PUBLIC HIGHWAY-SHIRE OF BRAYBROOK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the Government Gazette, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Braybrook has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired as a street by the said Council within Braybrook has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been acquired as a street by the said Council within the said shire, he so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land acquired as a street hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Braybrook aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY .- SHIRE OF BRAYBBOOK

All that piece of land commencing at a point being the north-west corner of Summerhill and Suffolk roads, within the municipal district of the Shire of Braybrook; thence bearing south 89 deg. 39 min. west for a distance of 973 ft. 7 inches; thence north 1 ft. 0 in.,; thence north 89 deg. 39 min. east, a distance of 973 ft. 7 in.; thence south 0 deg. 8 min. west, a distance of 1 foot to the commencing point.

A By-law-for Making and Levying the Rates for the Year commencing on the First day of July, 1945.

THE Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Trust (hereinafter ealled "the Trust"), in pursuance of and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on such Trust by the Geelong Waterworks and Sewerage Act 1928, and of any other powers and authorities in any wise enabling the said Trust in that behalf, doth hereby make the By-law for the area supplied with water by the Geelong Water Supply Works or any extension of such works.

- 1. The following rates are hereby made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the said area and supplied with water for domestic purposes:-
 - (a) On any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) the annual valuation whereof, does not exceed £20—Twenty shillings per annum.
 - (b) On any such tenement the annual valuation whereof exceeds £20—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
 - (c) On any land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof does not exceed £5—Five shillings per annum.
 - (d) On any such land on which there is no building the annual valuation whereof exceeds £5—One shilling in the pound of the amount of the annual valuation.
- 2. Such rates are made and shall be levied for the year beginning with the first day of July, 1945, and ending with the thirtieth day of June, 1946, and shall be payable in two equal instalments on the fifth day of October, 1945, and the first day of January 1946. first day of January, 1946.
- Such persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for that purpose shall be and are hereby authorized to demand, receive, collect, sue for, and recover the said rates.
- 4. For making and levying such rates within the said area, the valuation for the time being of all lands and tenements for the municipal rate of the municipality in the municipal district of which such lands and tenements are situate shall be deemed and taken to be the valuation of such lands and tenements respectively; but if any such lands and tenements are not included in a valuation in force for the municipality in whose district they are situate, or if there is no such valuation, the net annual value thereof may for all the purposes for such rate be determined in accordance with the provisions of the Local Government Acts by the council of such municipality on the written application of the Trust, as provided for in such case by the Water Acts.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Sewerage Districts

REQUIATIONS: FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "BOTANIC GARDENS" IN THE CITY OF MELBOURNE.

WHEREAS by section 181 of the Land Act 1928, as reemacted by section 9 of the Land Act 1941, power is given
to the Board of Land and Works to, inter alia, make
regulations for the care, protection, and management of lands
reserved pursuant to the provisions of the Land Acts and not
conveyed to and vested in trustees, and for the preservation of
good order and decency therein: Now therefore the Board,
in pursuance of the power-conveyed as aforesaid, doth hereby
make the Regulations following for so much of the lands
reserved for Public Park and Gardens in the City of Melbourne
as is known as the "Botanic Gardens" hereinafter referred to
as the "Gardens."

- REGULATIONS.
- (1) The gates of the Gardens shall, unless the Minister of Lands otherwise directs, be opened daily at 7 a.m. during the months of October, November, December, January, February, and March, and at 7.30 a.m. during the months of April, May, June, July, August, and September, and shall be closed at sunset; Provided, however, that on all Sundays the Gardens shall be opened at 8 a.m.
- A hell shall be rung five; (5) minutes before the locking of the gates; and any person found in the Gardens during hours; when the Gardens are required by this Regulation to be closed, shall be liable to prosecution.
- (2) No person shall enter or remain in the Gardens who is in a state of intoxication, or who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct, nor shall any person

behave in a disorderly manner; or create or take part in any disturbance, or use indecent or abusive language, or commit any nuisance, or in any way offend against decency, or commit any act of indecency therein.

- (3) No person shall interfere with any bulb or thing growing within the Gardens, or with any seed or fruit of any such thing, nor shall any person, without the authority of the Director of the Gardens, have in his possession therein any shrub, plant, flower, bulb, fern, or seed.
 - (4) No person shall whilst in the Gardens:-
 - (a) Interfere with or deface any property or tree or plant life therein, or any fence in or around the Gardens.
 - (b) Trespass on any flower or shrubbery bed, border, or edging therein, or any plot specially planted or enclosed for a plantation or any other purpose therein.
 - (c) Interfere with any fish, bird or other animal, or bird's nest, or bird's egg therein.
 - (d) Engage in any game or sport therein.
 - (e) Throw stones or any other material or missiles therein.
 - (f) Commit any nuisance or leave any refuse therein. "
 - (g) Spit on the paths, lawns, or on or in any structure or building therein.
 - (h) Lie on the seats or on the grass in an offensive or indecent attitude or manner.
 - (i) Enter without lawful excuse any enclosure or area wherein a dwelling, conservatory, equipment shed, or other building or propagating frames are located.
 - (j) Ride any bicycle or tricycle therein, or drive or allow to enter therein any carriage, car, or other vehicle unless the same be used or required in connexion with works therein.
 - Wilfully obstruct or interrupt any person employed therein in the proper execution of his work or duty.
 - (1) Annoy any person therein.
 - (m) Bathe, wade. or wash in any lake, pond, stream, or other ornamental water therein, or pollute any such water, or use any drinking fountain for any purpose other than drinking.
- (5) No person other than a member of the staff of the (a) so person other than a memoer of the stall of the Gardens, or the lessee of the kiosk or his servants, shall light any fire therein.
- (6) No male person shall enter any of the women's lavatories, and no female person shall enter any of the men's
- (7) No child under the age of ten (10) years shall enter the Gardens unless accompanied by and in the care or charge of an adult.

- ...(8) No person shall, unless authorized in writing by the Board of Land and Works, offer for sale or sell in the Gardens any goods or article, or let for hire any chair or seat.
- (9) No person shall cause or suffer any dog in his charge to enter the Gardens unless such dog be and remain under proper control on a chain, cord, or leash, and be at all times effectually restrained from causing annoyance to any, person, or from entering any ornamental water or area enclosing a house or other building, or going on or being upon any garden or bed
- (10) No assembly for a concert, musical performance, fete, or picnic, or for the purpose of public worship, preaching, or public speaking of any kind; or meeting of a like character shall take place in the Gardens without the approval, in writing, of the Secretary for Lands first obtained.
- (11) No person whilst in the Gardens shall, without the approval; in writing, of the Secretary for Lands first

 - (a) Distribute any bill, programme, or like thing.
 (b) Collect, or attempt to collect, money.
 (c) Take part in any public entertainment of any kind.
 (d) Preach or deliver an address or speech of any kind
 - to members of the public.

 (c) Display any flag, banner, sign, or device.

 (f) Take any photograph for commercial purposes.
- (12) No person shall take part iii or be a member of any assembly in the Gardens unless such assembly has been duly authorized as provided in clause 10 hereof.
- (13) Any person offending against any of these Regulations shall, upon being requested by any member of the staff of the Gardens, or of the Police Force, to leave the Gardens, forthwith leave the same, and such person shall, in addition, be liable to precent the same. liable to prosecution.
- (14) No person shall remain in the Gardens when lawfully directed to leave the same, and any person who refuses to so leave may be removed therefrom, and be liable to prosecution.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any of these Regulations shall for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5); and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulations, and who after he has been warned by any Bailiff of Crown Lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such Bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds (£10).
