AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

W HEREAS by the Land Act 1928 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said Land Act 1928, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieuteniant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the Land Act 1928 aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the Land Act 1923 aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

W HEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then on thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as streets by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways; Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Govenor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Whittlesea aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.: highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:-

WATERWORKS TRUSTS AND LOCAL GOVERNING BODIES—REDUCTION OF PRINCIPAL AND ADVANCES FOR DETERMINING HALF-YEARLY PAYMENTS.

NDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct that for the purpose of determining the half-yearly payments to be made by Waterworks Trusts and Local Governing Bodies the principal and advances made to such Waterworks Trusts and Local Governing Bodies under the provisions of the Water Acts or the Unemployment Relief Loan and Application Acts shall be deemed to be reduced, as on and after the first day of July One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, by the respective amounts as set out in the schedules "A" and "B" hereto in accordance with the certificate of the Auditor-General bearing date the 23rd November, 1944, pursuant to the provisions of section 3 of the Water Act 1943 (No. 4983.)

DETERMINATION OF GRAZING PERMIT.
