

- (a) Only a female between the ages of 16 years and 18 years (both inclusive) at the time of signing indentures and who has already completed the first year of an approved course with a school of Domestic Economy is eligible for binding as an apprentice under this scheme. During the course of her apprenticeship she shall be required to do only such work as is consistent with the course undertaken at the school.
- (b) During the currency of the indentures the apprentice shall attend evening classes at the said school in order to complete the prescribed course of training.
- (c) For the purposes of this clause "prescribed course" shall be a course of training decided by the Principal of the Training School concerned, subject to approval by the Wages Board. Upon such approval being given by the Wages Board the Chairman shall approve of same on sufficient copies to enable each member of the Board and the Principal of each Training School to be supplied with one.
- (d) Until further order schools approved by the Wages Board for the purpose of this scheme of apprenticeship shall be:—
  - (i) The Emily McPherson College of Domestic Economy, Melbourne, and
  - (ii) The Gordon Institute of Technology, Geelong.
- (e) The wages of apprentices shall be:—

- (f) On completion on her term of apprenticeship an employee shall be entitled irrespective of her age to be paid not less than the appropriate wage for adult employees for the class of work done.
- (g) A form of indenture has been prescribed by the Board.

\* The minimum wage where the employer boards and lodges the employee shall in the case of an adult male employee be 18s. per week less, and in the case of an adult female employee or an apprentice or improver 16s. per week less than the rate fixed without board and lodging.

A war loading of 2s. 6d. has been included in all rates for apprentices and improvers as shown above. Such war loading is not adjustable and shall not be taken into account when computing the penal rate payable for overtime or for work done on a public holiday mentioned in clause 11.

A war loading of 5s. has been included in each wage rate shown in sub-clauses (a) and (b) of this clause. Such war loading is not adjustable and shall not be taken into account when computing the penal rate payable for overtime or for work done on a public holiday mentioned in clause 11.

## MEAL INTERVAL.

3. A meal interval of not less than 30 minutes shall be allowed each employee during each shift. Such meal interval shall not be counted as time worked.

## TIME OFF.

4. All employees shall receive a period of not less than 26 hours off duty in each week provided that the employee shall not be required to work more than eight consecutive days without such period off duty.

## OVERTIME.

5. The following overtime rates shall be paid for all work done:—

(a) Within a spread of 12 hours from the time of commencing work on any day—

(i) In excess of the rostered hours for a day's work .. .. . } Time and a half.

(ii) In excess of the number of hours fixed as a week's work .. .. . } Double time

(b) Outside a spread of 12 hours from the time of commencing work on any day .. .. . } Double time

Overtime worked shall be paid for, and an employee shall not be allowed or required to take time off in lieu thereof.

## A FULL WEEK'S WAGES TO BE PAID.

6. Any employee (other than a casual worker) willing to work who works for less than the full working week, viz., 44 hours in the case of seamstresses and 48 hours in all other cases, shall be entitled to the payment of a full week's wage.

## CASUAL LABOUR.

7. A casual employee, i.e., a person who is employed for not more than 18 hours per week, shall be paid per hour an amount equal to  $1\frac{1}{10}$  of the weekly rate prescribed by this Determination for the work performed divided by 44 in the case of seamstresses and 48 in all other cases.

## RISK RATE.

8. Persons (other than dressers doing venereal diseases work for whom provision is already made in clause 2) shall in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 2 be paid allowances as follows whilst:—

## NAUSEOUS WORK.

9. All male employees not provided for in clause 8 who handle linen of a nauseous nature, other than linen bagged or packed in containers, shall be paid at the rate of 5s. per week in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 2.

## ANNUAL LEAVE.

10. Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted by such employer two week's leave (of seven days' each) in each year on full pay, without any deduction for board and lodging. Such payment shall be made to the employee before the commencement of the annual leave period concerned.

Provided that any employee who leaves or is dismissed for any reason (other than misconduct) after six months' continuous service in any qualifying twelve monthly period, shall in lieu of annual leave, receive a pro rata payment, based on the amount payable for the leave prescribed herein for a full twelve months' continuous service, and the period actually served.

## PUBLIC HOLIDAYS.

11. Employees shall be entitled to the following holidays without deduction of pay:—New Year's Day, Australia Day, Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day (within a radius of 20 miles of the General Post Office, Melbourne), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day, but if any other day be by Act of Parliament or Proclamation substituted for any of these holidays employees shall be entitled to the days so substituted.

Provided that if an employee works on any of such holidays or such holiday occurs on his or her rostered day off or during his or her period of annual leave he or she shall be given—

(a) within four weeks following the date on which such holiday occurred—

- (1) one extra day's pay, or  
(2) equal time off in lieu thereof, or

(b) one day shall be added to his or her annual leave.

## SICK LEAVE.

12. (a) In the event of an employee becoming sick and certified as such by the Medical Superintendent or by a Medical Practitioner approved by the institution or in an institution where there is no Medical Superintendent by a qualified Medical Practitioner approved by the institution, he or she shall be entitled to sick leave on full pay as follows :—

- (i) During the first year of service in an institution—one day for each month of service.
- (ii) During the second, third, and fourth years of service in an institution—fourteen days in each year.
- (iii) Thereafter—twenty-one days in each year.

Sick leave shall be in addition to the annual leave provided in clause 10.

Provided that an employee may be absent through sickness for one day without furnishing evidence of such sickness as provided in sub-clause (a) hereof on not more than three occasions in any one year of service.

(b) If the full period of sick leave as prescribed in sub-clause (a) hereof is not taken in any year, such portion as is not taken shall be cumulative from year to year up to a period not exceeding forty-two days, which shall be the maximum amount of leave to which an employee shall be entitled in any year without deduction of pay.

For the purposes of this sub-clause, service prior to the 28th June, 1943, shall be disregarded.

(c) Notwithstanding any other provision in this clause an employee who contracts an infectious disease in the course of his or her duties and same having been certified to by the Medical Superintendent or by a Medical Practitioner approved by the institution shall receive full pay during the necessary period off duty up to but not exceeding a period of three months.

## EMPLOYEES ENGAGED ON NIGHT DUTY.

13. For any period of not less than 3 hours worked by females between the hours of 8 p.m. and 8 a.m. and by males between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. an amount of 6d. for each such period shall be paid in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 2 of this Determination.

## EARLY MORNING DUTY.

14. Employees (other than employees referred to in clause 13) who commence duty on any day between the hours of 5 a.m. and 6.30 a.m. shall be paid an amount of 5d. for each of such days in addition to the rates prescribed in clause 2 of this Determination.

## TIME BOOK.

15. Every employer shall provide and cause to be kept a time book or other record in which each employee shall daily enter his or her starting and finishing times.

Such time book or other record shall be available for inspection to the General Secretary of The Hospital, Dispensary, and Asylum Employees' and Allied Government Officers' Federation.

## ROSTER.

16. A weekly roster setting out employees' weekly and daily working hours, times of commencing duty, meal intervals, time off duty and time of ending duty shall be kept posted or affixed in some conspicuous part of the premises in which persons subject to this determination are employed where it may be readily seen by such employees and the Secretary of the Hospital, Dispensary and Asylum Employees and Allied Government Officers' Federation of Australia, No. 1 Victorian Branch.

## DRESSING ROOMS, ETC.

17. Dressing rooms, rest rooms, bathrooms or shower rooms, and lunch rooms, shall be provided for non-resident employees, and suitable healthy accommodation for resident employees.

## UNIFORMS, ETC.

18. Uniforms, overalls, caps, and aprons, shall be provided and laundered free of cost for employees required to wear same.

## RUBBER GLOVES, ETC.

19. Rubber gloves and all necessary safety appliances shall be provided free of cost for the use of employees and an adequate supply of same shall be maintained.

## TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

20. Except where the conduct of an employee justifies instant dismissal, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or employee, or one week's wages paid or forfeited as the case may be in lieu of such notice.

## UNION INTERVIEWS.

21. During working hours employees of any establishment subject to this Determination may, with the consent of the person in charge of such establishment (which consent shall not be unreasonably withheld) be interviewed by the Secretary or Organizer of the Hospital, Dispensary, and Asylum Employees and Allied Government Officers' Federation of Australia, No. 1 Victorian Branch, or have their Union contributions collected by the steward of the said organization.

## DEFINITION.

22. For the purpose of this Determination "experience" referred to in clause 2 means experience at such work in any hospital or institution subject to this Determination.

NOTE.—Section 174 of the Factories and Shops Acts provides: Where any person is employed to perform two or more classes of work to which a rate fixed by a Wages Board is applicable then such person shall be paid in respect of the time occupied in each class of work at the rate fixed by the Board for such work.

## PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES.

23. The wages rates set out in clause 2 are based upon the following basic wage rates and pursuant to the provisions of Section 21 of the Factories and Shops Act 1934, shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time as such basic wage rates.

The basic wage rates hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 24.

## ADJUSTMENT OF WAGE RATES.

24. (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in November, 1944, the wages rates hereinbefore prescribed, shall be paid.

(b) During each future period of or near a quarter beginning with the first pay period to commence in a November, a February, a May, or an August, the amounts of the said rates shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's 'All Items' retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) Adjustment is to be based upon the equating of index number 1,000 with a needs basic wage of 81s., the amount assessed upon that number of the Commonwealth Statistician's declared needs basic wage per week for an adult male.
- (2) The index number for Melbourne is to be applied.
- (3) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of or near a quarter for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
- (4) The amount of addition or deduction assigned in the following table (or in any extension thereof) to the index number division comprising such number is to be ascertained.
- (5) That the assigned amount shall for work done during such period of or near a quarter be added to or deducted from the originally prescribed amounts of the rates in accordance with that table.
- (6) The division called "original" in the following table is that for the amount of the needs basic wage upon which the rates are to be deemed to have been originally prescribed:—

#### MURTOA WATERWORKS TRUST.

##### BY-LAW No. 7.

THE Murtoa Waterworks Trust, hereinafter referred to as "the Trust," in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following for preventing the waste or misuse of water supplied by the said Trust within the Murtoa Urban District:—

1. During the period commencing with the 8th day of November, 1944, and ending with the 30th day of June, 1945, no person shall—

- (a) water any garden, except between the hours of Six o'clock in the afternoon and Eight o'clock in the afternoon of the same day;
- (b) water any garden, other than by means of a hose, held in hand, or by means of a can or other vessel, held in the hand.

2. Every person who shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law, shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

3. If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does, or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the

pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

## REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE METROPOLITAN MILK SUPPLY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by Part I. of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1943* (No. 4997), His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. The Regulations made on the 25th September, 1939, under section 97 of the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1928* are hereby repealed.

2. These Regulations may be cited as the "Metropolitan Milk Supply Regulations."

3. In these Regulations—

"Dairy" means any premises (not being solely a dairy farm or factory) where milk is kept for sale or where any dairy produce is prepared for sale and includes a house trade dairy, a milk shop, and a milk depot.

"Dairy farm" means any premises where cows are milked or kept for the purpose of producing milk either for sale or for preparing any dairy produce for sale and includes the animals thereon.

"Dairy farmer" means the owner of a dairy farm.

"Dairyman" means the owner of a dairy.

"Dairy produce" means milk, cream, butter, cheese, or any article derived or prepared from milk or cream.

"Metropolis" means the municipal districts as defined under the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1943* (No. 4997).

"Milk" means anything purporting to be milk.

"Milk depot" means any premises prescribed as a milk depot under the *Milk and Dairy Supervision Act 1943* (No. 4997).

"Officer" means any officer appointed under the Milk and Dairy Supervision Acts.

"Owner" includes occupier or person in charge, owner's agent, or manager, and, in the case of a body corporate or incorporate, the manager, secretary, or other controlling officer thereof.

"Pasteurization" when used in relation to milk intended for human consumption, means the process of heating every particle of milk once only to—

(a) 145 deg. Fahrenheit and holding at such temperature for at least 30 minutes, or

(b) 162 deg. Fahrenheit and holding at such temperature for at least 15 seconds,

in equipment approved by the Superintendent of Dairying and immediately afterwards cooling to a temperature not greater than 38 deg. Fahrenheit.

"Pasteurize" and "pasteurized" shall have a corresponding meaning.

"Production" includes manufacture, storage, treatment, preparation or other handling of dairy produce, and "produced" has a corresponding meaning.

4. No holder of a dairy farm permit or milk depot permit shall use in the production of dairy produce any receptacle, utensil, appliance, or equipment which is not in a clean and sterile condition.

5. The maximum temperature at which milk shall be kept by any dairy farmer forthwith after production until disposed of to a milk depot or to a dairy within the metropolis, or to a dairy from which milk is sold or distributed within the metropolis, shall be the temperature of the coolest water available on the farm on which such milk is produced.

6. No dairyman shall sell any milk unless such milk is below a temperature of 58 deg. Fahrenheit.

7. Every owner of a milk depot shall cool forthwith on its receipt from a dairy farm, all milk intended for consumption within the metropolis, to a temperature of 38 deg. Fahrenheit or less and maintain it at such temperature until its despatch to the metropolis.

Provided that where the milk is to be pasteurized and such process is completed within two hours of the receipt of the milk at the depot it need not be cooled before pasturization.

8. Every holder of a dairy farm permit shall forward immediately after production all milk intended for consumption in the metropolis.

Provided that after the 30th day of April and before the 15th day of September in each year, milk produced on the afternoon of any day may be forwarded with the morning's milk of the following day.

9. Every owner of a milk depot shall forward direct to the metropolis all milk intended for consumption therein, within twelve hours of its delivery to such depot from a dairy farm.

10. No owner of a milk depot shall receive direct from the holder of a dairy farm permit any milk intended for consumption in the metropolis that arrives thereat later than 11 a.m. in respect of the morning's milk of that day or later than 8.30 p.m. in respect of the afternoon's milk of that day.

Provided that after the 30th day of April and before the 15th day of September in each year, milk produced during the afternoon of any day may be received as late as 11 a.m. on the following day.

11. No owner of a dairy in the metropolis or of a dairy from which milk is sold or distributed in the metropolis shall receive direct from the holder of a dairy farm permit any milk intended for consumption in the metropolis that arrives thereat later than 12 noon in respect of the morning's milk of that day or later than 9.30 p.m. in respect of the afternoon's milk of that day.

Provided that after the 30th day of April and before the 15th day of September in each year milk produced during the afternoon of any day may be received as late as 12 noon on the following day.

12. Every milk carrier shall ensure that all milk collected by him is transported without unreasonable delay to its destination and in respect of—

(a) Milk from a dairy farm being transported to a milk depot that not more than four hours elapses between the time of its collection from the dairy farmer and its delivery to such milk depot.

(b) Milk from a milk depot or direct from a dairy farm being transported to a dairy within the metropolis or to a dairy from which milk is sold or distributed in the metropolis, that not more than five hours elapses between the time of its collection from the milk depot or the dairy farmer and its delivery to any such dairy.

13. No person engaged in the transport of milk from a dairy farm to a milk depot shall deliver thereto later than 11 a.m. in respect of the morning's milk of that day or later than 8.30 p.m. in respect of the afternoon's milk of that day, any milk intended for consumption in the metropolis.

Provided that after the 30th day of April and before the 15th day of September in each year milk produced during the afternoon of any day may be delivered as late as 11 a.m. on the following day.

14. No person engaged in the transport of milk from a dairy farm to a dairy within the metropolis or to a dairy from which milk is sold or distributed in the metropolis shall deliver thereto later than noon in respect of the morning's milk of that day or later than 9.30 p.m. in respect of the afternoon's milk of that day any milk intended for consumption in the metropolis.

Provided that after the 30th day of April and before the 15th day of September in each year milk produced during the afternoon of any day may be delivered as late as noon on the following day.

15. Any owner of a dairy farm, dairy, or milk depot, and any employee thereat who—

(a) furnishes any certificate, report, return, or account sales, which is not to the best of his belief true and correct in all particulars,

(b) replies falsely to any officer in inquiries which such officer deems it necessary to make in the course of his duty, or

(c) refuses to make available for inspection by an officer the account sales of any dairy, dairy farm, or milk depot for milk sold by or purchased from him or otherwise render assistance to an officer in the carrying out of his duty,

shall be guilty of a breach of these Regulations.

16. No dairy farmer shall sell to a dairyman or owner of a milk depot, any milk which at the time of delivery thereto contains more than 200,000 individual bacteria per millilitre or in which the number of groups of bacteria exceeds 60,000 per millilitre as determined in each case by the prescribed direct microscopic count method.

17. No owner of a milk depot shall sell to a dairyman or owner of another milk depot any milk which at the time of delivery thereto contains more than 300,000 individual bacteria per millilitre or in which the groups of bacteria exceeds 90,000 per millilitre as determined in each case by the prescribed direct microscopic count method.

18. No dairyman shall sell for consumption as milk any milk which contains more than 500,000 individual bacteria per millilitre or more than 150,000 groups of bacteria per millilitre as determined in each case by the prescribed direct microscopic count method.

19. No dairyman shall sell for consumption as milk any milk in which may be detected by the prescribed Coli Test any Coliform bacterial in one one-hundredth part of a millilitre.

20. No person shall pasteurize any milk that contains more than 300,000 individual bacteria per millilitre or in which the number of groups of bacteria exceeds 90,000 per millilitre as determined in each case by the prescribed direct microscopic count method.

21. Any owner of a dairy or milk depot receiving milk from the holder of a permit shall, upon receiving notice that such permit has been cancelled or suspended, forthwith cease to receive milk therefrom until the permit has been renewed or until the period of suspension has expired. Such notice may be given to the owner or such dairy or milk depot verbally or in writing by an officer, or in writing posted by registered letter.

22. Every application for a dairy farm permit shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in Schedule 1 of these Regulations.

23. Every application for a milk depot permit shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in Schedule 2 of these Regulations.

24. Every dairy farm permit shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in Schedule 3 of these Regulations.

25. Every milk depot permit shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in Schedule 4 of these Regulations.

26. The following are the conditions that shall be contained in a dairy farm permit and subject to which such permit may be granted:—

1. All milk shall be produced and forwarded in accordance with the requirements of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Acts and the Regulations thereunder.
2. The milk shall be the normal product of healthy cows and wholly derived from the herd maintained on the premises to which the permit applies.
3. The milk shall be cleanly produced and free from excessive sediment or other foreign matter.
4. The milk shall be pure, sweet, and unadulterated new milk without the addition of any preservative.
5. The milk shall comply with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations under the Health Act.

6. No milk produced at one milking period shall be mixed with milk of another period. Milk of each period shall be forwarded to the milk depot or dairy in separate cans each can being clearly labelled "morning milk" or "afternoon milk," as the case may be.
7. This permit is not transferable to any other person or premises and remains the property of the Department of Agriculture to whom it must be returned on demand.
27. The following are the conditions that shall be contained in a milk depot permit and subject to which such permit may be granted:—
  1. All milk shall be received, treated, stored, and forwarded in accordance with the requirements of the Milk and Dairy Supervision Acts and the Regulations thereunder.
  2. All milk forwarded to the metropolis shall be pure, unadulterated new milk, sweet and clean, with all its cream content and without the addition of any preservative. It shall comply with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations under the Health Act, 1931 as amended.
  3. This permit is not transferable to any other person or premises and remains the property of the Department of Agriculture to whom it must be returned on demand.

ADJUSTMENT OF OUTSTANDING LIABILITY FOR THE COST OF WORKS.

WHEREAS by section 2 of the *Water Act* 1943 (No. 4983) it is provided that within twelve months after the commencement of the said Act the Governor in Council may, by Order published in the *Government Gazette*, adjust the outstanding liability as on the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, for the cost of works (excluding free headworks) under the jurisdiction and control of the Commission serving any Urban District of a Waterworks District or any Urban Division of an Irrigation and Water Supply District to an extent which would in the opinion of the Governor in Council enable the water rate (including the minimum amounts of such rate) in such District or Division to be reduced by thirty-three and one-third per centum (but so that such reduction does not bring the rate below one shilling and four pence in the pound or the minimum amount of rate in respect of land on which there is a building below fifteen shillings or the minimum amount of rate in respect of land on which there is no building below ten shillings) as compared with the water rate (including minimum amounts of such rate) in force on the said thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three: And whereas it is provided that the amount by which the liability is adjusted as aforesaid shall forthwith be transferred to the account in the books of the Commission called the "Capital Expenditure borne by the State Account": Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof and in pursuance of the provisions of the said section, doth hereby transfer from the capital accounts of the Urban Districts and Divisions named in the Schedule hereto to the "Capital Expenditure borne by the State Account" the amounts of capital liability set out in Column 4 opposite their respective names in the said Schedule, and as on and from the thirtieth day of June, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, such amounts shall be deemed to be so transferred.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS IN SUCH PORTION OF THE SHIRE OF MORNINGTON AS IS WITHIN A RADIUS OF ONE AND A HALF MILES OF THE MORNINGTON RAILWAY STATION.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby revoke, as from and inclusive of the eighth day of January, 1945, the Regulations made on the sixth day of January, 1915, directing that all shops (except shops for the sale of fresh uncooked meat, hairdressers' shops, and shops of the classes or kinds mentioned in the Fourth Schedule to the Factories and Shops Act 1912, as amended by the Factories and Shops Acts Amendment Act 1914), within the portion of the Municipal District of the Shire of Mornington, within a radius of one and a half miles of the Mornington Railway Station, shall be exempted from the Saturday Half-holiday, and fixing the closing hours of all such shops on Saturdays, Fridays, and Wednesdays.

RESCISSION OF EXEMPTION FROM SATURDAY HALF-HOLIDAY AND REGULATION OF CERTAIN SHOPS WITHIN THE TOWNSHIP OF SHEPPARTON.

10. (1) Every person carrying on the trade of cow-keeper, dairyman, or purveyor of milk within the Shire of Belfast shall, on or before the thirtieth day of September in each year, register himself or herself with the Council of the Shire of Belfast in manner following, that is to say:—

(i) By delivering to the Secretary of the said Council an application in the form set out in the Schedule hereto.

(ii) By paying to the said Council the fee for such registration provided by clause 10 (2) of this By-law.

10. (2) The fee payable, pursuant to clause 10 (ii) of this By-law, shall be as follows:—

(a) Where the person applying to be registered keeps or intends to keep cows, and the maximum number of cows to be kept during the period of twelve months from the first day of October in the year in which the application is delivered as aforesaid—

(i) Does not exceed four—the sum of two shillings.

(ii) Exceeds four—the sum of two shillings, together with the sum of three pence for each cow in excess of four, provided that in no case shall the fee payable exceed Two pounds.

- (b) If the person applying to be registered does not keep cows, the sum of Ten shillings
- (c) Any person who fails to register himself or herself as aforesaid or who knowingly makes any false or incorrect statement in any application made pursuant to this By-law, shall be guilty of a breach of this By-law.
- (d) If any person commit a breach of any provision of this By-law, he or she shall, for every such breach, be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds nor less than Five shillings, or to a penalty of not more than One pound nor less than Five shillings for each day during which such breach shall be committed or continued.
