Land Act 1923.

AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1923* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1923*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1923* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 6 and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1923* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

PUBLIC HIGHWAYS—SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then on thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as streets by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be public highways: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as streets hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Whittlesea aforesaid, to be public highways within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

The Fisheries Acts.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN THE GLENMAGGIE RESERVOIR AND THE MACALLISTER RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES ABOVE THE GLENMAGGIE WEIR FROM 1st MAY TO 31st AUGUST (BOTH DAYS INCLUSIVE) IN EACH YEAR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the twenty-eighth day of January, 1930, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of February, 1930, respecting fishing in the Macallister River above the Glenmaggie Weir, and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Glenmaggie Reservoir and the Macallister River and its tributaries above the Glenmaggie Weir, from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Thirty-five and two-thirds per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of December, 1944.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or her or for his or her use, and may cease to supply him or her with water as provided by the Water Acts.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of this By-law the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied to him for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided in the Water Acts.

WATERWORKS TRUSTS AND LOCAL GOVERNING BODIES—REDUCTION OF PRINCIPAL AND ADVANCES FOR DETERMINING HALF-YEARLY PAYMENTS.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling him in that behalf, His Excellency the Lieutenant Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, doth hereby declare, order, and direct that for the purpose of determining the half-yearly payments to be made by Waterworks Trusts and Local Governing Bodies the principal and advances made to such Waterworks Trusts and Local Governing Bodies under the provisions of the Water Acts or the Unemployment Relief Loan and Application Acts shall be deemed to be reduced, as on and after the first day of July One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, by the respective amounts as set out in the schedules "A" and "B" hereto in accordance with the certificate of the Auditor-General bearing date the 23rd November, 1944, pursuant to the provisions of section 3 of the *Water Act 1943* (No. 4983.)

AMENDED REGULATION FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ST. KILDA FRONTAGE RESERVES."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make regulations and to rescind any regulation in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby rescind clause 18 of the Regulations made by the Board of Land and Works on the 16th day of February, 1938, and in lieu thereof make the following Regulation in respect of the lands reserved by Orders in Council as set out hereunder and known as the "St. Kilda Foreshore Reserves."

(4) Four acres three roods thirty-eight perches in the City of St. Kilda, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 11th September, 1906, as a site for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people.

(5) Fourteen acres three roods twenty-five perches in the City of St. Kilda, temporarily reserved by Order in Council of

28th July, 1911, as a site for the recreation, convenience, and amusement of the people.

AMENDED REGULATION.

18. Under no circumstances shall any site within any of the Reserves or any building or amusement or any part of any building or amusement on any site within the Reserves be opened on Sundays for purposes of business or amusement; provided, however, that this Regulation shall not apply to any cafe, tea rooms, refreshment kiosk, life-saving clubhouse, yachting or sailing clubhouse, or to the miniature railway located on Marine-parade.

The Reserves have been placed under the control of the Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.
