CLOSE SEASON FOR QUAILS (ALL SPECIES).

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I, THE Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia; by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Game Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation remove from the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928* the names of the following birds:—

Quails, *Phasianidae* and *Turnicidae*, all species; and the period of the close season set opposite the names of such birds, and I do hereby name the under-mentioned birds as birds which shall be included in the Third Schedule to the *Game Act 1928*, and do set opposite such names in the said Schedule the periods shown hereunder:—

Quails, *Phasianidae* and *Turnicidae*, all species, except Brown Quail and Painted Quail—from the first day of June in each year to the thirtieth day of April next following (both days inclusive);

Quail, Brown *Synoicus australis*; and Quail, Painted *Turnix varia*—the whole year.

I do further direct that this Proclamation shall come into operation after the expiration of a period of seven days from the date of its publication in the *Government Gazette*.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this tenth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

COUNTRY FIRE AUTHORITY REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make regulations for regulating the expenses of officers and employes of the Country Fire Authority :

Now Therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say) :—

1. In these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter—

“ Authority ” means the Country Fire Authority.

“ Officer ” includes employé.

2. Officers must avoid travelling that is not necessary, and must not claim payment of any amount in excess of the rate allowed under these Regulations.

No allowance shall be payable unless an officer has incurred an expenditure which he would not have incurred in ordinary circumstances.

3. Certifying officers will be considered responsible that travelling for which payment may be claimed was necessary ; that it could not have been more economically arranged ; and that claims presented to the Authority are correct.

4. Allowances for personal expenses shall, except where otherwise stated, be in addition to the cost of conveyance.

5. Personal allowances, except as may be granted specially by the Authority, shall not be allowed within an area of fifteen miles radius from an officer's headquarters. The question as to which is an officer's headquarters shall be decided by the Authority.

6. No officers shall be allowed personal expenses in excess of £100 during any financial year unless the Authority is satisfied that the expenditure is necessary in the interests of the efficient working of its organization and specially approves by resolution recorded in the minute book of the Authority.

7. The daily rates set forth in these Regulations, except as otherwise indicated, are fixed to cover the expense of three meals per day and lodging when an officer is necessarily absent from his headquarters over night. The allowance for each meal and for bed shall be one-fourth of the daily rate.

An allowance for breakfast, lunch, or tea shall not be granted unless an officer commences travelling earlier than or is absent later than the time or times respectively prescribed hereunder, that is to say :—

Provided that the Authority may, in any special case, authorize payment beyond the hours prescribed, where the circumstances warrant.

8. No allowance except as may be specially granted by the Authority shall be payable to an officer for being absent from his headquarters when he leaves and returns the same day. Provided that any officer who is required to leave before 7 a.m. may be granted an allowance of 3s. for breakfast, and that any officer who is unable to return until after 7 p.m. may be granted an allowance of 3s. for tea.

9. An officer appointed by the Authority to act in the place of an officer senior to him may be paid the travelling allowance payable to that officer while so acting.

10. The following shall be the scale of allowances for personal expenses :—

An officer authorized to claim mileage rates will not be permitted to hire motor cars, except in cases of emergency, and then only with the approval of the Authority.
