VARIATION OF PROCLAMATIONS RESPECTING FISHING IN THE ACHERON BREAKWAY AND THE GOULBURN RIVER.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

I the Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in pursuance of the provisions of the Fisheries Acts and all other powers me enabling in that behalf, do by this Proclamation provide as follows:—

- (1) Vary the Proclamation dated the twenty-eighth day of June, 1939, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the fifth day of July, 1939, respecting prohibition of fishing in certain streams, by deleting therefrom all reference to the Acheron Breakway.
- (2) Revoke the Proclamation dated the twenty-sixth day of August, 1940, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the twenty-eighth day of August, 1940, regarding the variation of the Proclamation respecting the prohibition of fishing in certain streams; and
- (3) Prohibit all fishing in or the taking of fish from the Goulburn River and its tributaries below or downstream from the Riversdale Bridge, near Alexandra, to its junction with the Murray River, and including the waters impounded by the Goulburn Weir, from the first day of September to the thirtieth day of November (both days inclusive) in each year.

of Corner Inlet and Port Albert, by adding thereto the following words:—"provided that the use of a spear or similar contrivance for taking flounders is hereby permitted in the said waters north of a line running north-easterly from the south-east corner of allotment 9B, Parish of Tarra Tarra, to the south-west corner of allotment 52B, Parish of Balloong."

## BY-LAW No. 146.

A By-law of the City of Hawthorn, made under section 197 of the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling, and numbered 146, for altering clause 5 (c) of By-law numbered 112 and for regulating traffic.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Local Government Act 1928* and every other power it thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Hawthorn order as follows:—

1. That the By-law numbered 112, made by the Council of the City of Hawthorn under section 6 of the *Police Offences Act 1928* and sections 197 and 228 of the *Local Government Act 1928*, passed by the said Council on 20th September, 1933, and confirmed on the 18th October, 1933, is hereby altered as follows:—

2. Clause 5 (c) of the said By-law shall be and the same is hereby altered by inserting the following words before the word "Where" at the commencement of such clause, "Where any part of any load on a vehicle projects more than 4 feet beyond the rear of such vehicle, a red flag shall, between sunrise and sunset, be displayed at the rear end of such load, and."

The streets comprised within the area commencing at the south-east corner of Crown allotment 9 of section 24, Town and Parish of Bairnsdale; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Nicholson-street, Bairnsdale, to the intersection of Nicholson-street and Riverine-street; thence by a line, being a prolongation of the northern boundary of Nicholson-street, easterly across Riverine-street to the junction of a prolongation north of the eastern boundary line of Wood-street; thence southerly along the eastern boundary of Wood-street and Smith-street to the south boundary of McLeod-street; thence westerly along the south boundary of McLeod-street to Sharpe-street, Bairnsdale; thence northerly along the western boundary of Sharpe-street and Pyke-street to the point of commencement.

2. In this By-law "vehicle" includes any conveyance propelled or drawn by mechanical, electrical, or other power, and includes a motor car as defined by the *Motor Car Act 1928*.

3. No person shall park any vehicle in that portion of Riverine-street, Bairnsdale, as is comprised in the area described in clause 1 of this By-law.

4. The following sites are hereby appointed as parking areas for vehicles, subject to the reservations, restrictions, and conditions hereinafter contained:—

(a) In Main-street, Bairnsdale, within the area comprised in clause 1 of this By-law, within that portion thereof that immediately abuts upon the northern and southern portions of the garden reserves in such street. Every vehicle parked in such part of Main-street shall be parked in such a position that the right-hand or off side front wheel thereof is not more than 10 inches from the edge of the said garden reserve, and such vehicle shall be parked at an angle of approximately 35 degrees to the edge of such garden reserve.

(b) In Main-street, Bairnsdale, within that portion thereof that abuts upon the kerb of the footway upon the left-hand side or near side of any vehicle, and in that portion of Nicholson-street, Bairnsdale, as is bounded on the west by Bailey-street and on the east by Riverine-street. Every vehicle parked in such parking area shall be drawn up close to the kerb in such manner as to be wholly within an imaginary line drawn 9 feet from and parallel to the kerb, and shall not remain parked in such area for a longer period than twenty minutes.

(c) In all streets within the area specified in clause 1 of this By-law, other than Riverine-street and the sites specified in the preceding paragraphs (a) and (b), that portion of the roadway thereof that immediately abuts upon the kerb of the footway of such street. Every vehicle parked in such area shall be parked in such a position that the left-hand or near side front wheel thereof is not more than 10 inches from the kerb, at an angle of approximately 35 degrees to such kerb.

5. No person shall park any vehicle having an overall length, inclusive of its load and any trailer or other attachment thereto, exceeding 18 feet in any part of Main-street within the area comprised in clause 4 (a) of this By-law.

6. No person shall park any vehicle in any of the carriage-ways intersecting the garden reserves in Main-street.

7. No person shall park any vehicle in any street within the area comprised in clause 1 of this By-law, except in an area prescribed for parking by this By-law, and in the manner directed by this By-law.

8. By-law No. 54 of the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale is hereby repealed.

9. Any person who is guilty of an offence against this By-law shall be liable, on conviction, to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
