REVOKING PROCLAMATIONS REGARDING THE BRING-
ING OF POTATOES FROM CERTAIN PORTIONS OF
VICTORIA INTO OTHER PORTIONS OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by section 4 of the *Vegetation and Vine Diseases Act 1928 (No. 3797)*, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation revoke the Proclamations made under the said Act on the 7th September, 1936, the 26th October, 1936, the 8th November, 1937, and the 29th November, 1937, with respect to the bringing of potatoes from certain portions of Victoria into other portions of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eighth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928 (No. 3720)*, section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare

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any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Whittlesea aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act. viz.:—

PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF WHITTLESEA.

All that piece of land situate in the County of Bourke, containing 2½ perches, being part of Crown portion 8, Parish of Morang, and bounded as follows:—By a line commencing at a point on the southern boundary 9.170 links westerly from the south-eastern corner of Crown portion 8 and bearing north 20.6 links through other part of said portion; thence south 82 deg. 12 min. west 50.1 links; thence north 85 deg. 57 min. west 46.6 links to a point on the bank of the Darebin Creek, being the western boundary of Crown portion 8; thence southerly along the boundary to a point on its intersection with the southern boundary of this portion; thence east 130 links along this boundary to the commencing point.

If any person supplied with water by the Trust wrongfully does, or causes or permits to be done, anything in contravention of this By-law the Trust may, without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof, close or cut off any pipe or pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at Two shillings (2s.) per thousand (1,000) gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where water is so supplied is fixed at ten thousand (10,000) gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the Trust.

2. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on streets, roads, lanes, or passages.
3. No person shall deposit or leave any refuse or rubbish on any land.
4. The owner or occupier of any land shall remove or destroy all refuse or rubbish thereon (other than refuse or rubbish the removal of which the Council has undertaken or contracted for under section 39 of the *Health Act 1928*).
5. Any person who commits any wilful act or default contrary to the provisions of this By-law shall, on conviction, be liable for any such offence to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds and not less than Two pounds, and in the case of a continuing offence shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds for each day on which an offence against this By-law is continued after a conviction or order by the Court.
6. This By-law shall have operation throughout the whole of the Municipal District of the Shire of Dandenong.
