## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS Monday, the sixteenth day of December, 1946, is by sub-section (1) of section 187 of the *Public Service Act 1928* appointed for a public holiday: And whereas it is made to appear to me expedient that the said day should not be a public holiday throughout Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the *Public and Bank Holidays Act 1934*, do by this my Proclamation declare that the said day shall not be a public holiday throughout Victoria and appoint

MONDAY, THE SEVENTEENTH DAY OF JUNE, 1946,

to be a public holiday throughout the said State.

**RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.**

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and any other powers hereunto enabling, the following Rule is made and shall take effect from the 3rd day of December, 1945:—

**RULES OF PROCEDURE IN CIVIL PROCEEDINGS.**

*Orders LXII., LXIII., and LXIV.—Amending Rule.*

1. Order LXII., as made on the 21st day of October, 1938, is amended as follows:—

In Rule 1 the words "and in a clear and legible hand" are repealed.

2. Order LXIII., as made on the 21st day of October, 1938, is amended as follows:—

(a) In Rule 3 after the word "Sundays" the word "Saturdays" is added.

(b) In Rule 4 the words "nor upon" after the word "Sunday" are repealed and the following words substituted therefor:—"Saturday or".

(c) In Rule 5 the words "the birthday of His Majesty" and the words "When any of such days falls on a Sunday, the next following Monday shall be a holiday in lieu of such day" are repealed.

(d) In Rule 6 the words "on Saturdays and" are repealed.

3. Order LXIV., as made on the 21st day of October, 1938, is amended as follows:—

(a) In Rule 2 after the word "Sunday" the word "Saturday" is added.

(b) In Rule 3 the words "a Sunday or other" are repealed and the word "any" is substituted therefor.

RULES UNDER THE JUSTICES ACTS.

## REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fourth day of July, 1942, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, declared that on and after the date of the publication in the *Government Gazette* of the Proclamation, the provisions of section 33 of the *Gas Regulation Act 1933* should have effect: And whereas such Proclamation was published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-fifth day of July, 1942: And whereas it is provided in the said section that so long as any such Proclamation remains unrevoked the Governor in Council may make such Regulations as he thinks fit for or with respect to matters set forth in the said section: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the said State, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the aforesaid section and all other powers him thereunto enabling, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Gas Regulation (Emergency Powers) Regulations (No. 12)," and shall take effect on and from the twelfth day of December, 1945.

2. During the period beginning on the day of commencement of these Regulations and ending on the thirty-first day of January, 1946, the provisions of sub-section (1) and sub-section (3) of section 20 of the *Gas Regulation Act 1933* shall not apply.

3. If on any day for a period of two hours or upwards the calorific value of gas supplied by any undertaker ascertained in accordance with the said Act is below the prescribed calorific value the undertaker shall be liable—

(a) to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for every complete One per centum by which the calorific value is deficient;

(b) for any deficiency in excess of Five per centum of deficiency —to a penalty of not less than Twenty-five pounds and not more than Fifty pounds:

Provided that, where there is no continuous record of the calorific value of the gas supplied by any undertaker, if on any occasion of testing the calorific value at any testing place is found to be deficient by more than one per cent. of the prescribed calorific value a second testing shall be made on the same day after an interval of not less than one hour and the mean of the two testings shall be deemed, for the purpose of these Regulations, to be the calorific value of the gas supplied by the undertaker at that testing place for a period of two hours ascertained as aforesaid.

4. An undertaker shall not be liable to any penalty under these Regulations in any case—

(a) where it shows that the deficiency or failure was due to circumstances which could not reasonably have been avoided by the undertaker;

(b) where a deficiency in calorific value on the occasion of any complete testing made as aforesaid does not exceed five per centum of the prescribed calorific value and the average calorific value of the gas supplied for the calendar month in which such deficiency occurs is not less than the prescribed calorific value.

5. An undertaker shall not be liable for more than one penalty in respect of any complete testing for any deficiency in calorific value composition or pressure of gas supplied from any one works.

And the Honorable William Slater, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AMENDMENT OF BUTCHERING AND/OR SMALL GOODS MAKING TRADES REGULATIONS (No. 1).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say):—

1. Regulation 10 of the Butchering and/or Small Goods Making Trades Regulation (No. 1) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded from the commencement of the first pay period after the 13th day of August, 1945.
2. Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the commencement of these Regulations.
3. For the said rescinded Regulation substitute the following:—

"10. The minimum rates of pay to be paid as wages to apprentices in the said trades in each year of their apprenticeship course shall be as follows, and shall operate from the commencement of the first pay period after the 13th day of August, 1945, on, from, and after which date all indentures of apprenticeship heretofore executed under the provisions of the Acts and the Regulations made in respect of the aforesaid trades shall be deemed to be amended accordingly:—

- (a) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of five years—
  - 1st year—at the rate of 30s. per week.
  - 2nd year—at the rate of 40s. per week.
  - 3rd year—at the rate of 60s. per week.
  - 4th year—at the rate of 76s. 6d. per week.
  - 5th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.
- (b) With respect to the term of apprenticeship of four years—
  - 1st year—at the rate of 35s. per week.
  - 2nd year—at the rate of 50s. per week.
  - 3rd year—at the rate of 76s. per week.
  - 4th year—at the rate of 99s. 6d. per week.

And the Honorable Percy James Clarey, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

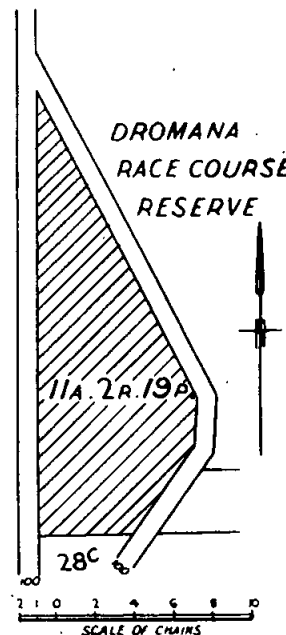

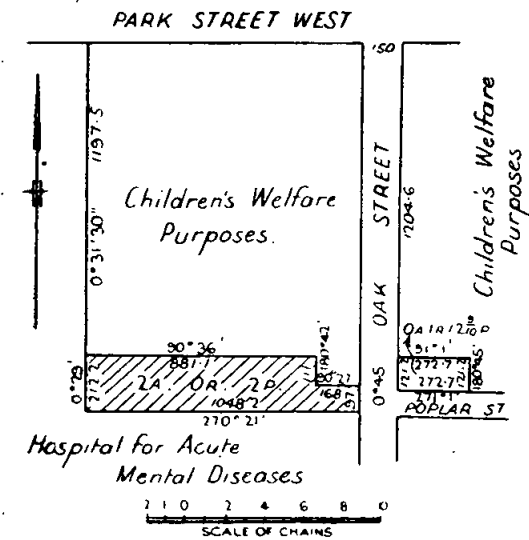

Clause 4—*Minimum area, depth, and width of frontage.*—Adopts the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage prescribed in columns 1, 2, and 3 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations for the portions of the municipal district, as set out and described respectively in the Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Schedules of the By-law.

Clause 5—*Distance from street alignment.*—Specifies the minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Classes I. and II. occupancy, as defined by the Uniform Building Regulations, from the street alignment of land as 15 feet.

Clause 6—*Sites below minimum requirements.*—Provides for the construction of a building of Class I. occupancy on land having a lesser area depth or width of frontage or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in columns 1, 2, or 3, as the case may be, of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations or in clause 5 of the By-law, or for the construction of a building of Classes III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Uniform Building Regulations in any case where on the date of commencement of the Uniform Building Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Clause 7—*Rear access.*—Provides that in the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Uniform Building Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Uniform Building Regulations shall be dispensed with.

The By-law was passed by the Council of the City of Hawthorn on 19th September, 1945, confirmed on 31st October, 1945, and approved by the Governor in Council on 21st November, 1945.

2. This By-law shall come into operation on its confirmation by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

## SHIRE OF RUTHERGLEN.

## BY-LAW No. 7.

A By-law of the Shire of Rutherglen, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and numbered 7, for regulating traffic and cattle allowed to graze upon any land not enclosed by a substantial fence and for the good rule of the municipality.

**IN** pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928*, the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the Shire of Rutherglen order as follows:—

1. The adoption of Part 9 of the 13th Schedule of the *Local Government Act 1928* as part of By-law made by the Council is hereby repealed.

2. By-law No. 4, for or with respect to regulating traffic, prohibiting or regulating cattle being allowed to graze on roads, and for the good rule of the municipality is hereby repealed.

3. The owner or occupier of any property within the Shire may graze cattle upon such portions of the roadway upon which any property owned or occupied by him abuts and upon no other unless the cattle are being removed for any of the following purposes:—

(a) Transference from one property or one paddock to another for any purpose whatever when the use of any roadway is indispensable for any such purpose.

(b) Transferring the cattle from one place to another on the change of ownership of such cattle.

(c) Taking the cattle directly from any property to any saleyard or to any railway yard for trucking.

(d) Taking the cattle for water, for shearing, for dipping, or for any other essential purpose.

Provided that in each such case the cattle shall be under the control of the owner thereof or some other person acting for him, and that proof that the cattle are being taken on to any roadway or roadways other than on to the portions of roadway or roadways on which the property or properties of the owner or the occupier abut for any of the purposes recited in the above sub-clauses shall be upon the owner of such cattle.

4. Every person who drives cattle from any other town, shire, or district through the Shire of Rutherglen, from boundary to boundary, shall, prior to entering the Shire with any cattle, notify the Council's Herdsman of his intention so to do, and shall state the number and kind of cattle, the name and address of the owner or owners thereof, as well as his own, the starting point and time, the route to be taken, and the intended destination of the cattle, and failure to give such notification or to supply any or all of the information set forth shall be guilty of an offence hereunder.

5. Every person who drives cattle through the Shire aforesaid shall proceed with them along a direct route, as far as practicable, and at the rate of not less than six miles per day in the case of sheep, and ten miles per day in the case of other cattle, until they reach the point at which they will cross the boundary of the Shire towards their destination.

6. Every person guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten shillings for each head of cattle and not more than Five shillings for each head of sheep, provided that the aggregate maximum penalty shall not exceed £20.

7. This By-law shall apply to and have operation throughout the whole of the Shire of Rutherglen.
