REGULATIONS.—CHAPTER XII.—ATTENDANCE AND CONDUCT OF OFFICERS.

THE Public Service Board, in pursuance of the powers vested in it, hereby amends Chapter XII. of the Public Service Regulations, as shown below, and submits the same for the approval of the Governor in Council:—

For-

Clauses 3, 5, 6, 9, 11, 46, and 47.

Read-

3. Hours of Business.—The hours of attendance to be observed by officers shall, unless otherwise determined, be from 8.45 a.m., to 5.6 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive.

Provided that any officer may be required to work on a Saturday morning from 8.45 a.m. to 11.45 a.m., in which case he shall be allowed equivalent time off duty during the following week, at the convenience of the Department.

Provided further that where the nature of the work will not admit of the general observance of these hours, the Permanent Head, with the approval of the Board, shall determine the hours of attendance of the officers concerned.

- 5. Attendance books, when accessible.—Attendance books shall be accessible for record and signature by officers up to 8.50 a.m. daily, when such books shall be withdrawn, and shall not be produced for recording departures until the proper time for ceasing work.
- 6. Officers arriving late at their offices.—Any officer arriving at his office after 8.50 a.m. shall report himself to the officer-in-charge or sub-charge, who shall record the time of his arrival in the attendance book.
- 9. Time allowed for huncheon.—Except as specified in Part IV., three quarters of an hour shall be allowed daily to every officer for luncheon from 12.45 p.m. to 1.30 p.m., or at such time as in departmental or public interest the Permanent Head or the Head of the Branch may determine.

The officer-in-charge of each room shall report to the Head of the Branch or of the Department all cases in which officers have not returned to duty after luncheon at the prescribed time.

11. Tea Money.—An allowance, to procure a meal, of two shillings and six pence may be paid to officers who are required to work after office hours, provided that no payment shall be made unless an officer works after 5.6 p.m. for at least two hours in addition to the interval taken for tea.

Such payment may, however, be made to Warders who are required to remain continuously on duty at the Law Courts later than 6.30 p.m.

Officers in charge are to watch carefully that no abuse of this Regulation is permitted.

CHAUFFEURS.

46. The hours of duty of Chauffeurs in the Departments of Premier, Chief Secretary (Children's Welfare Branch), Public Works, and Health shall be from 8.30 a.m. to 6.3 p.m. inclusive of three quarters of an hour for luncheon on Monday to Friday inclusive.

Provided that a Chauffeur may be required to work on a Saturday from 8.30 a.m. to 12.30 p.m., in which case he shall be allowed equivalent time off duty during the following week, at the convenience of the Department.

BOTANIC GARDENS.

47. The ordinary hours of attendance of persons employed on other than professional and clerical work in the Melbourne Botanic Gardens shall be from 7.40 a.m. to 5.15 p.m. on Monday to Friday inclusive, with an interval of three quarters of an hour for luncheon from 12 noon to 12.45 p.m.

Provided that any officer may be required to work on a Saturday morning, in which case he shall be allowed equivalent time off duty during the following week, at the convenience of the Department.

Employees may be required by the Director to perform general watching duty on public holidays and other special occasions or for the safe keeping of the conservatories, or, in the case of urgent necessity, to perform work beyond the hours prescribed, and may be granted leave of absence for such time worked.

Watchmen on all-day duty (i.e., from 8 a.m. to the actual closing of the gates) shall be allowed half an hour for luncheon, from 1 p.m. to 1.30 p.m., but shall on no account leave the gardens during the luncheon interval without permission from the Director.

State Electricity Commission Acts. STATE ELECTRICITY COMMISSION OF VICTORIA. AMENDMENT OF THE LICENSING OF ELECTRICAL MECHANICS REGULATIONS.

 - (i) to any person who produces to the Commission proof that he has satis-Commission proof that he has satisfactorily completed a course or passed an examination or examinations which are not listed in the Second Schedule to these Regulations, but which, in the opinion of the Commission, demand an equivalent or higher standard of technical knowledge and ability; and

- (ii) to any person over the age of 45 years who satisfies the Commission's examiners by oral examination as to his knowledge of the theory of electrical wiring; and
- (iii) to any person in connexion with whose application there are special circumstances which warrant any such exemption. Exemption under this sub-clause (iii) may be granted for a limited period or may not be so limited, and any such period may be extended or not extended, as the Commission may decide—
- (b) may grant a licence of the appropriate grade to any applicant who holds or who has held a licence in another State of the Commonwealth or in New Zealand, if the Commission's Chief Electrical Inspector certifies that to qualify for the licence held he was required to pass examinations of a standard not lower and to engage in electrical wiring work for a period not shorter than that prescribed under these Regulations for a licence of that grade."
- 2. Regulation 14 shall be deleted and the following Regulaton substituted therefor:—
 - "Recognition of work and service as electrical wiring
 - 14. (a) For the purposes of this Regulation and of Regulations 7, 9, and 13-

 - "(b) In this Regulation "the war" means the war which commenced on the 3rd day of September, 1939, and includes any other war in which His Majesty became engaged after that date and before the date of commencement of this Regulation."







DECLARATION OF THE NEW WALKER'S-ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF TRARALGON.


