## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,  
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Land Act 1928* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette*, at any time diminish or increase the area of land comprised in any of the classes mentioned in Part I., Division 1, section 5, of the said *Land Act 1928*, but that the area of lands which may be sold by auction (Class 6) shall not be increased except as in certain cases in the said Act provided: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, and in accordance with the provisions of sections 94 and 117 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid, do hereby diminish or increase (as the case may be) the areas of Crown lands comprised in Classes 2, 3, and 7 respectively of the classes mentioned in section 5 of the *Land Act 1928* aforesaid to the extent set forth in the subjoined Schedule (that is to say):—

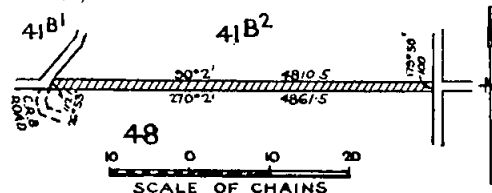

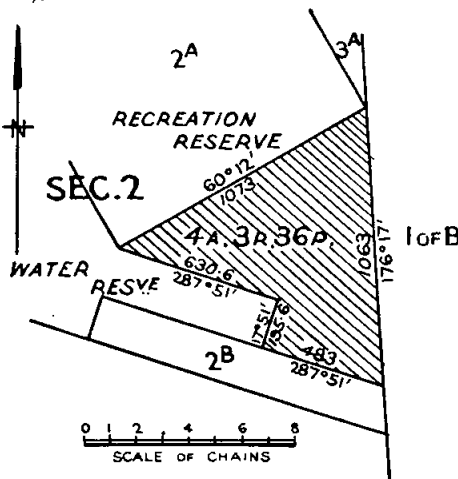

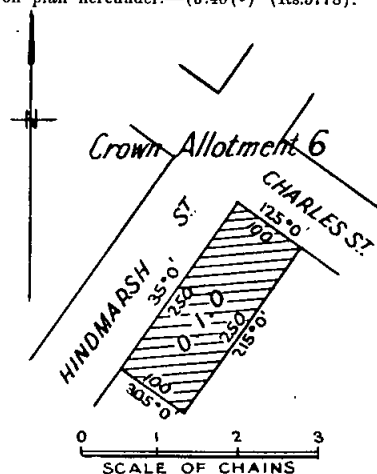

(2) Order that a Wages Board, consisting of six members and a chairman, three of such members being appointed as representatives of employers and three as representatives of employees, be constituted and appointed to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons, or classes of persons employed in the process, trade or business of making roofing tiles, other than roofing tiles made of cement: Also that such Wages Board may in any Regulation, Determination, Order, instrument, or legal proceeding be described for all purposes as the Roofing Tiles Board, and that the area or locality within which the Determination of the said Wages Board shall be operative shall be the whole of the State of Victoria.

(3) For the purpose of adjusting the powers which the said Roofing Tiles Board and the Pottery Trade Board may lawfully exercise, deprive the Pottery Trade Board of the power to determine the lowest prices or rates which may be paid to any person or persons or classes of persons employed in the process, trade, or business of making roofing tiles, other than roofing tiles made of cement, and confer such power exclusively on the Roofing Tiles Board.

Now therefore His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, doth appoint—

1. That the provisions herein contained shall come into operation on and after the 1st day of November, 1946.
2. That the interval and place at which the Licensing Court for each Licensing District named in the first column of the subjoined Schedule shall be held shall be the interval and place set forth in the second and third columns of the said Schedule respectively opposite to the name of each such Licensing District; and
3. That the Licensing Court for each of the Licensing Districts named in the first column of the said Schedule appointed by this Order to be held elsewhere than at Melbourne shall as occasion requires be held at Melbourne in addition to the places by this Order appointed, and that the interval at which each such Licensing Court shall be held, whether at Melbourne or elsewhere, shall be such that each such Court shall be held once at least in every six months.
4. That with the exception of Melbourne, where the duties shall be performed by the Registrar of Licensing Courts the places at which Clerks of Petty Sessions shall discharge the duties of Clerks of Licensing Courts in respect of the Licensing Districts named in the first column of the said Schedule, shall in respect of each such district be the place set forth in the fourth column of the said Schedule opposite to the name of each such District in the first column of the said Schedule.

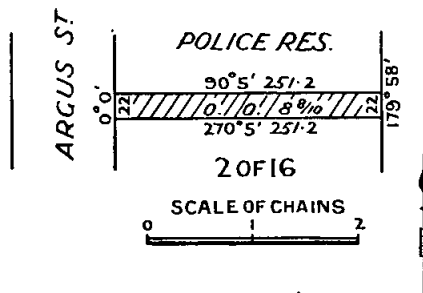

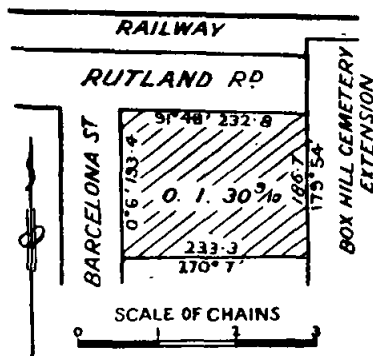

The minimum area, depth, and width of frontage specified in column 3 of table 803 of the uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations) are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout those portions of the municipal district set out in the Second Schedule hereto.

#### Distance from Street Alignment.

3. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet.

#### Sites Below Minimum Requirements.

4. Notwithstanding anything contained in the Regulations, any person may—

(a) construct a building of class I occupancy on land having a lesser area, depth, or width of frontage, or at a lesser distance from boundaries than those specified in column 3 of table 803 of the Regulations, or in clause 3 of this by-law (as the case may be), or

(b) construct a building of class III., V., VI., VII., or VIII. occupancy, or a building to which a building of class IV. occupancy is attached on land having an area, depth, or width of frontage less than that prescribed in clause 809 of the Regulations, in any case where on the date of commencement of the Regulations such land existed as a separate allotment, and has not since been reduced in area, or is shown on any plan of subdivision approved by the council, and lodged in the Office of Titles.

#### Rear Access.

5. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the council, and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations are hereby dispensed with.

(In any factory or place.)

An employer shall not employ male apprentices in excess of the proportion of one male apprentice to every three male workers or fraction thereof receiving wage rates or earning at piece work prices not less than the minimum hourly wage for adult males. Such proportion shall be based on the average number of workers employed during the previous six months receiving wage rates or earning at piece work prices not less than the minimum hourly wage for adult males.

If the probationer becomes indentured, his or her indentures shall be taken to have commenced from the commencement of the period of probation.

In the event of the employer to whom an apprentice is bound ceasing to carry on business, such apprentice may be bound to another employer for the remainder of the term to be served: Provided if such apprentice be over the age of eighteen years at the time of the original employer ceasing to carry on business, such person may complete the time to be served as an improver.

Persons classing or sorting green hides or skins being unhaired, hand flesher, hand fleshing after machining, machine flesher, unhairer, scudder, persons trimming green hides on tables after being fleshed, persons working unhairing and scudding machine, lime jobber, drum hand, paddle or vat hand, tan pit-man, hydraulic presser, green splitting machinist and man behind, extract worker in tannery, employee unhairing on beam or sweeping, employee operating squeezing machine, person lime jobbing on mechanical reels, hair washers, shed men in hide houses of beam shed department sorting out and hooking hides together, employees setting out from wet drums (excluding sole leather) and shedman who applies dressing to sole leather.

All apprentices shall be indentured in accordance with the prescribed form of indenture, provided that a minor may serve an employer as a probationer for a period not exceeding three months. During the said three months he or she shall be paid at least the minimum rates prescribed by this Determination for the first six months of apprenticeship. If the probationer becomes indentured, his or her indentures shall be taken to have commenced from the commencement of the period of probation.

In the event of the employer to whom an apprentice is bound ceasing to carry on business, such apprentice may be bound to another employer for the remainder of the term to be served; provided that if such apprentice be over the age of eighteen years at the time of the original employer ceasing to carry on business, such person may complete the time to be served as an improver.

Notwithstanding anything contained in this Determination, any person who on 3rd March, 1933, was employed in the industry and whose engagement or continued employment as an improver is by this Determination forbidden, shall be entitled to be employed and shall be paid the scale of wages prescribed for an apprentice or improver of like experience.
