AMENDMENT OF NURSES REGULATIONS 1941.

THE Nurses Board of the State of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by section 29 of the Nurses Act 1928, doth hereby make the following additions to the Nurses Regulations 1941, which shall come into force on publication in the Government Gazette:—

A. By adding at the end of Regulation 36 the following sub-regulation—

"Course of Education in the Care of the Pre-school CHILD.

IX(1). In this sub-regulation-

(a) 'Education in Child Development' means a course of training, with a minimum of eighty lectures and demonstration hours, which offers opportunity for studying human development up to six years of age, in relation to physical, mental, social, emotional, and spiritual growth, with special reference to their inter-relationship.

Such a course includes lectures in theory, supple mented by demonstrations of all aspects, as well as practical experience and application of theory in the guidance of children, such as is conducted by a Pre-school Training College.

- (b) 'Pre-school Child Centre' means an institution that receives children of pre-school age (eighteen months to six years of age), and offers a six-hour programme in keeping with the growth of such children.
 - (i) The head teacher therein shall hold a recognized diploma in Child Development, as well as State registration as a sub-primary teacher, and shall demonstrate the techniques of child guidance, in accordance with her knowledge of same. She shall also have ability to train students in this field.
 - (ii) The equipment of the above centre shall give ample illustration of sequence of material required to meet the developing needs of these pre-school children.
- (c) 'Residential Home, for Pre-school Children' means a Residential: Home, for Pre-school Children' means a residential institution which receives pre-school children (i.e., children from eighteen months to six years of age) and provides a 24-hour programme for them, based on the philosophy of growth through guidance. It provides an outdoor and indoor environment, and equipment suitable for carrying out a necessary programme in keeping with child development, as demonstrated in an approved Pre-school Training College.
- (d) 'Pre-school Educational Training College' is one approved by the Department of Public Instruction which fulfils the requirements laid down in the conditions of training, examination, and certification of the Nurses Regulations.
- (2) Any Pre-school Educational College, approved by the Department of Public Instruction as such, which fulfils the following requirements to the satisfaction of the Board may be recognized for the purposes of the Act as a Training School for Registered Nurses who are also Registered Infant Welfare Nurses, in the special course of Education known as Care of the Pre-school Child.
- (3) The requirements referred to in the last 'preceding paragraph are-
 - (a) That the principal in charge of the instruction thereat is a qualified teacher in pre-school educa-tion, holding a pre-school diploma based on Child Development, and issued by an approved Pre-school Training College.
 - (b) That the lecturer thereat shall hold approved qualifications in their specific subjects, and systematic courses shall be given as set out in the Twelfth Schedule to these Regulations.
 - (c) That the period of the course of training for nurses registered under Part V. and Part VII. of these Regulations does not exceed six months.
- (d) That provision shall be made in accordance with the curriculum as set forth in the Twelfth Schedule for—

 - (i) Systematic course of lectures by approved instructors.

 (ii) Practical experience in approved Pre-school Child Centres, under guidance from approved instructors.

- (iii) Residential accommodation for trainees in an approved residential home for pre-school children wherein trainees will spend a minimum of two days in ofder to observe a 24-hour guidance programme, with the aid of approved instructors.
- (iv) That certified statements that trainees have hat certified statements that trainees have attended the systematic course of lectures and have received practical instruction in accordance with the curriculum as set forth in the Twelfth Schedule hereto shall be furnished to the Registrar, Nurses Board, prior to the special examination for Pre-school Infant Welfare Nurses."
