BY-LAW No. 5.—PREVENTION OF THE WASTE AND UNDUE CONSUMPTION OF WATER.

THE Town of Horsham Waterworks Trust (hereinafter called "the Trust"), in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the Water Acts, doth hereby make the By-law following, for the prevention of the waste and undue consumption of water supplied by the Trust within its district.

4. No person shall use or permit to be used or allowed to run on any premises any water for other than domestic purposes, manufacturing, or fire-fighting purposes. The use of hoses, other than for fire-fighting purposes, is prohibited.

5. No person shall use, or permit or suffer water supplied by the Trust to be used contrary to the provisions of this By-law.

6. No person shall connect any hose to any water-tap or hydrant or allow any hose to remain so connected whether or not at the time any such connexion be made or continue, water be running through such water-tap or hydrant; and no occupier of any premises shall permit or suffer any hose to be or remain so connected on such premises; provided that the prohibitions in this paragraph contained shall not extend to prohibiting any connexion as aforesaid for the purpose of fire-fighting only, but that in the case of such connexion for fire-fighting any hose so connected shall immediately be disconnected upon the ceasing of the necessity of using the same for fighting a fire.

7. Any person authorized by the Trust in that behalf either generally or for any class of cases, or in any particular case, at all reasonable times may enter into or upon any premises for the purpose of inspecting, or may inspect any private service, or any part thereof, and may give to the owner or occupier of such premises, or any person found therein or thereon, any directions or instructions necessary for the purpose of ensuring that all provisions of this By-law shall be duly complied with and observed.

8. Any person who obstructs, hinders, impedes, or resists any such authorized person acting in compliance with this By-law or refuses such person admission to any premises, or fails or neglects to carry out and observe all lawful directions and instructions given him by any such person shall be guilty of an offence against this By-law.

9. Any person who is guilty of any breach of any of the provisions of this By-law shall be liable to a penalty of not more than £5 and, in the case of a continuing offence, to a further penalty not exceeding £5 for every day after notice of the offence from the Trust.

10. If any person supplied with water by the Trust does, or permits, or causes anything to be done in contravention of this By-law, the Trust may (without prejudice to any remedy in respect thereof) close or cut off any of the pipes by or through which water is supplied by the Trust to him or for his use, and may cease to supply him with water as provided by the Water Acts.

MELBOURNE HARBOR TRUST COMMISSIONERS.

REGULATIONS.

IN pursuance of the *Melbourne Harbor Trust Act 1928*, the Melbourne Harbor Trust Commissioners make the following Regulation:—

1. The Regulations made by the Commissioners on the 21st October, 1942, and approved by the Governor in Council on the 2nd November, 1942, and published in the *Government Gazette* on the 27th November, 1942, and any amendment thereto, are hereinafter referred to as "the principal Regulations."

2. After Regulation No. 35 the following Regulation is inserted:—

35A. No vessel having a draft exceeding 28 feet of water shall be navigated at a higher speed per hour over the ground within a quarter of a mile of the Spotswood Sewer Tunnel than four nautical miles.

3. The following Regulation is substituted for present Regulation 87, which is hereby repealed. Provided always that this repeal shall not abrogate or affect any obligation or liability heretofore imposed or incurred by or under the repealed Regulation:—

87. The master of a vessel in port shall cause at least one seaman to be at watch on deck, except—

1. Vessels laid up, coal hulks, ballast, or other lighters lying within such limits as the Harbor Master may have authorized them to occupy; but all such vessels shall have always one person on board.

2. Vessels (not being vessels moored to or lying at any wharf), and boats lying within either of the areas limited in Regulation 46.

In case of non-observance of this Regulation the master of such vessel shall be liable for any expense incurred by the Commissioners in remedying the neglect. Where there is no master the owner or agent of such vessel or person having lawfully or *de facto* the control of the vessel shall be liable for any breach of this Regulation and for any such expense as aforesaid incurred by the Commissioners in remedying the neglect. Any such expense shall be recoverable in addition to the penalty imposed for breach of this Regulation.

1. The Certificate of Competency in Physical Education shall be granted to qualified candidates in accordance with the conditions mentioned hereunder.

2. Candidates shall—

- (a) produce satisfactory evidence at the beginning of each year of the course that they are physically capable of undertaking all required activities;
- (b) complete satisfactorily a fortnight's intensive training in each of two years under conditions to be prescribed from time to time by the Director;
- (c) undertake such reading, furnish such reports, and pass such theoretical and practical examinations as may be required and determined from time to time by the Director;
- (d) take charge, at a time during the course to be determined by the Director, for a prescribed period of the physical education at an approved school; and
- (e) carry out in their own schools for the period of one year an approved program of physical education, and at the end of the period submit to the Director a certificate from the district inspector that the work has been satisfactory performed.

3. Details of courses and examinations mentioned in sub-clause (c) of clause 2 shall be published from time to time in the *Education Gazette and Teachers' Aid*.

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.
