MELBOURNE AND METROPOLITAN BOARD OF WORKS.

BY-LAW No. 40.—STANDING ORDERS.

THE Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works (herein after called the Board), pursuant to and in exercise of the powers and authorities conferred on it by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works Acts, and in exercise of all other powers possessed by or vested in such Board, doth hereby make the By-law and Regulation following:—

1. Clause 64 of By-law No. 17 (as amended by By-law No. 39) of the By-laws and Regulations of the Board, therein called Standing Orders of the Board, and the said By-law No. 39 shall be and the same are hereby repealed as on, from, and after the sixth day of March, 1945.

2. The following clause 64 shall be and is hereby made and substituted for clause 64 of the said Standing Orders as on, from, and after the sixth day of March, 1945:—

"64. In addition to the Officers and Servants' Committee required to be appointed, pursuant to section 46 of the Act, there shall be six permanent committees, to be respectively called "Finance," "Water Supply," "Sewerage," "Legislative," "Farm," and "Stores" Committees. The Water Supply and Sewerage Committees shall consist of ten members each, the Officers and Servants', Finance, and Farm Committees of nine members each, the Legislative Committee of seven members, and the Stores Committee of five members, and the quorum for committees shall be as follows, namely for the Officers and Servants', Finance, Water Supply, Sewerage, and Farm Committees five, and for the Legislative and Stores Committees three."

The foregoing By-law and Regulation was made and passed by the Melbourne and Metropolitan Board of Works on the sixth day of February, 1945, One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and the common seal of the said Board was affixed hereto, in the presence of—

- (c) No person supplied with water by the Trust shall waste the same, or permit or suffer the same to run to waste.
- (d) Except for fire fighting purposes, no person shall take or carry away, or permit or suffer any other person to take or carry away, from any premises any water supplied by the Trust.
- (e) No person shall sell any water supplied by the Trust.
- (f) Any person who shall use or permit or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to any of the provisions of this By-law shall be guilty of an offence, and shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each such offence, recoverable summarily before any court of competent jurisdiction, and in cases of continuing offences to a further penalty not exceeding Five pounds for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.
- (g) If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does or causes or permits to be done anything in contravention of any of the provisions of the Water Acts, or wrongfully fails to do anything which under such provisions ought to be done for the prevention of the waste, misuse, consumption, or contamination of the water, the Trust (without prejudice to any remedy against him in respect thereof) may cut off water and cease to supply him so long as the cause or injury remains or is not remedied.

3. This By-law shall have effect throughout the whole of the Waterworks District of the Trust.
