REGULATIONS.—CHAPTER XII.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, here amends Chapter XII. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

For-

Clauses: 3, 5, 6, 9, 11, and 44.

Read-

3. Hours of Business.—The hours of attendance to be observed by officers shall, unless otherwise ordered, be as follows, viz.:—

In the Metropolitan District-.

Monday to Friday (inclusive)—from 8.45 a.m. to 4.45 p.m. Saturday—from 8.45 a.m. to 11.45 a.m.

Outside the Metropolitan District-

Monday to Friday (inclusive)—from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday—from 9 a.m. to 12 noon.

For the purpose of these Regulations, Metropolitan District shall be the district defined by Section 82 of the Factories and Shops Act 1928.

- 5. Attendance books: when accessible.—Attendance books shall be accessible for record and signature by officers up to 8.50 a.m. daily in the case of officers in the Metropolitan District, and up to 9.5 a.m. daily in the case of officers outside the Metropolitan District, when such books shall be withdrawn, and shall not be produced for recording departures until the proper time for ceasing work.
- 6. Officers arriving late at their offices.—Any officer arriving at his office after 8.50 a.m., if the office is situated in the Metropolitan District, and after 9.5 a.m., if the office is situated outside the Metropolitan District, shall report himself to the officer-in-charge or sub-charge, who shall record the time of his arrival in the attendance book.
- 9. Time allowed for lunckeon.—Except as specified in Part IV., one hour will be allowed to every officer for lunckeon, from 1 p.m. to 2 p.m.; during this time officers may leave their offices, unless, for the better transaction of public business, any officer is required by the Permanent Head or the Head of the Branch to attend to duty.

The officer-in-charge of each room shall report to the Head of the Branch or of the Department all cases in which officers have not returned to duty after luncheon, at 2 p.m.

11. Tea Money.—An allowance, to procure a meal, of two shillings and sixpence may be paid to officers who are required to work after office hours, provided that no payment shall be made unless an officer works after 4.45 p.m. in the case of officers in the Metropolitan District, or after 5 p.m. in the case of officers outside the Metropolitan District, for at least two hours in addition to the interval taken for tea.

Such payment may, however, be made to warders who are required to remain continuously on duty at the Law Courts later than 6.30 p.m.

Officers in charge are to watch carefully that no abuse of this regulation is permitted.

- 1. This By-law shall come into operation at such time as the Council from time to time directs by notice published in a newspaper circulating generally within such district, and cease to have operation at such time as the Trust from time to time directs by notice so published.
- 2. The provisions of this By-law shall apply to the whole of the Ararat Water Supply District.
- 3. No person shall use or permit or suffer to be used or allow to run any water supplied by the Council for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, mining, or fire-fighting purposes, except between the hours of six o'clock and eight o'clock in the afternoon, and on-the land occupied by the Ararat Lawn Tennis Club, Ararat Bowling Club, and Ararat Croquet Club; except between the hours of 8.30 o'clock and 10.30 o'clock in the forenoon.
 - 4. No person shall-
 - (a) water any garden other than by means of a garden hose of not more than 1 inch in diameter, which during use shall be continuously held in the hand.
- (b) wash any vehicle of any description by means of a hose or other mechanical contrivance.
 - 5. Any person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Council to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds, recoverable, summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing the offence, to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Council.
 - 6. If any person supplied with water by the Council wrongfully does or causes, or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Council may (without prejudice to any remedy thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Council to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water, as provided by the Water Acts.

- (b) All those allotments with a frontage to the west side of Sackville-street from St. Helliers-street to Altonastreet (originally part of Residential Area No. 1 but excised from that area by clause 2 of By-law 122).
- 4. The erection (including the adaptation for use) or the use of any building, or the use of any land for the purpose of such classes of trade, industries, manufactures, or business shall be and are hereby prohibited in the said Residential Areas No. 4 as are specified in Schedule D hereunder:—

Noxious and dangerous trades.

5. Nothing herein contained shall extend to the business or profession of any solicitor, doctor, dentist, architect, music teacher, or tutor, or to private schools and private hospitals, or to a single worker who carries on business in a private dwelling and whose advertising is restricted to an approved plate, or to the business of a milk vendor, but no person shall erect or cause to be erected any dairy or other building to

be used in connexion with a milk vendor's business, or convert or cause to be converted any existing building to such purposes in any residential area without first obtaining the consent in writing of the Council.

- 6. This By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building for any purposes for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involve the use of adjoining land which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.
- 7. Should a business or trade, &c., established in a building or on any land prior to the coming into operation of this By-law and contrary to its provisions be removed, become defunct, or closed down the Council may, on receipt of an application in writing, grant permission for the building or land to be used for such other purposes as the Council thinks reasonable in the circumstances.
