PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS section 14 (2) of the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or to any part thereof: And whereas the councils of the municipalities of the Boroughs of Echuca and Ringwood, and of the Shires of Bacchus Marsh and Warrnambool have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities, and the councils of the municipalities of the Shires of Marong, Numurkah and Warracknabeal have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to parts of the municipal districts of such municipalities: Now therefore, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* to the municipal districts of the municipalities of the—

Boroughs of Echuca and Ringwood, Shires of Bacchus Marsh and Warrnambool, and to parts of the following municipalities as set out hereunder:—

Shire of Marong.—Townships of Bridgewater, Kangaroo Flat, Marong and Raywood.

Shire of Numurkah.—Townships of Nathalia, Strathmerton, Wunghnu, Picola and Numurkah, and the vicinity within a distance of one and one-half (1½) miles of the boundary of the Township of Numurkah.

Shire of Warracknabeal.—Township of Warracknabeal.

Hairdressers Registration Act 1936 (No. 4396).

HAIRDRESSERS REGISTRATION REGULATION 1945.

THE Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria, by virtue of the powers conferred by the *Hairdressers Registration Act 1936 (No. 4396)*, doth hereby make the additional Regulation following (that is to say):—

1. This Regulation may be cited as the Hairdressers Registration Regulation 1945, and shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

TRAINING.

Any applicant for registration in respect of any prescribed class of hairdressing under sub-section (2) of section 8 of the Act whose contract of apprenticeship is deemed to have been suspended by virtue of the provisions of the *Re-establishment and Employment Act 1945 (No. 11 of 1945)* shall be deemed to have served an apprenticeship if he satisfies the Board that he has served in Victoria not less than three years of apprenticeship, during which he was taught hairdressing of the class in respect of which he applies for registration.

The foregoing Regulation was made and passed by the Hairdressers Registration Board of Victoria at a meeting of the said Board held on the seventeenth day of October, 1945.

ADDITION TO THE METROPOLITAN MOTOR OMNIBUS REGULATIONS.

HIS Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth, in pursuance of the powers conferred by sections 13 and 15 of the *Motor Omnibus Act 1928* (No. 3742), make an addition, as set out hereunder, to the Metropolitan Motor Omnibus Regulations made by the Governor in Council on the 21st January, 1925, viz.:—

"In that portion of clause (d) of the above-mentioned Regulations relating to *Seats*, after the words 'shall be allowed to ride beside the driver at any time' where appearing in the fourth paragraph, insert the following new paragraph:—

"A bulkhead, which shall extend to the off side of the body of the motor omnibus, must be constructed immediately behind the driver's seat. Such bulkhead shall be not less than five feet in height and shall be fitted with a glass window. A railing affixed to and extending from the left-hand side of the door or entrance to the motor omnibus shall be fitted to the bulkhead. In every instance, the railing shall be fitted in such a manner as will prevent passengers from crowding the driver, and from intruding into his driving view. The whole to be constructed to the satisfaction of the Licensing Authority."

CITY OF BRIGHTON.

By-LAW No. 112.

A By-law of the City of Brighton, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 112, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City of Brighton, under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brighton order as follows:—

Brick Areas.

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas, and no person shall in any such area construct or cause to be constructed any building, the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete.

Limit of Two Storeys.

2. The whole of the municipal district is hereby prescribed as an area in which buildings of Classes II, and III, occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey, and no person shall in any such areas construct a building of Class II, or Class III, occupancy to contain more than two storeys, including the ground storey.

Minimum Area, Depth, and Width of Frontage.

3. The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Distance from Street Alignment.

4. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 25 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 25 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

5. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—

(a) construct a building of Class I, occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations or in clause 4 of this By-law (as the case may be; or

(b) construct a building of Class III, V, VII, VI, or VIII, occupancy, or a building to which a building of Class IV, occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations, in any case where, on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Flat in Business Areas.

6. In the case of a building constructed in an area used primarily for business purposes, the requirements of clause 803 of the Regulations as adopted by clause 3 of this By-law are hereby dispensed with in the case of a building containing flats (Class II, occupancy), and the requirements of clauses 803 (as adopted by clause 3 of this By-law) and 807 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with where such flats have only one habitable room, provided that—

(a) the site of such building shall have an area of not less than 3,300 square feet, a width of frontage of not less than 33 feet, of a depth not less than 80 feet; and

(b) the requirements of Part III, of Chapter II, of the Regulations shall be observed in the construction of such building.

Rear Access.

7. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the

Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.
