IT is hereby notified, for general information, that it is intended, after the expiration of one month from the date of publication of this notice in the *Government Gazette*, to move His Excellency the Governor in Council to make a Proclamation repealing the Proclamation made the second day of July, 1900, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the thirteenth day of July, 1900, respecting the mouth of the Barwon River, and in lieu thereof prescribing that the mouth of the Barwon River shall be defined as an imaginary line running from the seaward or outer end of the Ocean Grove jetty south 59° west to the opposite shore, and permitting the use of seine or hauling nets in the estuary of the Barwon River below or seaward of such imaginary line throughout the whole year.

## QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

## BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Sixty-seven per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of March, 1944.

## CHEESE QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be Seventy-five per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of March, 1944.

### CITY OF MELBOURNE.

#### BY-LAW No. 263.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 263, for the purpose of prohibiting the erection or use in any residential area of any land or building for the purpose of the business of a school and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and of every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, the Council of the City of Melbourne makes the By-law and orders as follows:—

#### 1. In this By-law—

"The Council" means the Council of the City of Melbourne.

"Erect" includes "adapt for use."

"Person" includes person, company, and corporation.

"Residential area" means a part of the City of Melbourne duly prescribed by the Council as a residential area.

Words importing the masculine gender shall include females and the singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

"Surveyor" means every such surveyor who is appointed by the Council, and includes every deputy surveyor appointed by the Council.

2. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law, no person shall, without the written consent of the Council first had and obtained—

(a) use in any residential area any land or building for the purpose of the business of a school;

(b) erect in any residential area any building for the purpose of such business.

Provided that this By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any land or any building for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building used for any such purpose, whether or not such enlargement, rebuilding, or extension involves the use of adjoining land, which immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law was in the same ownership.

3. From and after the coming into operation of this By-law no person shall, without the written consent of the Council first had and obtained—

(a) erect or construct in any residential area any building or erection which is intended or adapted to be used for the purpose of—

(i) a school, or

(ii) public recreation or amusement, whether or not charges or fees are imposed for entering into or using any such building or erection;

(b) use or occupy in any residential area any building or erection for such purpose.

Provided that this By-law shall not preclude the continuance of the use of any building or erection for any purpose for which the same was used immediately before the coming into operation of this By-law, or the enlargement, rebuilding, or extension of any building or erection used for any such purpose.

4. Every person who by act or omission wilfully offends against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every such offence to a penalty not exceeding £20, and in case of a continuing offence to a further penalty not exceeding £10 for each day while such offence is continued after written notice from the Council under the hand of the Surveyor.

5. Notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty under this By-law, if any building or erection after the passing of this By-law be erected or constructed, used or occupied, or suffered to remain wholly or partially contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law, the Council may, by notice, in writing, under the hand of the Surveyor, require the owner or the occupier, if the owner is unknown or cannot be found within a time to be limited in the notice, to put the building or erection in a state or condition conformable to the provisions of this By-law, or else to pull down and remove the same.

Resolution for passing this By-law agreed to by the Council of the City of Melbourne, this eighteenth day of October, 1943, and confirmed the fifteenth day of November, 1943.

### CITY OF MELBOURNE.

#### BY-LAW No. 264.

A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under the Local Government Acts, and numbered 264, to amend By-laws numbered 220 and 251.

THE Council of the City of Melbourne doth hereby, in pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and by every other Act or power enabling it in that behalf, order as follows:—

1. This By-law shall, from and after the date of the same coming into operation, be read and construed as one with By-law No. 220, intituled "A By-law of the City of Melbourne, made under Part VII. of the *Local Government Act* 1928 (19 George V. No. 3720), and Part IV. of the *Health Act* 1928 (19 George V. No. 3697), and numbered 220, to amend and consolidate the By-laws for regulating and restraining the erection and construction or alteration of buildings, erections, or hoardings, and for other purposes," and any By-laws amending the same or read and construed as one with the same.

2. At the end of Part VII. of By-law No. 220, there shall be inserted the following section:—

"15. (a) Whenever any building or dwelling house referred to in this Part has been or shall hereafter be erected, constructed, converted, altered, or added to in accordance with the requirements of By-law No. 220, or any By-laws amending the same, the areas of open space and all the provisions for light and ventilation prescribed by such By-laws shall at all times be maintained and preserved in relation to such building or dwelling house.

"(b) No person shall use or occupy as a place of human habitation any such building or dwelling house unless all such areas of open space and provisions for light and ventilation continue to exist in relation to such building or dwelling house at the time of such use or occupation."

3. By-law No. 251 is hereby amended as follows:—

(a) In sub-section (b) of section 5, for the word "permitted" in such sub-section, there shall be substituted the words "not prohibited."

(b) In the Fifth Schedule, immediately after the word "manufacture" there shall be inserted the word "business."

(c) The provisions of By-law No. 251 shall not apply to the pieces of land referred to in the Schedule hereunder, or to any buildings erected or hereafter erected thereon.

## BOROUGH OF MARYBOROUGH.

## BY-LAW No. 55.

*Garbage Regulations.*

A By-law of the Borough of Maryborough, made under the provisions of the *Health Act 1928*, and numbered 55, for the purpose of the provision, use, and control of receptacles for the deposit and collection of refuse and rubbish (whether temporary or otherwise) and prescribing the size and shape of the materials to be used in the construction of such receptacles, and for the removal and disposal of refuse and for other purposes.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Health Act 1928* and of every other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Borough of Maryborough, in the name and on behalf of the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the said borough, for the purpose of carrying the said Act into execution within their jurisdiction, make the following By-law (that is to say):—

1. All former By-laws, so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law, are hereby repealed.

2. This By-law shall come into force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council, and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the whole of the municipality of the Borough of Maryborough, and shall apply to every house, building, and premises therein, unless exempted by the Council.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

“Proprietor” means the proprietor of any house, building, flat, shop, and premises, and includes the owner, occupier, and any person having the management or control thereof.

“Refuse” includes all wastes produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, flat, shop, or premises, and includes jam tins, but does not include garden clippings, ashes, sewage, and manure.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, flat, shop, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly-constructed receptacle or receptacles in which he shall cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, flat, shop, or premises.

6. Every such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron, of not more than 26-gauge, in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Every such receptacle shall have a capacity of not less than 1 cubic foot and not more than 3 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. Every such receptacle shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side-lifting handles.

9. Every such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid fitting over such receptacle and not into the same, and shall be kept constantly covered (except when refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom), and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any garden clippings or ashes in such receptacle or receptacles.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle or receptacles to be kept at all times in good and sweet order and condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacles with tar or other suitable substance.

12. The proprietor of house, building, shop, flat, or premises shall cause, at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited within 5 feet of but inside the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street on which such house, building, or premises abuts, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. The proprietor of any shop, flat, and business premises built on a street alignment where such premises do not abut on suitable land on which such receptacle or receptacles could be placed for collection and emptying, may place such receptacles in or upon the street upon which such shop, flat, or business premises abut.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council, such contractor or person shall be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle or receptacles properly covered with its lid and shall close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle or receptacles are taken.

15. The contractor or persons authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall, at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle, in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

17. Such vehicle shall, so far as practicable, be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining of galvanized iron or other suitable and approved means.

18. Such vehicle, when full, shall be taken by the shortest convenient route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other methods as may be approved by the Council, and in such manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or the person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth, lime, or other approved materials, so as not to create any nuisance.

21. Any person committing a breach of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence against the By-law, and for every such offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds, and in the case of continuing the offence to a further penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which such offence continues.

22. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Maryborough.

Resolution for passing this By-law was agreed to by the Council on the 4th day of November, 1943, and confirmed on the 2nd day of December, 1943.
