AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

PROCLAMATION

By the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation, be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 1, 2, 3, 6, and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

Cemeteries Act 1928.

RULES AND REGULATIONS OF THE LAKE BOGA PUBLIC CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Cemeteries Act 1928*, the Trustees of the Lake Boga Public Cemetery make the following rules and regulations (that is to say):—

1. These rules and regulations shall come into force immediately after their publication in the *Government Gazette*, and from and after such publication all rules and regulations heretofore made shall be and are hereby rescinded.

2. All fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders are given.

3. Any person desiring ground for a private grave shall apply to the Trustees therefor, who, if the application is approved and the prescribed fees paid, will issue a burial right (Schedule B) which shall give the holder and his representatives the exclusive right of burial or interment in the portion of ground allotted thereby as a family or private burial place, and the right, on obtaining the permission of the Trustees as hereafter mentioned, to erect and maintain any monument, cenotaph, tablet, or other erection therein.

4. Any person desiring to construct a vault, grave, tombstone, or other erection shall apply to the Trustees for permission to do so, and submit a plan or drawing with a copy of any proposed inscription or epitaph, and no such erection shall be made without the written approval of the Trustees.

5. No interment shall be permitted until an application has been made, the particulars required in the form Schedule A given, an order obtained, and a certificate from a coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths has been delivered to the Secretary (gatekeeper or sexton).

6. Application for an order for interment shall be made at least eight working hours before the time fixed for the burial.

7. No coffin shall be buried within 4 feet of the ordinary level of the ground unless it contains the body of a child under twelve years, when it shall not be less than 3 feet below the ordinary level of the ground, and a layer of earth at least 6 inches thick shall be left undisturbed above and around any coffin previously buried in the same grave.

8. The hours for burials shall be—On week days, 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. No interment shall be allowed on Sundays except when it is certified, in writing, by the Officer of Health of the district, or by a police magistrate, or Justice of the Peace, that for sanitary reasons it is necessary that the burial take place that day, and on payment of the special fee provided.

9. No re-interment or removal from another cemetery or another grave will be permitted until there be submitted a certified copy of the original certificate of the coroner, Justice of the Peace, or Registrar of Deaths, and the licence for disinterment of the Minister of the Crown authorized in that behalf.

10. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person having paid the fee for a private grave and requiring a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, subject to the approval of the Trustees, but every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron, securely cemented.

11. No private grave shall be re-opened or any interment permitted therein without the consent, in writing, of the person entitled to give the same.

12. No person employed by the Trustees shall accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of his duty, nor shall he be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment or for which he has special authority from the Trustees.

13. The cemetery shall, unless otherwise ordered, be open to the public from 7 a.m. to sunset daily throughout the year.

14. No person shall be permitted to pluck any flower, or take any tree, shrub, or plant from the cemetery unless with the previous authority of the Trustees.

15. No smoking shall be allowed nor any firearms discharged within the cemetery.

16. No dogs shall be allowed in the cemetery.

AMENDMENT OF PLASTERING REGULATIONS (No. 2).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Regulation 8 of the Plastering Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as from the first pay period to commence on or after the 2nd day of March, 1944.

2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.

3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

“8. The minimum rates of pay to be paid to apprentices as wages in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows as from the first pay period to commence on or after the 2nd day of March, 1944, on, from and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

(a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of six years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 21s. 6d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 29s. 9d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 41s. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 56s. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 72s. 3d. per week.
- 6th year—at the rate of 89s. 6d. per week.

(b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—

- 1st year—at the rate of 24s. 9d. per week.
- 2nd year—at the rate of 33s. 9d. per week.
- 3rd year—at the rate of 47s. 6d. per week.
- 4th year—at the rate of 65s. 9d. per week.
- 5th year—at the rate of 89s. 6d. per week.”

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION OF ACT.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI. intituled the *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act 1943* (No. 4989) it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the 21st day of March, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, as the day on which the said *Discharged Servicemen's Preference Act 1943* shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this twenty-first day of March, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-four, and in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

Factories and Shops Acts.

DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 12 (FUEL AND FODDER).

NOTES.—(1) This Determination applies to the following parts of Victoria, namely:—The Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder; such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District; the cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool; the town of Newtown and Chilwell; and the boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol.

(2) By Orders in Council made on the 10th September, 1913, and 21st October, 1930, power was conferred on the Coal and Coke Board to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons, employed in any business or occupation connected with the sale or distribution of coal or coke by any—

- (a) coal importer;
- (b) coal mine owner;
- (c) gas company;
- (d) agent or contractor who distributes coal or coke for any coal importer, coal mine owner, or gas company.

[N accordance with the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts, the Wages Board which now has the power to "determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons—

- (a) employed in the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (b) employed in carting or driving or assisting in carting or driving in connexion with the business of a hay, corn, or chaff dealer;
- (c) employed in any business or occupation connected with the preparation of firewood for sale or connected with the sale or distribution of wood, coal, or coke.
- (d) employed handling or distributing brewers' or distillers' grains."

Employees shall be entitled to absent themselves from work without loss of pay on the under-mentioned public holidays, viz:—New Year's Day, Australia Day (26th January), Good Friday, Easter Monday, Labour Day, Anzac Day, Fuel and Fodder Trades' Annual Holiday, King's Birthday, Melbourne Cup Day (within the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council thereunder, and such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included within the said Metropolitan District), Christmas Day, and Boxing Day. Work done on Sundays or on any of the specified public holidays shall be paid for as follows:—

- (a) On Sundays—
 (i) Time occupied in attending to horses, or in the essential conveyance of fodder for stock .. Time and a half;
 (ii) All other work Time and three-quarters.
 (b) On any of the specified public holidays—
 (i) Time occupied in attending to horses, or in the essential conveyance of fodder for stock .. Time and a half;
 (ii) All other work Double time.

If any other day be substituted by Act of Parliament or Proclamation for any of the above-mentioned holidays, the special rate prescribed shall be payable only for work done on the day so substituted.

TIME WAGES.

8. Any person employed in a factory or shop on time wages for less than the number of hours fixed for an ordinary week's work shall be paid for time worked up to 22 hours as follows:—

- (a) in any week in which two or more public holidays occur .. At the ordinary wages rate with an addition of fifty per centum.
 (b) in any other week At the ordinary wages rate, with an addition of thirty-three and one-third per centum.

For time worked beyond the 22 hours aforesaid, he shall be paid the ordinary wages rate up to but not exceeding the rate prescribed by this Determination for an ordinary week's work, together with any overtime rate which is applicable.

CASUAL LABOUR.

9. Casual hands, i.e., persons who are employed other than in a factory or shop during any week for not more than one-half of the maximum number of hours fixed in this Determination as a week's work shall be paid at the rate of time and a third.

ANNUAL LEAVE.

10. Any employee who has been in the service of an employer for a period of not less than twelve months shall be granted one week's holiday (exclusive of the holidays prescribed in Clause 7) in each year on full pay, and such holiday shall be given within two months of the completion of the twelve months' service.

Provided that any person whose service terminates after not less than six months, but less than any period of twelve months, shall be granted leave *pro rata*.

SICK LEAVE.

11. No deduction shall be made from the wages of any employee unavoidably absent through illness for not more than four days in any year, commencing on 1st December annually, provided he has submitted within 24 hours of the commencement of such absence satisfactory evidence that the same is not the result of his own misconduct.

TERMINATION OF EMPLOYMENT.

12. Except in a case where an employee has been guilty of a misdemeanour, seven days' notice of termination of employment shall be given by either employer or worker. If such notice be not given, a week's wages shall be paid or forfeited, as the case may be, in lieu thereof.

PERIODICAL ADJUSTMENT OF WAGES RATES AND PIECE-WORKERS' EARNINGS.

14. The wages rates for adults set out in clause 2 (i) are based upon the following basic wage, and pursuant to and in accordance with the provisions of section 21 of the *Factories and Shops Act 1934*, the Board hereby determines that such wages rates and the weekly earnings of piece-workers shall be automatically increased or decreased by the same amount, and at the same time, as such basic wage. Provided that the wages of juniors shall be adjusted proportionately to adjustments of the basic wage, such adjustments to be to the nearest 3d., half or less than half of 3d. to be disregarded.

The basic wage shown hereunder shall be adjusted as prescribed in clause 15.

ADJUSTMENT OF BASIC WAGE.

15. (a) Until the beginning of the first pay period to commence in May, 1944, the amount of the basic wage shall be as prescribed in clause 14.

(b) During each future successive period beginning with the first pay period to commence in a May, an August, a November, or a February, the amount of the basic wage shall be adjusted by the following method according to the position and fluctuations (if any) of the Commonwealth Statistician's "All Items" retail price index numbers.

For the purposes of this Determination the expression "Commonwealth Statistician's retail price index numbers" or any like expression means the numbers stated to be such index numbers in any document purporting, and not proved to be wrongly so purporting, to be printed by the Commonwealth Government Printer or to be signed by or on behalf of the Commonwealth Statistician:—

- (1) The index number set to be applied is that assigned to Melbourne.
- (2) The index number for the calendar quarter next preceding the period of or near a quarter for which the adjustment is made is to be ascertained.
