AGRICULTURAL COLLEGES ACT 1944 (No. 5044).
DATE OF COMING INTO OPERATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 1 of the *Agricultural Colleges Act* 1944 (No. 5044), it is provided that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the twenty-first day of May, 1945, as the day on which the said Act shall come into operation.

Given under my Hand and Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five, and in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

PROCLAMATION OF A MENTAL HOSPITAL.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by section 34 of the *Mental Hygiene Act* 1928 as amended by the *Mental Hygiene Act* 1933 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may at

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any time by Order published in the *Government Gazette* proclaim any house or building in Victoria provided by the State for the reception of insane persons a mental hospital: And whereas on the twenty-fourth day of May, 1938, a Proclamation was issued proclaiming the following buildings a mental hospital as from the said date:—

Ward A, Ward B, and Ward C of Janefield Colony, situate at Janefield, in the Parishes of Nillumbik and Keelbundora, Counties of Evelyn and Bourke.

And whereas it is now desired that the Farm Workers Block described as the "Boys" Block of the said Janefield Colony shall also be portion of the said mental hospital: Now therefore I the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby, as from the date of this Proclamation revoke the said Proclamation issued on the twenty-fourth day of May, 1938, and proclaim the following buildings a mental hospital on and after the sixteenth day of March, 1945, viz.:—

Ward A, Ward B, Ward C and the Farm Workers Block described as the "Boys" Block, situate at Janefield, in the Parishes of Nillumbik and Keelbundora, Counties of Evelyn and Bourke, as shown in the plan annexed hereto.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid at Melbourne, this fifteenth day of May in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-five in the ninth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

BOROUGH OF STAWELL.

BY-LAW No. 34.

A By-law of the Borough of Stawell, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1915 and *Police Offences Act* 1915, and numbered 34, for regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of powers conferred by the foregoing Acts and every Act and power enabling it in that behalf, the Mayor, Councillors, and Burgesses of the Borough of Stawell order as follows:—

1. That By-law No. 27 of the said Borough of Stawell shall be and is hereby repealed.

2. In the construction of this By-law, unless the context otherwise requires—

"Borough" means the Borough of Stawell.

"Council" means the Council of the Borough of Stawell.

"Driver" means any person in charge of a vehicle.

"Footway" includes every footpath, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough habitually used by pedestrians, and not vehicular traffic.

"Horse" includes any draught animal or beast of burden.

"Motor car" means any conveyance propelled by mechanical power, and includes a motor cycle.

"Motor cycle" means a motor car having only two wheels, but includes a motor cycle having a trailer, fore-car, or side-car attached thereto.

"Public place" includes and applies to every public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare, notwithstanding that such public highway, road, street, footway, footpath, court, alley, passage, or thoroughfare may be formed on private property, and also any public park, garden, or reserve.

"Street" includes every highway, road, carriage-way, lane, thoroughfare, or other public place within the Borough other than a footway.

"Vehicle" means any conveyance drawn or propelled by human, animal, or mechanical power, and includes a motor car and motor cycle.

Words importing the masculine gender includes females, and words in the singular include the plural, and words in the plural include the singular.

3. The driver of any vehicle shall not bring such vehicle to a standstill and shall not allow it to stand in any street unless—

- (a) The front wheel on the near or left side of such vehicle is not more than 2 feet distant from the footway or from the outer edge of any water channel or gutter by the side of such footway on the left side of such vehicle,
- (b) Such vehicle is parked at an angle with the footway, the angle between such footway and the direction in which such vehicle faces to be not less than 25 degrees, and not more than 45 degrees.
- (c) Such vehicle to be so placed that it will not obstruct any fire plug.

Provided that the provisions of clause 3 shall not apply to drivers of vehicles stopping for the purpose of loading or unloading goods from such vehicles.

The provisions of clause 3 shall only apply to and have operation in that portion of Main-street, Stawell, between Layzell-street and Frayne-street on the north side, and Patrick-street and Napier-street on the south side, and to every street intersecting or joining Main-street between Layzell-street and Mansie-street on the north side, and Patrick-street and St. George-street on the south side, for a distance of two and a half (2½) chains along such intersecting or junctioning street.

4. Notwithstanding any provisions herein contained, vehicles parked in that portion of Main-street between Patrick-street and Wimmera-street, shall, in addition to the requirements of clause 3 hereof, be parked so that the vehicle and its contents must be within the areas indicated by white lines.

5. No vehicle or horse shall be drawn up or stopped on the outer edge of any other vehicle or horse already standing in any street.

6. The driver of any vehicle or the rider of any horse upon any street shall—

- (a) keep as near as practicable to the footway on his near or left-hand side;
- (b) obey the order of a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council when in charge of or in any way directing the traffic;
- (c) if any horse or vehicle in his charge is causing or likely to cause an obstruction to the traffic upon any street, and if he is directed by a member of the Police Force or officer of the Council to remove such horse or vehicle from any position, do so without delay.

Any person who neglects or refuses to immediately comply with, or wilfully disobeys any direction, order, or request given or made by such member of the Police Force or officer of the Council shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

7. The driver of any vehicle or the rider of any horse upon any street shall not leave such vehicle or horse stationary in—

- (a) Victoria-place, between Main-street and Church-street;
- (b) Skene-street, between Main-street and Sloane-street;
- (c) Patrick-street, between Main-street and Sloane-street;
- (d) Main-street, opposite the intersection of Victoria-place;
- (e) Main-street, opposite the intersection of Patrick-street;
- (f) Main-street, in front of the Town Hall.

8. It shall be lawful for the Council, by Resolution from time to time, as may be necessary or convenient, to make rules to—

- (a) regulate the traffic in any particular street or public place;
- (b) regulate the parking of cars in any particular street or public place;
- (c) distinguish such parking areas or prohibited parking areas by such marks or notices as may be necessary, and such distinguishing marks or notices shall be considered sufficient definition of such areas.

9. Local rule (one-way traffic).—No vehicle shall be driven and no animal shall be ridden or driven in a south-easterly direction in Scotland-place.

10. Any contravention of any of the foregoing sections or sub-sections of this By-law or Resolution of the Council made thereunder by act or omission shall be an offence against this By-law.

11. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds (£5).

12. This By-law shall, except as herein expressly provided, apply to and have application throughout the whole of the municipal district of the Borough of Stawell.
