*Fire Brigades Act 1928.*

ENLARGEMENT OF FIRE DISTRICTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Fire Brigades Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that, on the request of the council of any municipal district outside the metropolitan fire district or any country fire district, and on receiving a certificate from the Metropolitan Fire Brigades Board or the Country Fire Brigades Board (as the case may be) that it is necessary or desirable so to do, the Governor in Council may at any time by Proclamation in the *Government Gazette* declare that any such municipal district or any portion thereof shall be added to and form part of such fire district, and that thereupon such municipal district or portion shall for the purposes of the said Act be included in and become part of such fire district: And whereas the councils of the municipal districts hereinafter mentioned have requested that the portions of such districts enclosed within the boundaries set forth hereunder, and not already part of the fire district respectively specified in connexion therewith, be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively, specified: And whereas certificates have been received from the Country Fire Brigades Board that it is necessary and desirable so to do: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 5 (1) of the *Fire Brigades Act 1928*, do hereby declare that the said portions of such municipal districts shall be added to and form part of the fire districts respectively specified accordingly:—

EASTERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Berwick, Township of Berwick, and Parishes of Berwick and Pakenham, County of Mornington: Commencing at the north-western angle of the Township of Berwick, Parish of Berwick; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the township to Cardinia Creek; thence south-westerly by that creek to a point in line with the southern boundary of allotment 58E, Parish of Pakenham; thence south-easterly by a line, the last-mentioned boundary, and a line in continuation of that boundary to the western boundary of allotment 57A; thence south-westerly by a road to a point in the western

boundary of allotment 53 distant 6 chains (north-easterly) from its south-western angle; thence south-easterly by a line to the most northerly angle of lot 10 on lodged plan No. 2593; thence south-easterly by the northern boundary of lots 10, 9, 8, 7, 6, 5, 4, 3, 2 and 1 of that subdivision to the north-eastern angle of the last-named lot; thence south-westerly by the eastern boundary of the said lot 1 on lodged plan No. 2593 to the north-western angle of lot 1 on lodged plan No. 3783; thence south-easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 to the north-eastern angle of the last-named lot; thence south-easterly by a line to the north-western angle of lot 6; thence easterly by the northern boundaries of lots 6, 7, 8 and 9 to the north-eastern angle of the last-named lot; thence southerly by the eastern boundary of that lot to its south-eastern angle; thence westerly by the south boundaries of lots 9, 8, 7 and 6 on lodged plan No. 3783 to the south-western angle of the last-named lot; thence westerly by Beaconsfield-avenue to the eastern boundary of Station-street; thence south-westerly by the eastern boundary of that street to the centre line of the main Gippsland railway track; thence north-westerly by the centre line of the said railway track, Parishes of Pakenham and Berwick, to a point distant 5 chains westerly at right angles from the west side of a road forming the eastern boundary of allotment 19, Parish of Berwick; thence northerly by a line distant 5 chains from the road last mentioned to the Prince's Highway; thence easterly by that highway a distance of 6 chains; thence northerly by a line and a road to the point of commencement.

SOUTHERN FIRE DISTRICT.

Shire of Bellarine, Parish of Bellarine, County of Grant: Commencing at the north-western angle of Crown allotment 47 of section 2, Parish of Bellarine; thence southerly by a road and the west boundary of allotment 5 to the south-western angle of the last-mentioned allotment; thence westerly by a road to the south-eastern angle of allotment 4, no section; thence northerly by a road to the north-eastern angle of allotment 5B; thence easterly by a road through allotments 6 and 8 to a point on the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment; thence northerly to a point in line with the south boundary of a road forming the north boundary of allotment 41 of section 2; thence easterly by the last-mentioned road to the point of commencement.

Shire of Bellarine, Parishes of Bellarine and Paywit, County of Grant: Commencing at a point on the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay in line with the eastern boundary of allotment 143 extended northerly, Town of Portarlington, Parish of Paywit; thence southerly by a road to the north boundary of allotment 4, section 1, Parish of Paywit; thence southerly

by the eastern boundary of the last-mentioned allotment to a road forming the south boundary thereof; thence westerly by the road last mentioned, Parishes of Paywit and Bellarine, to a road forming the south-eastern boundary of allotment 20, no section, Parish of Bellarine; thence south-westerly by the last-mentioned road to a road forming the south-western boundary of allotment 20; thence north-westerly by the last-mentioned road and a line to the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay; thence generally in a north-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly direction by the foreshore of Port Phillip Bay to the point of commencement.

QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.  
BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. ## AMENDMENT OF REGULATION XXVI.—COMPULSORY ATTENDANCE AND THE TRANSFER OF PUPILS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by section 46 of the *Education Act 1928* and of all other powers thereto enabling, doth hereby amend Regulation XXVI.—Compulsory Attendance and the Transfer of Pupils, as follows:—

After clause 2 there shall be inserted the following clauses:—

- 2A. If a child of school age does not reside within statutory distance of a State school, the parent or guardian of the child shall report to the head teacher of the nearest State school the child's full name, age, and address and such other particulars as may be required and this information shall be recorded by the head teacher in the school rolls.
- 2B. If a parent or guardian referred to in clause 2A above fails to supply the information therein required, the child shall be deemed to be absent from a State school without a reasonable excuse and the parent or guardian shall be liable to prosecution in accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the *Education Act 1928*.
- 2C. When a child is reported as required in clause 2A above and such child is not being educated in an approved manner, the head teacher of the State school shall forward to the Secretary, Education Department, Melbourne, C.2. the particulars required on the prescribed form and the child shall be enrolled at a correspondence school of the Education Department.
- 2D. When a child is enrolled at a correspondence school of the Education Department, the parent or guardian shall cause the child to carry out satisfactorily all lessons forwarded to the child by post from such school.
- 2E. If the provisions of clause 2D above are not complied with in respect of any child in any week and the head teacher of a correspondence school of the Education Department certifies accordingly, such child shall be deemed to be absent from a State school without a reasonable excuse and the parent or guardian shall be liable to prosecution in accordance with the provisions of section 30 of the *Education Act 1928*.

In clause 10, amend the quotation from the *Education Act 1928*, as follows:—

For section 25 sub-section (3) (e) there shall be substituted the following paragraph:—

“(e) that there is no State school which the child can attend within a distance (measured according to the nearest practicable route) from the residence of the child—

- (i) of two miles if the child is under nine years of age; or  
(ii) of three miles if the child is at least nine years of age—  
and that the child is being educated by correspondence tuition.”

At the end of sub-section (5) there shall be inserted the expression—

“Being educated by correspondence tuition means—

- (a) that the child is receiving tuition by correspondence from a Correspondence School of the Education Department pursuant to registration of the child for enrolment thereat effected by the parent of the child by notification as prescribed to the head teacher of the State school nearest the child's place of residence; or  
(b) that the child is receiving efficient and regular tuition by correspondence in manner approved by the Minister.”
