PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria, passed in the eighth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI. intituled the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* (No. 5040), it is amongst other things enacted by section three thereof that Parts III., IV., V., and VI. shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*, and which day is for the purposes of the said Act called "the appointed day":

Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix the second day of April, 1945, as the day upon which Parts III., IV., V., and VI. of the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* shall come into operation, and which day for the purposes of the Act aforesaid shall be called "the appointed day".

REVOCATION OF PROCLAMATION RESPECTING PROHIBITION OF FISHING AT THE INLET TO THE WARANGA RESERVOIR.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st October, 1942, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations."

2. After Regulation No. 298 the following Regulation is inserted:—

298A. (a) No person shall:—

(i) make any repairs, alterations, or renovations to any vessel in the Port involving the use of oxy-acetylene or electrical cutting or welding apparatus or any other apparatus, article, or tool by which a naked flash or naked flame of any description may be caused; or

(ii) use on any vessel in the Port any oxy-acetylene or electrical cutting or welding apparatus or any other apparatus, article, or tool by which a naked flash or naked flame of any description may be caused,

without the permission of the Harbor Master first obtained.

(b) Any person making any such repairs, alterations, or renovations or using any such apparatus shall at all times observe and comply with any conditions or directions made or given by the Harbor Master in relation to the use of any such apparatus;

(c) The owner of any vessel on which any such repairs, alterations, or renovations are made or on which any such apparatus is used shall pay to the Commissioners all expenses incurred by the Commissioners in taking any safety precautions which the Harbor Master may in any case consider necessary and in particular the expenses incident to the standing by of fire-fighting apparatus and personnel.

Provided always that nothing in this Regulation shall apply to His Majesty's ships of war.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for the payment of compensation in cases of accidents to officers and members of brigades or, where death ensues therefrom, to their wives and families and for the creation and establishment or continuation of any fund or funds for the purpose:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

| Investment of Fund. | 4. The Fund shall be invested by the Authority in the same manner and under the same conditions as a trustee may invest trust funds pursuant to the provisions of the <i>Trustee Act 1928</i> :

Provided that the Authority shall not invest any moneys on the security of first mortgage of any property if any person directly or indirectly connected with the administration of the Fund or the wife of any such person within five years of the execution of such mortgage has had any estate or interest in such property. |
| Cost of administration. | 5. The cost of the administration of these Regulations shall be paid out of the revenue of the Authority. |
| Audit. | 6. The accounts relating to the Fund shall be audited in the same manner as the accounts of the Authority are audited, pursuant to the provisions of the <i>Country Fire Authority Act 1944</i> and the regulations made thereunder. |
| Payments into Fund. | 7. (1) The amount to be paid into the Fund by the Authority in every financial year shall be based upon a per capita payment of not more than three shillings in respect of every volunteer officer and fireman enrolled on the 31st day of December in the said financial year pursuant to the provisions of the Act. |

(2) The Authority shall from time to time determine the said per capita payment.

(3) The Authority shall pay into the Fund such sum or sums as shall at the end of each financial year amount to the total of all per capita payments as determined by the Authority.

8. (1) Every volunteer officer or fireman enrolled in accordance with the provisions of the Act and the Regulations made thereunder who suffers personal injury by accident arising out of and in the course of his service as such shall be entitled to be paid compensation by the Authority. Entitlement to compensation.

- (2) Service as a volunteer officer or fireman shall mean— Service defined.
- (a) service at a fire or whilst proceeding to or returning from a fire or an alarm of fire by the most direct or usual route;
 - (b) the carrying out of any duties pursuant to the Act or the Regulations thereunder or of fire brigade routine duties by the order or with the knowledge and consent of the Chief Officer or any superior officer;
 - (c) service at a fire brigades demonstration held in accordance with the provisions of the Act; and
 - (d) service at a recognized fire brigade practice or during training provided such practice or training is carried out under the direction or with the knowledge and consent of the Chief Officer or any superior officer.

9. (1) Every claim to compensation pursuant to these Regulations shall be made to the Authority through the captain of the brigade with which the injured volunteer officer or fireman is enrolled and shall be— Claims how made.

(a) made in writing verified by statutory declaration;

and

(b) accompanied by a certificate from a legally qualified medical practitioner setting out the nature and extent of injury.

Provided that the Authority may, if it thinks fit, dispense with the production of a medical certificate in respect of any claim where the period of incapacity does not exceed seven days.

(2) It shall be the duty of the captain and the secretary of the brigade with which the injured volunteer officer or fireman is enrolled to obtain a statement from any member of the brigade who witnessed the accident and to forward any such statement together with a report of the circumstances of the accident and their opinion thereon to the Authority.

10. Compensation under these Regulations shall be determined by reference to the compensation and other benefits prescribed by the Workers' Compensation Act of Victoria for the time being in force.

Provided that, for the purposes of these Regulations, the said Act shall be read and construed as if every worker's earnings were in every case sufficient to entitle him to the maximum compensation provided for in the said Act.

11. The Authority shall have full power and authority to do all acts matters and things necessary or expedient to determine every claim to compensation and in so doing still be guided by observe and comply with the provisions of the Workers' Compensation Act of Victoria for the time being in force so far as the same are applicable.

And the Honorable Herbert John Thornhill Hyland, His Majesty's Chief Secretary for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for the provision grant or payment of superannuation allowances pensions or gratuities to officers and employees of the Authority or their wives families widows or dependants on the resignation retirement or death of such officers and employes; and for the creation and establishment or the continuation of any fund or funds for the purpose: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

Citation and Commencement.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Country Fire Authority Superannuation Fund Regulations" and shall come into operation on the second day of April, 1945.

Revocation.

2. On the commencement of these Regulations the Regulations relating to the Country Fire Brigades Board Superannuation Fund made by the Governor in Council on the seventeenth day of September, 1930, and the seventh day of August, 1939, respectively, shall be and are hereby revoked.

3. Such revocation shall not affect any benefit granted or record kept or any right acquired or liability incurred or any act matter or thing done or suffered under the said Regulations before such commencement.

Interpretation.

4. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

"Act" means the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* and any Act amending the same.

"Authority" means the Country Fire Authority.

"Financial Year" means the year commencing on the first day of July and ending on the thirtieth day of June.

"Fund" means the Country Fire Authority Superannuation Fund.

"Legal Personal Representative" includes a person who appears to the Authority to be entitled to a grant of representation in respect of the estate of a deceased subscriber.

"Permanent Staff" comprises all those male employees of the Authority who are performing duties of a permanent nature, and all permanent officers and members of brigades.

"Subscriber" means a member of the permanent staff who has become a contributor to the fund pursuant to these Regulations.

Establishment of Fund.

5. (1) It is hereby declared that the Fund established by the Governor in Council by and under the Regulations referred to in clause 2 of these Regulations shall be continued under the name of the "Country Fire Authority Superannuation Fund".

(2) Into the Fund shall be paid the contributions of subscribers and the payments by the Authority provided for in these Regulations.

(3) Out of the Fund shall be paid the benefits provided for in these Regulations.

(4) Income derived from the investment of the Fund shall form part thereof.

6. The Authority shall control the Fund, and may from time to time appoint trustees in and by whom the Fund may be vested and administered respectively, and may in its discretion, remove any such trustee so appointed.

Control of Fund: Appointment and Removal of Trustees.

7. Every person appointed by the Authority to the permanent staff and every person who becomes a member of the permanent staff by transfer to the service of the Authority pursuant to the Act, shall on and from the date of commencement of his service with the Authority and so long as he remains a member of the permanent staff be a subscriber to the Fund.

All Members of Permanent Staff to become Subscribers.

8. For the purpose of these Regulations, the date of a contribution to the Fund shall be deemed to be the day when the payment of wages, from which such contribution is deducted, became due, although such payment of wages may not, in fact be made until a later date.

Date of Contribution to Fund.

9. (a) Every subscriber to the Fund shall contribute thereto annually a sum equal to 5 per cent. of his actual wages, and such contributions shall be deducted by the Authority by equal instalments as the wages are or may become due or payable.

Contributions to Fund by Subscribers.

(b) The Authority shall in each year, in respect of each subscriber, contribute to the Fund an amount equal to the sum of his contributions for this year. Such contribution shall be made in two instalments, payable on the 31st day of December and the 30th day of June in each year.

Contributions to Fund by Authority.

10. The Authority shall keep at its office separate ledger accounts in the respective names of all the subscribers to the Fund, to which the contributions of such subscriber shall be credited in the first instance.

Books to be kept and Subscribers' Accounts Credited.

11. The contributions of the Authority shall be credited to the respective accounts half-yearly.

Crediting Contributions of Authority.

12. All moneys constituting the Fund, notwithstanding that the same have been credited to the respective accounts of the separate subscribers as aforesaid, may be treated as one Fund for the purpose of investment, and may be invested by the Authority or the trustees in any securities which are or may be prescribed by any Act or Acts of the Parliament of Victoria then in force relating to investments by trustees, but the Authority shall not be responsible for any loss resulting from any such investment.

Investment of Fund.

13. All revenue derived from the investment of money constituting the Fund, less any expenses incurred, shall, at the end of each financial year, be credited to the said respective accounts in the proportion that the amount standing to the credit of each subscriber bears to the total at credit of all the subscribers at the close of the previous financial year.

Allocation of Profits from Investments.

14. Each subscriber shall be entitled to receive annually a statement of the amount standing to his credit at the end of the last preceding financial year.

Statement of Account of each Subscriber.

15. The procedure of the Authority as to the management of the Fund, the execution of deeds and documents, and all other matters connected with the Fund, shall, insofar as it is not inconsistent with these Regulations, from time to time be regulated by the Authority.

Management of Fund.

16. The Authority shall decide upon all claims upon the Fund.

Claims to be Decided by Authority.

17. Subject to the exceptions hereinafter provided, and to any advances or loans made by the Authority from the Fund to him by way of investment under Regulation 12 hereof, a subscriber, upon his retirement, or his legal personal representative upon his death, shall receive the total amount standing at credit to his account as aforesaid at the date of his retirement or decease, provided that—

Payments from Fund on Retirement, Dismissal or Death.

(a) If a subscriber, not totally incapable of performing his duties by reason of ill health or physical or mental incapacity, retires from the service of the Authority after having subscribed to the Fund for a period of less than ten years, or retires for the purpose of engaging in other employment, he shall receive his own contributions only, with interest at 4 per cent. per annum calculated in yearly rests.

- (b) If a subscriber, not totally incapable of performing his duties by reason of ill health or physical or mental incapacity, nor intending to enter other employment, retires after having subscribed for a period of ten years to the Fund, but before reaching the age of 50 years, he shall receive from the Fund, for each completed year during which he subscribed thereto, a sum equal to one-twentieth of the total amount standing at credit in his account, but not exceeding in the aggregate such total amount. In the event, however, of a subscriber entering other employment, after having received the amount to which he became entitled in accordance with this paragraph, he shall repay to the Fund an amount equal to the excess (if any) of the sum so received over that payable under paragraph (a) of this Regulation. If such excess, after demand, remains unpaid, it may be recovered in a court of petty sessions as a civil debt, recoverable summarily or in any court of competent jurisdiction.
- (c) Notwithstanding the limitations in paragraphs (a) and (b) hereof, the Authority may, at its discretion, increase the amount payable thereunder to a sum not exceeding the full amount standing at credit in the account of any subscriber to which such paragraphs apply.
- (d) In the event of the dismissal of a subscriber, or of his retirement in order to escape dismissal, he shall be entitled to receive from the Fund only a sum equal to the amount of his contribution thereto.
- (e) In the event of a subscriber committing a breach of trust or other wrongful act, by reason of which the Authority suffers or may suffer pecuniary loss, the Authority shall have full power to use the amount standing at credit to such subscriber's account for the purpose of making good any such loss, and the balance, if any, shall be forfeited.
- (f) Any balance standing at credit in any subscriber's account after payments to him under paragraphs (a), (b), (c), (d), or (e) have been made, shall remain in the Fund and be credited to the accounts of the remaining subscribers, at the end of the financial year then current, in the same proportion as that referred to in Regulation 13 hereof.

Benefits
Inalienable.

18. Except as provided by Regulation 17 hereof, any benefits derivable from the Fund shall not be in any way assigned or charged or passed by operation of the law to any person other than the subscriber or beneficiary.

Date of
Payment of
Benefits.

19. Any sum due or payable to any subscriber under these Regulations shall be paid only if the cash is available for the purpose; until paid, however, such sum shall carry its proportion of the interest earned by the Fund up to the date of payment.

Audit.

20. Once at least in every year the accounts of the Fund shall be examined by a licensed auditor or licensed auditors. The auditor or auditors shall be appointed by the Authority, which shall also fix the remuneration of such auditor or auditors.

Winding-up
and
Distribution
of Fund.

21. With the consent of the Governor in Council, the Authority may at any time wind up and distribute the Fund by paying to each subscriber, subject to the provisions hereof, the amount standing at credit in his account, and thereupon the Fund shall cease to exist and these Regulations shall be deemed to be cancelled and to have no effect whatsoever except for the purpose of determining any right or title or exercising any power of discretion for the time being necessary to be determined or exercised for the purpose of winding up and distributing the Fund: Provided always that in any case at least six months' previous notice, in writing, shall be given to each subscriber of the intention to wind up and distribute the Fund.

Notices.
How to be
Given.

22. Notices to subscribers may be given by the Authority through its secretary, to such subscribers personally, or by sending the same through the post in prepaid letters addressed to the respective subscribers at the last known address of each.

Any notice sent by post shall be deemed to have been served on the day following the day on which the envelope or wrapper containing the same is posted, and in proving such service it shall be sufficient to prove that the envelope or wrapper containing the notice was properly addressed and put in the post office.

23. No alteration or amendment of the rate of contribution by subscribers, or of the payments from the Fund on retirement, dismissal, or death, shall be made unless two-thirds of the subscribers vote in favour of such amendment or alteration. Express notice of any such proposed amendment or alteration shall be given to every subscriber. For the purposes of this Regulation, the vote shall be taken by forwarding to each subscriber a voting paper setting out the amendment or alteration proposed to be made, and containing the following clauses:—

(a) I vote for the proposed amendment (or alteration).

(b) I vote against the proposed amendment (or alteration).

or such other words as will clearly indicate the question in respect of which the vote is to be recorded. Such voting paper shall be signed by the subscriber voting, and returned in accordance with the instructions issued to the subscribers with the voting papers, but not later than fourteen days after the date when the voting paper would be received by the subscriber if delivered in the ordinary course of postal delivery: Provided always that all voting papers which are not returned as aforesaid shall be deemed to be and shall be counted as votes in favour of the amendment or alteration proposed.

24. The decision of the Authority on any question respecting the construction or application of these Regulations, or respecting any matter or thing arising out of the same, shall be final and conclusive.

25. Subject to the discretion of the Authority, the expenses of management and administration of the Fund shall be borne by the Authority: Provided that the Authority may at any time decide that the Fund shall bear the whole or any portion of the expenses of management and administration thereof.
