QUOTAS FOR BUTTER AND CHEESE.

BUTTER QUOTA.

I, NORMAN A. MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of butter at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for butter as follows:—

The proportion shall be Eighty-one and one-quarter per cent.

The period for which this quota is to operate shall be the month of February, 1945.

CHEESE QUOTA.

MARTIN, Minister of Agriculture in the State of Victoria, after consultation with the Victorian Dairy Products Board, and after ascertaining that the supply and distribution of cheese at reasonable prices to consumers thereof in Victoria will be ensured, hereby determine a quota for cheese as follows:—

The proportion shall be Seventy-nine per cent.

HAMILTON WATERWORKS TRUST.**RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.**

THE Hamilton Waterworks Trust, the waterworks district of which Trust has been proclaimed an urban district for the purposes of the Water Acts (hereinafter referred to as the Trust), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make this By-law for such urban district for determining the rate to be paid in respect of the several lands and tenements to be supplied with water for domestic purposes, and directs as follows:—

1. The said Hamilton Waterworks Trust doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound on the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Hamilton Waterworks Urban District. Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable in respect of any land upon which there is a building be less than Fifteen shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Ten shillings. Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing on the first day of January, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and shall be payable on the first day of February, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five at the office of the said Trust.

2. The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

3. Except where water is supplied by special agreement, and except as provided by By-law No. 30 of the Trust—

(a) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons.

(b) The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is hereby fixed at 10,000 gallons.

4. The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

5. Such person or persons as the Trust may from time to time appoint for the purpose shall be authorized to demand, receive, collect, and recover the rates and charges aforesaid, and each of them. And in the absence of such appointment, the secretary and/or rate collector of the Trust shall be deemed to have been appointed for the purpose aforesaid, and every one of them.

KORUMBURRA WATERWORKS TRUST.**RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.**

THE Korumburra Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Korumburra Urban District.

Provided that in no case shall the amount of rate payable per annum in respect of any tenement (other than land on which there is no building) be less than Twenty shillings, and in respect of any land on which there is no building less than Six shillings.

Such rates are made and shall be levied upon the occupiers or owners of the said lands and tenements for the year commencing the 1st January, 1945, and shall be due and payable on the 31st January, 1945, at the office of the said Trust.

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at a charge of One shilling per one thousand gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property rated by the Trust in excess of such maximum quantity, computed as in the last preceding clause, is hereby fixed at One shilling per one thousand gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

For water supplied for building and construction purposes the following charges shall be payable, namely:—

1. For buildings constructed of materials other than timber, iron, or fibro-cement, and for all concrete construction work whatsoever, including work carried out by the shire council, Five shillings (5s.) per £100 of the contract price or estimated cost of labour and material of all brick, stone, concrete, and plastering work to be done.
2. For timber, iron, and fibro-cement buildings, 2s.-6d. per 1,000 for all bricks used in the construction of chimneys, foundations, &c.

Builders and others desiring to use water from the Trust's mains shall lodge at the office of the Trust a written application for permission to do so, stating the site of the proposed building or structure, the owner's name, the type of construction, and the contract price, the estimated cost, or the number of bricks to be used, and shall, at the same time, pay the prescribed charge. In no case shall water be available before payment of the charge.

MOUNT MACEDON WATERWORKS TRUST.**RATING BY-LAW FOR THE YEAR 1945.**

THE Mount Macedon Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make a rate for the supply of water for domestic purposes of One shilling and four pence in the pound of the annual municipal valuation of lands and tenements liable to be rated within the Mount Macedon Urban District.

(a) Adult male officers shall be paid a needs basic salary of £240 per annum, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in Part 2 of the Award of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration known as the Victoria Daily Paid and Salaried Grades Consolidated Award dated 25th March, 1930, as consolidated by Order dated 10th day of February, 1944, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of this Board of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 45, 46, 49, 56, 60, 61, 62, 65, 74, and 79, and in the Schedule to this Award.

(b) Adult male employees (except Gatekeepers) shall be paid a needs basic wage of 15s. 4d. per day, subject to adjustment in the manner prescribed in Part 2 of the Award of the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration known as the Victoria Daily Paid and Salaried Grades Consolidated Award dated 25th March, 1930, as consolidated by Order dated 10th day of February, 1944, and in addition the margins prescribed therefor in the Schedule to Award No. 20 of this Board of the 17th December, 1926, subject to the alterations and additions provided in the Schedules to Awards Nos. 22, 24, 25, 26, 30, 35, 40, 44, 45, 46, 49, 51, 56, 60, 61, 62, 65, 68, 74, 79, and 80, and in the Schedule to this Award.

(c) Adult male Gatekeepers with free quarters shall be paid a rate of 1s. per day less than the adult male needs basic wage.

(d) Casual employees shall be paid the hourly rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule to this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

(e) Female employees and junior officers and junior employees shall be paid the rates prescribed therefor in the Schedule of this Award adjusted as prescribed in clause 2 hereof.

2. The rates prescribed for casual employees junior employees, and female employees are based on an adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day, and those prescribed for junior officers are based on an adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, and the said rates shall on the date on which the quarterly adjustments are made in the basic wage and/or salary be increased or decreased in the following manner:—

(a) The hourly rates for casual employees shall be increased or decreased by one-eighth of the amount by which the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day is increased or decreased.

(b) The rates of junior employees, female employees, and junior officers shall be increased or decreased in proportion to the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage of 14s. 5d. per day and/or the adult male needs basic salary of £226 per annum, such sum to be calculated to the nearest penny or the nearest pound (as the case may be). Provided that the increase or decrease in any junior or female rate of pay shall not exceed the increase or decrease in the adult male needs basic wage and/or salary.

3. (a) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clause (a), the salaried rates of all adult male officers shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of £13 per annum, being the amount of prosperity loading as determined by the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration for adult male officers in this industry.

(b) In addition to the rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clauses (b) and (c), the wage rates of all adult male employees shall be increased by a constant amount at the rate of 10d. per day, being the prosperity loading as determined by the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration for adult male employees in this industry.

(c) The hourly rates prescribed in clause 1, sub-clause (d), and clause 2, sub-clause (a) for casual employees shall be increased by the constant amount of 1½d., being the amount of the prosperity loading as determined by the Commonwealth Court of Conciliation and Arbitration for casual employees in this industry.

(d) Where the rate prescribed for female employees is at least an amount being 54 per cent. of the adult male needs basic wage payable from time to time as provided in clause 1, sub-clause (b) of this Award, such rates shall be increased by an amount equal to the difference between 54 per cent. of

the needs male basic wage and 54 per cent. of the sum of the needs male basic wage and the constant amount prescribed in sub-clause (b) of this clause, both calculations to be made to the nearest 1d. per day.

(e) Junior male employees or officers and female employees in the grades set out in the following table shall, in addition to the rates prescribed elsewhere in this Award, be paid the constant amounts of prosperity loading indicated hereunder:—

WHEREAS by the Resolution set out below and dated the fifteenth day of January One thousand nine hundred and forty-five the Country Roads Board incorporated under the *Country Roads Act 1928* (No. 3662) being of opinion that the highways in the State of Victoria set out or described in the Schedule to the same are of sufficient importance to be State highways and acting under the powers in that behalf conferred upon it by the said Act declared such highways to be State highways within the meaning and for the purposes of the Act aforesaid: And whereas the said Act amongst other things provides that the Governor in Council may by Order published in the *Government Gazette* confirm such Resolution whereupon any road mentioned in such Resolution shall be a State highway: And whereas it is deemed desirable to confirm the Resolution so made and passed by the said Country Roads Board: Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm such resolution and declare upon the publication of this Order in the *Government Gazette* the roads men-

tioned in the Schedule to such Resolution of the Country Roads Board State highways within the meaning and for the purposes of the *Country Roads Act 1928*.

Resolution for Declaration of State Highways under the Country Roads Act.

AMENDMENT OF PLUMBING AND GASFITTING REGULATIONS (No. 2) AND (No. 3).

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Apprenticeship Acts and the *Acts Interpretation Act 1928*, the Lieutenant-Governor, as Deputy for His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby make the following amendments to the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 2) and the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) (that is to say):—

Amendment of Terms and Conditions of Indentures of Apprenticeship.

1. (a) Paragraph (f) of the Employer's Covenant contained in the Second Schedule to the General Regulations (No. 2) as

incorporated by Regulation 5 of the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 2) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from 1st day of January, 1945.

(b) For the said rescinded paragraph substitute as on and from the said date, the following paragraph:—

Employer's Covenant.

(f) Provide the apprentice with the following tools during the first, second, and third years of the term of his apprenticeship, viz:—

Hammer, pliers, cold chisel, screw-driver, one pair snips, soldering iron, two pairs footprints, shave-hook, dresser, hack-saw, two pairs Stilson wrenches, and bossing mallet.

2. (a) Regulation 6 of the Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the first day of January, 1945.

(b) Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the said date.

(c) For the said rescinded Regulation substitute, as on and from the said date, the following Regulation:—

Standard of and Increased Rates of Pay for Proficiency.

6. (a) Should the apprentice in any year pass in the subjects prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, and attain a standard as certified by the Commission of not less than an average 75 per cent. of the possible marks allotted at the annual examinations approved by the Commission to the subjects of Trade Theory and Practice prescribed for that year of such course, he shall be deemed to have attained the standard of proficiency for such year.

(b) When an apprentice attains in any year the standard of proficiency prescribed for that year of his apprenticeship course, he shall—

(a) for the first occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

(b) For the second occasion on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Two shillings and six pence per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage;

(c) for the third and subsequent occasions on which he attains such standard be paid for the next succeeding year the sum of Three shillings per week in addition to the prescribed weekly wage.

3. (a) Regulation 10 of the said Plumbing and Gasfitting Regulations (No. 3) shall be and the same is hereby rescinded as on and from the first day of January, 1945.

(b) Such rescission shall not affect any right accrued or accruing to any person or any liability of any person under the said rescinded Regulation before the said date.

(c) For the said rescinded Regulation substitute, as on and from the said date, the following Regulation:—

Payment of School Fees.

10. (a) The school fees of apprentices or applicants for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during the first, second, third, and fourth years of their apprenticeship course shall be paid by such apprentices or applicants, but on receipt by the employer of a report from the Commission that any such apprentice or applicant has secured during the period covered by the report a record of not less than 80 per cent. of the possible attendances at the prescribed day and evening classes respectively, the employer shall refund to the apprentice or applicant the school fees so paid by him for such period of instruction. Provided, however, that if such report states that the apprentice, or applicant, has in the opinion of the Commission, failed to be diligent, or has behaved in an indecorous manner while in attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during such period, the employer shall not be required to make the refund as aforesaid.

(b) In cases where the apprentice or applicant is absent from the said classes by reason of illness or accident, or detention at work by his employer, such absences shall not be included as possible attendances in determining the aforesaid percentage; provided that the employer may demand a medical certificate from the apprentice or applicant as proof of such illness or accident.

(c) The school fees of apprentices for attendance at the prescribed classes for instruction during the fifth year of their apprenticeship course shall be paid by such apprentices.
