PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the eighth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI., intituled the *Goods (Textile Products) Act 1944* (No. 5012), it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Tuesday, the first day of May, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, as the day upon which the said *Goods (Textile Products) Act 1944* shall come into operation in the said State of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this second day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

APOLLO BAY WATERWORKS TRUST.

RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.

THE Apollo Bay Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Apollo Bay Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty-six shillings and eight pence (26s. 8d.), and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings (10s.).

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable on the 10th day of January, 1945, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the said Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons.

Water supplied to cricket, tennis, or bowling clubs, and to Government Departments, showgrounds, and similar properties, shall be charged for at the rate of One shilling and six pence (1s. 6d.) per 1,000 gallons, provided that the minimum quantity to be charged for shall not be less than 15,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

SWAN HILL SEWERAGE AUTHORITY.

RATING BY-LAW FOR 1945.

THE Swan Hill Sewerage Authority, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts Acts, doth hereby make:—

1. A sewerage rate of Two shillings in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Swan Hill Sewerage District.

2. A special rate of Three pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Swan Hill Sewerage District, and which are sewerer properties. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rates payable in respect of any rateable sewerer property be less than Twenty shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the 1st day of January, 1945, and shall be payable on the 10th day of January, 1945, at the office of the said Authority, Town Hall, Swan Hill.

TOWN OF ARARAT WATER SUPPLY DISTRICT.

BY-LAW No. 44.—RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR ENDING 30TH SEPTEMBER, 1945.

THE Council of the Town of Ararat, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Town of Ararat Water Supply District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount payable per annum in respect of any tenement, other than land on which there is no building, be less than £1 6s. 8d., and, in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Five shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year ending the 30th day of September, 1945, and shall be payable on the 12th day of January, 1945, at the office of the said Council.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Council is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of Eight pence per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Council in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Nine pence per 1,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Council.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS.

RATING BY-LAW FOR YEAR 1945.

No. 48.

THE BALLARAT WATER COMMISSIONERS, pursuant to and in exercise and execution of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Water Acts, and in exercise and execution of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling it in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law following:—

1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied for the supply of water for domestic purposes upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated by it within the Ballarat Water Supply District:—

- (a) Of any tenements (other than land on which there is no building) the annual municipal valuation whereof does not exceed £16, Fifteen shillings per annum.
- (b) Of any such tenement the annual municipal valuation whereof exceeds £17, a rate of Eleven pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.
- (c) Of lands on which there is no building, a rate of Eleven pence in the pound on the net annual municipal value.

2. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year beginning the 1st day of January, 1945, and ending 31st day of December, 1945, and shall be payable on the 31st day of March, 1945, at the office of the Water Commissioners, Ballarat.

3. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Commissioners is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Commissioners in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at Ten pence per 1,000 gallons.

5. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Commissioners.

6. Such person or persons as The Ballarat Water Commissioners may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be and is or are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover such rates and charges.

RULES OF THE COUNCIL OF LEGAL EDUCATION.

RULES RELATING TO THE QUALIFICATION OF CANDIDATES TO PRACTISE AS BARRISTERS AND SOLICITORS, AND FOR THE ADMISSION OF SUCH CANDIDATES TO PRACTICE.

The 15th day of December, 1944.

In pursuance of the authority in this behalf conferred upon the Council of Legal Education by the *Legal Profession Practice Act*, 1928, the said Council hereby alters its Rules made the 20th day of May, 1941, as follows:—

1. By deleting paragraph (a) of Rule 6 and inserting in place thereof the following:—

“(a) obtained the degree of Bachelor of Laws at the University and who has thereafter passed at the University in the subjects of Procedure, Accounts, Professional Conduct, and Taxation, and also, if he has not passed in the subject of Law of Procedure and Evidence under the Rules in force prior to the 15th day of December, 1944, or in the subject of Evidence as part of the course for the Degree, who has after obtaining the Degree passed at the University in the subject of Evidence.

Provided that—

- I. A person who before the 1st day of March, 1945, has passed in thirteen or more subjects in the course for the Degree shall not—after obtaining the degree—be required to pass in any of the subjects Accounts, Professional Conduct, and Taxation.
- II. A person who before the 1st day of March, 1945, has passed in more than four subjects in the course for the degree shall not—after obtaining the degree—be required to pass in the subject of Accounts.
- III. Until the 31st day of December, 1949, the Board of Examiners may exempt from passing in one or both of the subjects of Accounts and Taxation any person who in its opinion would suffer undue hardship if he were required to pass in one or both of such subjects; or”

2. By inserting in Rule 14 the words “at least” after the words “one year”.

3. By deleting from paragraph (a) of Rule 15 the subjects “3. Law of Wrongs (Civil and Criminal)” down to and including “11. Private International Law” and inserting in place thereof the following:—

- “3. Law of Contract.

5. Law of Property in Land and Conveyancing.
6. Constitutional Law, Part I.
7. Mercantile Law.
8. Procedure.

9. Evidence.

14. Accounts.
15. Taxation."

" Provided further that—

- I. A person who before the 1st day of March, 1945, has passed in nine or more subjects as prescribed by this Rule shall not be required to pass in any of the subjects Accounts, Professional Conduct, and Taxation.
- II. A person who before the 1st day of March, 1945, has passed in more than one of the subjects as prescribed by this Rule shall not be required to pass in the subject of Accounts.
- III. Until the 31st day of December, 1949, the Board of Examiners may exempt from passing in one or both of the subjects of Accounts and Taxation any person who in its opinion would suffer undue hardship if he were required to pass in one or both of such subjects."

5. By deleting from line 4 of clause 1 of Schedule A thereto the words "one year (or five years)" and inserting in place thereof the following :—" (here state the term) ".

NATIONAL SECURITY (FOOD CONTROL) REGULATIONS.

ORDER No. 14.

OATS (VICTORIA) ORDER.

WHEREAS there is a shortage or a threatened shortage of oats for seed and other essential purposes in Australia:

And whereas it is necessary to conserve the available stocks of oats for use as seed or for other essential purposes:

And whereas there are stocks of oats in that part of Australia which is in the State of Victoria:

And whereas by instrument of delegation dated 9th December, 1944, the Minister of State for Commerce and Agriculture did, in pursuance of section 17 of the *National Security Act 1939-43*, delegate to the Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria all his powers and functions under the National Security (Food Control) Regulations in relation to oats in the said State.

Now therefore I, Norman Angus Martin, the Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria, acting under the said delegation, do hereby make the following Order in pursuance of the National Security (Food Control) Regulations:

1. This Order may be cited as the Oats (Victoria) Order. Citation.
2. This Order shall apply in relation to oats in that part of Australia which is in the State of Victoria. Application of order.
3. In this Order, unless the contrary intention appears— Definitions.
 - "authorized person" means a person appointed by the State Minister to act under this Order;
 - "Government Gazette" means the *Government Gazette* of the State of Victoria;
 - "the State Minister" means the Minister of Agriculture for the State of Victoria.
4. (1) A person shall not, except with the approval of the State Minister or an authorized person and in accordance with the terms and conditions of the approval, move, transport, distribute sell or otherwise dispose of, or use (otherwise than for his own domestic purposes) any oats. Distribution of oats.
 - (2) An approval given under the last preceding sub-paragraph may be subject to such terms and conditions as the State Minister or an authorized person thinks fit, and may be varied, suspended or revoked by him at any time.
 - (3) A person shall comply with every term and condition upon which an approval is given to him in pursuance of this paragraph.
5. (1) If the State Minister or an authorized person is satisfied that it is necessary so to do for the purposes of the defence of the Commonwealth and the effectual prosecution of the war, he may, by notice served personally or by post or published in the *Government Gazette*, require any owner or other person having the possession of oats to supply, within such time and manner as are specified in the requirement, to such person or to persons included in such class of persons as is so specified, such quantity of oats as is so specified. Requirement as to the supply of oats.
 - (2) An owner or other person who has been required under this paragraph to supply any specified quantity of oats shall not refuse or fail to supply that quantity of oats within the time and in the manner and to the person or persons included in the class of persons specified in the requirement.
6. (1) The State Minister or an authorized person may, by notice served personally or by post or published in the *Government Gazette*, require a person or persons included in a class of persons, to furnish, on or before the date and in the manner specified in the notice, a return, containing such information in relation to oats as is so specified. Returns and information.
 - (2) A person who has been required under this paragraph to furnish a return shall not—
 - (a) refuse or fail to furnish the return, on or before the date and in the manner specified in the notice, to the person making the requirement; or
 - (b) furnish any such return which is incomplete or false or misleading in any particular.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for regulating the business and proceedings at the meetings of the Country Fire Authority and of committees thereof, and for prescribing the notice to be given of such meetings and the expenses to be paid to members of the Authority:

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the regulations following that is to say):—

1. The Authority shall meet for the transaction of ordinary business not less than twelve times in every year, on such days and at such time and place as the Authority shall from time to time determine. Meetings of
the Authority.

The Authority shall commence business so soon after the time stated in the notice as there is a sufficient number of members present to form a quorum, but if a quorum be not present within fifteen minutes after the time appointed for a meeting, the members present, or a majority of them, or any one member if only one is present, or the Secretary if no member is present, may adjourn such meeting to any day not later than seven days from the date of such adjournment.

Provided that nothing herein shall be construed to prevent the adjournment of any meeting to a later hour of the same day on which such meeting was appointed to be held.

2. The Chairman may from time to time and shall forthwith upon the receipt of a requisition in writing requiring him to do so signed by at least three members of the Authority convene a special meeting for any particular purpose or purposes. No business other than that specified in the notice shall be transacted at any special meeting. Special
meetings.

3. All notices of any meetings of the Authority or of committees of the same shall be in writing, and shall be delivered or sent by post or otherwise so that in the ordinary course of transmission they would be received at the usual place of business, if any, or to the place of abode of each of the members, in the case of an ordinary meeting *two* clear days at least previous to the meeting, and in the case of a special meeting *four* clear days at least previous to the meeting. Notices of
meetings.

Every such notice shall specify the time and place of the meeting, and in the case of a special meeting the business to be considered thereat.

4. The Authority may from time to time:—

- Committees.
- (a) Appoint committees of members of the Authority either for general purposes or a special purpose or special purposes.
 - (b) Fix a quorum of any committee.

5. The Chairman of the Authority shall be *ex officio* Chairman of all committees.

In the absence of the Chairman of the Authority the members of a committee shall elect a Chairman.

6. On any matter the decision of the majority of the members present at any meeting of a committee shall be the decision of the committee, but in the case of an equality of votes the Chairman shall have a second or casting vote.

All committees appointed by the Authority shall meet within fourteen days of their first appointment, or any time thereafter by order of the Authority, or on the written order of the Chairman of any committee or of any two members of any committee.

7. Subject to the foregoing provisions, a committee may meet from time to time and may adjourn from place to place as it thinks proper, but no business shall be transacted at any meeting of a committee unless the quorum if any fixed by the Authority, or if no quorum be so fixed, three members at least, are present.

Minutes.

8. The Authority shall cause entries of all proceedings at meetings of the Authority and of every committee appointed by the Authority with the names of the members present at each meeting, to be made from time to time in books to be provided for the purpose and which shall be kept by the Secretary under the superintendence of the Chairman.

9. Minutes of all proceedings of a committee shall be signed by the Chairman of such committee and presented to the first meeting of the Authority subsequent to the meeting of such committee for approval or otherwise.

10. At all meetings of the Authority the first business shall be the confirmation or otherwise of the minutes of any preceding meeting of the Authority not previously confirmed and no discussion shall be permitted thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The minutes, if confirmed, shall thereupon be signed by the Chairman.

Order of business at meetings of the Authority.

11. The order of business at an ordinary meeting of the Authority shall be as follows or as near thereto as practicable, that is to say:—

- (i) Confirmation of the minutes of previous meetings.
- (ii) Payments.
- (iii) Presentation of reports of committees.
- (iv) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
- (v) Ordinary business.
- (vi) Orders of the day, including subjects continued from the proceedings of former meetings.
- (vii) Extraordinary business and new rules and regulations.
- (viii) Other motions of which notice has been given.
- (ix) Presentation of reports of officers.
- (x) Notices of motion.

The order of business at a special meeting of the Authority shall be the order in which such business stands in the notice thereof only.

Vote, how taken.

12. On taking the vote on any motion or amendment the Chairman shall put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative, and shall declare his opinion from a show of hands as to which party has the majority.

Manner of voting.

13. The Authority or any committee shall vote by show of hands. Any member may, however, call for a division upon any question, in which case the members voting in the affirmative shall stand up, and those in the negative shall retain their seats until the result is declared by the Chairman.

Notices of motion.

14. Any member of the Authority may bring forward such business as he may consider advisable in the form of a notice of motion, such notice to be dated and numbered and given in writing to the Secretary at least seven clear days previous to the meeting at which same is to be considered, or to be given by the intending mover to the Secretary at the close of the meeting of the Authority, and the Secretary shall enter the same in the notice of motion book in the order in which it may be received.

Notice of motion to be given.

15. No member shall make any motion initiating a subject for discussion except in pursuance of notice given as prescribed in the last preceding clause.

Mover of motion.

16. No motion entered in the notice of motion book shall be proceeded with unless the member who has given such notice, or some member authorized by him in writing, shall be present when the business is called in order, and motions must be moved in the order in which they have been received, and if not so moved or postponed shall be struck out.

Motions and amendments must be seconded, &c.

17. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded, and no motion or amendment may be withdrawn except by leave of the Authority.

18. Any member desirous of proposing a motion or amendment, or of discussing any matter under consideration, must rise and address the Chairman, and no member when speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall sit down, in which case the member calling to order shall be heard thereon in preference to any other speaker, and the question of order shall be disposed of before the debate on the subject is resumed or any other subject entered upon.

19. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that question.

20. If two or more members rise to speak at the same time, the Chairman shall decide which is entitled to pre-audience.

21. No member may speak twice to a question before the Authority except in explanation or reply. A reply shall be allowed to a member who has made a substantive motion to the Authority, but not to any member who has moved an amendment. After such reply the main question shall immediately be put.

22. The Chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule or precedent applicable to the case without argument or comment, and his decision as to what is in order or explanation shall be final.

23. One amendment only shall be received or discussed at one time, but upon any amendment being carried it shall thereupon form part of the main question, and for purposes of further discussion shall be acted on as the original motion, except that it shall not be competent for the mover of such amendment to move another amendment on such main question.

24. The members present at a meeting may from time to time adjourn the meeting.

No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of a meeting, but if on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment be entertained, but if the motion for adjournment be carried the business then undisposed of shall have precedence at the next meeting of the Authority.

25. At every meeting of the Authority all motions, whether original motions or amendments, shall be reduced into writing, signed by the mover and delivered to the Chairman immediately on their being moved and seconded.

26. No resolution of the Authority shall be revoked within six months after the date upon which it was carried unless such revocation be either unanimously adopted or adopted by a majority greater than that by which the resolution was carried in the first instance.

27. In all cases not hereinbefore provided for, resort shall be made to the rules, forms, and usages of the Legislative Assembly of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Authority.

28. The common seal of the Authority shall be in the joint custody of the Chairman and Secretary or other officer authorized by the Authority, but shall not be affixed to any document except by order of the Authority as recorded in the minute book, and shall only be affixed in the presence of the Chairman (or in his absence any other member appointed by the Authority) and Secretary (or other officer authorized by the Authority).

29. (i) Every member of the Authority whose usual place of abode is more than 20 miles from Melbourne shall in respect of his attendance at each meeting of the Authority held in Melbourne be entitled to an allowance of the sum of Three pounds three shillings as personal expenses.

(ii) Every member of the Authority who is appointed by the Authority to attend a fire brigade demonstration or any other official function or duty (other than a meeting of the Authority) shall where travelling for more than 20 miles from his usual place of residence is necessary be entitled to an allowance of the sum of One pound one shilling as personal expenses for each day or portion of a day occupied in travelling and attendance.

30. Every member of the Authority attending any meeting of the Authority and every member of the Authority who is appointed by the Authority to attend any fire brigade demonstration or any other

official function or duty may be provided with a voucher to obtain first-class rail transport between his usual place of residence and the place of meeting or other duty as aforesaid.

Provided that where direct and convenient rail transport is not available between the usual place of residence of a member and the place of meeting or duty as aforesaid, such member may by resolution of the Authority be paid a sum not exceeding Four pence half-penny per mile for any journey made by road by the shortest practicable route.

32. Every claim for personal or other expenses shall be—

- (a) made in writing;
- (b) certified to as being correct by the claimant;
- (c) countersigned before payment by the Chairman (or in the case of a claim by the Chairman) by the last retiring Chairman, or alternatively by a member specially appointed by the Authority for the purpose if there be no last retiring Chairman;
- (d) delivered or posted by the claimant to the office of the Authority within seven (7) days after the date (or after the last of several consecutive days as the case may be) upon which the expenditure was incurred.

And the Honorable Herbert John Thornhill Hyland, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

DECLARATION OF THE WESTERN HIGHWAY IN THE TOWN OF ARARAT, SHIRES OF BACCHUS MARSH AND BALLAN, CITY OF BALLAARAT, SHIRES OF BALLAARAT AND DIMBOOLA, TOWN OF HORSHAM, SHIRES OF KANIVA, LOWAN, AND RIPON.

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the eighteenth day of December, One thousand nine hundred and forty-four the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highway in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same is of sufficient importance to be a State Highway and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highway to be a State Highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a State Highway: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such Resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the road mentioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board a State Highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for the Declaration of a State Highway under the Country Roads Act.

The Country Roads Board incorporated by the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) at a meeting now holden being of opinion that the highway within the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule hereunder written is of sufficient importance to be a State Highway acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act doth by this Resolution hereby declare such highway to be a State Highway within the meaning and for the purposes of the said *Country Roads Act 1928*.

SCHEDULE.

Town of Ararat.

2. *Western Highway*.—Commencing at the south-eastern angle of allotment 15, section C, Parish of Ararat; thence north-westerly to the north-western angle of allotment 593, Town of Ararat; thence westerly and south-westerly to the south-western angle of allotment 20, section F, of the said town; thence north-westerly to the south-western angle of section 118, Town of Ararat, Parish of Ararat.

Shire of Bacchus Marsh.

2. *Western Highway*.—Commencing at the south-western angle of the northern portion of Crown portion 11, Township of Bacchus Marsh, Parish of Korkuperrimul; thence westerly and north-westerly to a point on the southern boundary of the northern portion of Crown portion 6, of the said township, distant approximately 919 feet from the south-western angle of the said northern portion.

HOLIDAYS IN CERTAIN TRADES.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the Factories and Shops Acts, His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and—

1. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-sixth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts and the Order in Council made thereunder, and such portions of the City of Sandringham as are not included in the said district; the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, and Warrnambool, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol, be fixed as a holiday for persons whosoever employed in the business of—

- (a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game;
- (b) preparing fish for sale, uncooked or for canning, drying, or smoking;
- (c) selling by wholesale or retail (except for consumption on the premises), poultry, game, fish, or oysters;
- (d) marketing (in fish and poultry markets) poultry, game, or fish.

2. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Tinsmiths Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The third day of March, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the trade or business of manufacturing articles made of tin plate, or other sheet metal, including the japanning of such articles.

3. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 2 (Boot Repairers), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-sixth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in boot repairers' shops.

4. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 19 (Confectionery, Pastry, Fruit, and Vegetable), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The fourteenth day of March, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in fruit and vegetable shops.

5. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Brushmakers Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-fourth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the process, trade, or business of a brush-maker.

6. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Gas Meter Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The third day of March, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the process, trade, business, or occupation of making or repairing gas meters.

7. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Hairdressers Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twentieth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan and Geelong Districts, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the business of a hairdresser or barber, or other workers of hair, or employed at—

- (a) hair or scalp treatment;
- (b) toilet work.

8. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 8 (Dairy Produce and Cooked Meat), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The nineteenth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in dairy produce or cooked meat (other than tinned meat) shops.

9. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Pastrycooks Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The nineteenth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District and Geelong District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person employed in the process, trade, or business of a pastrycook.

10. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Biscuit Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The nineteenth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed making biscuits.

11. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 3 (Butchers), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed—

- (a) in the process, trade, or business of a butcher or seller of fresh uncooked meat, or maker or seller of small goods;
- (b) delivering fresh uncooked meat or small goods.

12. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Ice Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the business of a maker of ice for trade or sale (other than persons employed solely in issuing ice for distribution).

13. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Ice Cream Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the trade of making edible ices, ice cream, or any frozen article of which ice cream is the principal ingredient.

14. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Frozen Goods Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the trade of freezing, refrigerating, packing, or grading goods of any kind (other than ice cream) for the purpose of trade or sale, in a frozen or refrigerated condition, but not including—

- (a) persons subject to the Determination of the Ice Board;
- (b) any person or persons engaged in the slaughtering and boning departments of meat works or abattoirs in the preparation and packing of meats, offals, and by-products in a fresh condition.

15. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Meat Preservers Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, be fixed as a holiday for every person—

- (a) employed in the process, trade, or business of—
 - (1) preserving meat;
 - (2) preparing food products from animal fat or from edible oils;
 - (3) putting up preserved meat or food products prepared from animal fat or from edible oils;
- (b) employed as a storeman, packer, or sorter in connexion with the trade or business of—
 - (1) preserving meat;
 - (2) preparing food products from animal fat or from edible oils.

16. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Animal Manure Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business of the manufacture of manure from animal matter.

17. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Slaughtering for Export Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the meat export trade as—

- (a) slaughterers or dressers of sheep, lambs, cattle, pigs, or calves;
- (b) boners, trimmers, or labourers;
- (c) drovers, stockmen, or penners-up;
- (d) skin store workers.

18. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Sausage Casings Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The seventeenth day of January, 1945, shall, within the whole of the State of Victoria, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in the process, trade, or business of preparing or cleaning casings for sausages or similar products.

19. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Market Gardeners Board, doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twenty-eighth day of February, 1945, shall, throughout such portions of the State of Victoria, as are within a radius of 40 miles from the post office, at the corner of Bourke-street and Elizabeth-street, in the City of Melbourne, be fixed as a holiday for persons engaged in the trade of market gardening (that is to say, the growing of vegetables for sale).

20. On the recommendation of a Wages Board, described as the Shops Board No. 15 (Grocers), doth hereby make the following Regulation, that is to say:—

The twelfth day of February, 1945, shall, in the Metropolitan District and the Geelong District, as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, and within the City of Ballarat and the Borough of Sebastopol, be fixed as a holiday for persons employed in grocers' shops and in shops in which tea is sold.

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

BY-LAW No. 24.

A By-law of the Shire of Korumburra (formerly the Shire of Poowong and Jeetho) made under the provisions of the Local Government Acts, and numbered 24, for—

- (1) Prohibiting the depositing or leaving of refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages;
- (2) prohibiting or regulating the depositing or leaving of refuse or rubbish on any land; and
- (3) requiring the removal or destruction by the owner or occupier of any land of refuse or rubbish thereon, other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act* 1923.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Korumburra do hereby order as follows:—

1. No person shall deposit or leave, or cause or permit to be deposited or left, any refuse or rubbish on any street, lane, road, or passage within the Municipal District of the Shire of Korumburra.
2. No person shall deposit or leave, or cause or permit to be deposited or left, any refuse or rubbish on any land within the said Municipal District.
3. The owner or occupier of any land upon which any refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left shall remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish within four days after the service on such owner or occupier of a notice, in writing, from the Council over the signature of the Shire Secretary, requiring such owner or occupier so to do.

4. In the event of default being made by such owner or occupier in complying with such notice within the time aforesaid, and notwithstanding the imposition or recovery of any penalty, the Council may, by its Inspector, with a sufficient number of workmen, enter upon any land upon which refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left, and for that purpose break down any fence surrounding the said land on which such refuse or rubbish has been deposited or left, and remove or destroy such refuse or rubbish and any expenses incurred by the Council in so doing shall be paid by the owner or occupier of the said land to the Council on demand, and in default of payment such expenses may be recovered by the Council from such owner or occupier in a Court of Petty Sessions.

5. Every person who shall be guilty of an offence against any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable for every first offence to a penalty not exceeding Two pounds, and for every subsequent offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds. In the event of any offence being continued after a conviction or order imposed or made on or against such persons by any Court, such person shall be liable to a further penalty of One pound for each day such offence is continued.

6. In this By-law the words "street," "road," "lane," or "passage" shall mean and include any street, road, lane, or passage within the said Municipal District, whether or not the same be a public highway or set out on private property, or made or unmade, or under the care and management of the Council.

7. (a) Every notice which by this By-law is required to be given to the owner or occupier of any land shall be addressed to the owner or occupier of any such land, and shall—

- (1) If such owner or occupier and his residence in either case are known to the Council, be served on such owner or occupier, or left with some adult inmate of his abode.
- (2) If such owner and his residence are not known to the Council, be served on the occupier (if any) of such land, or left with some adult inmate of his abode, or if there is no occupier, be put up on some conspicuous part of any such land.
- (3) If such occupier and his residence are not known to the Council, be put on some conspicuous part of such land.

(b) But any such notice may also be served by post, by prepaid letter addressed to such owner or occupier: and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that such notice was addressed to the usual or last known place of abode or business of such owner or occupier, and was put into the post.

8. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Korumburra.
