ALTERATION OF DATE FOR EXHIBITION OF RATEPAYERS' LISTS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria
and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia,
&c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, pursuant to The Constitution Act Amendment
Acts, periodical elections for the Council are to be
held in the month of June, One thousand nine hundred and
forty-six, and for the purposes of the said elections rate-
payers' lists for every division of every province are required
to be prepared: And whereas, in respect of every such rate-
payers' list, it is provided, pursuant to section Ninety-one
of *The Constitution Act Amendment Act 1928*, as amended by
the *Legislative Council Elections Act 1935*, that the registrar
shall forthwith after the fifteenth day of January next
preceding the day on which periodical elections for the
Council are to be held, advertise in a newspaper generally
circulating in the division that the ratepayers' list is open
for inspection at the office of the registrar and at such other
places as are prescribed: And whereas, pursuant to section
One hundred and sixteen of *The Constitution Act Amendment
Act 1928*, as amended by the *Legislative Council Elections Act
1935*, it is provided that the Governor in Council may from
time to time, by Proclamation published in the *Government
Gazette*, alter the date referred to in the said section Ninety-
one: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria,
by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do,
in respect of the periodical elections for the Council to be
held in the month of June, One thousand nine hundred and
forty-six, alter the said date from the fifteenth day of January
to the thirty-first day of January next preceding the day on
which such periodical elections are to be held.

ADDITION TO WEIGHTS AND MEASURES UNION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by a Proclamation made by the Governor in Council on the sixteenth day of May, 1933, the Borough of Queenscliffe and the Shires of Bannockburn, Barrabool, Bellarine, South Barwon, and Winchelsea were proclaimed a Union for the purposes of the *Weights and Measures Act 1928*: And whereas the councils of all the aforesaid municipalities have requested that the Shire of Leigh be added to such Union: Now therefore I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do by this my Proclamation declare that the Shire of Leigh shall be added to and form part of such Union, and do fix as follows the proportion in which the expenses devolving upon such Union under the said Act shall be borne by the several municipalities, that is to say:—

Borough of Queenscliffe—one-seventh;
Shire of Bannockburn—one-seventh;
Shire of Barrabool—one-seventh;
Shire of Bellarine—one-seventh;
Shire of Leigh—one-seventh;
Shire of South Barwon—one-seventh;
Shire of Winchelsea—one-seventh.

And, further, I do hereby fix one as the number of managers each council in the said Union shall elect.

*Water Acts.*BELLARINE PENINSULA WATERWORKS DISTRICT.
PORTION OF DISTRICT PROCLAIMED AN "URBAN DISTRICT."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Governor of the State of Victoria and its Dependencies in the Commonwealth of Australia, &c., &c., &c.

UNDER the powers conferred by the Water Acts and all other powers enabling me in that behalf, I, the Governor of the State of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council thereof, do hereby proclaim that as on and from the date hereof that portion of the Bellarine Peninsula Waterworks District included within the boundaries set out and described in the Schedule hereto, shall be and become an "Urban District" for the purpose of the said Acts, and shall be known as Birregurra Urban District.

SCHEDULE.

Boundaries of Birregurra Urban District.

Commencing at the north-eastern angle of allotment K, section XXVIII., Parish of Birregurra, County of Polwarth; thence westerly by the northern boundary of that allotment a distance of 5 chains; thence northerly by a line parallel to the eastern boundaries of allotments J and H of said section XXVIII. to a point distant 5 chains northerly at right angles from the southern boundary of allotment A, section XXII.; thence south-easterly by a line parallel to the last-mentioned boundary to a point distant 5 chains westerly at right angles from the eastern boundary of the said allotment A; thence north by a line to the southern boundary of the land described in Memorial of Conveyance, No. 727, Book No. 579, in the office of the Registrar-General in the State of Victoria; thence by lines bearing west 2 chains, north 3 chains 35 4/10 links, south 72 deg. 56 min. west 7 chains 28 8/10 links, north 17 deg. 4 min. west 8 chains, north 72 deg. 56 min. east 8 chains 76 links, east 2 chains 95 links, north 5 chains, east 11 chains and south to the southern boundary of allotment J, section XXII.; thence easterly by the last-mentioned boundary and by a line in continuation thereof to the western boundary of allotment A, section XX.; thence southerly by the last-mentioned boundary and by a line in continuation thereof to the western bank of the Barwon River; thence generally southerly by that bank to the southern boundary of Hopkins-street, Township of Birregurra; thence north-westerly by the last-mentioned

boundary to the eastern boundary of Beal-street; thence south-westerly by that boundary to a point in line with the southern boundary of Murrell-street; thence north-westerly by a line and the last-mentioned boundary and by a line in continuation thereof to the eastern boundary of allotment K, section XXVIII.; thence northerly by that boundary to the point of commencement.

The boundaries set out and described in the foregoing Schedule are shown on a plan approved by the Governor in Council, and deposited in the office of the State Rivers and Water Supply Commission, 100-110 Exhibition-street, Melbourne.—(Corres. No. 45/19164.)

NOTICE TO BOATMEN AND OTHERS.

BOATMEN and others are hereby notified that Henley on the Maribyrnong will be held on Saturday, 2nd February, 1946, and that persons in charge of motor and other boats permitted to be on the river during the day and night shall observe the following Regulations, viz.:—

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "EPPING RECREATION RESERVE."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 25th June, 1877, as a site for Cricket and other purposes of Public Recreation in the Town of Epping, and known as the "Epping Recreation Reserve."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twelve, in any one year as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Two shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve, nor shall any fires be lighted therein without the consent of the Committee of Management.

4. No person shall climb or jump over the gates or fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any of the buildings, gates, fences, seats, or trees in the Reserve, nor leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, nor roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

5. No person shall put in the Reserve any cattle, horses, sheep, goats, pigs, or any other animals without permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

6. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

7. No person shall camp in the Reserve, nor erect therein any building nor any booth or other structure without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

8. No person shall take part in any public entertainment of any sort in the Reserve without the permission, in writing, of the Committee of Management first obtained.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall bet publicly in any part of the Reserve, and every person infringing this Regulation shall be liable to expulsion from the enclosures and Reserve.

11. No person shall play, practise, or engage in any game or sport at any time in the Reserve without the consent of the Committee of Management previously had and obtained.

12. No person, except labourers and workmen employed in the Reserve, shall enter any plots therein which may be enclosed for plantations of young trees or shrubs.

The Council of the Shire of Whittlesea has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

Every person who contravenes or fails to comply with these Regulations shall, in accordance with the provisions of section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, for each offence be liable to a penalty of not more than Five pounds, and every person who contravenes or fails to comply with any such Regulation and who, after he has been warned by any bailiff of Crown lands or by any member of the Police Force, does not desist therefrom, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or member of the Police Force and taken before some Justice to be dealt with according to law, and shall be liable to a penalty of not more than Ten pounds.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF THE "ARARAT PUBLIC PARK."

WHEREAS by section 181 of the *Land Act* 1928, as re-enacted by section 9 of the *Land Act* 1941, power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make Regulations in respect of the care, protection, and management of any land which has been reserved for any public purpose whatsoever, and which has not been conveyed to or vested in trustees, and for the further purposes as enacted: Now therefore the Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the following Regulations in respect of the land temporarily reserved by Order in Council dated 12th September, 1879, as a site for a Public Park in the Municipal District of Ararat, and known as the "Ararat Public Park."

REGULATIONS.

1. The Reserve shall be open to the public from sunrise to sunset free of charge, except on such days, not exceeding twenty in any one year, as the Reserve may be set apart for cricket or football matches, fêtes, sports, or holiday amusements, on any of which occasions a sum not exceeding Three shillings may be charged and taken for the admission of every adult to the Reserve.

2. No person shall enter or remain in the Reserve who may offend against decency as regards dress, language, or conduct.

3. No person shall light fires, climb or jump over fences in or around the Reserve, stick bills thereon, or cut names on, or in any way damage or injure any building, gates, fences, seats, any erection, or trees on the Reserve, or leave or deposit any glass, paper, or rubbish, or roll or throw stones or any missiles of any kind therein.

4. No person shall damage in any way the trees, shrubs, or flowers in the Reserve.

5. No person shall remove, damage, or displace any board, fitting, or written notice for the exhibition of any Regulations or notice fixed or set up by the Committee of Management in the Reserve.

6. The Committee of Management shall have full power and authority to impound any cattle found trespassing on the Reserve, and shall be taken to be the occupier of same within the meaning of any law for the time being in force relating to the impounding of cattle. For the purposes of this clause "cattle" shall mean cattle as interpreted by section 3 of the *Pounds Act 1928*.

7. No person shall bring into the Reserve any dog unless controlled by a chain or cord.

8. No person shall camp in the Reserve or erect any building, or any booth, tent, or structure for the purpose of offering for sale any article or conducting any entertainment or game, except after obtaining a permit which shall be subject to the payment of such fees and under such conditions as the Committee of Management from time to time may determine.

9. No person shall spit or expectorate on the paths or on any structure or erection in the Reserve.

10. No person shall, without the consent of the Committee of Management first obtained—

(a) gather, pick up, cut, pluck, dig up, remove, or have in his possession in the Reserve, or take away therefrom any live or dead timber or the whole or any part of any tree, bush, shrub, flower, grass, ferns, or other vegetation;

(b) ring-bark or strip or remove bark from any tree, bush, or shrub;

(c) carry or discharge therein any firearms.

11. The Committee may let the Reserve on such terms and conditions as it may deem to be reasonable and consistent with these Regulations, but the maximum fee shall not exceed the sum of Five guineas (£5 5s.) per day.

12. The Committee of Management may set apart any portion of the Reserve for the purpose of any lawful game or sports, and from time to time grant to any club or association of clubs, upon such terms and conditions as the Committee of Management may determine, the use of the grounds so set apart.

The Council of the Town of Ararat has been appointed a Committee of Management with power and authority to enforce the foregoing Regulations.

CITY OF PRESTON.**BY-LAW No. 53.**

A By-law of the City of Preston, made under the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria, and numbered 53, for determining, applying, dispensing with, or regulating such matters or things as are left to be determined, applied, dispensed with, or regulated by the Council of the said City of Preston under the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria.

IN pursuance of the powers conferred by the Local Government Acts and the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria and any and every other power thereunto enabling, the Mayor, Councillors, and Citizens of the City of Preston order as follows:—

1. The areas set out and described in the First Schedule hereto are hereby prescribed as brick areas in which no person shall construct or cause to be constructed any building the external walls of which are of material other than brick, stone, or concrete, provided that for the purpose of this clause buildings of the nature of Classes I. and II. occupancy of brick veneer construction conforming to the requirements of Chapter 26 of the Uniform Building Regulations shall be deemed to have external walls of brick.

2. The area set out and described in the Second Schedule hereto is hereby prescribed as the area in which buildings of Classes II. and III. occupancy shall not be constructed to contain more than two stories including the ground story, and no person shall in such area construct a building of Classes II. or III. occupancy to contain more than two stories including the ground story.

3. The minimum depth and width of frontage specified in Column 2 of Table 803 of the Uniform Building Regulations Victoria (hereinafter called the Regulations), are hereby adopted as the minimum area, depth, and width of frontage of land on which a building shall be constructed throughout the whole of the City of Preston.

4. (a) The minimum distance of the outer walls of any building of Classes I. and II. occupancy from the street alignment of any land is hereby specified as 15 feet.

(b) No person shall construct any building of Classes I. and II. occupancy closer to the street alignment of any land than 15 feet.

5. (a) Where any allotment of land having an area, frontage, depth, or contained rectangle less than that prescribed in Column 2 of Table 803 forms part of a plan of subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in Office of Titles prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further or sufficient land cannot be obtained to provide for the discrepancy, the Council on receipt of an application, in writing, may by resolution permit a building of Class I. occupancy to be erected on such land.

(b) Where any allotment of land having an area, frontage, depth, or contained rectangle less than that prescribed in clause 809 forms part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged in Office of Titles prior to the coming into operation of this By-law, and in the opinion of the Council further or sufficient land cannot be obtained to provide for the discrepancy, the Council, on receipt of an application, in writing, may by resolution permit a building of Class III., IV., V., VI., VII., VIII., or IX. occupancy to be erected on such land.

6. In the case of a building on any land forming part of a subdivision approved by the Council and lodged with the Office of Titles prior to the date of commencement of the Regulations, the requirements of clause 811 of the Regulations may be dispensed with by resolution of the Council if it is satisfied clause 187 (3) (b) of the *Health Act* 1928 can be otherwise complied with.

7. The fees to be fixed under Table 401 empowering a Council to fix a fee and a deposit shall be as follows:—

(g) The deposit for constructing a temporary crossing shall be £2.

(h) The fees shall be—

(a) 15s. for opening a made street or road or footpath;

(b) 7s. 6d. for opening an unmade street or road;

(c) 2s. 6d. for opening nature strip only or unmade footpath.
