AREAS OF LANDS COMPRISED IN CERTAIN CLASSES DIMINISHED OR INCREASED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2 and 7 of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

YEA WATERWORKS TRUST.

BY-LAW RELATING TO RATES AND CHARGES FOR THE YEAR 1945.

THE Yea Waterworks Trust, in pursuance and exercise of the powers conferred by the *Water Act*, hereby makes the following rates and charges for the supply of water within the Yea Urban District:—

The maximum quantity of water to be supplied in any one year without further charge to any property rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at the quantity which, at the charge of One shilling per 1,000 gallons, would produce an amount equal to the amount of the rate levied on such property for the said year.

The charge for water supplied by measure to any property not rated by the Trust is hereby fixed at One shilling per 1,000 gallons, and the minimum quantity of water to be charged for in cases where so supplied is hereby fixed at 5,000 gallons.

The charge for water supplied by measure shall be payable, on demand, at the office of the said Trust, Shire Hall, Yea.

## REGULATIONS.

**W**HEREAS by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may make Regulations for regulating the duties and conduct of officers and employés of the Country Fire Authority:

Now therefore His Excellency the Governor of Victoria in the Commonwealth of Australia by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State and in pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Country Fire Authority Act 1944*, doth hereby make the Regulations following (that is to say):—

1. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or Interpretation, subject matter—

“Authority” means the Country Fire Authority.

“Officer” means every Chief Officer, Deputy Chief Officer, Assistant Chief Officer, Regional Officer, and every other officer and employé of the Authority not being a member of a fire brigade.

“Subordinate officer” means every officer other than the Chief Officer and the Secretary.

2. Every officer of the Authority must promptly obey all lawful Discipline, orders of the Authority and of his superior officers.

3. The Authority may at such times as may be convenient grant Recreation Leave of Absence, to every officer leave of absence for recreation for any period or periods not exceeding fourteen working days in each year.

Provided that no such leave shall be granted until an officer has completed one year of service.

4. The hours of attendance to be observed by officers shall unless Hours of Business, otherwise ordered by the Authority be from nine o'clock a.m. until five o'clock p.m. on week days, with an interval of one hour for luncheon, and from nine o'clock a.m. until twelve o'clock noon on Saturdays.

5. (1) No payment shall be made for overtime unless an officer is Overtime, required to work more than forty-two hours in any one week or on a gazetted public holiday.

No officer whose remuneration is more than Eight pounds a week shall be paid for overtime.

Rates of payment for overtime shall be determined by the Authority from time to time.

(2) Any member of the head office clerical staff who is required to Tea Money, work after five o'clock in the afternoon for more than two hours in addition to an interval of one hour for tea, may be paid an allowance of two shillings and six pence for tea.

6. (a) Upon the receipt of satisfactory evidence that leave is Sick and Accident Leave, necessary on account of sickness or ill-health, and that in consequence an officer be unable to perform his duties, the Authority may grant to such officer leave of absence on such terms and for such period as it thinks fit.

(b) The Authority may send a Medical Practitioner to examine an officer who is absent from duty on account of ill-health.

(c) Any officer absent for more than three days shall forward to the Authority a medical certificate showing the nature of his illness; and he may be required to furnish a medical certificate in respect of a lesser period of absence.

In cases of extended absence the Authority may, if it thinks fit, require a fresh medical certificate to be furnished every week.

(d) Any officer must promptly report in writing to his superior officer or to the Authority any injury received in the execution of his duty, or any sickness or ill-health by reason of which he is unfit for duty. The Secretary shall keep and submit to the Authority from time to time a record of all cases of absence from duty due to any of the foregoing causes.

Chief Officer,  
&c.,  
Programme  
of Work.

7. Before the fifteenth day of June and the fifteenth day of December in every year, every Chief Officer shall prepare and deliver to the Secretary a programme of the inspections proposed to be made and the work proposed to be done by him, by his appropriate Deputy Chief Officer, and by all Assistant Chief Officers, Regional Officers, and other subordinate officers during the half year next ensuing, commencing the first of July and first of January respectively. The Secretary shall forthwith post a copy of such programme to every member of the Authority.

8. Every such programme of work and inspections shall be so arranged that whilst the Chief Officer carries out inspections in any one half of the fire control regions during any half year, his appropriate Deputy Chief Officer will be engaged in inspections in the remaining half of the fire control regions during the same half year, as nearly as may be practicable, and so that the aforesaid programme may be carried out without unnecessary expenditure of time or funds.

9. Every subordinate officer of the Authority engaged wholly or partly upon field or visitation work shall prepare and submit to his superior officer from time to time a programme of work and inspections, and the Secretary shall submit to the Authority when required and file for reference a copy of every such programme. All officers of the Authority shall adhere to the adopted programme of work and inspections subject to the exigencies of the service.

Discipline and  
Efficiency of  
Brigades.

10. The appropriate Chief Officer shall be responsible to the Authority for the maintenance of discipline and efficiency in the fire brigades under his control and for the good conduct and efficiency of his subordinate officers, brigade officers, and firemen.

Reports.

11. Every Chief Officer shall compile a report upon each inspection made by him and shall forward such reports weekly to the Secretary of the Authority, who shall record and file them. The Chief Officer shall deliver to the Secretary at least forty-eight (48) hours before each monthly meeting of the Authority a summary of his reports and inspections for presentation to the Authority including an account of the duties performed and the inspections carried out by officers responsible to him since his last report was furnished. He shall specify therein all requisitions or orders from the Authority to him or to officers responsible to him which have not been carried out at the date of compiling his report and the reasons therefor.

12. All subordinate officers shall report from time to time in the form and manner prescribed by the Authority.

Annual  
Report of  
Chief Officer.

13. Every Chief Officer shall submit to the Authority annually before the fifteenth day of July a report upon the training, operations, progress, equipment and buildings relative to the fire brigades under his control and generally upon the operation of the Act during the preceding year ended thirtieth June, and shall state therein the number of inspections made by him and by every officer responsible to him, distinguishing all formal inspections of fire brigades from other and casual inspections.

Requisitions  
for  
Equipment,

14. Every Chief Officer shall submit promptly to the Authority from time to time formal requisitions for maintaining and supplementing the plant and equipment of the fire brigades under his control, and for repairs to buildings and additional buildings, in order that provision may be made upon the estimates of expenditure at the appropriate time.

15. Subject to the Authority, the Secretary shall have the control <sup>Secretary.</sup> of the office of the Authority and of the clerical staff, and shall be responsible to the Authority for the proper control and management thereof.

The Secretary shall be responsible for the safe custody of all books of account, agreements, receipts, vouchers, and other papers and writings relating to the business of the Authority.

The Secretary or other officer appointed by the Authority to act in his stead shall, until otherwise determined by the Authority—

- (i) Prepare and send or cause to be prepared and sent to the members of the Authority or of any committee all notices of meetings and documents prescribed by the Act or the Regulations thereunder.
- (ii) Prepare and submit to the chairman, at least twenty-four hours before the relative meeting, agenda papers for meetings of the Authority.
- (iii) Attend all meetings of the Authority and of committees, present all correspondence, reports, notices, and other documents relative to the business of the meeting, and enter the minutes of all acts, resolutions, and proceedings in a minute-book to be kept for that purpose.
- (iv) Deal under the supervision of the chairman with all inward and outward correspondence of the Authority and of committees, and present records of the same at the next ensuing meeting of the Authority or committee.
- (v) Carry out or cause to be carried out under the supervision of the chairman all resolutions and directions carried or given at any meeting of the Authority or a committee.
- (vi) Give proper receipts for all moneys received on account of the Authority or any committee.
- (vii) Bank or cause to be banked to the credit of the Authority all moneys received upon the day of receipt of the same; or in the event of the bank being closed, on the next banking day.
- (viii) Disburse all amounts exceeding £1 by cheques signed as the Authority may, from time to time, by resolution determine.
- (ix) Act as paymaster and distribute all salaries and wages.
- (x) Keep and make or cause to be kept and made proper records and entries of all receipts and disbursements by the Authority and of the property, assets, and liabilities of the Authority.
- (xi) Have the charge and control of all books, papers, and records of the Authority, and of all other property of the Authority not placed by the Act under the charge and control of the appropriate Chief Officer.
- (xii) Prepare and submit to the Authority in the month of May in each year an estimate of the probable expenditure which may be necessary to be incurred by the Authority under or in pursuance of the Act during the next succeeding year between the first day of July and the thirtieth day of June.
- (xiii) Prepare and submit to the Authority in the month of August in each year a true abstract of the receipts and expenditure of the Authority for the financial year then last past.
- (xiv) Prepare and submit to the Authority in the month of August in each year a report of the proceedings of the Authority during the financial year then last past.
- (xv) Generally carry out or cause to be carried out all orders and directions of the Authority and of the chairman, and, subject to the control of the Authority and of the chairman, do all such acts as may be necessary for the proper and effective execution of the Act and these Regulations.

EXTENSION OF AREA OR LOCALITY WITHIN WHICH THE DETERMINATION OF THE SHOPS BOARD No. 10 (FISH AND POULTRY) IS TO BE OPERATIVE AND APPOINTMENT OF A SHOPS BOARD No. 10 (FISH AND POULTRY) TO TAKE THE PLACE OF THE BOARD APPOINTED ON THE 27TH JULY, 1914.

### WHEREAS—

- (1) Under the provisions of the Factories and Shops Acts a Wages Board described as the Fish and Poultry Board was appointed by Order of the Governor in Council dated the 27th July, 1914, and the short title of the said Board was, by Order dated the 10th May, 1921, altered to Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry);
- (2) the powers of the said Board were, from time to time extended and varied so that, from the 24th April, 1933, the said Board has exercised the following powers, that is to say:—  
To fix the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons wheresoever employed in the business of—  
(a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game;  
(b) preparing fish for sale uncooked or for canning, drying, or smoking;  
(c) selling by wholesale or retail (except for consumption on the premises) poultry, game, fish, or oysters;  
(d) marketing (in fish and poultry markets) poultry, game, or fish;
- (3) the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Board shall be operative has been defined as the Metropolitan District as defined in the Factories and Shops Acts, the Cities of Ballarat, Bendigo, Geelong, Geelong West, Sandringham and Warrnambool, the Town of Newtown and Chilwell, and the Boroughs of Eaglehawk and Sebastopol;
- (4) it is by the Factories and Shops Acts provided that where the area or locality within which the Determination of any Wages Board is to be operative is extended the Governor in Council may, if he thinks it necessary, appoint a new Wages Board to take the place of the Wages Board the operation of whose Determination is so extended.

Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth hereby—

- (1) Extend the area or locality within which the Determination of the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry) is to be operative to include all parts of Victoria;
- (2) Order that a new Wages Board to consist of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to take the place of the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry) appointed on the 27th July, 1914, as aforesaid, and to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any persons wheresoever employed in the business of—  
(a) killing, plucking, dressing poultry or game;  
(b) preparing fish for sale uncooked or for canning, drying, or smoking;  
(c) selling by wholesale or retail (except for consumption on the premises) poultry, game, fish, or oysters;  
(d) marketing (in fish and poultry markets) poultry, game, or fish;  
also that such Wages Board may, in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceedings be described for all purposes as the Shops Board No. 10 (Fish and Poultry), and the area or locality within which the determination of such Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

And the Honorable Thomas Tuke Hollway, His Majesty's Minister of Labour for the State of Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

## LOCH PARK RIDING.

**LODDON UNITED WATERWORKS TRUST—ABOLISHED.—  
MITIAMO WATERWORKS DISTRICT, LODDON WATER-

DISTRICT, WEST LODDON WATERWORKS DISTRICT—  
DISTRICTS CONSTITUTED.**

3. That there shall be excised from the Normanville Waterworks District that portion of the same set out and described in the Second Schedule hereunder, which portion, as on and from the 30th day of June, 1945, shall be deemed to be excised accordingly.

4. That the portion of the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust included within the boundaries defined in the Third Schedule hereunder shall be, and the same is hereby constituted a Waterworks District, to be known as the Loddon Waterworks District, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1945, such District shall be deemed to be so constituted.

5. That the portion of the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust included within the boundaries defined in the Fourth Schedule hereunder shall be, and the same is hereby constituted a Waterworks District, to be known as the East Loddon Waterworks District, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1945, such District shall be deemed to be so constituted.

6. That the portion of the Waterworks District of the Loddon United Waterworks Trust, and the portion excised from the Normanville Waterworks District by this Order, which portions are included within the boundaries defined in the Fifth Schedule hereunder, shall be, and the same are hereby constituted a Waterworks District to be known as the West Loddon Waterworks District, and as on and from the 1st day of July, 1945, such District shall be deemed to be so constituted.

BY-LAW No. 128.

A By-law of the City of Brunswick, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 128, for regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Brunswick order as follows:—

1. In this By-law the word "Vehicle" bears the same meaning as that given in By-law No. 108 of the City of Brunswick.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle ordinarily used for the conveyance of goods, wares, or merchandise or shall drive any other vehicle exceeding thirty-five hundredweight in weight unladen in Sydney-road, Brunswick, between Brunswick-road and Park-street—

(a) in a southerly direction on that portion of the roadway lying between the eastern kerb and the plantation rockery on the eastern side of Sydney-road;

(b) in a northerly direction on that portion of the roadway lying between the western kerb and the plantation rockery on the western side of Sydney-road—

unless such vehicle is being driven along such portion for the purpose of delivering goods to or taking goods from premises abutting such portion of Sydney-road.

3. Any contravention of these provisions shall be an offence against this By-law.

4. Every person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding £5.

## CITY OF COBURG.

BY-LAW No. 66.

A By-law of the City of Coburg, made under the provisions of the *Local Government Act* 1928, and numbered 66.

(a) Regulating and restraining the erection and construction of buildings, erections, and hoardings.

(b) Requiring the pulling down and removal of buildings, erections, or hoardings.

(c) Authorizing the Council to pull down and remove buildings, erections, or hoardings erected or constructed contrary to this By-law or not pulled down or removed as required by or under this By-law, and to sell the materials and apply the proceeds in reimbursing the expenses of pulling down and removing such buildings, erections, or hoardings and paying into the Municipal Fund any fees or penalties due by the owner thereof.

(d) Apportioning fees which may be charged and received by the Council for any act done or to be done by any of its officers under such Regulations and for any permit or license to be issued by the Council.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act* 1928, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Coburg, with the approval of the Governor in Council, order as follows:—

"That the said By-law No. 41 be amended by the inclusion in the Schedule (B) residential areas of the following land:—

No person shall erect, build, construct or cause to be erected, built or constructed any building or erection to be used as a dwelling house only except in conformity with the following:—

- (a) The site or curtilage of each dwelling house shall have a superficial area of at least 4,400 feet and have a frontage of not less than 44 lineal feet to a street or road and that, except in the cases of corner sites the buildings erected thereon shall cover not more than two-fifths of the superficial area of such site except, in such cases in which the Council prior to the passing of this amendment, shall have consented to or approved of any subdivision of land in which are comprised sites or curtilages each having a superficial area of less than 4,400 feet and a frontage of less than 44 lineal feet."

"But this provision shall not apply to matches of the Hawthorn Football Club to be held at the Sports Ground during the year 1945, the revenue from which matches, after paying ground management expenses and administration charges, shall be divided between the Hawthorn Football Club and the visiting clubs by paying to the visiting clubs the amount to which such clubs would ordinarily be entitled, and paying to the Hawthorn Football Club the remainder of such revenue, less an amount equal to 6d. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the Sports Ground, and 50 per cent. of the balance of the amount which, but for the provisions of this By-law, would have been payable to the Council, the sum so deducted as representing 6d. for each adult person who may pay for admission to the reserve portion of the Sports Ground, and 50 per cent. of the balance of the proportion payable under the rules of the Victorian Football League to the Council as the grounds management committee to be retained by the Council and, in the event of the amount payable to the Hawthorn Football Club during the year 1945 under the provisions hereof reaching an amount of £200 in excess of the amount to which the Hawthorn Football Club would ordinarily be entitled under the rules of the Victorian Football League, then the arrangement for the division of revenue from matches of the Hawthorn Football Club at the Sports Ground hereunder, shall cease, and such revenue shall thereafter be divided in accordance with the rules of the Victorian Football League."
