PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia. &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of the State of Victoria passed in the tenth year of the reign of His present Majesty King George VI. intitled the *Factories and Shops (Early Closing) Act 1946*; it is amongst other things enacted that the said Act shall come into operation on a day to be fixed by Proclamation of the Governor in Council published in the *Government Gazette*: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation fix Monday, the first day of July, One thousand nine hundred and forty six, as the day upon which the said *Factories and Shops (Early Closing) Act 1946* shall come into operation in the State of Victoria.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the State of Victoria aforesaid, at Melbourne, this eleventh day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand nine hundred and forty-six, and in the tenth year of the reign of His Majesty King George VI.

RULES OF THE SUPREME COURT.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Supreme Court Acts and all other powers hereunto enabling, the following Rules are made and shall take effect from the 28th day of May, 1946:—

1. Order LXV. shall be amended as follows:—

(i) After Rule 9 the following Rule shall be added:—

9A. (1) The total in any bill of costs of the fees as prescribed by Rule 9 of this Order (as distinct from payments) shall, in respect of business done in any cause, matter, or proceeding in the Supreme Court after the 1st day of May, 1946, be increased by 25 per cent., and any such increase shall be allowed upon any taxation of costs in respect of any such business, as well between party and party as between solicitor and client and in taxations under or pursuant to the *Supreme Court Act 1928*.

(2) Paragraph (1) of this Rule shall not—

(a) apply to the remuneration prescribed by or under section 94 of the *Supreme Court Act 1928*, or

(b) affect the question whether a bill of costs when taxed is or is not less by one-sixth part than the bill delivered, sent, or left, or

(c) affect the power to direct payment of a sum, in lieu of costs, under Order 65, Rule 23, or the power to allow a fixed sum for costs under Order 65, Rule 27 (38), or a gross sum under Order 65, Rule 27 (38A).

(3) Paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Rule shall apply to all references to arbitration, and to all business done in any criminal proceeding, and so far as applicable thereto to all business done in any divorce or matrimonial cause.

(ii) Rule 10 shall be amended by the deletion of the words "An increase on the scale not exceeding 30 per cent. may be allowed" and the substitution therefor of the words "There may be allowed an increase not exceeding 30 per cent. on the fees set forth in Appendix N or whenever Rule 9A is applicable such fees as increased thereby as the case may be."

(iii) Rule 27 (48) shall be amended by substituting for the figures "£12 12s." the figures "£15 15s.", for the figures "£8 8s." the figures "£10 10s.", and for the figures "£5 5s." the figures "£7 7s."

2. The Special Scale in Appendix N shall be amended by substituting—

(i) In Item 27, for the figures "£7 12s.", the figures "£8 13s.", and for the figures "£11" the figures "£14 3s."

(ii) In Item 29, for the figures "£1 3s. 6d." and "£2 4s. 6d.", the figures "£2 7s." in each case.

(iii) In Item 34, for the figures "£5 10s.", the figures "£7 12s.", and for the figures "£7 12s." the figures "£9 14s."

(iv) In Item 54, for the figures "£3 5s. 6d.", the figures "£4 6s. 6d."

(v) In Item 67, for the figures "£5 10s.", the figures "£7 12s.", and for the figures "£7 12s." the figures "£9 14s."

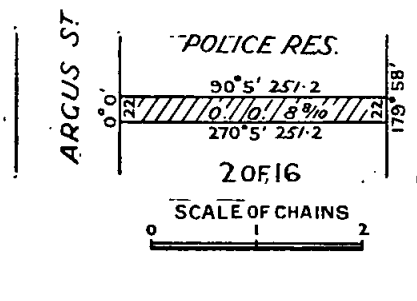

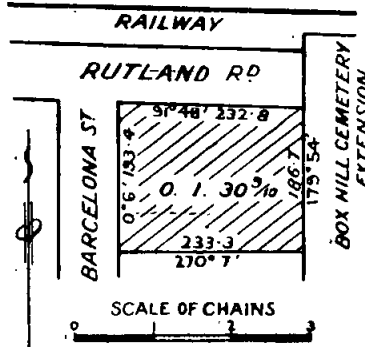

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF "WOORNOOK WATER RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of such portion of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council of 2nd February, 1880, as a site for affording access to water, as is indicated by red border on the plan marked W/20/8/45 with Department of Lands and Survey Correspondence Rs.5784, and hereinafter referred to as "the Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.
2. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, or shall light a fire therein.

3. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve; nor leave or deposit any glass, paper or rubbish; nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or other animals without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

5. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of the Reserve.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog, unless controlled by a chain or cord, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve nor erect therein any building or any booth, without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport within the Reserve, without the previous consent of the Committee of Management.

9. No person, except a labourer or workman employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

10. These Regulations are made in lieu of the Regulations made on the 24th June, 1880, relating to the above Reserve, which are hereby revoked.

The Council of the Shire of Charlton has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act 1928*, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act 1941*, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

BY-LAW No. 99.

A By-law of the City of Fitzroy made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations, Victoria, Numbered 99, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating, such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated, by the Council of the said City under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and for repealing By-law No. 98.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and of any and every other power it thereunto enabling the Mayor, Councillors and Citizens of the City of Fitzroy order as follows:—

Minimum Area, Depth of Frontage and Width.

1. The minimum area, depth and width of frontage, specified in column 1 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations of Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the municipal district.

Distance from Street Alignment.

2. In respect of buildings of Class 1 and Class 2 occupancy, as defined by the Uniform Building Regulations.

(a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 10 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 10 feet.

Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

3. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations any person may—

(a) construct a building of Class 1 occupancy in type three (3) construction on land having a lesser area, depth or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries, than those specified in column 1 of Table 803 of the Regulations.

(b) construct a building of Class III, V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy in type 1, 2, or 3, construction, or a building to which a building of Class IV. occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations.

in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations, such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area or is shown on any Plan of Sub-division approved by the Council and lodged in the Office of Titles.

Rear Access.

4. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a sub-division approved by the Council, and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

Brick Area.

5. The area described in the First Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as a brick area, in which no person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building, the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete, provided that for the purpose of this clause buildings of brick veneer construction conforming to the requirements of Chapter 26 of the Uniform Building Regulations shall be deemed to have external walls of brick.

Repeal.

6. The By-law of the City of Fitzroy numbered 98 shall be and the same is hereby repealed.

SCHEDULE 1.

Brick Area.

The whole area within the boundaries commencing at a point in the centre of Victoria-parade, due south of the centre of Nicholson-street; thence north by the western boundary of the city to a point due west of the centre of Johnston-street; thence east by the centre of Johnston-street to its intersection with the centre of Young-street; thence south by the centre of Young-street to the southern boundary of the city; thence west by the said boundary of the city to the commencing point.

3. By-law No. 249 is hereby amended as follows:—

(i.) In clause 62 by omitting from sub-clause (b) the following words:—

"Unless equipped with a speedometer approved by the inspector."

(ii.) By substituting for clause 86 the following clause:—

"86. The charge for the hire of a private hire car other than a hire and drive yourself car shall be calculated as follows: According to distance except in the cases of weddings and funerals.

IN pursuance of the powers contained in the *Health Act* 1928 and of any other power thereunto enabling them in that behalf, the Council of the Shire of Karkaroc, in the name and on behalf of the President, Councillors, and Ratepayers of the said Shire of Karkaroc, for the purpose of carrying the said *Health Act* into execution within their jurisdiction, hereby makes the following By-law numbered 18, relating to the Collection, Removal, and Disposal of Refuse, and order as follows, that is to say:—

- 1. All former By-laws so far as they relate to the matters and things provided for in this By-law are hereby repealed.
- 2. This By-law shall come into full force and operation on its approval by the Governor in Council and immediately after its publication in the *Government Gazette*.
- 3. This By-law shall apply to and have operation in the following portions of the municipal district of the Shire of Karkaroc, namely:—Being the Townships of Hopetoun, Beulah, and Woomelang, such townships being defined as follows for the purpose of this By-law:—

Hopetoun.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District for the Township of Hopetoun, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, and being part of Crown allotment 1, Parish of Goyura.

Beulah.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District for the Township of Beulah, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

Woomelang.—The whole of the area contained in the Water Supply Urban District of Woomelang, as defined from year to year by the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission.

In application, the By-law shall apply to every house, building, and premises in the foregoing three townships, unless exemption is granted by the Council.

4. In this By-law, unless inconsistent with the context or subject matter, the following definitions are given:—

"Proprietor" means the proprietor of any premises, and includes the owner, occupier, or any person having the management or control thereof.

"Refuse" includes all wastes (except sewage and manure) produced or accumulated in or about any house, building, or premises.

"Inspector" means the Health Inspector or any other officer duly authorized by the Council, and includes any acting or assistant inspector.

5. The proprietor of every house, building, or premises shall provide, keep, and maintain at all times upon his premises a properly-constructed receptacle in which he shall from time to time cause to be deposited all refuse produced or accumulated in or about such house, building, or premises.

6. Such receptacle shall be constructed of galvanized iron of not less than 24 gauge, or other approved material, in such manner as to prevent any absorption by any part of such receptacle of any offensive matter which may be deposited therein, or any escape by leakage or otherwise of any part of the contents of such receptacle.

7. Each such receptacle shall have a capacity of not more than 2 cubic feet, and shall be so constructed as to be capable of being easily and conveniently carried by one man.

8. It shall be strongly constructed and provided with properly attached side lifting handles.

9. Such receptacle shall be provided with a suitable close-fitting lid with a flange overlapping the top of such receptacle, and shall be kept constantly covered, except when such refuse is being deposited therein or discharged therefrom, and a sufficient quantity of some efficient deodorant shall be from time to time introduced therein when necessary to keep such refuse in an inoffensive condition.

10. No person shall place or cause or permit to be placed any slops or liquid waste in such receptacle, nor shall deposit any moist refuse in such receptacle unless such moist refuse has been previously strained and effectively wrapped in waste paper.

11. The proprietor shall cause such receptacle to be kept at all times in good order and sweet condition, and shall coat the inside of such receptacle with tar or other suitable substance when deemed necessary by the Council's Inspector.

12. The proprietor shall cause at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council for the removal of refuse, such receptacle to be deposited close to and inside of the entrance to such house, building, or premises from the street, lane, or right-of-way on which such house, building, or premises abut, in order that the contents of such receptacle may be conveniently removed by the contractor or person authorized or employed in that behalf by the Council.

13. No person shall place or cause to be placed any such receptacle in or upon any street, lane, or right-of-way except in the case of business premises built on the street alignment where such premises do not abut on a suitable right-of-way or land on which such receptacle could be placed for collection and emptying.

14. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall be responsible for the complete emptying (without spilling any of the contents) of such receptacle or receptacles directly into a vehicle provided for its reception at such hours and on such days as may be appointed by the Council.

Such contractor or person shall also be responsible for the replacement of such receptacle or receptacles properly covered with its lid, and shall close the gate or gates of the premises from which such receptacle or receptacles are taken.

15. The contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall at least once in each week, or at such greater frequency as may be necessary, collect and remove such refuse in a suitable covered vehicle in such a manner as not to cause nuisance, danger to health, or offensiveness.

16. Such vehicle shall as far as practicable be rendered watertight by means of an impervious lining or by painting the inside thereof with tar or by other suitable and effective means.

17. Such vehicles shall be provided with a cover and kept covered except when refuse is being put into or discharged from such vehicle.

18. Such vehicle when full shall be taken by the quickest possible route to the tip, incinerator, or destructor, where as soon as practicable the refuse shall be rendered innocuous by means of fire or such other method as may be approved by the Council, and in such a manner as not to create a nuisance.

19. The Contractor or person authorized or employed by the Council for the removal of such refuse shall cause all vehicles used for the reception and removal of such refuse to be properly constructed, kept clean, and thoroughly disinfected with approved disinfectant, and maintained in a proper state of repair.

20. If any refuse is authorized to be deposited or disposed of in or on any land, hole, quarry, or indenture, such refuse shall be deposited in a regular and orderly manner, and at the

conclusion of each day's depositing the contractor or person or persons authorized or employed by the Council shall blind the surface with clean earth or other approved material so as not to create any nuisance.

21. The Inspector shall have full power to enter into or upon any premises, yards, or lands at any time for the purpose of inspecting receptacles, vehicles, plant, and all other things and places therein and thereon, and for the purpose of carrying out the provisions of this By-law.

22. If any person or persons commit a breach of this By-law, he or they shall for every such breach be liable to a penalty of not more than Twenty pounds (£20), and in the case of a continuing offence a further daily penalty of not more than Five pounds (£5).

Resolution for passing this By-law No. 18 was agreed to by the Council of the Shire of Karkaroo, the 14th day of August, 1945, and confirmed at a meeting of the Council held on the 11th day of September, 1945.
