PUBLIC HIGHWAY.—SHIRE OF CRANBOURNE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the *Local Government Act 1928* (No. 3720), section 518, it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council at any time, and from time to time, upon the request of the Council of any municipality, by notice in the *Government Gazette*, to declare any land reserved, used, or by purchase or exchange acquired for a street, road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public highway, and that such land shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such Proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public as a public highway within the meaning of any law then or thereafter in force: And whereas the Council of the Shire of Cranbourne has requested that the land hereinafter mentioned, which has been used as a road by the said Council within the said Shire, be so declared to be a public highway: Now therefore I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, in the Commonwealth of Australia, by and with the advice of the Executive Council of the said State, do by this Proclamation declare the land used as a road hereinafter described, and situated within the Shire of Cranbourne aforesaid, to be a public highway within the meaning of the said Act, viz:—

LOCAL GOVERNMENT (BUILDING REGULATIONS)  
ACT 1940.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

PROCLAMATION EXTENDING THE OPERATION OF THE UNIFORM BUILDING REGULATIONS.

WHEREAS section 14 (2) of the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* provides, *inter alia*, that the Governor in Council may, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette* at the request of the council of any municipality (not being a city or town) extend the operation of the Regulations made under that Act to the municipal district of such municipality, or any part thereof: And whereas the Councils of the municipalities of the Borough of Queenscliff and the Shires of Dandenong and Glenlyon have requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to the municipal districts of such municipalities, and the Council of the municipality of the Shire of Omeo has requested that the operation of the said Regulations be extended to part of the municipal district of such municipality: Now, therefore, I, the Lieutenant-Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, by this, my Proclamation, do hereby extend the operation of the Regulations made under the *Local Government (Building Regulations) Act 1940* to the municipal districts of the Borough of Queenscliff and the Shires of Dandenong and Glenlyon, and to the Township of Omeo being part of the municipal district of the Shire of Omeo.

And do further provide that the said Regulations (other than those contained in Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 thereof) come into operation in the municipal districts and part of the said municipalities on publication of this Proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, and that the Regulations contained in the said Parts I. and II. of Chapter 8 come into operation therein on the first day of October,

*Opticians Registration Act 1935.*  
OPTICIANS REGISTRATION BOARD.

REGULATIONS.

UNDER the powers in that behalf conferred by the *Opticians Registration Act 1935*, the Opticians Registration Board, with the approval of the Governor in Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations, that is to say:—

1. These Regulations may be cited as the "Opticians Regulations 1946," and shall take effect on and from the date of publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.

2. The "Opticians Regulations 1936," as amended by the "Opticians Regulations 1937," the "Opticians Regulations 1937, No. 2," the "Opticians Regulations 1938," and the "Opticians Regulations" gazetted on the 3rd day of April, 1940, and the 17th day of September, 1941, are hereby repealed.

3. In the construction of these Regulations, unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—

"Act" means the *Opticians Registration Act 1935*.

"Board" means the Opticians Registration Board appointed under the Act.

"Certified optician" means a person who is registered under the Act.

"Member" means member of the Board.

"Optician" means a person who practises optometry.

"Optometry" or the "practice of optometry" means—

- (a) the employment of methods (other than methods which involve the use of drugs) for the measurements of the powers of vision and
- (b) the adaptation of lenses and prisms for the aid of the powers of vision.

"Prescribed" means prescribed by these Regulations.

"Register" means the Certified Opticians Register under the Act.

"Registrar" means the person who for the time being holds the office of Registrar of the Board under the Act, and includes an acting Registrar.

MEETINGS OF THE BOARD.

4. (a) *Ordinary Meetings*.—The Board shall meet once in every month at such time and place as it shall from time to time appoint. Three clear days' notice, in writing, of the time and place of such meeting shall be given by the Registrar to every member.

(b) *Special Meetings*.—The Board shall also meet on such other days and times as the chairman or any two members of the Board shall decide by requisition, in writing, addressed to the Registrar. Any requisition so given by either the chairman or any two members must state the nature of the business for which such meeting is called. Upon the receipt of a requisition the Registrar shall thereupon summon the members of the Board to meet on a day and time not less than three days after the receipt of such requisition. At any special meeting of the Board only such business for which the meeting was called shall be discussed and transacted.

QUORUM.

5. If at the expiration of thirty minutes after the hour appointed for any meeting of the Board there shall not be present at such meeting a quorum of members, as defined by section 4 of the Act, no business shall be transacted, and the meeting of the Board and all business shall stand adjourned till the date of the next meeting or such other date (not less than five days after such adjourned meeting) as may be fixed by the members then present, and if not adjourned as aforesaid the meeting shall be deemed to have lapsed.

VOTING AT MEETINGS.

6. Subject to sub-section 11 of section 4 of the Act every question submitted to any meeting of the Board shall be decided upon by a show of hands. If any member present at a meeting refuses to vote, his vote shall be counted for the negative.

Any entry in the book of proceedings of the Board that any resolution has been carried or lost at any meeting shall be conclusive evidence of that fact.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

7. The order of business at each ordinary meeting of the Board shall be as follows:—

- (a) Reading of minutes of previous meeting upon which no discussion shall be permitted, save as to the accuracy of such as a record of the proceedings.
- (b) Confirmation of same.
- (c) Business arising out of minutes.
- (d) Treasurer's financial report.
- (e) Presentation of accounts for payment.

(f) Correspondence and action thereon.

(g) Presentation of reports, consideration, and discussion thereon.

(h) Applications for registration.

(i) Motions of which one week's notice has been given previously.

(j) General business.

MOTIONS.

8. Every motion before a meeting of the Board must be seconded before being discussed.

PROCEEDINGS OF THE BOARD.

9. At every meeting of the Board the business and proceedings and the conduct and management thereof shall be dealt with, carried on, and regulated as provided by standing orders from time to time made by the Board, or in the absence or silence of such standing orders, resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of Parliament which shall be followed so far as the same are applicable to the proceedings of the Board.

AUTHENTICATION OF DOCUMENTS.

10. Every order, notice, certificate, or other document of the Board relating to the execution of the Act shall be sufficiently authenticated if signed by the Chairman or Registrar or any two members of the Board.

NOTICES.

11. Every notice of meeting shall be in writing, and shall be either delivered personally to the member to whom it is addressed or forwarded through the post in a prepaid envelope addressed to the member at his place of business not less than three clear days before the date of the meeting.

MINUTES.

12. The Board shall cause the Registrar to make minutes—
- (a) Of the names of members present at each meeting of the Board and
  - (b) Of all resolutions, business, and proceedings made or transacted at each meeting of the Board.

THE REGISTRAR.

13. The Registrar shall act as secretary to the Board. He shall prepare and keep the Register and bring before the Board all matters and things necessary to enable the Board to carry out its powers, duties, and obligations under the Act. He shall summon all meetings of the Board, and attend thereat, prepare the business paper for each meeting of the Board or Committee, and take and record the minutes of proceedings at the same, conduct all correspondence, and keep a correct record in the proper books of all accounts, receipts, payments, vouchers, reports, documents, papers, and proceedings in connexion with the Board's business and generally do all the clerical work of the Board, and supervise all business and affairs under the Board's directions. He shall be responsible for the safe custody of all receipts, papers, cheques, books, documents, and property belonging to the Board which shall be under his charge, and he shall at all times make the same available for inspection by the Board or any member thereof.

14. The Registrar shall be paid a salary of Three hundred and twelve pounds per annum.

CHEQUES.

15. All cheques shall be signed by the Chairman of the Board, the Honorary Treasurer, and the Registrar.

THE TREASURER.

16. The Board may from time to time appoint one of their number as honorary treasurer whose duty it shall be to receive from the Registrar a monthly account of all moneys received, and see that all moneys are lodged with the bank appointed by the Board to the Board's credit. The Treasurer shall see that all accounts are paid by cheque signed by the Chairman of the Board himself and the Registrar.

17. The Treasurer shall present to the Board at each ordinary meeting of the Board a monthly statement showing the receipts and expenditure for the past month, and shall in the month of July or as soon thereafter as shall be practicable in each year, prepare and present to the Board a financial statement made up to the 30th day of June, in each year, showing the receipts and expenditure (including liabilities of the Board) during the preceding twelve months.

REGISTRATION.

18. Any person who desires to be registered as a certified optician under the Act shall make application to the Board in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the First Schedule hereto, and shall furnish the Board with all such information as is therein indicated, and shall verify the same by a statutory declaration.

19. Every applicant at the time of making his application for registration shall furnish the Board with—

- (a) Certificates of character from two persons, each of whom must be either a justice of the peace, medical practitioner, barrister, solicitor, minister of religion, or bank manager.
- (b) Portrait photograph (passport size) of applicant signed by himself across the left-hand corner.
- (c) Specimen signature of applicant.

20. Every applicant shall furnish the Board with such other information and evidence as the Board may require.

21. The Board shall refund to any person whose application it has refused any fees paid by such person to the Board.

22. Every person who, in the opinion of the Board, is qualified and entitled to be registered as a certified optician shall, on the payment of the prescribed fees, be registered, and shall be supplied with a certificate in the form contained in the Second Schedule hereto.

23. Every certificate of registration shall be signed by the Chairman and Registrar.

24. The Register of Certified Opticians shall be compiled in the form of a book, and shall contain the particulars of each certified optician provided in the Third Schedule hereto.

25. No certified optician shall reproduce his certificate for any purpose whatsoever.

26. A certified optician who changes his address shall within one month after such change notify the Registrar, in writing, of the particulars of his new address.

27. Any person desiring to have his name restored to the Register shall make application, in writing, to the Board, stating the reasons why he claims such restoration should be effected, and shall lodge with such application the prescribed fees.

#### PENALTY.

28. The penalty for any wilful breach of these Regulations if not otherwise prescribed shall be a fine of not exceeding Ten pounds.

#### CERTIFICATES.

29. The following evidence of qualification shall be sufficient to entitle the holder to be registered as a certified optician:—

- (a) The fellowship diploma of the Victorian Optical Association; or
- (b) The licentiate diploma of the Australian College of Optometry, Melbourne.

#### FEES.

30. There shall be paid to the Board—

- (a) A fee of Two guineas by every applicant for registration.
- (b) A fee of One guinea for restoration of a name to the register after removal therefrom (otherwise than for default in payment of any annual fee).
- (c) A fee of Ten shillings for the restoration of a name to the register after removal therefrom for default in payment of the annual fee.
- (d) A fee of Five shillings for the amendment of any entry in the register on the application of the person registered.
- (e) A fee of Five shillings for any certificate.

#### SUSPENSION AND REMOVAL FROM REGISTER.

31. The following acts, matters, or things shall be causes for which the Board may suspend any certified optician from the privileges conferred by registration under the Act or remove from the register the name of any certified optician:—

- (a) To employ a person who is not a certified optician to practise optometry.
- (b) To pay or agree to pay any commission or other form of remuneration for or in respect of the direct or indirect introduction of patients.
- (c) Either personally or by an employee or agent to ply his calling as a certified optician from door to door.
- (d) Either personally or by an employee or agent to solicit custom or support by personal visitation from door to door.
- (e) To pay or agree to pay for the use of rooms on a commission basis dependent upon the number of patients introduced by the owner, hirer, or lessor of the rooms.
- (f) To exhibit or display his certificate of registration to the public in any place other than in his waiting room or consulting room at such place at which he is for the time being bona fide engaged in the practice of optometry.
- (g) To advertise in a manner misleading to the public.

#### NOMINATION OF CERTIFIED OPTICIANS AS MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

32. The persons to be nominated by certified opticians pursuant to the provisions of section 4 of the Act for appointment as members of the Board shall be determined by an election which shall be held on a day appointed by the Board. Provided, however, that such election shall be held at least seven days before the expiration of the period for which the members of the Board were appointed.

33. At any election held pursuant to these Regulations the Registrar of the Board shall be the Returning Officer.

34. In the event of the requisite number of medical practitioners not being available for appointment as members of the Board under section 4 of the Act, or on the occurrence of any vacancy on the Board in respect of which an election is to be held, a certified optician shall be elected by certified opticians in the same manner as other certified opticians are elected under these Regulations, and the Returning Officer shall fix the date of any such election.

35. The Returning Officer shall, not less than one month before the date of the election, fix a date for receiving nominations and cause to be published in the *Government Gazette* and in any daily newspaper or in any optical journal or journals circulating in Victoria an advertisement setting out the date of election and the date for receiving nominations. Each nomination shall be in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Fourth Schedule to these Regulations and shall—

- (i) be in writing; and
- (ii) set out the name and address of the person nominated; and
- (iii) be signed by not less than six certified opticians; and
- (iv) be accompanied by a statement signed by the nominee setting out that he is willing if elected to serve as a member of the Board; and
- (v) be lodged with or forwarded to the Returning Officer so as to be received by him before noon on the day fixed for receiving nominations, at least twenty-one days before the date of the election.

36. If the number of valid nominations does not exceed the number of persons to be elected the Returning Officer shall declare the persons so nominated to be duly elected.

37. If the number of valid nominations exceeds the number of persons to be elected—

- (i) The Returning Officer shall cause to be prepared printed ballot-papers containing the names of the candidates in the alphabetical order of their surnames. The ballot-paper shall contain instructions as to the method of voting and the number of candidates for whom the voter may vote. The ballot-paper shall be in or to the effect of the form in the Fifth Schedule to these Regulations.
- (ii) Not less than fourteen days prior to the date fixed for the election the Returning Officer shall cause one ballot-paper to be forwarded to each person who on the day fixed for lodging nominations is registered in Victoria as a certified optician.
- (iii) The voter shall mark his ballot-paper in accordance with the instructions thereon, and shall forward it by post to the Returning Officer so as to reach him not later than noon on the date fixed for the election, or place such ballot-paper in a ballot-box at the office of the Returning Officer prior to noon on that date.
- (iv) Each candidate may nominate, in writing, one scrutineer to be present at the marking off and scrutiny of the returned ballot-papers and at the counting thereof.

38. The Returning Officer may appoint two persons present at the time to assist him at the counting of the votes.

39. The candidate, or where more than one is to be elected, the candidates, receiving the highest number of votes shall be declared elected by the Returning Officer.

40. In the case of an equality of votes the Returning Officer shall decide forthwith by lot which candidate is to be elected.

41. If any question arises as to the validity or regularity of any vote, or of the ballot, or of any action in connexion with the election, the question shall be determined by the Returning Officer.

42. The Returning Officer shall report, in writing, to the Minister the result of the election, and such report may be countersigned by such of the scrutineers, if any, as may be present.

#### NOMINATION OF MEDICAL PRACTITIONERS AS MEMBERS OF THE BOARD.

43. The nomination of two medical practitioners by the Victorian Branch of the British Medical Association, in pursuance of the provisions of section 4 of the Act, shall be made in the form or to the effect of the form contained in the Sixth Schedule to these Regulations, and shall—

- (i) be in writing; and
- (ii) set out the names and addresses of each of the medical practitioners so nominated; and

- (iii) be signed by the Medical Secretary of the Victorian Branch of the British Medical Association; and
- (iv) be lodged with, or forwarded to, the Registrar so as to be received by him before noon on the day fixed for the election.

STUDY, TRAINING, AND EXAMINATIONS.

44. No person shall be entitled to commence the course of training or sit for the examinations prescribed by these Regulations unless he has matriculated at the University of Melbourne.

45. The course of study and training for persons desiring to be registered under the Act shall extend over a period of four years, and shall be divided into four sections as follows:—

First Section.—First Year—

- Chemistry, Part I.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING REGULATIONS (No. 1)—  
PREPARATION AND SUBMISSION OF PLANNING SCHEMES.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*, the Lieutenant-Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby make the following Regulations (that is to say)—

1. These Regulations shall be cited as "Town and Country Planning Regulations (No. 1)—Preparation and Submission of Planning Schemes"; and shall come into operation upon the publication thereof in the *Government Gazette*.
2. In these Regulations, unless the context otherwise requires, the Act means the *Town and Country Planning Act 1944*.
3. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter—
  - "Board" means the Town and Country Planning Board constituted under the Act.
  - "Minister" means the Commissioner of Public Works.
  - "Municipality" and "municipal district" respectively include the City of Melbourne and the City of Geelong.
  - "Public Authority" means any corporation board commission trust or other body corporate or unincorporate established or constituted by or under any Act for any public purpose, but does not include the council of any municipality.
  - "Responsible Authority" as regards the preparation and submission for approval of any planning scheme means the council of the municipality preparing such scheme or in the case of a joint scheme the committee preparing the scheme or in the case of a scheme prepared by the Board on the request or with the consent of the Minister the Board and as regards the enforcement and carrying out of any scheme means the council of the municipality whose municipal district or any portion thereof is included in the area of the scheme.
4. A Planning Scheme shall be a scheme prepared in accordance with the Act and any Regulations made thereunder, and shall comprise all maps, plans, descriptions, and other data necessary to enable the scheme to be effective.
5. The forms set out in the Schedule hereto, or forms substantially to the like effect, shall be the forms to be used in connexion with the exercise of the powers and duties of the Responsible Authority.
6. (i) The resolution of the Responsible Authority to prepare a Planning Scheme shall be in the terms of Form 1 (a). A certified copy of the resolution to prepare a Planning Scheme, together with a map showing the area proposed to be included in the scheme, shall be forwarded to the Board within twenty-eight (28) days of the passing of the resolution.
  - (ii) When the area of the proposed Planning Scheme includes areas in more than one municipal district, a resolution in terms of Form 1 (b) shall be passed by the Council of each municipality affected. A certified copy of the resolution to agree to the preparation of a Joint Planning Scheme shall be forwarded to the Board within twenty-eight (28) days of the passing of the resolution.
7. The preparation of a Planning Scheme shall be deemed to have been commenced when a resolution has been passed in accordance with paragraph 6 (i) hereof.

Interim  
Development  
Order.

8. After the commencement of the preparation of any Planning Scheme, the Responsible Authority may regulate the development of any area of land included in the scheme by the issuance of an Interim Development Order in accordance with section 12 of the Act. A specimen form of an Interim Development Order which may be used is set out in Appendix "A". The Order, in triplicate, shall be sealed and forwarded to the Board. The Order shall become operative when the approval of the Governor in Council has been granted and it has been published in the *Government Gazette*. A sealed and endorsed copy of the Order will be returned to the Responsible Authority and it shall be the duty of the Responsible Authority to publish the Order, as soon as practicable, in the *Government Gazette* and in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood. A copy of the Order shall be served upon every owner, lessee and occupier of any land proposed to be affected. Notices shall be served in the manner set out in section 51C of the *Local Government Act* 1928 as amended by section 28 of the *Local Government Act* 1941.

Preparation

9. Maps or plans forming part of any Planning Scheme submitted for the approval of the Governor in Council shall be prepared having a scale not smaller than 500 feet to an inch, except in rural, forest or similar areas where the Board may approve of a different scale. The matters referred to in Appendix "B" shall be shown on the maps by the notations and colours nominated in the Appendix and in such detail as the Minister may require. All Planning Schemes shall contain a description of the various proposals shown on the maps and all by-laws or other enabling methods necessary to effect the operation of the Planning Scheme. Any Council may, or shall when required by the Minister, submit maps or particulars in addition to those required under this clause.

10. (i) Before any Planning Scheme is submitted for approval to the Governor in Council, it shall be open for inspection at the office of the Responsible Authority or at the office of each of the Councils of the Municipalities, as set out in section 13 of the Act, and at the office of the Town and Country Planning Board, Treasury Gardens, Melbourne.

(ii) The Responsible Authority shall forthwith cause to be published in the *Government Gazette*, and twice in some newspaper generally circulating in the area included in the Planning Scheme a notice as set out in Form 3. This notice shall describe shortly the purport of the scheme; shall state where the relevant documents can be seen free of charge; shall call upon all persons affected, who may have any objections to the scheme, to set forth their objections in writing addressed to the Municipal Clerk of the Responsible Authority, or the Secretary of the Committee in cases of joint schemes, within three (3) months of the publication of the notice in the *Government Gazette*; and shall state that the Responsible Authority will consider any objections to the scheme at its next ordinary meeting after the expiry of the said three (3) months.

(iii) Notice shall be given to all Public Authorities affected by the Planning Scheme as set out in Form 2 (a), and, as set out in Form 2 (b) where the property in which the Public Authority is interested adjoins the area included in the scheme. In all cases, these notices shall be posted to the address of the Public Authority immediately after the scheme is open for inspection.

(iv) Notice shall be given in writing to all Municipalities whose municipal districts adjoin the area included in the Planning Scheme, as set out in Form 2 (b).

(v) The Responsible Authority shall keep a register of all notices sent out in connexion with a Planning Scheme and/or Interim Development Order.

11. The Responsible Authority at its first ordinary meeting held after the expiry of the three (3) months from the date of the publication of the said notice in the *Government Gazette*, shall proceed to consider and deal with all objections made by or on behalf of any persons affected by the Planning Scheme.

Adoption  
of Planning  
Scheme.

12. After considering any objections, the Responsible Authority may by resolution adopt the Planning Scheme with or without modifications or alterations. All documents comprising the Planning Scheme shall be sealed by the Council in the case of a scheme wholly within a municipal district. In the case of a joint Planning Scheme, two (2) members of the Committee appointed by resolution shall sign the documents which shall then be referred to each constituent municipality for sealing as far as the relevant area of its municipal district is concerned.

13. As set out in section 14 of the Act, every Planning Scheme shall after adoption be submitted to the Minister by the Responsible Authority. The Responsible Authority shall also forward a copy of all written objections and statements of any other objections to the Planning Scheme, together with a record of any action taken thereon by the Responsible Authority. An extra copy of the Planning Scheme shall also be forwarded.

Submission of Planning Scheme to Minister.

14. After a Planning Scheme has been submitted to the Board by the Minister, the Responsible Authority, or any other body, shall, when requested in writing by the Board, confer upon any matters included in the Planning Scheme.

Consideration of Planning Scheme by Minister.

15. When any Planning Scheme has been approved by the Governor in Council, one copy shall be returned to the Responsible Authority with the approval of the Governor in Council endorsed thereon. As soon as practicable after the return of the approved scheme, the Responsible Authority shall forward to the Board six (6) additional copies of the Planning Scheme, two of which will be retained by the Board, one copy forwarded to the Office of Titles, one copy to the Central Plan Office established under the *Survey Co-ordination Act 1940*, and one copy shall be laid before each House of Parliament.

Approval of Planning Scheme.

16. A Planning Scheme shall be effective immediately after notice of its approval by the Governor in Council has been published in the *Government Gazette*, and the Responsible Authority shall, within twenty-eight (28) days of such publication in the *Government Gazette*, notify by advertisement in some newspaper generally circulating in the neighbourhood that the Planning Scheme has been approved and became effective on the aforementioned date and shall state where a copy of such scheme may be inspected.

Notification of Approval of Planning Scheme.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO FOODS, DRUGS,  
SUBSTANCES AND METHODS OF ANALYSIS.

1. These Regulations may be cited as the Amending Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1946, shall be read and construed as one with the Food and Drug Standards Regulations 1939, and any Regulations amending the same and, except where otherwise stated, shall come into operation on publication in the *Government Gazette*.

2. In these Regulations unless inconsistent with the context or subject-matter the expression DDT means dichloro-diphenyl-trichlorethane.

3. Regulation 84 of the Food and Drugs Standards Regulations 1939 is hereby amended by addition of the following immediately after paragraph 2 (b):—

(c) (i) where such package contains DDT a statement of the DDT content in terms of the para para isomer of dichloro-diphenyl-trichlorethane.

(ii) In the case of liquid preparations containing DDT the label shall contain the following statement:—

Avoid repeated skin contact. Do not spray on food or food utensils. Wash hands after using.

(iii) In the case of powders containing DDT the label shall contain the following statement:—

Avoid contamination of food or food utensils with this preparation.

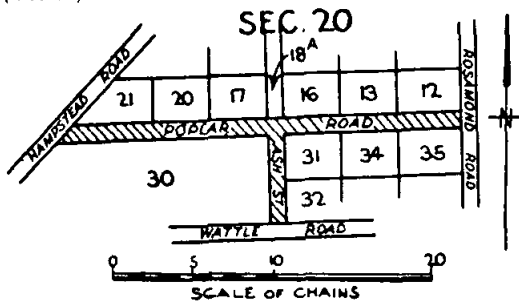
