Read—

8. *Assistant, Class "E," Public Library.* A candidate for appointment to the position of Assistant, Class "E," Public Library, must have passed examinations qualifying him to enter the University of Melbourne (or such examinations as the Board may deem equivalent), and must at some such examination have passed in English and two other languages.

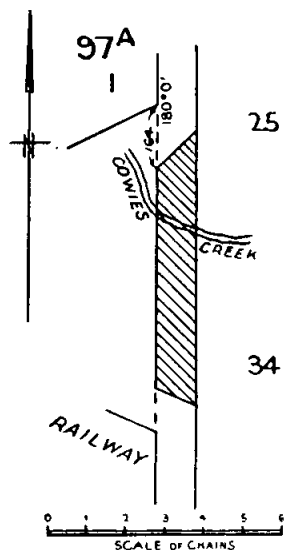

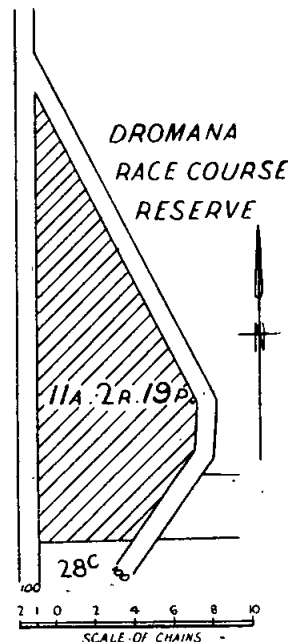

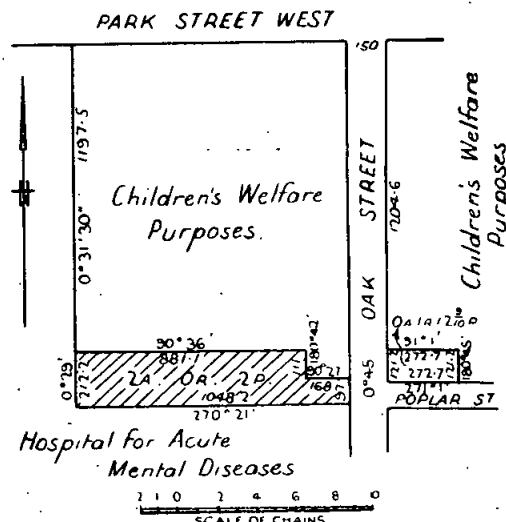
