  - (ii) Copper and/or Brass Smithing.

VARIATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE LANG LANG RIVER AND ITS TRIBUTARIES.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation revoke the Proclamation made the twenty-third day of March, 1943, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fourth day of March, 1943, regarding prohibition of fishing in the Lang Lang River and its tributaries; and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the following waters for the periods mentioned:—

1. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries between the Heath Hill Bridge and the mouth of such river, including what is known as the Lang Lang straight cut—from 1st May to 31st August in each year, both days inclusive.

2. The Lang Lang River and its tributaries (except O'Mahony's and Pheasant Creeks and their tributaries which are already closed to all fishing during the whole year) above or upstream from the Heath Hill Bridge—from 1st May to 15th December in each year, both days inclusive.

PROHIBITION OF ALL FISHING IN OR THE TAKING OF FISH FROM THE EASTERN AND WESTERN BRANCHES OF THE TARWIN RIVER FROM 1ST MAY TO 31ST AUGUST IN EACH YEAR.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia: &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers... enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation repeal the Proclamation made the twelfth day of October, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fourteenth day of October, 1942, respecting fishing in the Tarwin River, and prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Eastern and Western Branches of the Tarwin River and their tributaries, from the first day of May to the thirty-first day of August (both days inclusive) in each year.

## THE TOWN OF HORSHAM WATERWORKS TRUST.

## BY-LAW No. 7.—PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied by the Trust within its district.

1. For the purposes of this By-law, the district supplied with water by the Trust is divided into a northern area and a southern area by a line commencing at a point on the western boundary of the said district situate due west of the centre of Baillie-street west, at its westerly end; and running thence in a due easterly direction to the centre of Baillie-street west at its westerly end; and thence along the centre of Baillie-street west, Baillie-street, and Baillie-street east, to the eastern end of Baillie-street east; and thence in a due easterly direction to the eastern boundary of the said district.

2. During the period commencing at Three o'clock in the morning of the day following the day on which this By-law shall be published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, and ending at midnight on the thirtieth day of June, 1946 (hereinafter called "the said period") no person, except with the permission in writing of the Trust, shall—

- (a) water any garden or lawn in the said areas supplied by the Trust other than by means of a hose held in the hand, or by means of a can or other vessel held in the hand;
- (b) water any garden or lawn in the said northern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Tuesday, a Thursday, or a Saturday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday;
- (c) water any garden or lawn in the said southern area, except during the period of four hours commencing at 4.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Monday, a Wednesday, or a Friday, or except during the period of two hours commencing at 6.30 o'clock in the afternoon of a Sunday.

3. No person shall use, or permit, or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

4. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf, either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, may at all reasonable times—

- (a) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting, or may inspect any private service, or any part thereof, or any watering of gardens or lawns in course of execution therein or thereon, and/or
- (b) enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of superintending the watering of any gardens or lawns in the course of execution therein or thereon, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises, or any person engaged in executing such watering, any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all relevant provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed during and in connexion with the execution of such watering.

5. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, resists, or opposes, or refuses admission to any premises, or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given him by any person duly authorized in that behalf, shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

6. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5, and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

7. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or permits, or causes anything to be done in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Act.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

other remedy in respect thereof, close or cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water.

3. Every statement written out by the owner of pigs or his agent upon the sale thereof, pursuant to section 13 of the *Swine Act* as amended and given or transmitted to the purchaser of such pigs shall be retained by the purchaser for a period of at least three years.

4. In any proceeding for the recovery of any penalty under these Regulations the production of any statement unstamped or stamped with an insufficient swine duty stamp, or the swine duty stamp of which is

not properly or sufficiently obliterated and cancelled, or the proof of any such statement having been unstamped or not sufficiently stamped at the time when it was given or transmitted to the purchaser, or of the stamp not having been properly and sufficiently obliterated and cancelled, shall be sufficient prima facie evidence of such document having been so given or transmitted to the purchaser, or of the doing or performing of the act matter or thing without using a swine duty stamp or without the swine duty stamp having been properly and sufficiently obliterated and cancelled.

5. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

3. Every statement written out by the owner of cattle or his agent upon the sale thereof, pursuant to section 12 of the Cattle Compensation Act as amended and given or transmitted to the purchaser of such cattle shall be retained by the purchaser for a period of at least three years.

4. In any proceeding for the recovery of any penalty under these Regulations the production of any statement unstamped or stamped with an insufficient cattle duty stamp, or the cattle duty stamp of which is not properly or sufficiently obliterated and cancelled, or the proof of any such statement having been unstamped or not sufficiently stamped at the time when it was given or transmitted to the purchaser, or of the stamp not having been properly and sufficiently obliterated and cancelled, shall be sufficient prima facie evidence of such document having been so given or transmitted to the purchaser, or of the doing or performing of the act matter or thing without using a cattle duty stamp or without the cattle duty stamp having been properly and sufficiently obliterated and cancelled.

5. Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds.

## REGULATIONS.—CONSULTATIVE COUNCIL IN RESPECT OF VICTORIAN INSTITUTIONAL COMMUNITY SERVICE.

WHEREAS pursuant to section 11 of the *Ministry of Health Act* 1943, the Minister of Health may by Order under his hand establish a consultative council in respect of such matters and consisting of a chairman and such number of members as are specified in the Order:

And whereas the said Minister of Health did on the first day of November, 1945, establish a Consultative Council in respect of Victorian Institutional Community Service:

And whereas pursuant to the said section, the Governor in Council may make Regulations for or with respect to—

- (a) prescribing the powers and duties of consultative councils established under that section and of the chairman and other members thereof, and
- (b) generally carrying into effect the objects of that section:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

Citation and  
Commence-  
ment.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Ministry of Health (Consultative Council in respect of Victorian Institutional Community Service) Regulations 1945 or in abbreviated form as "The V.I.C.S. Regulations" and shall come into operation one month after publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Interpretation.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter the words and symbols hereunder shall have the meaning set out opposite them:—

"Determination" shall mean the determination for the time being in force made by the Hospital and Benevolent Asylum Attendants Board under the Factories and Shops Acts,

"Council" shall mean the Consultative Council in respect of Victorian Institutional Community Service,

"Minister" shall mean the Minister of Health,

"Salaried employee" shall mean a person who receives more than £5 2s. 6d. a week,

"Service" shall mean the Victorian Institutional Community Service,

"V.I.C.S." shall mean the designation by which the Service and members thereof may be known.

In these Regulations and the schedule thereto words importing the singular shall be deemed to include the plural and vice versa unless the context otherwise requires.

Objects.

3. The Council established by the Minister on the first day of November, 1945, shall advise the Minister as to the most effective methods of securing adequate female personnel for service as full-time employees (not being trained nurses, trainee nurses in recognized training schools, or salaried employees) of all Government subsidized hospitals and benevolent homes and such other hospitals, benevolent homes and institutions as the Minister may from time to time determine and, subject to the Minister, shall establish and conduct an organization according to directions contained in the schedule hereto to be known as the "V.I.C.S."

- (a) as additional members of the Council, and
- (b) to fill vacancies thereon,

the names of persons having special knowledge of matters relating to hospitals and benevolent homes and institutions.

2. Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Council shall have power to appoint, suspend and dismiss officers and employees engaged in the administration of the Service.

3. The Council shall appoint an honorary secretary and an honorary treasurer from its members and shall prescribe their duties.

4. Subject to the direction or approval of the Minister, the Council shall have power to do all things necessary to carry these Regulations into effect.

5. The Council shall meet as often as shall be considered necessary by the chairman.

6. At any meeting at which the chairman of the Council is not present the members thereof may elect a chairman for such meeting provided that the number of members present constitute a majority of the Council.

7. A majority of the members of the Council present at any meeting shall constitute a quorum thereof and may transact any business brought forward.

8. Each member (including the chairman) present at a meeting shall have one vote. In the event of the voting being equal the chairman of the meeting shall have a casting vote.

9. Minutes shall be kept of the proceedings and all meetings of the Council, and the confirmation of such minutes at such meeting or at a subsequent meeting shall be conclusive evidence of the proceedings thereat.

10. Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Council may appoint a person as director of the Service who shall receive such remuneration as the Minister may in his discretion determine.

11. Under direction of the Council, the director shall control and direct the Service. If required by the Council, the director shall reside at the headquarters of the Service.

12. The appointment of the director may be terminated in the following manner—

- (a) by the giving of four weeks' notice by either party, or
- (b) by the Council forthwith upon the consent of the Minister, if the Council decides after inquiry that the director has been negligent or careless in the performance of his or her duties or guilty of improper conduct.

13. Subject to the approval of the Minister, the Council may appoint such other officers and staff as it deems expedient for the efficient and proper organization and working of the Service and define the conditions of employment, duties and remuneration of such officers and staff.

14. Membership of the Service shall be open to all females (except salaried employees) and who on the date of coming into operation of these Regulations are employed and doing full-time work at the Queen's Memorial Infectious Diseases Hospital, Government subsidized hospitals, benevolent homes and institutions and to other females who desire to be employed in such institutions and are accepted as members by the director.

15. Every female who desires to join the Service may apply to the director for acceptance as a member and the director shall cause the name and personal particulars of each female accepted for registration to be recorded in a register of members. The director shall acquaint such persons with the conditions of membership.

16. Persons who at the date of coming into operation of these Regulations are qualified for admittance as members of the Service shall, upon admittance to the Service, be supplied with indoor uniforms (as soon as available). Such uniforms shall be supplied free of cost.

17. New members may be required upon admittance to the Service to spend at least seven (7) days at headquarters (when established) be fitted with indoor uniforms and be given suitable instruction and practice to fit them for posting to institutions and generally be made familiar with their obligations and privileges as members of the Service.

18. Nothing in these Regulations shall affect the liability of the persons or bodies, by whom members may be employed, to observe the determination entirely both as to the wages and conditions therein prescribed.

When required or permitted to live out, a member who is not entitled to receive a living-out allowance by provision of the determination shall be recouped at the rate of fourteen (14) shillings per week

for living-out expenses. Every member shall in addition to the recreation and sick leave prescribed by the determination, be entitled to a continuous period of seven days' rest a year on full pay and may if she so desires be accommodated at Service headquarters (when established) for such period at such charges as are fixed by the Council.

Upon leaving the Service with an honourable discharge after two (2) or more years' service each member shall be entitled to payment for half the period of sick leave accumulated under the provisions of the determination.

**Control.**

19. Each member of the Service shall be subject to the disciplinary control of the institution at which she is employed. When an institution dispenses with the services of a member of the Service, the chief executive officer of such institution shall immediately report such fact to the director in writing and state the reason or reasons for her discharge. No officer of an institution shall exchange views with an officer of any other institution as to the suitability or otherwise of any member, but shall apply direct to the director for any labour required and the director shall allot members of the Service to an institution on the request of the matron or other authorized employing officer of such institution.

A member shall within twenty-four hours after receiving notice of termination of employment by an institution inform the director of such notice, when consideration shall be given to future placements or termination of Service membership.

**Super-annuation.**

20. The Council may with the consent of the Minister institute or arrange for affiliation with a contributory scheme of superannuation of which he shall approve.

**Hostels, lounges, &c.**

21. Upon being directed to do so by the Minister, the Council shall establish a hostel which shall be the headquarters of the Service. The site capacity and general conditions relating to the hostel shall be subject to the approval of the Minister and a club room for the free use of members of the Service shall be established as part of the hostel or provided separately in the City of Melbourne.

**Age of entry.**

22. The minimum age of entry into the Service shall be fifteen (15) years but no member shall be posted to ward duties until she has attained the age of seventeen (17) years.

**Voluntary membership and termination of Service.**

23. Membership shall be voluntary and may be terminated by a member giving seven (7) days' notice to the director. Upon termination of membership from any cause the member shall return to headquarters all uniforms and other equipment issued to her by the Service.

If the membership of any member is terminated by the director against her wishes, such member shall have a right to appeal to the Council the decision of which shall be final.

24. The Council shall not be liable to remunerate in any way a member of the Service during her period of membership including the period referred to in clause 17 and any period when such member is awaiting a new placement of service, but shall be liable to a member for all concessions, allowances and privileges provided in these Regulations where no provision for such is made in the determination.

**Affiliation with Service.**

25. Any hospital or benevolent home or institution subsidized by the Government or (if not so subsidized) approved by the Minister may apply to the Council for and may be granted affiliation with the Service and shall thereafter be entitled to apply to the Director for allotment of members of the Service to such institution.

**Payments by affiliated institutions.**

26. Affiliated institutions shall pay to the Council such amounts as shall be fixed by the Council. Such payments shall be recouped to affiliated institutions in such manner as may be decided by the Minister.

**Expenses of the Service.**

27. With the approval of the Minister, the Council shall have power to expend moneys for the inauguration and organization of the Service, to pay rents, wages and salaries, to purchase furniture, stores and equipment and generally to carry out these Regulations.

**Rules.**

28. The Council may make rules for the conduct of the Service and the appointment, control and duties of officers and staff and for prescribing the books of record and otherwise to be kept by the Service and institutions affiliated therewith.

And the Honorable William Crawford Haworth, His Majesty's Minister of Health for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

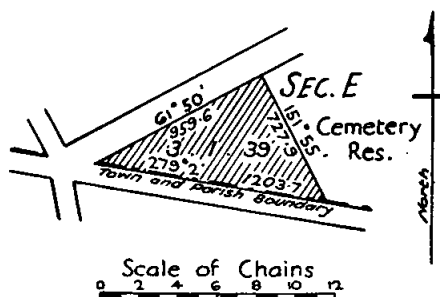

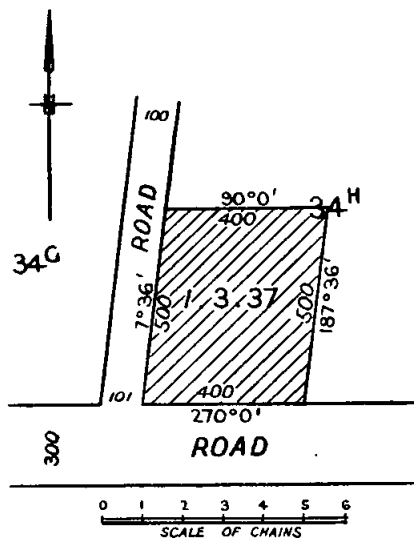

## CITY OF FOOTSCRAY.

### BY-LAW No. 110.

A By-law of the City of Footscray, numbered 110, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, for prescribing areas within the municipal district as residential areas and prohibiting or regulating within the whole of the such residential areas the use of any land, or the erection (including adaptation for use), or the use of any building or vacant land for the purposes of trades, industries, manufactures, businesses, or public amusements.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Act and every power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Footscray, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

The following clause shall be added to Schedule "A" of By-law 74 of the City of Footscray, namely:—

13.
