PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI., intituled the *Housing Act 1943* (No. 4996), it is enacted by section 1, sub-section (2) thereof that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Thursday, the tenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four as the day upon which the said *Housing Act 1943* shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

ALTERATION OF DAY APPOINTED FOR BANK HOLIDAY (LABOUR DAY).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

Fire Brigades Act 1928.

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the council of the municipal district hereinafter mentioned has requested that the portions of such district enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of such fire district: And whereas a certificate has been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal district shall be added to and form part of the fire district specified accordingly:—

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Rosedale, Parish of Rosedale, County of Buln Buln: Commencing at the most northerly angle of crown allotment 45b, no section, Parish of Rosedale; thence south by a road and the eastern boundary of allotment 90 to the south-eastern angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by allotments 90 and 93, a line, the Gravel Reserve, allotments 1 to 5 of section V, Township of Rosedale, a line and allotments 125 and 143 to Blind Joe's Creek; thence generally in a north-westerly direction by the last-mentioned creek to the most southerly angle of allotment 14 of section III., Township of Rosedale; thence north-easterly and northerly by the last-mentioned allotment to a road forming the northern boundary of allotments 1 and 2 of section III.; thence north-easterly by the road last mentioned to the south-eastern angle of the Water Reserve in the Township of Rosedale and generally in a northerly, north-easterly and northerly direction by the eastern boundary of the Water Reserve to the south-eastern angle of allotment 10 of section VI.; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to the La Trobe River, and continuing by that river generally in a north-easterly direction to a point due north from the most northerly angle of Crown allotment 45b first mentioned; thence southerly by a line to the point of commencement.

Qualifications.—To be a qualified Medical Practitioner with experience in Child Psychiatry. Administrative capacity and knowledge of clinic methods in relation to testing and treatment of retarded children and defectives.

Lecturer, School of Forestry, Class "C," State Forests Department.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS AND FOR THE ADMISSION OF SUCH CANDIDATES TO PRACTICE.

The sixteenth day of December, 1943.

IN pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act 1928*, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the 20th day of May, 1941, by deleting Rule 26, and by substituting therefor the following Rule:—

26. (a) Where any person has established to the satisfaction of the Board of Examiners that he was engaged in war service, the term of service under Articles prescribed by Rule 14 or Rule 15 (b) as the case may be shall be reduced by a period equal to one-half of the period during which he was so engaged on war service but to the extent of not more than one-half of the prescribed term.
- (b) (i) Any person who is or was engaged on war service may apply to the Faculty for a certificate that by reason of the extent or circumstances of such war service he has been so prejudiced in his studies that it would be an undue hardship to require him to comply with Rule 17.
- (ii) The Faculty may grant such a certificate in respect of all or any one or more of the subjects prescribed by Rule 15 if in its opinion the circumstances of the case so warrant.
- (iii) Notwithstanding anything contained in Rules 17, 18, and 23 a person who has obtained such a certificate shall be allowed credit for any subject which is passed by him thereat and which is covered by such certificate, although he has not passed at that examination in two subjects. The credit so allowed shall be in addition to the credit which he would be allowed under Rule 17 for two subjects passed singly.

(iv) The fact that a candidate holds such a certificate shall not debar him from presenting himself for examination in and receiving credit for more than one subject at any one annual examination (including, subject to Rule 18, the supplementary examination).

(v) The Faculty, in determining in any case whether such a certificate should be granted, may inform its mind upon the extent and nature of the applicant's war service and upon the question whether by reason of such war service he has been so prejudiced in his studies that compliance by him with Rule 17 would involve an undue hardship, by such evidence and other means as it thinks proper.

(vi) An application for such a certificate may be made to the Faculty either before or after the date of the examination or examinations in respect of which it is intended to be used.

(c) For the purposes of this Rule—

(i) War service means continuous service for some period during the War which commenced on the 3rd day of September, 1939, or the War with Japan which commenced on the 9th day of December, 1941, or both in the Naval, Air or Military Forces of the Commonwealth or in some other like Forces of the Crown.

(ii) A person shall be deemed to be engaged on war service during any period while he is a prisoner of war if he became such whilst on war service and also during any period after the termination of his war service during which he is through ill health or other disability arising from his war service incapacitated from serving under Articles.

(iii) The period of such war service may in all cases be sufficiently proved by a certificate from the Naval, Military, or Air Force Authorities, or by such other evidence as the Board of Examiners or the Faculty as the case may be deems sufficient."

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1944 (No. 49).

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the Waterworks District of which Trust has been proclaimed an Urban District for the purposes of the Water Acts (hereinafter referred to as the Trust), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make this By-law for such Urban District for determining the rate to be paid in respect of the several lands and tenements to be supplied with water for domestic purposes, and directs as follows:—

1. The said Hamilton Waterworks Trust doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hamilton Waterworks Urban District. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any land upon which there is a building be less than Fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building, less than Ten shillings. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the first day of January. One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and shall be payable on the fifteenth day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, at the office of the said Trust.

2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

3. Except where water is supplied by special agreement, and except as provided by By-law No. 30 of the Trust—

(a) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 10,000 gallons.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid and each of them. And in the absence of such appointment the Secretary and/or rate collector of the Trust shall be deemed to have been appointed for the purposes aforesaid and every one of them.

SHIRE OF MANSFIELD.

By-LAW No. 29.

Relating to Collection and Disposal of Nightsoil.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1928 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Mansfield, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors and Ratepayers of the said Shire for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law numbered 29 shall apply to and have operation within the following boundaries:—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 73; thence northerly by west

boundary of allotments 73, 72, and 71, a line across road, west boundary of allotment 66, a line across road, and west boundary of allotments 59 and 56 to north-west angle of allotment 56; thence easterly by north boundary of allotments 56, 57, 38, a line across road, north boundary of allotments 37, 36, a line across road, and north boundaries of allotments 24 and 23 to north-east angle of allotment 23; thence south by east boundary of allotment 23, a line across road, east boundary of allotments 21, 1A, a line across road, east boundary of allotment 8A, a line across road, and east boundary of allotments 13A and 14A to south-east angle of allotment 14A; thence westerly by south boundary of allotments 14A, 15A, a line across road, and south boundary of allotments 16A, 23A, and pound reserve; thence westerly across road along the south boundary of cemetery reserve and allotments 69 and 73 to the commencing point, all in the Parish of Mansfield, and unless exempted by the Council shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein.

4. In this by-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Inspector" means any officer authorized by the Commission or Council, and includes any acting or assisting inspector.

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, the occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"The Commission" means the Commission of Public Health.

5. The proprietor of any premises on which there is erected a pan-closet shall cause the space under the seat of each pan-closet on such premises to be prepared for the accommodation of a pan as prescribed herein, and shall permit the same to be used for the double-pan service hereinafter provided for, and shall cause each pan-closet to be kept in a fit state for such service.

6. The proprietor shall cause every pan-closet to be supplied by the Council or otherwise with a pan for the reception of nightsoil, and shall (except when being exchanged) cause such pan to be always kept in proper position under the seat of each pan-closet, and shall also provide a lid capable of being tightly fitted to such pan when being removed from the premises to the depot, so as to prevent the spilling of the contents and the emission of offensive vapours, gases, or effluvia from the contents of such pan.

7. Such pan shall be cylindrical in shape and formed of galvanized iron of not less than 22 gauge or other approved material or materials, presenting on the inside and outside an impervious, hard, smooth, and durable surface, and those surfaces which come into contact with nightsoil shall also be free from any projections. It shall be watertight, strongly constructed, reinforced with metal bands where necessary, and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

Each pan shall have a capacity of 1½ cubic feet, and shall have an internal depth of 14 inches, a diameter of not less than 14 inches, and a suitable rim or lugs to permit an airtight lid to be affixed.

The seams of the pan shall be folded, grooved, and sweated with solder.

8. The proprietor of the premises shall cause to be kept in every closet belonging thereto a supply of liquid deodorant or lime, sawdust, or some other dry material efficient for deodorizing nightsoil, and shall cause all nightsoil which may be deposited in the pan in such pan-closet to be immediately on the deposit thereof covered with a quantity of deodorizing material sufficient to thoroughly and effectually deodorize the contents of such pan.

9. The proprietor shall provide every urinal with an approved apparatus for the regulated automatic discharge into such urinal of sufficient approved deodorant for the purpose of keeping such urinal constantly deodorized.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops, water, or rubbish in any pan.

11. The proprietor of any premises whereon there is a pan-closet or urinal shall—

(a) maintain such pan-closet and urinal in good repair and in a cleanly condition; and

(b) when required by an inspector effectually disinfect such pan-closet and urinal and/or the contents thereof, and effect any repairs thereto that such inspector may deem necessary.

12. At least once a week, and in any case as often as may be necessary to prevent the level of the contents of such pan approaching within 2½ inches of the brim thereof, the pan in use shall be closed with a lid and removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council with its contents from the premises, and another pan thoroughly cleansed and in good order shall be left in its place.

13. Such contractor or person removing such pans shall report to the Council at the earliest available opportunity the discovery of any pan found to be overflowing or leaking, and shall forthwith cause the place whereon the contents have been dropped or spilled to be properly cleansed.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for that purpose shall cause all pans to be removed in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness, and forthwith cause such vehicle to be removed to the approved depot.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause such nightsoil to be deposited at the depot and disposed of in such a manner as may be authorized by the Regulations.

16. If such nightsoil be disposed of in trenches such trenches shall be not less than 9 nor more than 18 inches in depth, nor exceed 2 feet in width, and the bottom thereof shall be broken up by suitable means to facilitate percolation of liquids, and the nightsoil shall be deposited therein in layers not more than 6 inches deep, and shall be left at such a depth that there shall be below ground level a covering of at least 6 inches in depth of clean, thoroughly broken-up soil upon the nightsoil and pan-washings when covered in.

17. No trench shall be used for the disposal of nightsoil where the bottom consists of rock or other impermeable material.

18. Immediately after the deposit of the nightsoil and washings in any trench such trench shall be filled in with thoroughly disintegrated earth. The necessary filling shall be obtained by excavation of another trench in a position parallel to but not less than 12 inches from the aforesaid trench required to be filled in, and using the material so obtained as a covering over the nightsoil so deposited. Trenches shall be excavated and used and filled in in regular consecutive order.

19. Seed of grass or any foliage or cereal crops or other such form of vegetable life as the Council shall direct or approve shall be seasonably planted or sown on any land into which nightsoil has been deposited, provided that vegetables or seeds of vegetables shall not be planted therein or thereon until three months have elapsed since the last deposit of nightsoil in such land.

20. Every pan used for the reception or conveyance of nightsoil shall immediately on being emptied be thoroughly washed or otherwise cleansed. The resultant washings or other filth shall be disposed of in a similar manner as the nightsoil.

21. Every pan after the disposal of its contents and after being cleansed in the manner aforesaid and before it again leaves the depot or disposal ground shall on every such occasion be thoroughly cleansed and disinfected by—

- (a) immediately after washing and scrubbing with water subjecting the pan to a current of steam from a boiler at 60-lb. pressure to the square inch for not less than two minutes in a steamtight box or chamber; or
- (b) thorough washing and scrubbing in water, then rinsing in clean water, and finally submerging for not less than five minutes in an aqueous solution containing not less than 1 per cent. of aceol. cyllin, kerol, izar, hycol, or other disinfectant of equal efficiency; or
- (c) thorough washing and scrubbing in water and afterwards submerging for not less than five minutes in boiling water; or
- (d) any other method approved in writing from time to time by the Commission.

22. The internal surface of every pan before it is first used shall be properly coated with well-boiled tar, crude creosote, or other approved material, and such coating shall thereafter be renewed when deemed necessary by the council, but not less than once a month.

23. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of nightsoil shall cause all vehicles used for the transport of pans to the depot to be properly constructed, kept clean, and disinfected daily at the depot and maintained in a proper state of repair.

24. The proprietor or any other person shall not remove any nightsoil from any premises except in accordance with this By-law.

25. The proprietor or any other person within the area defined by this By-law shall not bury nor cause to be buried any nightsoil in any yard, garden, or other place not being a place set apart for such purpose by the Council.

26. The inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting closets, urinals, pans, receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

27. If any person or the Council commit a breach of this By-law he or they shall for every breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence to a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds.

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the third day of November, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three, and confirmed by the Council on the first day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-three.

SHIRE OF ELTHAM.

A By-law of the Shire of Eltham, made under the provisions of section 197, sub-section (1) paragraph (6), section 222, and section 719 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, and numbered 22, for preserving good order and decency in the public baths, Eltham, in the Shire of Eltham, including any land or building used in connexion with the said baths, and preventing damage to such building or to the furniture or fittings thereof, and for the management and use of the said baths, buildings, furniture, fittings, or other property or effects used in connexion therewith, and for fixing the amounts to be charged for admission to and for the use of the same, or any part thereof, and for imposing a penalty for any wilful act or default contrary to this By-law.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Eltham order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall have force and effect within that portion of the Shire of Eltham described in Schedule A of this By-law.

2. This By-law shall come into operation immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. Every person shall, before being admitted to the public baths or any part thereof, pay the proper charge for such admission, and obtain by such payment from the authorized money-taker a ticket authorizing the admission of such person to such baths, and such person before being admitted shall, upon the application of any person appointed or acting as attendant of such baths, deliver such ticket to such attendant.

4. No person shall enter or use the swimming bath without having previously used one of the cleansing shower baths erected at the baths.

5. No person in an uncleanly condition shall use the swimming bath, and no person whilst suffering from any skin, infectious, or contagious disease shall use any portion of the baths, and any such person shall immediately retire from the baths upon being requested to do so by the caretaker or other person in charge.

6. No person shall use soap in any part of the baths other than in the cleansing shower baths provided for that purpose.

7. No person shall at any time, while in the swimming bath, use any substance or preparation whereby the water in such swimming bath may be discoloured or rendered turbid or unfit for the proper use of bathers.

8. No person shall wilfully or improperly commit any nuisance, or foul or pollute the water in the swimming bath, or wilfully or improperly soil, defile, injure, or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, drawers or bathing gown, or any bath-room, closet, box compartment, or any furniture or article therein, or break or injure or improperly interfere with the efficient action of any lock, cock, valve, pipe, or any machinery in connexion with the baths.

9. No person shall at any time carelessly or negligently injure or destroy any towel, bathing trunk, bathing gown, or other article supplied for use in the baths.

10. No person shall spit in the swimming bath or on the floors or walls of any portion of the baths, or deface any wall, fittings, or any portion of the baths by cutting or making marks thereon.

11. No person using the baths, nor any officer or servant or other person employed thereat, shall at any time introduce therein any spirituous or intoxicating liquors, and no person shall enter or remain in the baths whilst in a state of intoxication.

12. No person shall at any time whilst being upon any portion of the premises use any indecent or improper language or behave in an indecent or offensive manner.

13. No person shall, by forcible or improper means, seek admission to any dressing-room or compartment which shall be occupied by any other person, or seek admission to any dressing-room or compartment before any person who, by priority of payment, shall be entitled to prior admission to such dressing-room or compartment.

14. No person shall cause or allow any dog or other animal belonging to such person, or under his or her control, to enter or remain in the baths or any part thereof.

15. No person shall obstruct, hinder, or interfere with any attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths in the performance of his duty at the baths.

16. Every person using the swimming bath must wear proper bathing trunk or drawers or bathing gown.

17. Every person supplied with a towel, bathing trunk, or drawers, or bathing gown, shall, before leaving the baths, return the same to the attendant.

18. No bath attendant, officer, or servant employed at the baths, other than a duly authorized money-taker, shall accept from any person any payment for the hire or use of any article for use in the baths or for any other purpose whatsoever in connexion with the baths, without the knowledge and consent of the caretaker of the baths, and then only for and on behalf of the Council.

19. Any person finding anything which may have been left in any bathroom or dressing-room, or in any other part of the baths shall, immediately after finding such article, deliver the same to the caretaker, or other person acting on his behalf, who shall thereupon register a description of the same and all particulars relating thereto in a book kept for that purpose; and any person claiming such article shall, upon giving satisfactory proof of ownership, receive such article from the caretaker (or other authorized person) upon entering his or her signature and address in the book referred to.

20. The Council shall not be held responsible for any article lost by or stolen from any person whilst in the baths.

21. The hours for admission to the baths during the swimming season (commencing 1st day of November and ending 30th day of April) shall be 10 a.m. to 10 p.m.

22. The charges for admission to and for the use of the baths shall be as follows, provided always that when the baths are in use for galas or other entertainments, such charges shall be suspended, and tickets and passes will not be available for use:—

Each district school under the charge of a competent teacher shall be admitted free on one half-day per week

23. Any person guilty of any wilful act or default contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and not less than Five shillings for each offence.

24. For the purposes of this By-law, the expression "Public Baths" shall mean the area fenced off for use as a swimming baths and includes all buildings, structures, fittings, fencing, &c., in or upon that area. The term "baths" shall have the same meaning.

The expression "swimming bath" shall mean the structure or structures constructed in or on the area aforesaid from time to time so as to hold water for the purpose of swimming, bathing, or paddling therein.

SCHEDULE A.

That portion of the Eltham Central Park in the South Riding of the Shire of Eltham, set apart and fenced off for use exclusively as a public baths and known as the "Eltham Swimming Baths."

The resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Eltham on the thirteenth day of December, 1943, and confirmed on the tenth day of January, 1944.
