DECLARATION OF THE NEW PRINCES HIGHWAY IN THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

WHEREAS by sections 21 and 74 of the Country Roads Act 1928 (No. 3662) it is amongst other things enacted that when the Country Roads Board under the provisions of the Country Roads Act has taken the land necessary for constructing a road or deviation it shall as soon as it thinks such road or deviation is fit to be used as a public highway by Resolution declare the road or deviation to be a State highway or part thereof and that upon publication in the Government feacette of the Order of the Governor in Council confirming such Resolution such road or deviation shall thereupon be a State highway or part thereof within the meaning of the said Act: And whereas the said Board has by Resolution declared the road on the land described in the Schedule to such Resolution to be part of a State highway: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof doth hereby confirm the said Resolution.
